GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE STATE OF DELAWARE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

April 27, 1955

To The Senate, 118th General Assembly State of Delaware

> On April 20, 1955, I received Senate Bill No. 85, entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 15, TITLE 10 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE TERM OF THE JUDGE OF THE COURT OF COM-MON PLEAS FOR KENT COUNTY.

I respectfully return herewith this Bill without my approval.

In 1931 the General Assembly, acting favorably upon the recommendations of the members of the Kent County Bar Association, and of many prominent citizens, created the Common Pleas Court for Kent County.

A growing demand for Juvenile Court services for Kent and Sussex Counties brought about the establishment of the Juvenile Court for Kent and Sussex Counties, in 1933. The Judge of the Common Pleas Court for Kent County was made, ex-officio, the Judge of the Juvenile Court.

In 1951 the Legislature, very commendably, set up a separate twelve-year Judgeship for the Juvenile Court for Kent and Sussex Counties, and provided a staff to take care of the ever increased amount of work in that court.

The continued increase of population in the two lower Counties made feasible the establishment in 1953 of a Common Pleas Court for Sussex County, the Judge thereof to serve for a term of twelve years. At the same time it was deemed fair and reasonable that the term of the Judge of the Common Pleas Court for Kent County be made twelve years to coincide with the term of Judges of other Courts, such as the State Judiciary, the Common Pleas Court for New Castle County, the Family Court for New Castle County, the Juve-nile Court for Kent and Sussex Counties and the Municipal Court for the City of Wilmington.

Records reveal that leaders of both major political parties made possible the Legislation that afforded this gradual and progressive development of these additional court facilities for Kent and Sussex Counties. These several pieces of Legislation were non-partisan in their inception and were initiated to meet the growing demand of the inicreased population in the lower part of the State for improved and additional judicial services more in keeping with those already

existing in our metropolitan areas.

To the best of my knowledge, as the law now stands, all judicial appointments to State Courts, excepting, of course, Justice of the Peace appointments, are for a term of twelve years. I can see no justifiable reason for making the Court of Common Pleas for Kent County the exception.

As a result of this evaluation of the history and the facts relating to the creation of the several courts referred to, including the Court in question, it is my opinion that progress in the administration of justice would not be served with the approval of this Bill and that we would be moving backward rather than forward.

In connection with yesterday's hearing on State vs. County police protection, I would like to offer these comments as a basis of arriving at some final decision on this problem which I think can be briefly stated as follows:

1—There seems to be no problem respecting the policing of rural areas which could not be solved by increasing the

size of the State Police force.

2—The State Police force is apparently not adapted to policing highly populated, unincorporated areas.

3—It is impractical to set up a separate police system to cover individual islands of unincorporated areas, which therefore requires that they be set up on a broader basis.

Therefore, the following action should be considered:

1—Meet this need of supplying protection to highly populated, unincorporated areas on a Hundred basis as at present.

- 2—Continue to allocate the cost of Hundred Police services on a County-wide basis because it is impractical to set up a separate accounting by Hundreds on such a small expediture. It is less than 1/10th cent per \$100 valuation if charged individually. Further, a study of the total New Castle County budget clearly shows many items of expenditure which are not allocated on the basis of service rendered; but on the property valuation which in effect is "the ability to pay" when it comes down to the individual. To illustrate, more than 1/3 of the 1954 budget (1.1 million dollars) was allocated to the New Castle County Workhouse, Hospitals, and Relief and General Welfare activities. I doubt that the four Hundreds now receiving Hundred Police protection benefitted proportionately to the tax contribution made by these areas.
- 3—Make the requirements of future police candidates equal to State Police to assure that such personnel would be acceptable to State Police or Local administrators, should future incorporation of an area justify reducing or eliminating Hundred Police protection.

4—Utilize the excellent administrative and supervisory facilities of the State Police force to coordinate and up-grade the performance of the Hundred Police forces by having the State Police Administration take over the responsibility for directing the patrolling duties and assignments of the personnel.

This Bill would raise the salaries of certain officials and clerks of the City of Wilmington. The City of Wilmington has complete authority and right to determine this matter.

Both political platforms have advocated home rule for municipalities. Such legislation as this Bill provides would be a usurpation by the State of local authority and in conflict with the home rule philosophy.

I have every confidence that any city in the State of Delaware would prefer to regulate the salaries of its employees without having the legislature or the State of Delaware get into its local affairs and assume this responsibility.

GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE STATE OF DELAWARE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

To The Senate, 118th General Assembly State of Delaware

On April 20, 1955, I received Senate Bill No. 22 with Senate Amendment No. 1 entitled:

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 14 OF THE DELA-WARE CODE, RELATING TO "EDUCATION" BY PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A PRO-FESSIONAL STATUS CERTIFICATE FOR TEA-CHERS AND FOR REGULATIONS CONCERN-ING CERTIFICATE RENEWAL.

