## Lest we forget

Though Sunday clouds threatened to bring rain, the weather held out long enough for Newark to celebrate Memorial Day in its own, special way by holding its annual parade and ceremonies.

Color guards, bands, and military personnel lined the green outside of Memorial Hall at the University of Delaware to pay honor to the men and women who have served and continue to serve in the U.S. Armed Forces. Maj. Thomas E. Kelly, USMC Retired, led the ceremonies, which includ-

ed a demonstration from the U.S. Coast Guard Drill Team, the featured service branch for this year's parade. A 21-gun salute was performed by local members of the Veterans of Foreign War post.

Local favorites, the Newark High Marching Band and UD mascot YouDee were on hand to entertain the crowds that lined Newark's Main St. A host of dignitaries, including Newark Mayor Vance Funk, New Castle County Executive Chris Coons, and U.S. Representative Mike Castle, also participated in the parade.

## Death ruled homicide

The December death of a Newark woman has been classified as a homicide by the State Medical Examiner's Office.

On December 4, 2008 at 6:31 p.m., a 911 call was placed by the victim's husband, who reported finding his wife to be unresponsive in their home in the 800 block of Baylor Drive, Newark.

Responding officers, emergency services personnel, and paramedics found the victim, Shirley June Hollins, who was 64 years old at the time of her death, in a bathroom.

Efforts to revive Hollins were unsuccessful, and she was pronounced dead at the scene. On Monday, the Newark Police Department received notice from the Medical Examiner's Office, stating Hollins death certificate had been signed, and the manner of death was homicide. At this time, no arrest warrant has been sought, which prohibits the Newark Police Department from publicly naming a suspect. No further details were

## Lyles named superintendent

Marcia Lyles has been named superintendent of the Christina School District. She was chosen by the school board from a field that included Interim Superintendent Freeman Williams, a longtime administrator in the sprawling district that includes Newark and portions of Pike Creek, Bear-Glasgow and the city of Wilmington. However, Williams faced an uphill battle for the post, which for the past two decades has mainly been filled by candidates from outside the district.

Lyles succeeds Lillian Lowery, who is the Secretary of Education for Delaware. She will face continued budget challenges brought on by the state's nearly \$800 million shortfall in the next fiscal year. School districts derive much of their funding from state aid, with the remainder coming from property taxes. Under Lowery, the district returned to financial health, following a reported budget gap

from her successor, Joseph Wise. Wise claimed the gap was largely manufactured by critics and by a complex formula for state aid for Delaware public schools.

Lyles is a resident of Staten Island, N.Y. She holds an Ed.D. degree from Teachers College, Columbia University, a master's degree in English from New York University, and a bachelor's degree in English from Hunter College, City University of New York.

Lyles presently serves as Deputy Chancellor for Teaching and Learning for the New York City Department of Education. Prior to this position, she served for three years as Regional Superintendent for the New York City Department of Education. She has a total of 19 years of experience as a building and district administrator, serving as program coordinator, assistant principal, principal, deputy superintendent, community super-

# Newark Dodge to remain a Chrysler dealership

Newark Dodge will remain open at its Elkton Road location,

despite being listed late last week as one of the dealers on the chopping block.

The dealer survived with a unique one-dealer, two-location status, due to its high sales volume.

Chrysler typically opted to quit selling vehicles to low-volume stores.

"We were on the list because every dealer is assigned a code and they did eliminate one of our two dealer codes," said

Newark Dodge owner Gary Hendrixson Jr.

Hendrixson said he considers himself lucky because he sold Chrysler, Jeep and Dodge at two locations under two dealer codes, which will allow him to continue selling the three brands at two locations by consolidating them under one code.

"We got tons of calls Friday when the story came out that we were on the list to close," said Newark Dodge Manager Tom Biggs. "We will continue to sell and service Dodge vehicles from our Elkton Road store," he said.

Hendrixson said that so far Newark Dodge ranks first in Delaware in sales volume for Dodge in 2009. The owner operates a separate Chrysler-Jeep dealership on Cleveland Avenue and employs about 100 people between the two locations, automaker.

