

Growing Pains Aren't New

Twenty-five years ago the residents of Newark were faced with pretty uch the same municipal problems that confront the city today.

In the March 2, 1927, issue of The Newark Post it was reported that ree bills had been submitted to the Legislature calling for the extension the town limits, the building of sewer, water, and electric lines within the extended limits, and permission to borrow \$100,000 to finance these classifications.

Johnson, then pr of The Poxt, agreed with the intent of the bills but "deplored the fact the residents of π fown feel it in their power to include the resident of the jurisdiction of the town, without the formality of first publishing the facts of the case, and calling a town meeting, where the

ray be open discussion of the matter."

Things have changed in Newark since 1927. The people of Newark, under the provisions of the new city charter, have the right to approve or disapprove the annexation of any additional area into the city limits by means of a referendum. It is also necessary now that a majority of the residents of the area to be annexed vote in favor of coming into the city. With regards to the borrowing of money to finance new utility facilities, the property owners of the city must approve of the expenditure and the method of financing, through a referendum.

Such a referendum is scheduled to take place here in the near future. Under the provisions of the city charler, City Council must motify the city property owners of the amount of money to be borrowed, the purpose for which it is needed, the manner of securing the money, and set a date for a pulse hearing at which time all persons of interest shall be given an opportunity to express their views.

Following that, the Council shall set a date for a special election at which time all properly owners shall be entitled to one vote, and each corporation wining property in the city shall be entitled to one vote. A majority of those onling at such a referendum will decide whether or not the bonds shall be


