## Construction begins on Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail



The City of Newark announces that construction of the Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail began on Wednesday, August 31. Newark's City Council recently awarded the contract to construct the Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail to Merit Construction Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$2.15 million. Construction is expected to be completed in 2012. Funding for the project was provided to Newark through the Federal Highway

Administration's SAFETEA-LU Program administered by the State of Delaware's Department of Transportation. Merit also constructed the James F. Hall Trail which opened in 2003.

The two-mile long Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail will connect to the James F. Hall Trail (a National Recreation Trail) just south of Wyoming Road and continue north, following the old rail line into the White Clay Creek

State Park. The trail will feature an 8' wide hard surface, lights for 24-hour use, emergency call boxes, bike racks, benches, information kiosks and maps as well as direct access to the DART Transit Hub, Main Street, Newark Shopping Center, a vast network of trails at the White Clay Creek State Park, the University of Delaware's Laird Campus and other points of interest and destinations.

### Newark man arrested after evading police

On Tuesday, September 6, Delaware State Police apprehended William Sells, 29, of Newark, who was wanted in connection with two robberies committed in August. Sells had barricaded himself in the Shamrock Motel, located in the 2100 block of Dupont Highway, just outside of Dover. Police breached the room and found Sells hiding in the bathroom.

Sells was one of two suspects wanted in robberies committed at the Royal Farms store at 6538 Halltown Road, Hartly, on August 19, and the First Bank of Wyoming, located at 105 Irish Hill Road, Felton, on August 26.

The other suspect, Russell Grimes, 40, of Wilmington, was apprehended on August 26 after the vehicle he and Sells were

using to evade a police pursuit, a black SUV with a NJ registration, crashed into a ditch in the 500 block of Steele's Ridge Road in Camden-Wyoming, DE. The suspects then fled from the vehicle on foot with the officers chasing them. At one point during the foot pursuit, a Delaware State Trooper discharged a round from his divisional issued weapon striking Grimes in the lower portion of his body. He was transported by EMS to the Kent General Hospital where he was treated and released for his injury. He was subsequently arrested and charged for his part in the incident.

Sells eluded capture after a four-hour search was performed by law officials.

Grimes was arraigned at JP Court 3 and committed to the James Vaughn Correctional Institution for lack of \$94,000 cash bail. No information was available on Sells' arraignment.

### Juvenile arrested for hate crime

New Castle County Police Detectives have arrested a 16 year-old male and charged him with a hate crime and related offenses.

On Monday, September 5, at 12:11 p.m., County Police responded to the unit block of

Delrose Court in the community of Delaplane Manor for the report of a hate crime. The 58 year-old male victim indicated that he observed a cross made of PVC pipe planted in his yard. The cross had racial slurs and the words "burn in hell" written across it.

Officers and detectives extensively canvassed the area and conducted interviews. The Chief Investigating Officer reviewed all the information gathered as a result of the neighborhood canvass and conducted numerous follow-up interviews. He was able to link a local juvenile suspect to the hate crime. On Tuesday, September 6, as a result of the investigation, a 16 year-old male who resides in the unit block of Delaplane Avenue in Delaplane Manor was positively identified as the suspect.

Police contacted the juvenile's father who was cooperative with the investigation. Detectives conducted a search of the teen's residence and located PVC pipe and tape that were used to construct the cross. Evidence collected from the cross was also linked to the juvenile.

The 16 year-old juvenile, was charged with harassment and hate crime (felony). His arraignment is pending.

The investigation is continuing to determine if others were involved.

### Newark Police arrest four on graffiti charges

Ongoing graffiti investigations by the Newark Police Department Street Crimes Unit have led to the identification and arrest of four graffiti vandals:

A 17 year-old juvenile (graffiti vandal tagging BALAD), from Bear, has been arrested by the Newark Police Department for two counts of Graffiti, two counts of Possession of Graffiti Implements, two counts of Trespassing, and two counts of Conspiracy. Additionally, the 17 year-old juvenile was charged with Manufacture of a Nonnarcotic Schedule I Controlled Substance (Marijuana), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Possession of Marijuana.

Locations vandalized by the 17 year-old juvenile include: Unit block of Scholar Drive and 200 Block of E. Main Street Newark. The damage caused by the 17 year-old juvenile is estimated to be \$900.

The 17 year-old juvenile was arrested by Newark PD on August 16 and was released on

\$2,000 unsecured bail pending a hearing in the State of Delaware Family Court.

A 15 year-old juvenile (graffiti vandal tagging REPO), from Newark, has been arrested by the Newark Police Department for one count of Graffiti, one count of Possession of Graffiti Implements, one count of Trespassing, and one count of Conspiracy.

