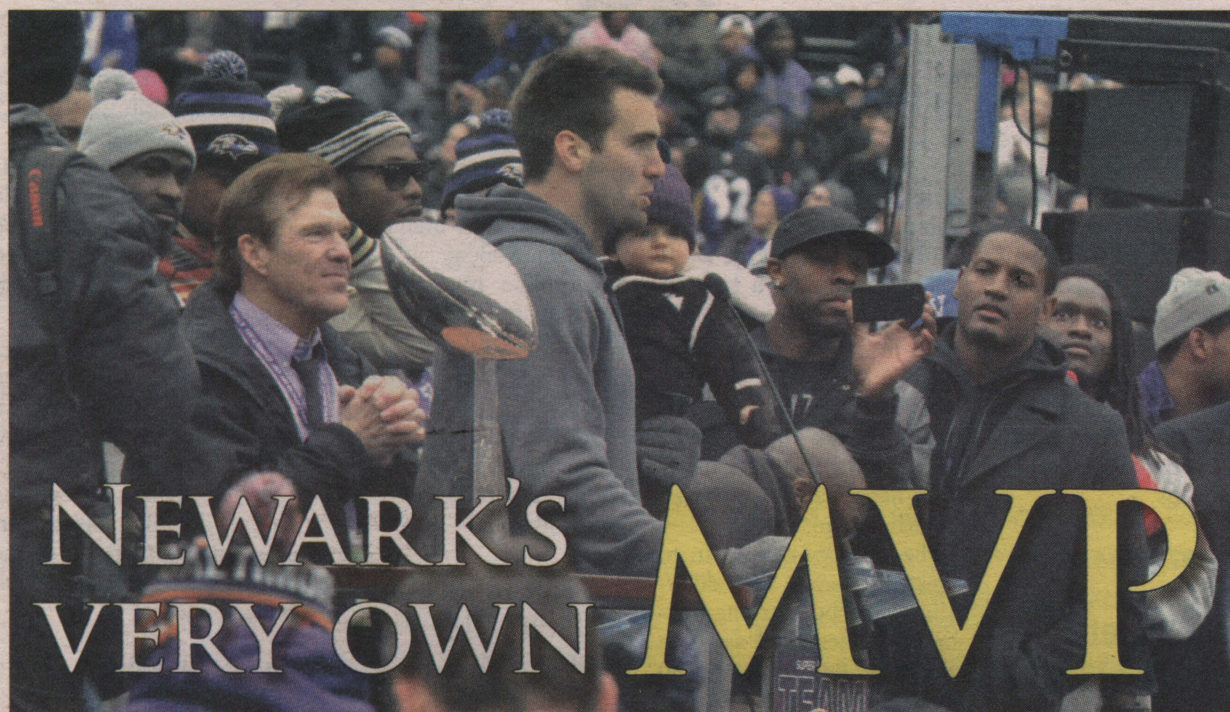

Local Ravens fans celebrate Super Bowl XLVII victory

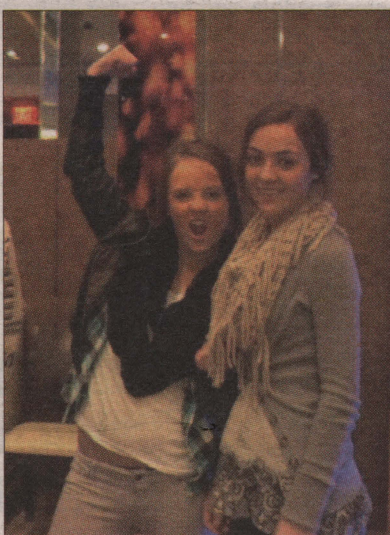

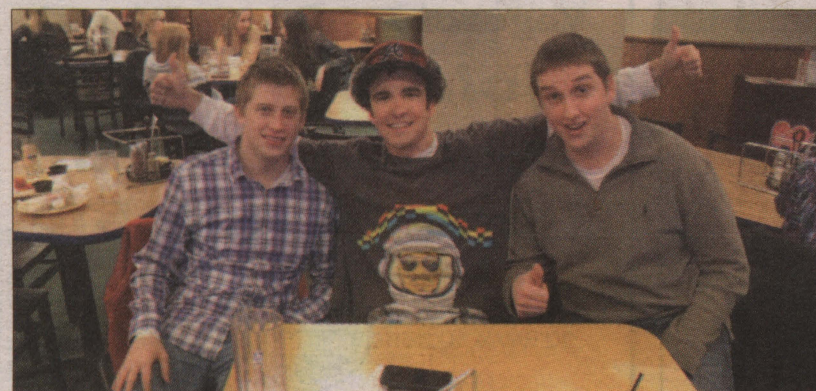

City seeking share of PILOT funds

Newark deserves reimbursement for the revenue it loses due to tax-exempt property, city officials told state lawmakers this week.

Mayor Vance A. Funk III, councilmen and city staff made their pitch Monday during a dinner meeting with state representatives and senators who represent the Newark area.

"It's an issue of fairness," Councilman Jerry Clifton said.

Since 2008, the state has distributed PILOT funds, or payment in lieu of taxes, to

municipalities as a way to make up for property tax revenue lost due to tax-exempt institutions, like schools and government buildings.

However, only the county seats — Wilmington, Dover and Georgetown — are eligible, explained City Manager Carol Houck.

That arbitrary caveat is unfair, Houck said, pointing out that nearly 46 percent of property in Newark is tax-exempt, due mostly to the University of Delaware.

"If anybody is getting funds in lieu of taxes, Newark should," she said, estimating

Man charged in September robbery of UD students

woman — were sitting on a curb in front of Building 300 when two men approached them at approximately 2:30 a.m.

Newark Police have arrested an Elkton, Md., man they say robbed and assaulted two University of Delaware students last fall.

Aaron A. King, 20, is charged with two counts of first-degree robbery, possession of a deadly weapon, conspiracy, assault and offensive touching in connection with the Sept. 15 incident in the parking lot of the University Courtyard Apartments.

According to investigators, the victims — a 19-year-old man and an 18-year-old

The victims noticed both suspects were armed with silver revolvers and started to stand up. One of the suspects then struck the female victim in the face, knocking her to the ground, Farrall said.