I respectfully return herewith this bill without my approval.

This bill repeals certain administrative regulations of the State Board of Education with respect to the in-service professional study required for periodic renewal of teaching certificates. These regulations were adopted and have continued to be effective as a part of the state's program to maintain the highest possible standard of instructional ability for the benefit of all children in the public schools.

This bill would nullify efforts of long standing on the part of this state to assure continuing professional qualifications on the part of its public school teachers and would revert to educational standards abolished in this state approximately a quarter of a century ago. Under its provisions the mere fact of serving time as a teacher three out of each successive years would be the only requirement for retaining professional status.

The vast majority of states recognized as having the highest standards of public education have rejected the principle of lifetime or permanent certificates of professional status. Term certificates requiring some evidence of professional growth are now approved in most educationally progressive states as representing the best and fairest procedures.

The State of Delaware cannot afford to lower standards of professional efficiency while simultaneously increasing salary rates and granting other such benefits as tenure. Increased salary rates, tenure and other benefits cannot continue to be approved on the one hand while requirements for performance and improvements are decreased on the other.

Several pieces of pending legislation provide for automatic salary increases for teachers. Retention of the principle of automatic salary increases, while the need for professional progress and growth is otherwise ignored, is unjustified and completely indefensible before the tax paying public.

Determination of the continuing professional competence of teachers is generally considered to be an administrative function of the agency established to plan, conduct and supervise public education and has been so recognized in Delaware for about 25 years. This authority should continue to be an administrative function, but it is important that administrative regulations be reviewed periodically. I shall therefore request the State Board of Education to review promptly the matter of professional certification.

It is of great significance that this bill is not known to have received support from any institution of teacher training: local board of education, local board of school trustees, or group of school administrators. Likewise, it is not known to have received the support of a single lay group organized to assist in the promotion and protection of public educational standards.

This bill purports to increase the state's ability to attract teaching personnel. To accept this endorsement is also to admit at the same time that any teacher candidate who would be attracted to service in Delaware solely on the basis of not being required to maintain a minimum program of self improvement is not the type of teached wanted in the Delaware schools. I therefore cannot accept this premise as a valid reason for approving this bill.

Dover, May 12, 1955

To The Senate of The State of Delaware:

On May 4, 1955, I received Senate Bill No. 255 with Senate Amendment No. 1. entitled:

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 1, TITLE 15 OF THE DELAWARE CODE BY ABOLISHING THE PRESENT DEPARTMENT OF ELECTIONS FOR NEW CASTLE COUNTY AND CREATING A NEW DEPARTMENT OF ELECTIONS FOR NEW CAS-TLE COUNTY.

I respectfully return this bill without my approval.

No logical reason is known to exist for ripping out the present Department of Elections for New Castle County. The only apparent reason which can be attributed to such action is partisan politics.

The Department of Elections for New Castle County has done an excellent job of administering the registration and election laws of the State. During a period of great growth in population and important changes in the election laws this Department has efficiently performed its duties. The transition from paper ballots to voting machines, with its many difficult administrative problems, was smoothly carried out by the Department.

It is right and proper to abolish, alter or temporarily suspend public agencies only when the public interest is to be served. This bill, however, reflects a complete disregard for the public interest, as there has been no suggestion or charge of any unlawful action or misconduct of any kind on

the part of the Department as presently constituted.

The members of the Department of Elections for New Castle County are persons of experience and integrity. They have performed their duties conscientiously and well, often under difficult circumstances. Such public service deserves commendation rather than summary dismissal.

The abolition of properly functioning public agencies solely in an effort to acquire political advantage, rightly deserves and will surely receive public condemnation. It is for that reason that responsible leaders of both parties have been outspoken in opposition to this type of legislation.

This bill finds no support in any political platform and, in fact, is contrary to a specific pledge in the platform of the

Democratic Party.

There is also no justification for depriving a Governor of the right to appoint the members of administrative and executive bodies. Therefore, the reason for doing so must be political expediency. Those favoring the bill themselves reveal this is to be true by providing that the Governor shall make such appointments after the initial ones have been made.

Two years ago, upon the strong urging of the party representing the minority members of this Department, the number of members of the Department was increased to assure each party that it will be represented by at least five of the twelve members. Now the same party reverses its position by endorsing this bill which would establish a much less favorable balance between the parties. Even from a purely political point of view there can be no justification for this backward step.

