## Day honored Nobel winner

Last week, the University of Delaware welcomed the return of Dr. Richard Heck, the 2010 Nobel Prize winner in Chemistry, by hosting a day-long symposium in his honor.

The event, entitled "Frontiers in Catalysis," brought together professors, students, alumni, and business leaders to discuss his contribution to the worlds of science and industry. Heck, accompanied by his wife Socorro, made the trip to UD from his home in the Philippines.

UD President Patrick Harker opened the day by honoring the achievements of Dr. Heck, and proclaiming May 26 as "Dr. Richard Heck Day."

Dow, along with Ashland, which acquired Hercules Inc. several years ago, sponsored the symposium honoring Dr. Heck and also used the event to celebrate 2011 as the International Year of Chemistry.

Harker joined the companies in acknowledging the value that chemistry has had in modern society and the importance of Dr. Heck's work. "I hope it will long

**Police investigate fatal dirt bike crash**

The Delaware State Police Crash Reconstruction Unit is investigating a crash that killed one dirt bike rider and injured another on Monday afternoon.

Troopers said that at 1:15 p.m. Nicholas Schrader, 16, was operating a Honda dirt bike in an eastbound direction on a dirt access road approximately one-fourth of a mile east of Route 72, north of Reybold Road. The location, south of Newark, is nine miles east of Elkton.

Schrader's dirt bike collided almost head-on with a Yamaha dirt bike that was traveling westbound on the same access road. The operator of the Yamaha was Cody J. Kegelman, 14. Both riders were thrown from their dirt bikes. It is believed that neither rider was able to see the other since both were at the crest of a small hill.

Kegelman was transported

to Christiana Hospital where he was pronounced dead. Schrader was also transported to the Christiana Hospital where he is being treated for serious injuries. Both operators were wearing helmets at the time of the crash.

**Police officer arrested in domestic dispute**

New Castle County Police have arrested a 13-year veteran of the force on charges related to a domestic incident.

Last Wednesday at 1:30 a.m., County Police were called to a home in the Pike Creek area. When police arrived, it was learned that the officer and a 33 year-old woman victim were involved in a domestic altercation.

The investigation revealed that the officer and the victim began arguing. The victim allegedly sustained an injury to

her hand, when she removed a steak knife from the officer's grasp. The victim's 12-year-old child was also pushed several times during the incident. The victim refused medical treatment and neither of the two children was injured during the incident.

After an investigation by county detectives and consultation with the Attorney General's Office, the officer faces assault, endangering the welfare of a child, offensive touching and reckless endangering.

He was arraigned and released on \$3,000 unsecured bond and was ordered to have no contact with the victims. The officer will be placed on paid leave for the duration of an internal investigation.

Citing family concerns, County Police asked that the name of the officer not be used, noting that similar incidents occur on an almost daily basis and don't warrant a news release. In this case, County

Police chose to issue the release, since it involved one of their officers. After reviewing past releases, The Newark Post honored that request.

**Copper pipe taken from two residences**

Newark Police are investigating a pair of home robberies, where the suspects made off with copper piping.

The first incident was reported on Monday, May 23 at a residence in the unit block of Madison Drive. The owner, a resident of Hockessin, told authorities that an unknown number of suspects had entered the house and removed copper piping, a fire alarm, and a light fixture, all worth a total value of \$570.

The owner stated that the unit has been vacant since last September, when the last tenants moved out.

A search showed that the front door was still secured,

but that the basement door was not. No signs of forced entry were evident. The owner told authorities that the only people who have the keys are himself, his wife, and their repairman, who was notified by the police.

Officers noticed that the basement ceiling had been torn out to retrieve the piping. The fire alarm was part of the basement ceiling and the light fixture was taken from a spot near the top of the basement stairs.

No physical evidence was recovered at the scene. A neighbor told police that he had seen a black pickup truck driven by an older white male with a gray beard cruising through the neighborhood over the last few months. The witness added that he never saw the truck stop, just appearing to be looking for items left out.

The second robbery occurred on Friday, May 28 at a house in the 100 block of Madison Drive, also owned by

the same person.

Tenants in the house notified the owner after they discovered that the water would not turn on. A search by the owner showed that several copper pipes had been cut out of the wall and ceiling near the washing machine in the basement. No other items were taken. The pipe is estimated to be worth \$100.