The assailants also took the woman's cell phone and her companion's wallet and cell phone, according to police.

Moments later, the victim's

Newark-area men charged with robbing two Elkton motels

Officers captured two Delaware men on Sunday night after they allegedly robbed two motels in Elkton, Md., at gunpoint over the weekend, police reported.

Patrol officers with the Elkton Police Department nabbed the two suspects — Matthew Wayne Zickgraf, 23, of Newark, and Michael Lee Leary, 18, of Bear — about 10 p.m. on North

Bridge Street, after spotting their black Chevrolet Impala, which matched the description of the suspect vehicle, police said.

They took the suspects into custody about an hour after one of the suspects brandished what appeared to be a handgun during an armed robbery at Motel 6 at 223 Belle Hill Road, police added. The motel sits off of Elkton Road, less than two

miles from the state line.

A similar gun had been displayed about 7:45 p.m. on Saturday when the suspects allegedly robbed the nearby Days Inn at 311 Belle Hill Road, police noted.

"The suspects were arrested without incident. Officers determined that the weapon used during the robberies was an air soft toy gun. Officers also confiscated three other air

soft toy guns," said Capt. Matthew Donnelly, an EPD spokesman.

Leary and Zickgraf each are charged with two counts of robbery, police said. As of Monday night, police added, they remained in the Cecil County Detention Center in lieu of \$150,000 bond each.

In the robbery at the Days Inn on Saturday, a suspect wearing a blue ski-style

mask displayed a gun and demanded money from an employee while the other suspect stood by the office door, police said. They fled after the worker surrendered a "small undetermined" sum of cash, police added.