Locations vandalized by the 15 year-old juvenile include: 200 Block of E. Main Street.

The damage caused by the 15 year-old juvenile is estimated to be \$100.

The 15 year-old juvenile was arrested by Newark PD on August 17 and was released on \$2,000 unsecured bail pending a hearing in the State of Delaware Family Court.

Rocco Bradley, 19, (graffiti vandal tagging TWERP), of Newark, has been arrested by the Newark Police Department for one count of Graffiti and one count of Possession of Graffiti Implements.

Locations vandalized by Bradley include: Unit Block of E. Main Street. The damage caused by Bradley is estimated to be \$50.

Bradley was arrested by Newark PD on August 25 and was released on \$1,000 unsecured bail pending a hearing in the State of Delaware Justice of the Peace Court.

Zachary Hedinger, 19, (graffiti vandal tagging BEOND and RUGED), of Bear, has been arrested by the Newark Police Department for eight counts of Graffiti, eight counts of Possession of Graffiti Implements, and three counts

of Trespassing. Additionally, Hedinger was charged with Possession With Intent To Deliver A Nonnarcotic Schedule I Controlled Substance (Marijuana), Maintaining a Dwelling for Keeping Controlled Substances, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Possession of Marijuana.

Locations vandalized by Hedinger include: Unit Block of Madison Drive, 400 Block of New London Road, Unit Block of Country Club Drive, and 1000 Block of S. College Avenue. The damage caused by Hedinger is estimated to be \$650.

Hedinger was arrested by Newark PD on August 25 and was released on \$14,500 unsecured bail pending a hearing in the State of Delaware Court of Common Pleas.

### Troopers probe gas station robbery

The Delaware State Police are currently investigating the robbery of a Newark area fuel station that occurred late night on Thursday, September 1.

The incident happened at approximately 10:00 p.m., as two male suspects entered the Shore Stop located in the 700 block of Old Baltimore Pike in Newark. The suspects placed several items that they had removed from display on the sales counter and as the 23 year-old male clerk began to ring the items up, one of the suspects displayed a black handgun and ordered the clerk to open the register. After the clerk complied, the suspects removed an undisclosed amount of cash from the register. They then fled from the store and were last seen running toward Old Baltimore Pike. The clerk was not injured.

Suspect #1 is a black male, 18-23 years of age, 5'10"-6'00" tall, 110-120 lbs. He was last seen wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt with a skull and crossbones design and gold lettering, and blue jeans. He was also armed with a handgun.

Suspect #2 is also a black male, 17-23 years of age, 5'10"-6'00" tall, 110-120 lbs. He was last seen wearing a white American Eagle hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans, and aviator style sunglasses.

## Christina schools named "Partnership Zone"

Two schools in the Christina School District, Bancroft Elementary School and Bayard Middle School, were named Partnership Zone schools by the Delaware Department of Education on September 1. The District currently has two additional Partnership Zone schools that were named in 2010, Stubbs Elementary School and Glasgow High School.

The District will now need to engage the Bancroft and Bayard communities and develop a reform plan for each school. Christina will have three months to gather feedback and develop the plans. These plans must propose one of four reform models for each school. The model that is chosen will depend on many factors, including community input. Christina administration

and Board of Education will work closely with the Christina Education Association (CEA) and the Delaware Department of Education to review options.

"As the largest district in the state, we anticipated that additional Christina schools might be named to the Partnership Zone this year," said Christina Superintendent Dr. Marcia V. Lyles. "The announcement of two additional Partnership Zone schools will allow us to build on what we have learned through the experience of successfully planning for and implementing new, innovative programs at Stubbs Elementary and Glasgow High School. Although the planning process was a challenging one, we feel Christina is well-positioned to again be successful in creating effective plans for these two schools that will bring about improved achievement for all students. The concentration of additional resources in these targeted schools will enable Christina to create an "Excellence Zone" for student achievement."

## Student goals are focus of "Expect Excellence"

Now in its third year, the Christina School District's Expect Excellence Campaign again hopes to send the message that everyone in the community plays a role in student success. The more than 17,000 students in the Christina School District will be asked to list three goals they have for the year, part of a year-long campaign focusing on academic success. Teachers, parents, and community members will also be encouraged to support the students' goals, as well modeling their own commitment to personal achievement.

Last year, 5,500 students completed an Excellence Pledge at the beginning of the school year, and 11 out of 28 schools had a participation rate of 90 percent or more. Parents, teachers, administrators, and staff mem-

bers were also involved in the Excellence Pledge campaign.