Two of the roommates in the house stated that they believe that the house was secured when they had left, but could not verify it.

A canvass by the officers revealed little, as most witnesses stated that they had not seen or heard anything. One neighbor did say that he had heard a sound like "a shovel hitting rocks" at the site, but noted that since it was still daylight at the time he heard it, he "did not think anything of it." Physical evidence was sparse and no fingerprints were lifted at the scene.

be celebrated as an opportunity to acknowledge chemistry's life-changing, world-changing potential—and to rededicate ourselves to exploiting it," Harker said.

The symposium featured talks from notable chemistry professors from universities in both the U.S. and Canada to examine the practical and

theoretical applications of Dr. Heck's work. Dr. Ei-Ichi Negishi, who shared the 2010 Nobel Prize with Dr. Heck and Dr. Akira Suzuki, was the keynote speaker.

Dr. Richard F. Heck began his professional career as a research chemist at Hercules in 1957. During his time with the company, he examined the uses of organometallics, compounds that contain both carbon and metals, and how they might

be used to connect smaller, simpler molecules into larger, more complex ones.

His breakthrough, in what would later be called the Heck Reaction, occurred when he introduced palladium into the process to attain a more efficient means of joining the compounds.

Palladium, as a catalyst in the reaction, allows most organic chemical reactions to occur at temperatures below 100 degrees Celsius, or lower than the boiling point of water. In some cases, the Heck Reaction produces compounds with up to a 98 percent yield. These two aspects make it a very desirable process for manufacturers, who are looking to control both energy and

financial costs.

Though palladium is a very expensive metal (it's related to platinum), the Heck Reaction uses very little of it to start the catalyzing effect, and it is not used up during the process.

Heck's research was published in a scientific paper in 1971, the year he left Hercules (after the company moved in a new direction on research) and accepted a position with UD. He retired as a chemistry professor from UD in 1989 and remains the Willis F. Harrington Professor Emeritus in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry at the school.

In a statement from the governing body of the Nobel Prize Foundation, Dr. Heck won the honor by finding "more

efficient ways of linking carbon atoms together to build the complex molecules that are improving our everyday lives."

The Heck Reaction is widely used in the medical, pharmaceutical, electronics, and industrial fields for its ability to produce organic compounds efficiently, quickly, and at a low temperature. Presently the process is used for hundreds of applications, including coupling fluorescent dyes to DNA strands to map out the human genome.

Locally, Dr. Heck's contributions are being used to help build better electronics at Dow Chemical's facility in Newark.

According to Peter Freeman, Newark Site Leader for Dow, the Heck Reaction allows for

the manufacturing of a resin that can bond circuits directly to a board. The manufacturing process, called wafer-level chip scale packaging, produces extremely thin circuitry, thus producing smaller and more compact computer-controlled devices, such as smart phones and laptops. The resin also protects the circuitry from heat, vibration and impact damage, and moisture.

"What's so unique [about the resin], and you use the Heck Reaction to do this, is you're making the product so much more reliable," stated Freeman, about the usefulness of Heck's process in building semiconductors.

Though Heck was initially recognized by those in the scientific community for his research, recognition was slow in the private sector as manufacturers did not adopt use of the reaction until the late 1980s and early 1990s.

In the 21st Century, the Heck Reaction has seen a veritable explosion in the number of practical applications and has been the subject of numerous research papers, publications, and articles. In 2002, one publication devoted almost 400 pages listing the uses of the Heck Reaction.

Heck admits that he has not kept up with the myriad uses his research has produced, but he continues to be intrigued by the new ways that companies are utilizing it.

# Zerhusen caps career with All-State honor

Allyson Zerhusen entered her senior soccer season having been named all-conference three straight years, second team All-State her sophomore year and third team All-State her junior season. Last week the Christiana senior's outstanding high school career was capped off when she was named to the first team All-State girls soccer team.

"Overall this season was great," Zerhusen, who scored 25 goals, said in an email. "It had its ups and downs just like anything in life, but I couldn't imagine the season going differently. Win or lose the girls on the team were awesome."

The Vikings struggled as a team, finishing 2-12, but Zerhusen said she set a per-

sonal goal at the beginning of the season to reach 100 career goals. By the end of the season Zerhusen needed every single game of her senior year to reach that personal goal.