Since a number of State Agencies have seen fit to attack the budget proposals of the Joint Finance Committee in a manner calculated to arouse the resentment of the public without in any manner enlightening them as to the problems which confronted the Committee, we have decided to make this statement in order to set the record straight.

Since requests for appropriations as submitted to the Budget Commission for the next biennium exceed the anticipated income during the same period by approximately \$18,000,000, the enormity of the problem which confronted the Joint Finance Committee becomes immediately apparent.

Before commencing its deliberations, the Committee agreed that it should be guided by these principles:

- 1. That current operating costs should be paid out of current revenue.
- 2. That the present surplus, being of a non-recurring type, should not be used to pay current operating costs, but should rather be applied toward capital improvements.
- 3. That it is the duty of the Joint Finance Committee to present a balanced budget on the basis of the present tax structure.
- 4. That it is the duty of the General Assembly to decide upon additional appropriations, since such appropriations will necessarily require increased taxes.

In accordance with these principles, the Committee presented the bill which has been the object of so many attacks recently. The members of the committee regretted the necessity which required drastic cuts in many of the requests. They are willing to support bills requesting additional appropriations where hardships of a serious nature may otherwise result; provided, however, that the taxpayers are fully informed that such appropriations will mean increased taxes and signify their assent to the levy of such taxes by the votes of their elected representatives. Any other course of action would, in our opinion, be improper.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 27, TITLE 18 OF THE DELAWARE CODE BY PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL TAX ON CERTAIN GROSS PREMIUMS OF INSURANCE COMPANIES, THE DISTRIBUTION THEREOF, AND REQUIRING CERTAIN POLICE DEPARTMENTS OR BUREAUS TO MAKE CERTAIN REGISTRATIONS WITH THE STATE TREASURER.

It is apparent from the face of this Bill that it did not receive the required Constitutional vote in the Senate.

The funds raised under the provisions of this Bill are to "be paid out by the State Treasurer to the proper officers in charge of any State, County or Municipal police department or bureau having a pension fund . . ." This is an express appropriation. Section 4, Article VIII of our State Constitution provides that no appropriation of public money shall be made to any county, municipality or corporation otherwise than pursuant to an act of the General Assembly passed with the concurrence of three-fourths of all the members elected to each House.

This Bill received ten votes in the Senate. Therefore, it did not receive the votes of three-fourths of the members elected to the Senate, which would be at least thirteen votes.

On May 17, 1955, I received House Bill No. 405 with House Amendment No. 1, entitled:

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 1, TITLE 15, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ELECTIONS FOR KENT COUNTY.

I respectfully return this bill without my approval.

Partisan political advantage seems to be the sole objective of this ripper legislation wherein the public interest is given no consideration.

The Department of Elections for Kent County has done an excellent job of administering the registration and election laws of the State in the best interest of the public and through a difficult period of transition from paper ballots to voting machines. Again it may be said that such public service deserves commendation rather than summary dismissal.

This bill finds no support in any political platform and, in fact, as contrary to a specific pledge in the platform of the Democratic Party.

House Bill No. 405 removes the appointive power from the Governor and places it in the Levy Court of Kent County. On this point it may be said again that there is no justification for depriving a Governor of the appointive power of the Chief Executive as contemplated in the Constitution.

But in this bill not only is the Governor permanently deprived of the appointive power which is properly his, but such power is delegated to a county administrative body to appoint those who will be responsible for conducting elections pertaining to National and State-wide offices. Although this may not be illegal, it certainly seems inappropriate.

Furthermore, uniformity in the administration of the election laws is seriously jeopardized by the requirement that the Department of Elections in Kent County be selected by a different method and by an entirely different governmental body than are similar Departments in the other counties. If good reasons exist for depriving the State government of its present part in the administration of State and National elections, surely such reasons apply in all counties.

This bill is defective in that it fails to make any provision whatsoever for the filling of vacancies which may occur after July 1, 1959.

If the reports carried in the public press are correct, there were several misstatements made in connection with this bill on the floor of the House of Representatives which tend to indicate that the bill was misunderstood and the proponents uninformed. For example, a statement made on the floor by a member indicated that the bill would result in a net saving by reducing the salaries of the members from \$750 per year to \$500. No such saving would result, since the amount now spent annually annually for salaries is \$2250 whereas under this bill it would be \$3500.

The same member also reportedly referred to the five present members. His knowledge of the law which he urged to be amended was clearly limited, for the present Department consists, by law, of only three members.

It is also reported that a member stated "Any seven men would be better than what we now have." In the absence of any charges against any present member of the Department, this statement merely indicates that legislator's advocacy of ripper legislation.

The abolition of properly functioning public agencies solely in an effort to acquire political advantage rightly deserves and will surely receive public condemnation.