The men allegedly struck again in similar fashion about 9:15 p.m. on Sunday at Motel Six, police reported, noting that this time the gun-

man wore a black and white bandana.

"The suspect ran from the office and then was seen leaving the parking lot in a black Chevrolet Impala. The suspect and vehicle information were transmitted to other responding officers," Donnelly explained.

A short time later, EPD officers spotted the Impala on North Bridge Street, stopped it and then arrested Leary and Zickgraf, according to police.

Police warn of string of car burglaries

Newark Police are warning local residents to keep their cars locked in light of a recent string of vehicles break-ins throughout the city.

The burglaries occurred last week on Kells Avenue, Dallas Avenue, Chrysler Avenue, Kenyon Lane,

South Chapel Street and Apple Road.

In most cases, the burglar entered cars parked on the street or in driveways and stole property from the vehicles.

"Lock your cars," police spokesman Cpl. James Spadola urged. "In the majority of the vehicle break-ins, people left their cars unsecured. It's a crime of opportunity for someone

checking door handles."

Spadola said investigators believe the same person is responsible for all the break-ins.

Man charged with assault on Main Street

A Newark man was arrested Feb. 1 in connection with a fight on Main Street.

Newark Police spokesman Cpl. James Spadola said two plainclothes officers were on patrol at approximately 1 a.m. when they saw a group of people gathering in front

of Abbott's Shoe Repair.

"It appeared a fight was about to break out," Spadola said, noting that is exactly what happened by the time the officers got there.

The officers moved in to arrest the person they determined to be the aggressor, later identified as Evan Donovan, 23, of the 1700 block of Otts Chapel Road.

Donovan, who was intoxicated, then resisted arrest until officers threatened to take him, Spadola said, noting that once handcuffed, Donovan had to be dragged to a nearby police cruiser.

"He violently thrashed and

kicked his legs," Spadola said.

Donovan was charged with third-degree assault, offensive touching and resisting arrest.

Assault reported at University Courtyards

A man was assaulted by a group of three men Jan. 31 in the parking lot of the University Courtyard Apartments on Scholar Drive.

The victim, a resident of the complex, told police that the men approached him at approximately 1:20 a.m. and accused him of "hitting a girl."

One of the men hit him, bloodying his nose, before running away.

That suspect is described as a white man wearing a black T-shirt and a backward black baseball cap.

Police do not believe the victim actually hit a girl or anyone else prior to the attack, said spokesman Cpl. James Spadola.

Car dealership burglarized

Police are investigating a break-in at the Porter Nissan dealership in the 300 block of East Cleveland Avenue.

A private security guard doing routine checks saw an open door at the dealership at approximately 10:45 Jan. 31.

Officers found pry marks on the door, but no one was inside and nothing was missing.

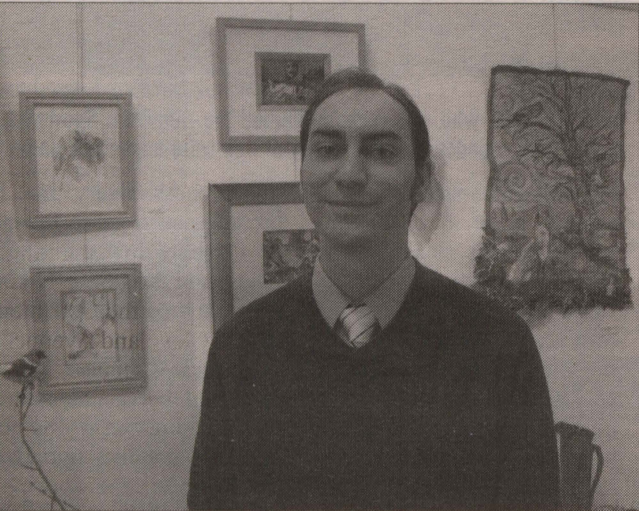
Newark Arts Alliance gets new director

Nonprofit looking to expand literary arts offerings

Dennis Lawson has always dreamed of working in the literary arts — more specifically, writing short stories.

