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Dear Family - I am trying to write you before I go down town to the Company. We enjoyed and appreciated your letter of the 3 March and hardly know that all is well with you & the family. Am so happy that your mother is over the effects of the operation and that your Father is well and occupied. Marion & I think of you all so often and miss seeing you.

I speak with my doctor yesterday & he thinks I should be able to go work in May or June. The urinary & intestinal infection seem to be clearing up and the Walks fever seems to be better but as you know it may take months more to clear it up. I have to take these shots but the doctor says he can arrange for me to take them while I

over away. I have no desire to travel far  
the present, but a change will do Maria &  
me a lot of good. Maria is well, but naturally

I keep her worried. The damned fever comes on  
every day regularly as a clock usually in the  
afternoon, but at times it lasts all day. To my  
mind it is apparently getting better.

We are continuing to feel good but the year is  
not going to be as good as last. The new  
tendencies that have developed here in the  
last few years, less considerate treatment of  
business and more & more government in  
business, and intervening in business, naturally  
disturb the nation and even more the foreign  
investor.

Our labor control bill has been 15<sup>th</sup> and  
the matter is now in the Labor Bill, and  
if a settlement is not reached by April 1<sup>st</sup>

the Syndicale will order a strike. The head of  
the Syndicale was a Communist, and I think still  
is a Communist, so he's a problem not only for the  
Company but for the government. How it will turn  
out I do not know - but you know the  
Company is always scared.<sup>1</sup> The so called  
election is on July 6 but the real policies of  
the new administration will not be clear for  
a year. Most people are very optimistic,  
but I keep my fingers crossed.

The weather here now is good and we are  
having really warm days. I hope we will  
have a good rainy season - quite possible?  
If not, in spite of the Lechera addition  
coming by April 1, we shall have trouble  
meeting demand. The Lechera section will

be completed at least three months before time. The Tinguamalco plant of the Federal Power Commission was almost 3 years late in coming in.

The recession at home is real, no matter what polite and nice words are used to describe it. The government spending will help to make things easier, but it's no real cure. We are geared a little too high & I hope the Readjustment will not be too serious. The repercussions of our problems will of course be felt here as Mex. is, and everywhere, but the economy here has broadened so much, that the recession in Mex. is not as bad as in past similar periods.

The Republicans as a whole hasn't done

to live at home. Dulles, Benson, and Bill  
Martin have really done a good job and  
have courage & wisdom. I know you don't agree  
about Dulles, but we could not have done better  
in that field than with Dulles. It is everybody's  
whipping boy, but sticks to his job. The President  
is not a bad man, and that takes a lot out  
of any man. It is a great suspense but we are  
all human. Their confidence in me is, but  
in the meantime the Sherman Adams, Cutters,  
and Hoggarts are assuming responsibilities  
beyond their capacity. Whether the President  
will resign, I do not know. He is an  
unpredictable man, and his illness and  
worries, are making him difficult and  
crucial. All this is natural but it

Happens he is President of the country carrying  
the greatest burden in history.

I'm glad Simon Rose is so well settled.

or June. I will keep in touch with you. I  
hope you has enjoyed her trip to California.
