40th anniversary for Special Olympics

All dressed in red, athletes from the Newark Lightning dashed up the aisles of the Bob Carpenter Center, their fists raised in triumph. Most had not won any medals yet — they were proud, and even more excited, to be a part of the opening ceremonies of the 2010 Summer Games — an event that marked 40 years of the Special Olympics' presence in the state.

"For 40 years, the athletes of Special Olympics Delaware have demonstrated to us, what they always knew: 'We can.' They simply needed an opportunity," wrote Jon Buzby, spokesman for Special Olympics Delaware (SODE), about the important opportunities the games offer to individuals with intellectual disabilities.

"We can" was certainly the resounding theme this past Friday and Saturday as more than 900 athletes from around the state converged on the University of Delaware campus to compete in six sports — aquatics, athletics, bocce, powerlifting, softball and tennis — over the course of the two days.

In addition to the excitement of athletic competition, participants experienced the thrill and the pomp of the opening ceremonies which included a fireworks display, a keynote address from Philadelphia Eagle Macho Harris, and the lighting of the cauldron with the 'Flame of Hope' by SODE Athlete of the Year Deborah McDaniel. Throughout the weekend, athletes also had the opportunity to spend the night with their teams in the dormitories, enjoy the activities in Olympic Village in between competitions and attend free health screenings and education sessions.

"It's absolutely fantastic and a lot of fun," said Stephen Cleary whose son Ryan, affectionately referred to as "Little King," competed with the Newark Lightning in track and field events. "All I can say is that the experience is a tremendous thing."







Zoning change aims to bring residents to city

The Newark City Council approved amending the zoning code for the Center Village area for Choate, New, Center and Linden Streets, just off Main Street. The area is a mixture of different types of housing, but faces the threat of being dominated by student housing.

The proposed rezoning would affect new construction that expands the number of units in the area, but would not affect existing properties, according to City Planning Director Roy Lopata. Lopata says he believes developers will look at the area if the zoning overlay was approved.

"The goal is for this area not to be student rentals," said Councilman Stu Markham.

The city has seen some success in attracting more non-students to areas by limiting housing density and the number of unrelated people who can reside in a home. The same standard would apply to development in Center Village.

Detached homes, apartments, townhouses and garden apartments would be allowed in the district.

Towns and cities throughout the nation have been working to set the stage for such developments as more working adults, empty nesters and retired persons look for areas where they can walk to stores, restaurants and cultural attractions.

Councilmen heard a presentation on producing solar power in the city. John Byrne, a Nobel Prizewinning professor at the University of Delaware, said in his presentation that energy costs are likely to rise rapidly as cheap sources diminish, opening the door to alternatives; such as solar and wind. When

combined with federal tax incentives to private developers of solar power, the costs of solar-generated electricity can be less than the amount the city currently pays. The city cannot capture those tax incentives under current law but could instead partner with private investors.

Byrne noted that the University and Delaware Technical and Community are expected to announce solar energy projects. Also, a solar energy site will open in Dover with power costs below the price the city pays.

price the city pays.

The clock is ticking for the city, since a federal grant program for private development of solar power is set to expire at the end of the year.

The city recently received a report that looks at the potential of various sites for the installation of solar panel.

The council also approved a plan for a handful of surveillance cameras in the city. The \$196,000 will include seven cameras along Delaware Avenue, South Chapel Street, Main Street and Cleveland Avenue, all areas with crime concerns.

Councilman David Athey said there might be some opposition members of the community fearing it will infringe on civil liberties. At the same time, use of cameras has become widespread. Cameras are also being used on the University of Delaware campus and while the systems are separate, the city and UD will be able to share footage.

Council members also discussed the large crowds and fights that broke out at the end of Newark Night. A shooting was also reported after the event.

Councilman Jerry Clifton claimed the city has been affected by the fact that the Police Department has fallen victim to budget cuts. He also cited a conversation with Newark Police Chief Paul Tiernan that indicated members of the Crips and Latin Kings gangs were present during the time of the incident.