He eventually realized he needed to take a drastic move to make that happen, so three years ago, he quit his job as public relations manager for the Delaware Art Museum and enrolled at Rutgers University to pursue a master of fine arts in creative writing.



“I realized it wasn’t going to happen with a full-time job,” Lawson said. “I was looking for something that would let me work with creative people and use the skills I learned at the museum.”

After two years at Rutgers and an internship at the New Yorker magazine, Lawson’s journey has landed him in Newark, where last week, he was named executive director of the Newark Arts Alliance.

The nonprofit, which holds exhibitions, art

classes and other cultural events, is celebrating its 20th anniversary this year.

“Dennis brings strong communications experience, and that is essential in expanding the foundation of community support and engagement the Newark Arts Alliance has developed over the last 20 years,” NAA Board President Niki Rose Chester said. “I am especially excited that Dennis will be leading the organization into the future by developing new activities and programs for people of all ages, working closely with current and future artist members, and overseeing the growth of our corporate and public sector support.”

Lawson said he will focus on spreading the word about the NAA.

“I want to make sure that our local residents are aware of everything that’s going on here,” he said. “And when artists have work on view here, I want to make sure as many people see it as possible.”

Lawson, who moved

to Delaware from Connecticut a decade ago, hopes to put his newly minted literary skills to use and help the NAA expand into the literary arts.

Though the group will keep its strong focus on visual and performing arts, Lawson hopes it will soon host poetry readings, author talks and literary classes, as well.

He also hopes to expand NAA’s summer camp offerings and to better organize the group’s art classes into levels, such as beginner, intermediate and advanced.

“That will keep people coming back to NAA,” he said.

However, financial challenges also await Lawson. NAA is funded largely by grants and other donations, and with the recent state of the economy, funds have been harder to obtain, he said.

“The economy has been lean for a few years, and nonprofits have had to learn how to do more with less,” he said. “But the

fact remains, if communities don’t support their local arts groups, those groups can go away.”

Newark High alum honored for excellence in broadcasting

Scott Klatzkin has spent more time talking into a microphone than many people spend chatting with their spouses.

Being a sportscaster is something he always dreamed of doing, and now that he's successfully combined his passion for sports with his desire to entertain fans, the Newark native is being noticed outside of the small city and university boundaries.

For the second time in his career and first since becoming the "Voice of the Blue Hens," Klatzkin, 27, has been named the Delaware Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (NSSA).

"I said it when I got the job and now that I am almost six months into my first year, I can reiterate that being the 'Voice of the Blue Hens' is a dream job," said Klatzkin, who in the fall completed his first season as play-by-play announcer on 94.7

WDSB for the University of Delaware football team and currently is doing the same for men's basketball. "Working with the administration, staff, coaches and players at Delaware is a prize in itself and any award given out by the NSSA is simply a bonus."

Klatzkin will travel to Salisbury, N.C., in June, where he'll be honored along with other state recipients and national honorees Dick Vitale and Dan Patrick.

"Both of them played a pivotal role in peaking my interest of becoming a broadcaster when I was growing up," Klatzkin recalled. "I can remember watching Patrick and Keith Olbermann host 'The Big Show' edition of ESPN's SportsCenter and admiring how much more creative and entertaining their episodes of the show would be. Undoubtedly, Dick Vitale is the number one reason I took a liking to the broadcast profession. The passion and enjoyment he shows for his job should be admired by all. Possibly being able to thank

Mr. Vitale in person for passing along his enthusiasm for this profession is an experience that I look forward to."

It was at Newark High where Klatzkin first developed his broadcasting skills during the school's daily telecast of "The Bee Line."

"It's great to think that WNHS-TV at Newark High School influenced Scott to enter the field of broadcasting," said Mark Freidly, communication technology teacher at Newark. "Scott took the lead with 'The Bee Line' and showed initiative in organizing the crew and meeting daily deadlines. He was very expressive in front of, as well as behind the camera."

