

EASTER SEAL SALE NETS 6 MILLION

Fund To Aid Handicapped Of Nation

Nearly \$6,000,000 was contributed through the 1949 Easter Seal campaign for service to the nation's handicapped, according to Gerald M. Ungaro, of Chicago, treasurer of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

Ungaro said that on the basis of returns received to date, the 1949 drive would result in about a one-half million dollar increase over 1948 returns.

The 1949 Easter Seal campaign was conducted by member societies throughout the 48 states, the District of Columbia, Hawaii and Alaska. Ungaro pointed out that practically the entire amount was raised through a direct mail campaign with no personal pressure to contribute being placed on the recipient of Easter Seals.

"The increase in the 1949 campaign illustrates that the American people endorse free voluntary giving to causes in which they believe, where they can give as much or as little as they please," Ungaro said. "The additional funds will make possible an expansion of the three-point program of direct services to the handicapped, education and research which guides the National Society and its more than 2,000 affiliated State and local units."

Among the services the National Society and its member units provide for the nation's handicapped are, cerebral palsy services and clinics, consultation and organizational services to cerebral palsy parent groups, consultation in speech, occupational and physical therapy and other fields, employment services for the handicapped and a host of other activities, supported almost entirely by Easter Seal contributions. More than 90 per cent of the funds raised annually remain in the state in which they are contributed.

Proper Washing Give Sheets Longer Life

Sheets properly laundered and carefully hung to dry will last longer, says M. Katharine Jones, home demonstration agent. If sheets are ripped or torn they should be mended before laundering because small tears may become larger. Stains from medicine or cosmetics should be removed before washing, as many otherwise removable stains are set by laundering.

Sheets may be washed alone or with other white clothes. Light-colored clothes can be washed along with the sheets if the colors are fast to washing.

Hot water and plenty of soap suds are of first importance to laundering sheets. Thorough rinsing in hot, clear water is also important. Cold water hardens the soap and makes it more difficult to remove. Soap and washing powders weaken and yellow the sheets when allowed to remain on them indefinitely. Some homemakers like to use their washing machines for the first rinse at least. In an automatic washing machine the sheets are washed and rinsed and are ready to hang when the machine stops.

If a bleach is used, the manufacturer's directions should be followed carefully. Then the sheets should be rinsed at least twice after the bleach is used.

Clothes lines should be cleaned before the sheets are hung to dry. The white sheets may be hung in the sun but the colored ones are hung in the shade or in the house.

The way the sheets are hung to dry is also important. They are folded evenly from hem to hem, edges are straightened and hung with twelve inches of double thickness over the line. Three or four clothes pins hold them securely.

When the sheets are removed from the line they are folded again in the same direction, and they are ready to be ironed. Folded in this way, they will be easy to iron, first on one side and then on the other.

Retail Dept. Store Sales Show Decline

Department store sales during the week ended Aug. 6 dropped 13 per cent below the comparable week last year, making the Aug. 6 week's showing the poorest in months.

The Federal Reserve Board, reporting this recently, said that this year was only five per cent under 1948 for the entire period between Jan. 1 and Aug. 6.

The slack showing in early August as in July was attributed in part to the fact that the comparative period last year constituted the all-time high in department store sales, one allowance is made for seasonal factors. The heat also was blamed in part.

Another explanation was that prices have gone down since this time last year, and this decline is reflected in the board data since the relative showing of sales are gauged to the dollar volume of a department store turnover.

Dorsey's Orchestra To Play At Reading Fair, September 11

U. S. Air Force Band Will Also Highlight Grandstand Stage Shows

Some of the topflight entertainment attractions in the land will be presented at the eight-day Reading Fair which opens Sunday, September 11.

John S. Giles, fair president, reported this week that two world renowned musical organizations—Jimmy Dorsey and his orchestra, and the U. S. Air Force Band—will headline the grandstand stage shows on opening Sunday and Monday nights.

The U. S. Air Force Band, under the direction of Lieut. Col. George S. Howard, of nearby Reamstown, also is held in high regard in music circles throughout the nation. The band will play engagements at Miami, Fla.; Toronto, Can., and Cortland, N. Y., before appearing here.

As in past years, a radio broadcast over a national radio network will be made by the band during its stay at the fair. The broadcast is scheduled from 3:30 to 4 p. m., on opening Sunday.

In addition to the two bands, a series of supporting attractions are scheduled on Monday night. They include the semi-finals of the "Miss Reading Fair" beauty contest, a Schuylkill County talent parade, and Roxettes stage show. Special added attractions also are being booked for opening Sunday night.