Councilman Ezra Temko also asked that a committee that will look into improving the June celebration include more members of the overall community.

Landscaper loses equipment in robbery

The owner of Turf Pro, a landscaping business located on Sandy Drive, reported that unknown suspects had cut the fence enclosing his property and removed lawn care equipment sometime between 8 p.m on June 7 and 6 a.m. on June 8

An investigation revealed that the section was cut along

the northwest corner of the lot with a large cutting/snipping tool. This section of the fence runs next to a wooded area.

A trailer, containing a Toro commercial mower, three Stihl leaf blowers, two Echo weedwackers, and various parts for the machines, was removed from the site. The total value of all property is over \$3,200. The building and garage were undisturbed.

Tire tracks led from the area to a driveway at the business next door. No physical evidence other than the tracks was found and no video footage was recovered. Witnesses stated that they did not hear

anything unusual at the time.

 The owner of Turf Pro said that he doesn't believe he had any disgruntled or former employees that could be considered to be suspects.

Newark man shot to death

A Newark area man died of a gunshot wounds in Christiana Hospital Saturday night, following a shooting in Wilmington.

The victim of the homicide was identified as Anthony E. Bing Ir 28

At 8:40 p.m., Wilmington Police went to the 400 block

of Allen's Alley. Upon arrival officers located a 28 year-old victim who had sustained multiple gunshot wounds. The victim was transported to Christiana Hospital where he was pronounced dead at 9:18 p.m.

Preliminary information indicates the incident was an attempted robbery during a drug transaction. Detectives are currently investigating and interviewing witnesses. The only suspect information officers have at this time is three black males who were last seen fleeing on foot west-bound on W. 5th Street from Allen's Alley.

The victim's identity will be released once detectives have notified the family.

Road rage turns extremely violent

Last Thursday, police were called in to investigate a road rage assault. An Elkton woman reported that while she had been taking the Newark exit off of I-95 south she had to avoid hitting a vehicle that had swerved into traffic. When the woman stopped at the light near the Friendly's Restaurant on S. College Avenue, the driver of the offending vehicle pulled next to her and began to verbally assault her. The woman, who was driving with her grandmother, mother, aunt, and two young cousins, rolled down her window to confront the man.

When the light turned green, the man pulled his vehicle over to block the woman's car. The woman exited her car and was punched several times

in the chest by the other driver. He also used a lit cigarette to burn the woman on her nose and chest. The woman's aunt left the car in an effort to assist her, with the male feigning like he was going to hit the aunt.

The male driver was described as being in his late 40s or early 50's, approximately 6'0 tall and 180 pounds, wearing a hat, dark sunglasses, a work shirt possibly brown or tan, having a thick beard and mustache, and grayish hair. The woman chose a possible suspect from a photo array. Attempts to contact the suspect have been met with negative results. Additional witnesses are being contacted to improve the suspect's description.

City Council tables LEED ordinance

The Newark City Council Monday night tabled an ordinance to revise building codes to reflect LEED energy conservation standards. City Planning Director Roy Lopata said the standards would break new ground in energy conservation requirements for construction. Most cities and counties have made LEED standards voluntary.

One area architect questioned whether the ordinance would actually violate copyright laws of the U.S. Green Building Council. Lopata, while noting that the city has been communicating with the building group, said the copyright issue needed to be checked out.

Local architects and developers claimed the ordinance could drive up costs and increase paperwork, perhaps to the point of stopping construction in the city. It was also noted that revised international building code standards are coming. If those standards were adopted by the council, the provisions could be even tougher than those in the LEED-based code.

Lopata noted that the proposed code would allow those provisions to be rolled in when they become available.

The city standards are based on the new project adding up to a minimum number of points. One of those sources of points is landscaping and it was noted that a project on Main Street with no ability to landscape would have to come up with a nearly perfect score to meet minimum requirements.

· City staff, which came up with the LEED-based system at the request of the City Council, is expected to come back at a future meeting with possible revisions and an answer on the copyright issues.