"Students coming up through the ranks can use Scott as a model to emulate his diligence and expertise," Freidly added. "It's gratifying to see how his professionalism has grown and rewarding to see his hard work pay off."

From Newark, Klatzkin moved on to major in communication at the University of Delaware and like many

college students who strive to be future broadcasters, he took the opportunity to develop his broadcasting skills at the radio and television stations on campus. It was at the university's Student Television Network where Klatzkin separated himself from many of his peers.

"Scott was one of the most driven guys I came across in my time at STN," said Jay Passarella, former sports director at the UD television station and currently an editor at Comcast SportsNet in Philadelphia. "Scott was constantly trying to improve his on-air work and develop the necessary skills to make a career out of broadcasting. Many people who worked at STN saw it as a hobby or something to be done in their free time. Scott treated it as if it was a career, or a doorway to one."

On the day of a Delaware game, Klatzkin can be seen in the press box or at the press table hours before going on the air, reviewing and editing notes to make sure the broadcast goes off without a hitch. It's a pre-game routine he's followed since his days as a Blue Hen.

"So many people would show up at our network with the desire to go on the air,

but few understood what it actually took to be an on-air personality," Passarella explained. "Scott understood that by writing his own scripts, or at times editing things I had written, he was helping prepare for the night's broadcast. He didn't just sit down and read a teleprompter, he was heavily involved in the pre-produc-

tion process. Every time he broadcasted a game for me, he came with depth charts, notes and stats that would help the broadcast immensely."

Klatzkin's intense preparation at UD certainly helped prepare him, but it was perhaps his creative initiatives

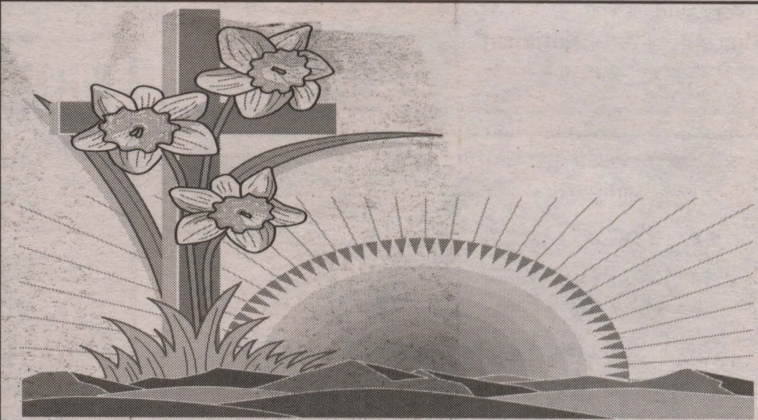

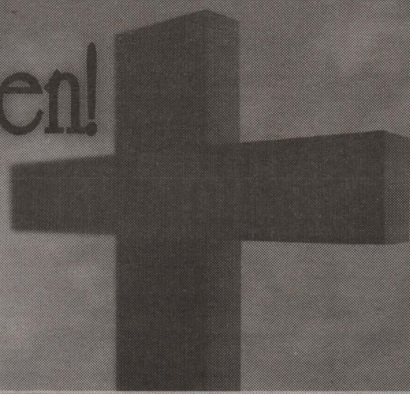

49ers at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans.

The game took on special meaning to many University of Delaware students and alumni, as Flacco, a former UD quarterback, threw for 287 yards and three touchdowns, earning the title of Super Bowl MVP.

Many fans described the game as an emotional roller coaster. However, after a 34-minute delay due to a power failure, an unexpected yet futile comeback by the 49ers and a final four seconds that kept viewers biting their nails, the Ravens secured the victory with a score of 34-31.

"It was definitely intense," said football enthusiast Ashley Pohn, of Huntington, N.Y. "It could have gone anywhere."

The first time the Ravens took a Super Bowl title was 12 years ago, when they defeated the New York Giants 34-7 in Super Bowl XXXV. For the five-time Super Bowl champs 49ers, this year was San Francisco's first loss in competing for the title.