Reservist Training At All-Time Peak

Navy's Summer Program Involved Nearly 100,000 Civilian Inactives

The training of Naval Reservists in all phases of Naval warfare will reach an all-time peak this summer, with nearly 100,000 civilian reservists reporting for active duty at sea, and at air stations and shore establishments throughout the country.

During the summer months, approximately 50,000 Reservists are filling sea-going billets aboard aircraft carriers, cruisers, destroyers, submarines and smaller vessels of the fleet.

Another 20,000 Reserve airmen are reporting to Naval air stations and designed aircraft carriers for refresher flight training and carrier requalification tests.

The additional 30,000 are received ashore training at Naval schools and bases, including the training of "activation" teams aboard vessels of the Navy's mothball fleet.

The salt-water phase of the training program will hit its peak in July when a majority of the 50,000 sea-going Reservists go aboard 71 warships of the fleet for two-week training cruises. The ships are sailing from East, Gulf and West Coast ports, with a number scheduled to visit ports in overseas areas, including the Canal Zone, Caribbean, Hawaii and Alaska.

Fed Trees Are Better Able To Endure Drought

Fed trees can withstand drought conditions better than unfertilized ones. This is a matter of scientific record, proved in experiments by Davey tree experts. Yet many people still cling to the discredited belief that it is more difficult for fertilized trees to support the extra leaves that feeding provides.

No less an authority than Martin L. Davey, Jr., reports that stimulated root growth in fertilized trees more than compensates for the lush foliage. Feeding makes for more efficient root systems and these, in turn, do a better

job of extracting nourishment and all available moisture from the soil.

Davey researchers have found that when blistering heat sweeps the countryside for a sustained period, annually fed trees are likely to come through unscathed while unfertilized neighbors decline or succumb to the adverse conditions. It also has been found they're more likely to maintain luxuriant green foliage.

Feeding is no substitute for watering or rain, but it does reduce the tree's water requirements. A plant in enriched soil is able to produce a pound of dry matter using less water than in poor soil.

How effective fertilizing with a special tree food high in nitrogen content actually is, can be shown in the case history of a group of trees fed for three consecutive years. Following a scorching, rainless period of two months, they continued to display their rich green mantles, while many unfed trees nearby were damaged or even killed.

Queries On Social Security Answered

Address all Queries to Social Security Administration, Customs House, 6th & King Sts., Wilmington, Delaware.

Q. I am 62 and expect to marry in a short time. Will my wife be able to collect a wife's insurance benefit when I retire?

A. Under amendments to the Social Security Act of August 10, 1946, a wife who files application for wife's benefits after January 1, 1947, will be entitled to those benefits provided she and the wage earner have been married for at least 36 months prior to the month in which she files her application.

Q. When are Old-Age and Survivors' Insurance benefits paid?

A. Retirement benefits are payable to the insured and his family when the worker retires at 65 or later. Survivors' benefits are payable to the insured wage earner's family when the worker dies, no matter at what age this occurs.

Q. Is my employer notified when I reach age 65?

A. We do not notify employer when you reach the age of 65. All information given by you to the Social Security Administration is held in the strictest confidence. If you are 65 or over, to protect your interest you should file your application even though you continue to work.

Sea Elephant On Rebound In California

The sea elephant, long believed nearly extinct, soon may roam the southern California coast in huge herds again, a Los Angeles zoologist believes.

The spectacular animal sometimes reached 20 feet in length and weighs several tons. Its name is derived from an elephant-like snout.

Veterans' Forum

Q—My son, a veteran of peacetime service, is drawing compensation for a service-connected disability due to spinal cord injury which has paralyzed his legs. Is he entitled to Federal aid to acquire a specially designed home for wheelchair living?

A—A veteran of war or peacetime service with a permanent total disability due to service-connected spinal cord injury such as you mention may qualify for Federal aid to acquire a home.

Q—My father was dependent on my brother who passed away while hospitalized by Veterans Administration. Is my father entitled to death compensation?

A—You father may qualify for compensation if your brother's death was due to service. Compensation for a parent is \$48.00 per month.

Q—I am receiving \$13.80 compensation every month for a service-connected disability. If I become permanently and totally disabled for causes not due to service, will I be entitled to compensation for non-service-connected disability?

A—Yes. Payment will be made to you under the benefit providing the higher amount, if you are otherwise eligible.
