 hope you can get a draft of his report to
 me at Rio. The steamer arrives there March
 6 & leaves March 7. If you can get it there
 perhaps you can get it to Trinidad by air
 mail if the Messrs Mac Cormack speak
 there.

Write me separate note by this mail
about our papers - 90 days - etc. I hope
they can be picked up so I can remain
tranquilly in U.S. until April 1 or 2 as I
don't want to make another trip with
baggage. I have some things I
must do in Wash. Washington I must
but when everything is in order about our
papers - I'm not going to take any
chances. I'm too old a bird for that & I
know promises don't count. I'd rather
go immediately for Steamer to
Mexico City & make another trip
with baggage - than take any
chances.

These are our last days. Process is
 coming in for the evening, & has just come
 in as a matter of fact - and we have
 a long evening ahead of us.

Thanks for the news of your father.
 I suppose he is married - that is why so
 many doctors. I will try to be a good
 doctor when I arrive - and see if we
 can't get rid of the pest of them!