Zerhusen took the field at Hodgson Vo-Tech for the final game of her career still needing one goal to reach 100. She wasted no time, finding the back of the net six minutes into the game to reach the century mark. She then went on to score a hat trick to finish her stellar four-year career with 102 goals.

"Every game was intense and important, but it was always a good time," said Zerhusen, who plans to play club soccer at the University of Delaware. "Reaching 100 goals was an amazing feeling."

# Smart tips to keep your summer pool time safe

With the start of the summer, everyone needs to be reminded of basic pool and water safety tips with children. If you are a homeowner who has a pool, make sure to do an annual pool safety check and remind all of your guests to be vigilant watching children at all time. This is especially important at the beginning of summer and every time you have family and friends over to celebrate special occasions.

Here are some pool safety reminders from the American Academy of Pediatrics:

Never leave children alone in or near the pool, even for a moment. Always have a designated adult assigned to monitor the water in case other adults get distracted. Teach all children the "no swimming rule" when the designated adult is not on duty.

Keep rescue equipment (a shepherd's hook - a long pole with a hook on the end - and life preserver) and a portable telephone near the pool. Choose a shepherd's hook and other rescue equipment made of fiberglass or other materials that do not conduct electricity.

Avoid inflatable swimming aids such as "floaties." They are not a substitute for approved life vests and can give children and parents a false sense of

security. Blow-up water wings, toys, rafts and air mattresses should not be used as life jackets or personal flotation.

Children ages 1 to 4 may be at a lower risk of drowning if they have had some formal swimming instruction. However, there is no evidence that swimming lessons or water survival skills courses can prevent drowning in babies

younger than 1 year of age. The decision to enroll a 1- to 4-year-old child in swimming lessons should be made by the parent and based on the child's developmental readiness, but swim programs should never be seen as "drown proofing" a child of any age.

Whenever infants or toddlers are in or around water, an adult - preferably one who knows

how to swim and perform CPR - should be within arm's length, providing "touch supervision."

Large inflatable above-ground pools have become increasingly popular for backyard use. Children may fall in if they lean against the soft side of an inflatable pool. Although such pools are often exempt from local pool fencing requirements, it is essential that they be

surrounded by an appropriate fence just as a permanent pool would be so that children cannot gain unsupervised access.

Take the time to review pool safety tips every time you use the pool and every time you invite guests over for a swim. By reminding adults and children of your pool rules, you can insure a safe swimming season for family and friends.

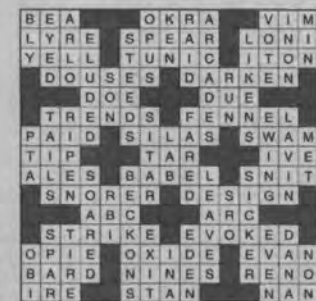

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 1976 aerial photograph of South College Avenue looking south from East Delaware Avenue that runs across the bottom of the picture. On the east (left) side of College Avenue from the bottom to top of the picture are Sharp Laboratory (on land that once was the home and shop of Dan Stowell the plumber and later the Flower Hospital), then Mitchell Hall with the round roof, and beyond that Hullahen Hall. To the west (right) of College from bottom to top is the then new Kirkbride Hall classroom and faculty office building (on land where once stood The Knoll that was the home of the University President), and Smith Hall. The overpass leading to Smith Hall was designed to relieve pedestrian congestion at the intersection of South College and Amstel Avenues. Later, Gore Hall was built at the east end of the overpass.

Helms explains that all half dollars, quarters and dimes made before 1965 contain 90% silver and are sought after any time silver prices rise. Right now it's a sellers market he said.

The rarest coins these collectors are looking for include \$20, \$10, \$5 and \$2 1/2 gold coins and any coin made before 1850. These coins always bring big premiums according to the ICCA. Silver dollars are also very sought after nowadays.

Other types of items the ICCA will be purchasing during this event include U.S. currency, gold bullion, investment gold, silver bars, silver rounds, proof sets, etc. Even foreign coins are sought after and will be purchased.

Also at this event anyone can sell their gold jewelry, dental gold or anything made of gold on the spot. Gold is currently trading at over \$1,400.00 per ounce near an all time high.
