Dear Dunn:

I am not writing to the Secretary this week as there is nothing of major importance to write about and Rogers has written a very good review of the position in his internal and external summary which goes forward by this mail.

I am still planning to sail on the MANHATTAN on April 7, leaving Vienna April 3, and I really feel the need of a little rest. Mr. Phillips from Rome has been here for four days and is returning to Rome tonight. I need not tell you what a pleasure it has been to us to have him here with us in the house, and how helpful it has been to talk over so many things in connection with the Austrian and the Italian positions, which are so bound up with each other. It has been a real pleasure to have him here.