This year, students will be asked to complete an Excellence Pledge stating "I pledge to work hard in school throughout the year, and to strive for excellence in academics, citizenship, and behavior every day." The pledge then provides space to list three goals students set for themselves to achieve in the coming school year. Teachers will help students with the goal-setting process. Similar to past years, students will be encouraged to display their pledges in their class-

room or school. Two years ago, Newark High School students completely covered the school's main entrance hall with signed pledges, and other schools have spelled out motivational words in huge letters using the pledges, or have adorned classroom entrances and hallways with them.

"The Expect Excellence concept is simple," said Christina Superintendent Dr. Marcia Lyles. "For children to succeed, they must believe that adults in their schools and communities have high expectations for them from the very first day they start

back to school in the fall. This year's goal-setting theme helps us focus on supporting students as they achieve the goals they have set for themselves, and we are excited to explore community partnerships to support this effort."

# Simpson looks to seniors to lead Newark High

Newark High football coach Butch Simpson is wearing the whistle as a head coach for the 35th year. He's won 258 games and nine state championships. He's watched countless Yellowjackets go on to play at college programs all over the country and a few to NFL teams.

He retired as dean of students at Newark following the 2009-10 school year, and from his baseball coaching position after last season. Now, he says, "I'm a full-time football coach."

And he's as excited as ever about the 2011 season.

"I don't think any of that has changed," said Simpson, 63, during a recent interview inside the Newark locker room. "If it did I'd have to step back and ask myself if this was something I should continue to do. It still gives me satisfaction and makes the heart pound. I just feel like it's still part of my life."

The 2011 edition of Newark football is the final chapter of a book that began two years ago when the star players on this senior-laden team were just sophomores.

"This class has had to play, ready or not, since they were sophomores," Simpson said. "And hopefully we are

going to reap all the benefits of what has transpired."

This group of 27 seniors has impressed the Newark coaching staff and school alike, and not just between the white lines on game day.

"What I'm most proud of with this senior class is what they bring to us across the board," Simpson said like a proud father. "From the beginning this is a group of players who have been good students and good citizens. They represent our program with class and dignity. They've always been a group that has done the right things in school and socially and in the community."

Senior quarterback Taylor Reynolds is the unquestionable leader of this team. The 6-foot-1, 179-pounder will lead an offense that averaged over 36 points per game last season. The athletic quarterback is always a threat to run, but also possesses a rocket for an arm. A first team All-State selection last year, Reynolds ran for 758 yards and scored 11 touchdowns, while also passing for 2,380 yards and 23 TDs.

"He threw a lot of footballs over the summer and went to a lot of camps," Simpson said of Reynolds, who has received several scholarship offers, including from Delaware. "I've always felt he had an arm that was a 'scholarship arm,' even before this year. And it looks a little stronger."

Reynolds' two main targets are

seniors Xavier Griffin and David Grinnage, who each have made verbal commitments to accept football scholarship offers from North Carolina State.

"They've come into their own as mature competitors in terms of their preparation, confidence, and how they go about their business," Simpson said of the receiving duo. "They've become very serious seniors."

Simpson added that he couldn't be

happier about the approach taken by all three of the highly-publicized seniors, who despite knowing they've received scholarship offers, have stepped up to lead an experienced team.

"I couldn't be happier because I've heard the nightmares about kids who got their scholarships already and just go through the motions," Simpson said. "The three of them have come back in with the leadership qualities I would have wanted and are setting the tone you would want your best players to set."

With the offense solidified, the question remains whether or not Newark can keep other teams out of the end zone. Simpson says it's on the defensive side of the ball — Newark gave up 24.5 points per game in 2010 — where the uncertainty lies.

"Our defense is something we are trying awful hard to get right," Simpson said. "We didn't play with any confidence early last year, but we finished on a high note winning four in a row by playing good defense. And we need that system and that confidence to carry over."

The defense is led by senior linebackers Lionel Brown, who led the team with 58 tackles, and Brandon Ciarlo (52 tackles). Senior Adam Economos (42 tackles) will play defense and also see action at wide receiver, as will senior Ed Davis, a

transfer from Glasgow.

Newark's kicking game is as solid as ever with senior Mike Powers returning to handle kickoff, extra point and field goal duties. Simpson compared him to former Yellowjacket and current Army kicker Alex Carlton, whose record Powers broke as a sophomore when he kicked a 49-yard field goal.

"He's a great weapon to add to what this offense can accomplish," the coach said.