Ryan Mowers, of Middletown, said that watching the game was exciting, though he is more a fan of Flacco specifically than the Ravens in general.

"This was the most nervous I've ever been for a game I didn't care about," Mowers said.

Sharing this sentiment were Mowers' friends Kyle Peters and Tyler Boulware, of Middletown. The three UD students were thrilled when Flacco was announced as MVP.

Though he was happy with the turnout of the game, Peters said that if the Ravens had lost, fans probably would have gotten much more upset about the electrical issues that occurred. The three friends agreed that the outage affected play because they gave the teams more time to consider their strategies.

"I think Ray Lewis was tired and summoned God to turn the lights out," Boulware said jokingly.

Though the fourth quarter brought the teams neck-and-neck, Jen Greers, of Montville, N.J., said she supported the Ravens all the way.

"It was a close one," Greers said, "But we got it."

found himself in the office of former Delaware State athletic director Rick Costello.

"I pitched to Delaware State to have their games on radio," Klatzkin recalled of his meeting in 2008. "There are simply not many openings at the Division 1 level, so sometimes when a door isn't

open you have to make your own entrance."

That entrance eventually turned into Klatzkin securing his dream job as "Voice of the Blue Hens." However, he remains on the broadcast crew for the high school games of the week, and regardless of the level of the game or the number

of people listening, the award-winning broadcaster approaches every broadcast the same.

"The amount of people tuning in, whether large or small, should never affect your focus or the sound of the broadcast," he said. "I try to go in to every game knowing that at the very least my dad will be lis-

tening intently and my mom will be trying her best to follow along, and hoping that anyone else deciding to hear the game will be enjoying themselves as well."

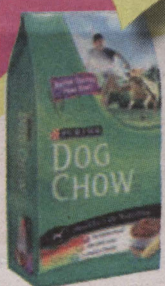

Keno latest addition to state's lottery offerings

Last month, a new gambling game called Keno began appearing in restaurants, gas stations, and stores throughout Delaware. The game, similar in play to bingo, was brought to the state by the Delaware Lottery and is now offered at more than 70 locations across the state.

One such location is The Deer Park Tavern. Assistant general manager Matt Warren said that Keno was

installed in the restaurant about two weeks ago and has since been played by customers frequently.

"It's more or less just something to do while you're sitting at the bar," Warren said, "A lot of people do win actually, so it winds up benefitting them."

Warren said Keno has become popular with the regulars at the bar and sees the most action during happy hour. During busy times, it can be difficult to play, but a new game begins

every four minutes from 9 a.m. to 12:05 a.m., Warren said.

The biggest payout at The Deer Park Tavern so far happened last week when one customer won \$125, however most times, the payout is a much smaller amount.

"The odds are pretty bad with Keno," Warren said. "It's more or less entertainment, rather than you trying to make it big."

After passing the Delaware Gaming Competitiveness Act of 2012, Delaware became the

14th state to offer Keno. The bill, signed into law in August, allows the lottery to issue both sports lottery and Keno retailer licenses to other Delaware businesses besides racetracks and casinos.

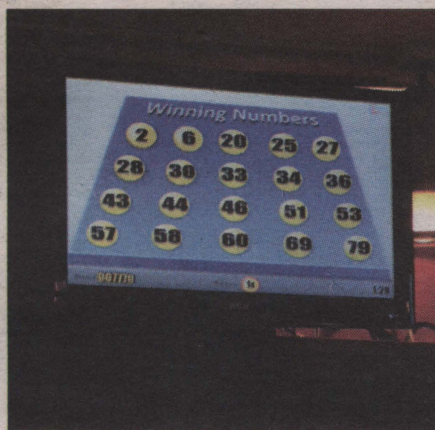
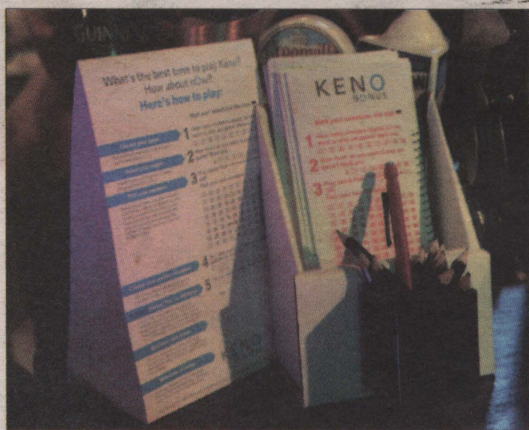
"It'll be pretty good for

