The julcy, golden-brown turkey on the holiday table is good reason to give thanks for the abundance of the season. Cook the bird "l'4 to 4 hours for a 6 to 8-pound turkey; 4 to 4½-bours for an 8 to 12-pound bird; 41s to 534 hours for a 12 to 16-pound bird; 5½ to 655 hours for a 16 to 20-pound bird; 6½ to 7 hours for a 20 to 24-pound bird.

The Society functions in other ways in the area of TB and respiratory disease prevention and control. Research projects, which may aid in eventual eradication of the diseases, are financed. Expert medical lecturers are brought to Delaware to discuss new techniques with local doctors and nurses. Student nurses are offered training courses in the care of tuberculosis patients.

College scholarships are provided to encourage young women to enter the field of nursing.

Patients suffering from TB and other respiratory diseases are aided, both in their recovery and in their return to some form of gainful employment, by the TB Society.

In these areas, more than \$100,000 is spent each year by the Delaware Tuberculosis and Health Society, This money is raised through the annual Christmas Seal Campaign.