The revised standards seem to enjoy support among City Council members. While concerns of developers and architects were not dismissed out of hand, they claimed the bigger issue is developing standards that save energy, long after the developer has completed the project

The standards would apply to larger buildings and residential developments. In the current market, the standards would apply to the bulk of new construction, Lopata said. - Doug Rainey





Ada Soles

Ada Leigh Soles, a respected civic leader and accomplished legislator, died on Monday, June 7. She was known throughout her career in public life for her commitment to ethics in government, fiscal accountability, public education and public libraries.

Ada Leigh was born May 19, 1937 in Jacksonville, FL and was the only child of A. Thomas and Dorothy Winter Wall. She graduated from Landon High School as Valedictorian of the Class of 1955, following in the footsteps of her mother, who was the

first Valedictorian of the high school.

She attended Florida State University where she majored in English and graduated Magna Cum Laude. Among the recognitions were her selection for Pi Eta Sigma, Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Beta Kappa, Alpha Lambda Delta, and Mortar Board. She was among the ten students of the Class of 1959 who were selected for the University Hall of Fame, and was chosen by vote of her classmates as the Outstanding Senior Woman of 1959.

She married James R. Soles the summer after her graduation and they lived in Tallahassee Florida. She taught at Augusta Raa Junior High School, while Jim began graduate work. They later moved to Charlottesville Virginia and she taught at Albermarle County High School. When Jim completed

his Ph.D. at the University of Virginia, they moved to College Park, Maryland, where their first daughter, Nancy Beth

In 1968 the family moved to Newark, where Jim assumed a position in the political science department at the University of Delaware and where their second daughter Catherine was born. For the next two years, Ada Leigh served as the National Visiting Director for Mortar Board, the national academic and leadership honorary, for the Middle Atlantic region.

She very quickly became involved in community affairs working with the Friends of the Newark Library and the League of Women Voters and the American Association of University Women. She served on the board of the AAUW in 1970. She served on

the Newark Board of the League of Women Voters in 1972, on the state board from 1975-1977 and as State President of the League in 1978-80. Continuing her work with libraries she served as a member of the New Castle County Library Advisory Board from 1975-80 and again from 1992-1999. She served as Chair of the Board from 1975-1977. She served as Chair of the State Library Advisory Board 1976-78. In 1991 she served as a Delaware delegate to the White

House Conference on Libraries and Information Services. Her tireless work on behalf of public libraries was recognized both in Delaware and nationally. She received a Citation from the Delaware Council on Libraries in 1984, a plaque of appreciation from the Delaware Library Association in 1991 and a Distinguished Service Citation in 1985. In 2000, the American Library Association named her to their newly established Honor Roll of Library Advocates and as one the five living

Delawareans who had contributed the most to Delaware Public Libraries during the 20th Centur

In 1980 the 23rd District Democratic Committee recruited her, as they had in 1978, to run for State Representative. This time she agreed and won the seat, the first Democrat to hold the seat in over half a century. She was elected five additional times to the seat and retired from the

But having your son or daughter shunned from an all-star team is hard to swallow - often more so for the parents than the players themselves.

As parents, we all want our kids to be the best. Ask any parents and they'll tell you if they had their way, their children best manners and excel in every sport in which they participate.

But that's just not realistic. So the sting we feel when our kids are let down in any facet of life radiates through us like no other feeling. And All-Star teams are

So what do we do as par-

The first thing is to not make a big deal about it before it is announced. The more attention we pay to it, the bigger the disappointment for us and our child should they not make it. And the child may be even more shattered than he or she would have been had we, as parents, not harped on its importance.

Secondly, if you thought your child had a chance, it means he or she probably was on the fence come selection time. Remind your child about this, and even suggest that you go support the

players are and what level of skill he or she needs in order to have a chance to make the team

Lastly, never publicly blame league politics on the All-Star selection decisions. Even if you truly believe a child was selected only because of a parent's role in the league, this sends the wrong message to your child that isn't necessary at such a young age.