Newark opens its season at Caesar Rodney on Sept. 9 against a Rider team that returns just four starters. Despite that fact, Simpson said his team will take nothing for granted.

"In a program like Caesar Rodney, which has an outstanding coaching staff, just won a state championship a couple years ago, and was in the playoffs last year," Simpson said, "there's going to be players, there's going to be speed, and they're going to be in great shape."

When asked to sum up this year's team heading into the season, the normally verbose Simpson managed to do so rather simply.

"We feel like we can compete. And there's no better feeling than to just feel comfortable you can compete."

### Traffic stop yields drug arrest

# Lifting of yard waste ban extended thru Sept. 10

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control has extended the lifting of a statewide yard waste ban through Saturday, Sept. 10 to help Delawareans cleaning up from Hurricane Irene who are finding it difficult to dispose of downed trees and fallen limbs. DNREC will also consider, on a case-by-case basis, applications for burning yard waste associated with the hurricane until October 1, when the annual statewide open burning ban expires.

Approvals for burning will be based on a review of exceptional circumstances and hardships faced by landowners in disposing of their yard waste. Burn approvals will be prioritized and allowed in a manner that minimizes air quality impacts.

Delawareans are still encouraged to keep their yard waste separated from household trash and to take it to a Delaware Solid Waste Authority facility, yard waste drop-off site, or to a private company that accepts

yard waste in order to preserve land fill space and to provide valuable material to the mulch and composting industries.

However, as a vigorous effort continues to clean up the state from Hurricane Irene, residents should be aware that they may put yard waste in with their household trash for disposal until Sept. 10. (Please note that residents who live in municipalities that already have a separate yard waste collection program should continue to use that service rather than

put their storm debris in with their household trash. Also, DNREC's yard waste drop-off sites in New Castle County; the Polly Hill Drummond site and DART Mid-County site, will continue to operate on regular schedules, and will be open Labor Day.)

# Jake's Burgers gets new look

The existing Newark location, on Ogletown Road, already has some of the new signage and is expected to begin renovations within a month. Renovations will include painting the walls red, replacing existing tables with steel ones and installing a milkshake bar with stools.

"You can go into Jake's and grab that juicy burger that's fresh, not frozen, and drink a milkshake out of a tin cup," Maffeo said.

One reason for the name change is that there are other

types of businesses named Jake's, and switching to a more specific name makes it easier to expand to other states without running into trademark issues, company officials said.

The name change occurred last year, but the renovations are being rolled out slowly to avoid bewildering customers, Maffeo said.

The food will not change, though the company did switch to a new, fluffier hamburger roll a few months ago. However, some other locations are testing new ideas, such as more dessert items, a breakfast sandwich and serving beer.

The Ogletown Road loca-

tion was the first Jake's to open in 1991. Since then, the company has slowly expanded and now, as the chain marks its 20th anniversary, it has 33 restaurants in seven states.

Recently, the company launched an aggressive expansion plan, aiming for 100 new restaurants each year. It should have 70 by the end of this year.

One of the new stores will be on Elkton Road, near the Newark Municipal Building, Maffeo said. The restaurant, which will be targeted toward the University of Delaware community, is still in the permitting stage and does not yet have an opening date.

# Vice President to make public appearance at UD

## OUT OF THE ATTIC

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 1968 picture of the Newark Department Store then located in the Newark Shopping Center in the 200 block of East Main Street.

The picture appeared in the Indexed Map of Newark, Delaware published by the Greater Newark Chamber of Commerce. The store moved to the Newly built shopping center in 1955 from its long-time location at 56-58 East Main Street in the heart of the downtown commercial area. The store for well over a half-century at both locations, was the destination for shoppers from the Greater Newark Area for quality goods that were especially "just right" for gift giving as well as personal use. Just ask any oldtimer. The downstairs of the Shopping Center store was a treasure trove of specialty items and also housed a Community Room available to all groups for meetings and activities. The store was the local outlet for Boy Scout and Girl Scout uniforms, program materials, and camping gear. The Handloff family owners kept their small town store up to date with the



big city department stores. Even the payment transactions were handled via a pneumatic tube system like those in New York, Philadelphia, and elsewhere. The sales clerk would insert the sales slip and money into a canister that was shot on a carpet of air to a cashier upstairs. Shortly, with a hiss of air and a thump on the counter, the canister was back with the customer's receipt and change. A Newark Department Store canister is on display at the Newark History Museum.

Visit the Newark History Museum located at the historic 1877 passenger train station on South College Avenue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks.

The museum will be open Sunday afternoons from 2 to 5 p.m. through November.