bar owners and stuff like that because we get a lot of publicity and a lot of advertisement through the Delaware Lottery," Warren said.

Other local locations where Keno can be played include Malin's Market and

Wize Guyz Sports Lounge on South College Avenue, as well as McGlynns Pub in Peoples Plaza..

"It's kind of new to Delaware, so a lot of people don't know about it," Warren said, "But it is picking up pretty quickly."

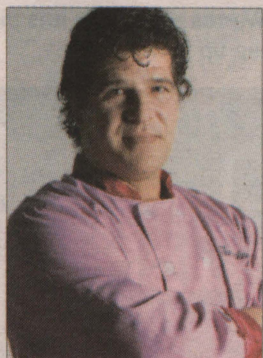

A Greek specialty: Cretan salad

A friend of mine who is also a chef, but privately, posted some pictures of a traditional Italian antipasto. It was a Caprese salad,

or Insalata Caprese as rightfully heralded. Although a great salad in its own right and admired worldwide, I think I have a better one, and it's not Italian.

While working for the Brontas family here in Maine many years ago, I developed the love of Greek cuisine. Among the outstanding ingredients the Greeks use is Feta cheese. It may be an acquired taste for some, but my palate instantly admired the crumbly texture of this cheese, and I think you will too.

Named after the island of Crete, off the coast of Greece, the cretan salad has the simplicity and flavor a beginning course should portray. I didn't put olives in this recipe although it truly should have them. The reason? I don't care for olives either, nor do my children. So why waste them?

Ingredients:

2 ripe tomatoes

1/2 small red or white onion, minced
1 green, red or yellow bell pepper, cored and julienned
Kalamata olives
Feta cheese, sliced 1/4-inch thick
Salt, cracked black pepper and oregano
Extra Virgin olive oil
2 cup loosely packed spinach leaves, stemmed and shredded
1 large clove garlic, minced
1/4 cup loose basil leaves

Directions:

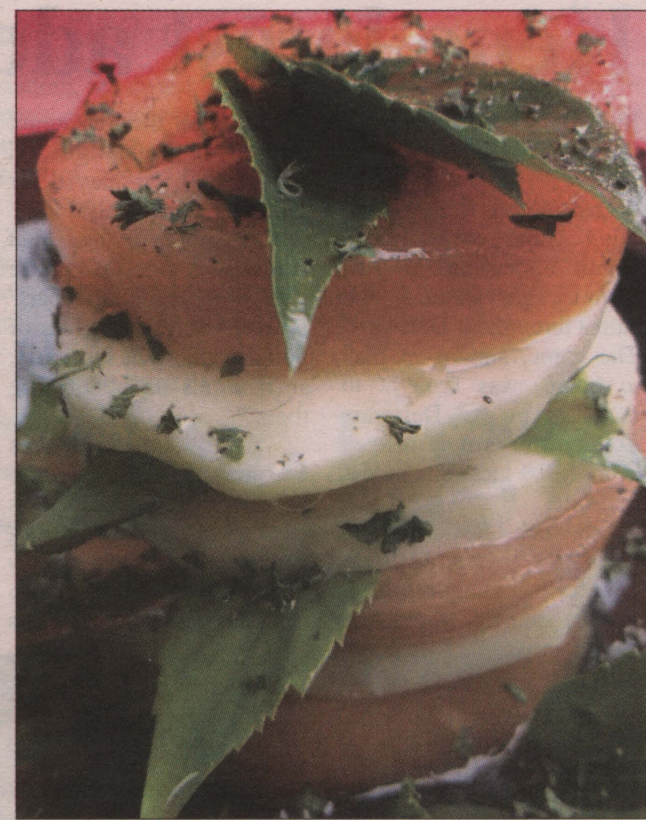
Preheat broiler while preparing recipe, making sure the oven rack is at least three inches from heat source. Divide the spinach leaves among two plates or shallow bowls. Lightly sprinkle tomato and feta slices with oregano, garlic, onion, salt and pepper, drizzle with oil on both sides.

