a. Rationale for creation, revision, or deletion:

REVISION #1: Students are currently required to take **BOTH** THEA 200 Intro. to Theatre Production **AND** THEA 202 Intro. to Theatre Design. The change is to now require **EITHER** THEA 200 **OR** THEA 202. Both of these courses have come to contain the same introductory material because all of our classes are open to all university students who may not have had the other course, and a basic level of understanding of theatre production is a necessity before going forward in either of these courses. For majors, however, this is resulting in a repeat of material. Taking one or the other (depending on which one we are able to offer in a given semester consistent with faculty workloads) will provide a sufficient introduction for majors to go forward with their 300 level elective requirements. While THEA 200 is currently the prerequisite for most of the 300 level production electives, we will submit course revisions allowing for either THEA 200 or THEA 202 to serve as the prerequisite for 300 level courses.

REVISION #2: Students are currently required to take 10 credits of THEA 407 Practicum for Majors. The change is to now require only 6 credits. The rationale is that we are no longer able to use undergraduate students on a consistent basis in run-crew positions on the productions of the PTTP. Students' erratic schedules affect our ability to rehearse and perform when needed, and we cannot sufficiently train them to have the kind of professional skill that is required in order to maintain the production standards that are expected of a conservatory graduate training program. As a general practice, we will fulfill students' practicum assignments through the building of our shows in our various shops. These types of assignments will continue to provide undergraduate majors with fundamental skill training in the areas of theatre production. Through these types of assignments, we can accommodate a 6-credit requirement for all students. This change will also allow students to take fewer credits of Practicum at a time and extend the 6 credits over perhaps 3 semesters. With the 10 credit requirement, transfer students and/or UD students who change their major late, often end up taking 4 credits at a time at some point in order to finish their degree in a reasonable amount of time. This is a huge time commitment on their part and often results in conflicts with their other classes. For those students who do demonstrate a higher level of skill and ability and whose schedules can meet the required availability of the PTTP, the possibility of serving in run-crew positions will remain an option.

The above revisions will result in the total credits for the major being reduced from 37 credits to 30 credits, the minimum required for a major in the College of Arts and Science.