The long-time Newark dealership spent much of its existence as Rittenhouse Dodge, a long-time family business in the city.

Two other dealers in Delaware are also on the list, C.F. Schwartz Motor Co. and

Hertrich Jeep. Those dealers also offer other auto brands.

Newark Dodge is adjacent to Newark City Hall and had hired some employees of the now-closed Advantage Dodge and Chrysler dealership in nearby Elkton, Md. that had closed earlier for reasons unrelated to the latest move by Chrysler.

Auto companies have been working to cull the number of

dealers in recent years, due to the expense of the dealership system. However, state laws have often limited the ability of companies to make aggressive moves. Management was also reluctant to confront dealers.

Chrysler has the flexibility to make major changes, due to its Chapter 11 filing that gives management more room to make drastic changes.

### Plumbing company owner faces charge

A local plumbing contractor has been charged with damaging a vehicle during an apparent dispute over business dealings.

Last week, Newark Police were dispatched to Superior Building Services, located at 1400 Interchange Blvd., Newark.

Owner Mario Mareno reported that the front windshield of his Ford F350 pickup truck had been smashed and that the truck also received paint and fender damage. Police found a cinder block next to the truck and a business card for Stan Perkowski's Plumbing & Heating tucked into the driver's side window.

During his interview with police, Mareno stated that he and Perkowski had entered into a business deal. Mareno was to build a garage for Perkowski. In an earlier deal, Mareno had already owed the plumber \$9,000 for work done and the purchase of a commercial van. Due to some prob-

lems with permitting, Perkowski cancelled the project, though Mareno had already purchased some trusses for the job. Mareno wrote a check to settle what he owed, and later Perkowski notified Mareno that the check had bounced. Mareno telephoned Perkowski to let him know that he would "take care of it".

According to police, a video surveillance system located outside of Mareno's business showed Perkowski throwing a cinder block at the pickup. The additional damage was caused by the block bouncing off the hood of the truck. The damage is estimated to be \$1,200.

Perkowski is charged with Criminal Mischief/Damage to Property Valued Greater Than \$1,000 But Less Than \$1,500. A warrant is being issued for Perkowski.

### Thief breaks into dealership's secured lot

Last Sunday, Porter Chevrolet, located at 414 E. Cleveland Ave., reported that a 2009 Chevy Equinox, parked inside of the secured lot, had had all four of its tires and rims stolen.

An investigation by Newark Police discovered that a section of the fence near McKees Road

had been pulled. The front passenger side window of the Chevy was broken and the car's jack had been removed to lift the car. Another jack, from an unknown vehicle, had also been used. There were no fingerprints on either jack and no video surveillance of the scene.

### Drunk driver goes wrong way on Main

At approximately 3:30 a.m. on Sunday, a patrol stationed on Main St. in Newark observed a black Jeep Cherokee with New Jersey registration traveling the wrong way. The officers present immediately stopped the vehicle and interviewed the driver, Brandon O'Donnell, 18, from Northfield, N.J. Two other occupants were in the vehicle with O'Donnell.

Upon questioning, O'Donnell stated that he was visiting his brother at the University of Delaware and that he was trying to get home. O'Donnell could not provide police with a current insurance card, though he had several that were expired. Officers detected a smell of alcohol coming from O'Donnell and the vehicle. A search revealed two half-filled bottles of vodka. O'Donnell did not pass the field

sobriety tests he was given and was taken to the police station. After being given an Intoxilyzer test, O'Donnell registered a .141 blood alcohol level.

O'Donnell was charged with Driving Under the Influence, Open Container in a Vehicle, Wrong Way on a One Way Street, and No Proof of Insurance.

### Police break up fight at Newark High

A Newark Police officer working a crime prevention detail at Newark High on May 13 responded to a disturbance coming from one of the classrooms. Upon entering, the officer observed one juvenile, 16, holding a 14 year-old in a headlock.

The officer separated the two, whereby the 14 year-old threw a punch at the 16 year old, but missed him. The 14 year-old was restrained by the officer and asked to leave the classroom. However, he resisted and was removed to the hallway. The 14 year-old continued to forcibly resist the officer until a stern warning was issued by the patrolman, where upon he complied with verbal orders.