Place on an oven proof

pan and broil for two to three minutes, or just until the cheese just begins to soften.

Lay the tomatoes and cheese on plate with spinach, overlapping each. Sprinkle with julienned peppers, basil leaves and olives and you are good to go.

Want to make your own, quick Caprese Salad? All you have to do is substitute fresh mozzarella for the feta and season as directed above along with the tomatoes. Alternately stack tomatoes with the Mozzarella cheese and slip in a few leaves of fresh basil leaves. Sprinkle a bit of oregano throughout if desired, but serve cold.

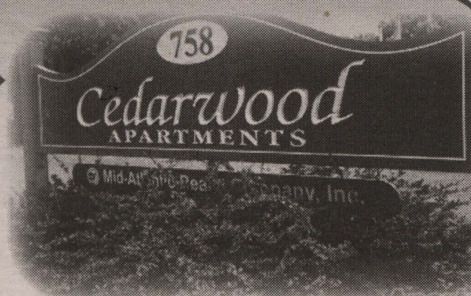

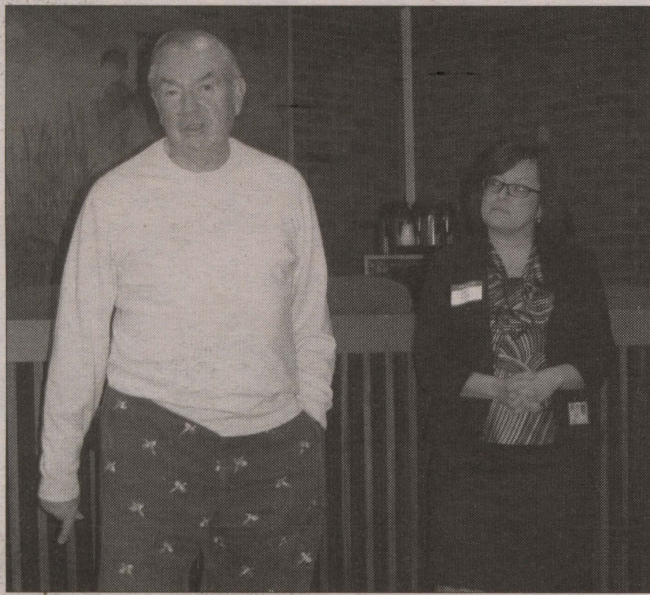
that the city should receive approximately \$300,000 to \$400,000 in PILOT funds each year.

Houck told lawmakers that the city has been in a financial crunch recently, starting the 2013 budget process with a \$1.7 million deficit. Officials solved the deficit by postponing capital projects, tapping into financial reserves and not filling vacant positions.

One significant loss is transfer tax revenue, which, due to a weakened real estate market, has decreased from \$2.3 million in 2005 to \$1.2 million in 2012.

"That's a significant chunk of money to run our city that we don't have," Houck said.

She emphasized that Newark has taken steps to improve its finances — such as reorganizing departments, raising utility rates and installing smart meters for electric and water — but still desires a share of the

PILOT funds.

"I don't want you to think we're not doing anything about it," Houck told lawmakers. "We're not just coming to you with a hand out."

State Rep. John Kowalko (D-Newark South) expressed his support for

the city.

"You're talking about the third-largest city in the state doing away with 46 percent of its revenue," Kowalko said. "That's not how government should work."
