This resolution appears to address two situations which have developed with the new route designation made by the State Division of Highways in connection with the major highway improvement work being done on former Interstate Highway 95. First, the Resolution directs that the Division, rather than

rerouting traffic around the construction, advise motorists that the Highway may still be used.

certainly sympathetic to tourists and commercial interests in the area who wish to assure that their businesses and attractions are readily accessible by highway. And I note that the route designations do in fact advise motorists that former I-95 provides access to Exits 6 - 9 and Routes 52 and 202, and additional signs are to be installed directing traffic to hotels, motels, museums and other attractions. I believe, however, that it is crucial for the safety of motorists that traffic through the construction area be reduced as much as possible. Since the passage of the resolution, it has become necessary to restrict traffic on part of the highway to a As there are, in this particular stretch, no single lane. other lanes or shoulders for motorists to pull into, accident or even a disabled vehicle could create interminable traffic backups and greatly complicate tow trucks or ambulances reaching the site. Also, of course, the more traffic, the more difficulty for construction vehicles and supplies to reach the site. In short, I believe the less traffic on this particular highway during the construction work, the better for the public as a whole.

Secondly, the Resolution appears to direct the Division of Highways to continue to use "I-95" markers on former Interstate Highway 95. However, the change in the designation of this highway had long been planned, in conjunction with the development of the federal interstate highway system. Although undoubtedly the change from the accustomed marking will create some confusion at first, the situation should be mitigated by the installation of the additional markers and signs by the Division.

Accordingly, I am returning SJR 13 without my signature.

The result is that it is possible today for all members of the General Assembly to know what grants are incoming from Washington, how they are used and what policies should be adopted for their continuance. Isaacs, the Joint Legislative Committee on Finance (Budget Committee for short) has broken away entirely from the old rules of silence and misdirection and, with Sen.