Interviews with both boys revealed that the 14 year-old

accused the 16 year-old of throwing an object at him. The younger juvenile, in retaliation, threw a mug and a chair at the older one. The 16 year-old stated that he had not thrown anything, but admitted to throwing the first punch. The 14 year-old had swelling on his forehead, a minor laceration behind his right ear, and minor lacerations to his left hand. The older student had no injuries. Both were charged with Disorderly Conduct/Unrelated to Liquor.

# UD trustees appoint panel to buy Chrysler site

The University of Delaware Board of Trustees voted to give an ad hoc committee the authority to purchase the Chrysler site.

Appointed were trustees Howard Cosgrove, Gil Sparks, Bobby Fischer, Tom Burns, Chris Schell and Scott Green.

The board stated that it considers the acquisition to be "of great importance to the University and beneficial to the City of Newark and State of Delaware."

The Chrysler plant is not part of the Chapter 11 bankruptcy filing of the automaker. However, the financial problems of the company have complicated asset sales.

Other bidders have considered the site, but troubled financial markets have apparently left UD as the best hope when it comes to a plant.

The Trustees also came up with a funding plan for a new Interdisciplinary Science and

Engineering Building, which will house laboratory and teaching space for programs in both the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Engineering.

A planning budget of \$7 million was approved. Costs for the 150,000 square foot building are expected to be \$130 million with funding coming from UD operations and restricted gift support. The building is planned to be finished in 2013. UD President Patrick Harker and the Board agreed that the new building is a "No. 1 priority" and that the university must make a commitment to not falling behind in providing quality facilities for its researchers and educators.

An announcement was made that the incoming freshman class for the 2009-2010 school year will be 3,858 students, the largest class in the school's history. Delaware residents will comprise 1,202 of these freshmen, an increase of 27.3% from last year's class. The incoming class has an average 3.54 GPA on the 4.0 system.

President Harker stated that the Class of 2009 has donated

their gift to the school: a collection of solar panels that will allow the university to generate 6 megawatts of power. The president further emphasized the commitment of UD to become a leader in alternative power sources.

Edgar Johnson, who has stepped down after serving for 25 years as Athletic Director, was recognized for his many years of service. He was awarded a plaque given to him from Student Council President Teagan Gregory.

Finally, Board Chairman Howard Cosgrove will be stepping down from his position in June. Cosgrove will remain on the Board. His successor was not announced.

42, of Inman, S.C. Huskey was standing next to the vehicle as the officers arrived. An interview with the employees revealed that Huskey had entered and the left the store on three occasions that day.

A search of Huskey's car produced four collectible train engines, valued at \$314.97 each.

Another 235 train collectibles, from different stores were found in the trunk with an approximate value of \$12,990. Notes and addresses of several train stores in the area were also found. Huskey said that he had receipts for the items in the trunk, but that they were not on him at the time. All evidence was detained by police. Huskey was charged with Larceny/Shoplifting and three counts of Offensive Touching and released on bail.

## OUT OF THE ATTIC

This week's Out of the Attic features an undated picture of the Charles Parks statue, "The Student", at the Newark Free Library. The Newark children are identified as Kristin Mitchell, age 6; Katie Fickes, age 6; and Anne Fickes, age 3. The 200 pound, 8 foot high statue was commissioned by the Friends of Newark Library after seeing a smaller version in Chadds Ford, Pa. The model was Parks' nephew, Newark native Floyd Kemske, who posed for the original while a student at the University of Delaware. Dedicated July 27, 1975, the statue eventually rusted beyond repair. Parks used it to make the molds for a new 800-pound bronze casting that was dedicated February 14, 1999.

# UD president's pay package remains lucrative

The University of Delaware's practice of keeping the compensation of its presidents in the top tier among the nation's universities continued when Patrick Harker was hired.

The Review student newspaper reported Harker earned \$810,603 during his first year as president, which began in 2007.

That ranks No. 3 among the nation's universities, according

to the newspaper.

Harker will be taking a 10 percent cut in his salary this year, due to cost cutting by the university.