All-Star selections can be the highlight of the season for a very select few. But for most players, they will have to face the reality that although they are good, they just aren't good enough. And that's OK. It's important for us parents to realize that, and it's our job as parents to make sure our kids do.

Charter schools see big funding gap

In new research on char-ter school funding inequity issued recently by Ball State University, the funding gap between Delaware's public school district students and public charter school students was among the highest of the states studied. According to the research, which reviewed public data from the 2006-2007 school year, the difference in dollars per student between district and charter school students in Delaware was \$3,600. The disparity in funding climbed to more than \$4,500 per pupil for students attending Wilmington charter schools. On average, the nation's public charter schools received \$2,247 less per pupil than traditional public schools in the same state.

"The outcome of this research is no surprise," said Edward Emmett, acting president of the Delaware Charter Schools Network. "Charter schools in Delaware have watched funding erode since the introduction of the charter school law."

Delaware charter schools receive no portion of state or local funding to offset facility costs, but also encounter reduced funding in a number of other areas. Delaware was ranked as having a "severe" disparity in the study.

"It is unfortunate to see that, of the states surveyed, Delaware is ranked as having the fifth greatest funding disparity," Emmett said.

This nationwide report reinforces the 2008 LEAD Committee Report on Education Funding in Delaware that called for greater funding equity for Delaware's charter schools.

The Ball State University report, which is based on the most recent year for which reliable data is available, is a follow-up to an earlier report issued in 2005 by the Thomas B. Fordham Institute, and is entitled "Charter School Funding: Inequity Persists."

"When we speak of equi-ty in education for our public school students, we must begin discussing this disheartening disparity," said Susan Harris, director of the Delaware Charter Schools Network, a non-profit organization that serves as the unified voice for charter schools in Delaware. "Every charter school begins its first day trying to address this gap and continues daily to try to meet the growing expectations of charter schools with less and less funding to do so."

OUT OF THE ATTIC

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 1951 Lloyd Teitsworth photograph of Purnell Hall on the original Delaware College tract on the north side of East Main Street near South College Avenue. The ivy clad house then and since has been the University Alumni-Alumnae office. At the time of this picture it also housed the Business Guidance and Placement Bureau. Originally built as the home of a branch of the Evans family, the house has served as a Kappa Alpha fraternity house, a YMCA center, a library, and as an office building for the UD History and English departments. It is named for a former Delaware College (University of Delaware) president.







ing beats that feeling you get while waiting patiently for the first blooms of spring. Maybe you garden for the fresh air or the way the soil feels between your fingers. You like to sit on your back porch with a cool glass of iced tea and watch the hummingbirds drink from the native perennials you just planted. And, maybe gardening is your only escape - transporting you to another place and time after a long, hard day at work. Regardless of the reason you choose to continue "fighting the fight," keep in mind your local Cooperative Extension office is here to help - you never have to garden alone.

Call our garden line ((302) 831-8862) any time and leave a message with your gardening question. In just a day or two, a Master Gardener

will return your call, with an answer to your question. Utilize our plant and insect specimen "drop-off station" to leave plant and insect samples that need a diagnosis. For instance, do you have plants in your garden that you can't identify? Our office will help you to identify plants with ornamental value and also weeds. And, if-you suspect your plants are plagued by insects, or afflicted by a disease, leave us a representative sample of the problem and we'll help you to diagnose, and treat, the issue. Additionally, we offer a spring and fall home gardener works shop series. Consider signing up for a workshop to learn about a new, interesting, and/ or favorite gardening topic such as pruning, native plants, vegetable gardening, composting, and specialty topics like container gardening and propagating plants. Although

our spring workshop season is winding down, we've planned a tour of the native teaching garden on the evening of Wednesday, July 21st. And, in late summer on Saturday, August 28th, you're invited to attend a tomato tasting in the vegetable garden. Both events are free and open to the public, but require registration by contacting our office. Finally, stop in and visit us. Our Cooperative Extension office in Newark, on the University of Delaware campus, boasts several demonstration gardens, a native plant garden, a compost site, and a vegetable garden, complete with conventional and raised bed gardening examples.
