

Dear Dannie:

I mailed you a letter this morning dated May 19 in reply to your letter of May 16 and after sending it on it seemed to me just too ridiculous that you should not yet have word about your permit to enter Germany and I sent a letter to Major General Hilldring by this mail today, and I hope that he will do something about it. He is certainly the person who can do something about it if he wants to, and he certainly should do it. I hope you do not mind my having written, but it just seems so ridiculous that an American businessman who has every reason to go to Berlin should have difficulties when, I am sure, all sorts of persons who haven't anything like such real business are able to go.