David Brond, vice president of the office of communications and marketing at UD, said the figure includes all compensation for Harker, including use of the president's home on campus.

According to Brond, university trustees set the compensation package based on Harker's accomplishments as dean of the internationally known Wharton (Business) School at the University of Pennsylvania and

his progress in meeting goals that include faculty recruitment and admissions targets. He said the president's base compensation of \$640,000 compares favorably with other universities.

UD is expected to see a record freshman class this fall, with a higher percentage of Delawareans and higher average test scores.

The Review obtained the information from an IRS 990 formed filed by the university. Former UD President David Roselle ranked as one of the highest paid university presi-

dents for many years and gained notice with a more than \$2 million in compensation during his final year in the post. The figure was based on compensation he earned during his long tenure as president that was to be paid at retirement.

The University of Delaware has long been tight-lipped about financial matters.

However, Brond said UD is working to increase transparency and released information on details of Harker's compensation package.

No information on current salaries was released.



"It was a total team effort. As an example, Gerald Hornbuckle was hurt most of the season but continued to support the team. And although he didn't place in the 400 at the state meet, he finished the race and showed his teammates that Vikings never give up."

### Morrin and Freeman double winners on track

St. Mark's cross-country state champion Greg Morrin added two more titles to his portfolio last Saturday, winning the 1,600- and 3,200-meter runs in times of 4:23.24 and 9:39.51.

"Greg's performance didn't surprise me," Spartans coach Tom McCartan said of his Villanova-bound runner who was recently named a recipient of the Harry Roberts Senior Scholar-Athlete Award. "I have had the privilege of coaching him for four years and learned early on that he is gifted with a combination of physical ability and drive that make his potential virtually limitless.

Glasgow's Malachi Freeman took home the unof-

ficial title of fastest man, winning the 100- (11.04) and 200-meter (22.02) races.

### Two locals sweep shot put titles, Gibbons vaults to first

Newark's Adam Bunche (Div. I, 48'-5") and Caravel's Bobby Kennedy (Div. II, 57'-0") each won state shot put titles.

"Malcolm keeps it simple and throws with power," Newark coach Mike Mooney said of Bunche, who will head to Miami on a football scholarship in the fall. "His spirit and competitive attitude are effusive, giving a lift to the team and any competition that he is in."

Caravel's Darwin Gibbons easily cleared 14'-6" to cap-

ture the state pole vault title and set a new meet record.

### Newark boys win relay and hurdle title

Newark's 800- and 1,600-relay teams each won state titles with times of 1:30.05 and 3:24.85. Members of the 800 team were Julius Brewington, Elliott Webster, Antoine Brewington and Kendall Daniels. Joining Webster and Daniels on the 1,600 team were Shaun Thomas and Lee Sausen.

"The 1,600 relay was our knock-out punch all season," Mooney said. "And their win secured our second-place finish."

Senior Shaun Thomas also placed first in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 39.25, winning his fourth medal of the meet.

"Shaun is brilliant, technically," said Mooney. "He is patient and calculating in every race."

### St. Mark's girls bring home relay crown

The St. Mark's girls 3,200-meter relay team won the state title with a time of 9:45.44. Members of the team include seniors Devin Sullivan and Kara Pollock and sophomores Emily Frydrych and Beth Sowden.

"The girls are extremely excited about the win," Spartans coach Mike DiGennaro said. "We talked this week about getting down to 9:45, and all four girls ran the exact time required to do it. It was a great weekend." St. Mark's finished seventh overall with 34 points.

# GROW YOUR OWN

Self-styled "square-inch" gardener R.J. Ruppenthal will try growing food just about anywhere inside his home. He encourages other city-dwellers to do the same.

R.J. Ruppenthal didn't intend to become an expert in

"square-inch gardening," as he calls it. It wasn't a love affair with nature. He worked on an organic vegetable farm when he was young, "but I wasn't all

that interested in it."

Ruppenthal was motivated by a conviction and a very practical desire. The high cost of energy will eventually make

food much more expensive and the food supply unpredictable, he believes.

To ensure his family's well-being – and for you to ensure yours, he argues – calls for a return to traditional methods of growing food. City dwellers must learn to grow food to sustain themselves.

