Alone and armed with a machine gun, Mr. Williamson rescued the crew of a weapons carrier that received a direct hit during the fighting.

He remained exposed to the enemy fire as he attached a tow cable to a vehicle so it could be retrieved and not captured.

For his efforts that day, he was awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military decoration.

Mr. Williamson, who served three tours of duty in Vietnam, retired in 1969 as a staff sergeant after 21 years in the Army. He also served in the Korean War. He also received the Silver Star, Purple Heart, Bronze Star and other medals.

Dear Mr. Oberle.

Thank you for voting against S.B. 72 on March 28th. This is definitely a Euthanasia Bill or a Death by Neglect Bill. It is a sad commentary when we now have become so animalistic that we only desire survival of the fittest. I realize what family members go through when they perceive their loved ones to be suffering and feel that any invasive treatment they receive to be burdensome. But food and water, no matter how defined in a medical setting, is still basic care that everyone is entitled to. In actuality, it is the families that feel burdened, and it is not actually that it is burdensome to the patient.

My own brother died from cancer at the age of twenty-seven and I was fortunate enough to take care of him at home. Hospice was involved with his care and he had intravenous fluids infusing to keep him from becoming dehydrated. He ate what he could, when he could, but that intravenous served a purpose. It helped him to maintain his life with some comfort, not really sustain it, because there was no fighting against the disease process itself. With this bill there will be many premature deaths, and many people making erroneous decisions.

My fear is that now we will start seeing Death Rooms and Death Wards in the hospital. My standard as an R.N. requires me to care for and protect my patients. I cannot stand by silently and allow patients not to be cared for, which should be every patients' expectation and demand. In the twenty-two years that I have been in practice, the plea I hear from patients who are terminally ill, is "Please help me.", not "Please kill me.". Will there no longer be any liability? Every case is so unique and so individual, as the people they involve. Generalizations cannot and should not be made, especially in the form of Bills such as S.B. 72.

State of Delaware Office of the Governor May 16, 1996

To the Honorable Members of the House of Representatives 138th General Assembly:

I am returning House Bill Number 560 to you without my signature today. I feel the need to explain to you my veto decision so as to provide you with guidance as to my future actions with respect to such legislation.

H.B. 560 attempted to override the decision of a local school board about where to establish polling places for an election held on May 14, 1996, a mere week from when the bill was first introduced in the General Assembly. The bill was not introduced at the request of the local board which conducted the election.

By law, the elected boards of education are charged with running school elections within their respective districts. Therefore, I believe it is unwise and unfair for the State to engage in the process of selectively telling elected boards where they must put polling places. Such a practice will open the door to the politicazation of the administration of school elections by contending factions in such elections.

Moreover, the inclusion of information in the "Whereas" clauses of H.B. 560 which was not true may have led members of the General Assembly to supports its passage. For example, H.B. 560 seeks to require the Red Clay School Board to open a polling place within the City of Wilmington a mere five blocks from a polling place the Board itself established. Yet, H.B. 560 does not acknowledge this. To the contrary, it, regrettably, states that the Red Clay Board failed to establish a polling place anywhere in the City of Wilmington for the election, when in fact the Board established four such polling places.

The Red Clay Board and I share a profound respect for the outstanding organization whose building H.B. 560 mandates a polling place and the community that organization serves. The Red Clay Board's respect for that community is such that it was willing to establish an unnecessary polling place within a short walk of another polling place the Board established for the May 14, 1996 election. Therefore, with that Board's approval, I signed S.B. 387 which gave the Board the authority to open another polling place for the May 14, 1996 election if it so chose and which was devoid of the factual errors that exist in H.B. 560.

I believe it is inadvisable to usurp the authority of local boards to conduct their own elections. I do not intend to sign legislation such as H.B. 560 in the future unless the legislation is introduced with the prior support of the relevant local board.