"We will need to relearn basic food production skills in a hurry if we are to survive and thrive in this new world," he says. Using balconies, patios, rooftops, windowsills, cabinets, garages and counterspace, city dwellers can raise enough fresh food to sustain their families. "No space is too small or too dark to grow food," Ruppenthal says.

His brief, no-nonsense book "Fresh Food from Small Spaces" (Chelsea Green, 2008), is the fruit of years of experimenting to produce his family's fresh food in his own cramped living spaces. Ruppenthal lived in a series of apartments and small city homes, some of them gloomy and none of them with yards.

Now living with his family in San Francisco, where he is an attorney and instructor at a community college, Ruppenthal says he has grown enough in odd corners and nooks for his family to eat homegrown fresh food 365 days a year. Using his book, he says, readers will learn how to produce 10 to 20



percent of their fresh food from an average-size apartment or condominium space.

"Where there's space, there's growing potential," says Ruppenthal. He says the information in the book is "hard-won, through years of trial and error."

#### Size up your space

Assess the light: Fruiting vegetables such as tomatoes, peppers, potatoes, cucumbers, eggplant, squash or berries need at least 4 to 5 hours of strong sunlight daily. If your light conditions are less, Ruppenthal advises sticking with smaller fruiting vegetables: cherry tomatoes, banana peppers. Leafy greens, bush beans, peas, carrots and onions tolerate limited light.

#### Just the one:

Start small. Ruppenthal says he started with one container containing one "crop." When that succeeded, he tried another, then another. When he ran out of limited balcony space, he expanded to interior space.

#### Dwarf trees:

Many varieties of berries and dwarf and semi-dwarf fruit trees will thrive in containers on a balcony or a patio. A neglected spot next to a walkway or sidewalk may be perfect for a productive fruit tree.

#### Use all windowsills:

Containers of vegetables, herbs and even small fruit trees

will thrive on sunny windowsills.

#### Top of the refrigerator:

Ruppenthal produces 2 to 3 pounds of sprouts each week using a vertical sprouting system on top of his refrigerator: "an armload of alfalfa, radish, soybeans and wheatgrass."

They will grow in little or no light, Ruppenthal says; if you prefer to green them up just expose the plants to an hour or so of sunlight.

He uses sprouts fresh in salads and stir fries and juices the wheatgrass.

#### Make the most of mushrooms:

Look to dark cabinets, the basement or other dark areas that you might not immediately think of as productive growing areas.

#### Old plastic bottles:

Ruppenthal grew a thriving bush bean in an old 2-liter plastic soda bottle cut in half and filled with soil. The bush produced well with the bottle positioned in diffuse light. "I got a crop from it," he says.

#### Experiment:

"I'm always trying new stuff," says Ruppenthal. Last year, his tomatillos turned out to be very productive. He has some small blueberry plants in containers. "If you get the soil mix right – acidic, with a good amount of peat moss, pine needles or shredded bark – they'll grow like weeds."

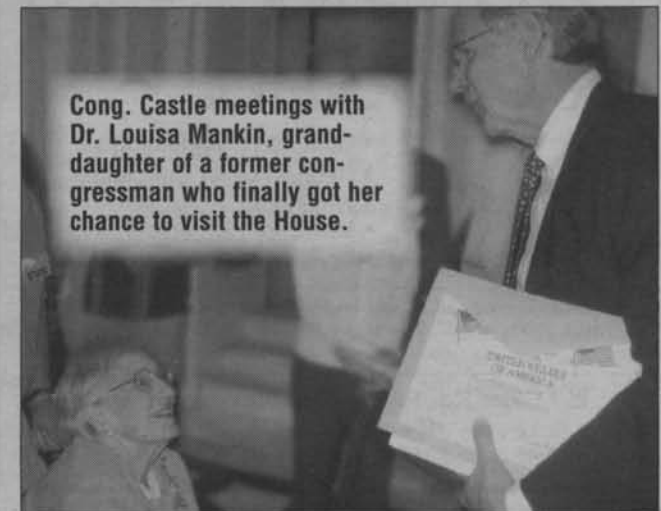
