SUBJECT: Report of the Senate Ethics Committee Relative to Allegations Regarding Senator Marshall

The Ethics Committee met on March 13, 1980, at 7:30 p.m., in Senator Cordrey's Office. Members of the Ethics Committee present were: Senator Cordrey, Senator Sharp, Senator Knox, and Senator Arnold. Also in attendance were Senator Marshall and his legal counsel, Victor Battaglia, and Attorney General for the State of Delaware, Richard S. Gebelein. The meeting was open to the public. At the conclusion of the discussion, which lasted for two hours, the following facts were agreed upon by all in attendance.

The Attorney General stated that his investigation had concluded that there was insufficient evidence to prove guilt under the existing Profiteering and Official Misconduct laws of our State. The Attorney General's investigation did conclude that: "It was clear, however, that the actions violated the Constitutional prohibition against conflict of interest contained in Article II, Section 20."

The Senate Ethics Committee has carefully reviewed the evidence and the conclusions presented by the Attorney General in his letter of February 14, 1980, referring this matter to the Senate. In Addition, the Committee has further explored the evidence and the allegations in question at its meeting on March 13, involving Senator Marshall his legal counsel, and Attorney General Gebelein.

After consideration of all relevant facts available to the Ethics Committee regarding Senator Marshall's role in the purchase and sale of the property at 1300 Linden Street, the members unanimously agree that the Committee cannot conclusively determine that the actions of Senator Marshall in that transaction, or his vote on Senate Bill 347, constituted a conflict of interest in violation of Article II, Section 20, of the Delaware Constitution.

The members of the Ethics Committee do feel that it was extremely poor judgement on Senator Marshall's part to sell the property to the Community Center, because, as a minimum, this created the appearance of a conflict.

The entire Committee present feels that there is a need to update and strengthen our current laws and procedures so that in the future, there will be definite evidence, rules, and guidelines defining what a conflict of interest is and providing penalties for violations.

The members of the Committee present, as a whole, feel so strongly on this matter, that, in talking with the Attorney General, we will be more that glad to co-sponsor any such legislation which he feels is necessary to define a conflict of interest.

RE: Forms Management Legislation (SB 499)

Dear Harris:

Our Department has just had the opportunity to review SB 499 which I understand has recently been introduced by you into the Delaware State Senate. I thought it might be helpful for you to have some of our thoughts on this legislation.

First, a little history. Until fiscal year 1978, the State of Delaware had no records management program to speak of. Each agency, department and organization kept what it felt it should, threw away some things, and sent the rest in a helterskelter fashion to the Bureau of Archives for Ofttimes, there were few, if any, indices to the material provided for storage and certainly almost no consistency or rationale for kind of materials stored. In short, the situation was bordering on chaotic with the vault rapidly filling up with useless material.

In response to the rapid filling of the Records Center, increasing demand for record storage, uncertainty about retention or disposal by agencies of their records, lack of conformity in the treatment of records going from agency to agency, and uneconomical retention of records by agencies we began a records management program. This program was untertaken, I might point out, without additional State resources. Executive Order #17 signed by the Governor in fiscal year 1978 formed a Records Management Advisory Committee (RMAC) with representation from the Department of State, Department of Administrative Services, Department of Justice and the Offices of the Administrator of the Courts, the Auditor of Accounts, and Management Budget and Planning. This group prepared, with the consultation of every State, County, and local government agency in the State of Delaware, and established uniform schedules for the preservation or disposition of all records created by not only State agencies but all public bodies in the State of Delaware. I think you can appreciate that to do this and to create a written plan (a copy of which we would be happy to provide if you wish) without additional resources was a substantial achievement indeed. The project was accomplished with the help of a CETA team which inventoried the records of all the agencies of government and presented its findings to the Records Management Advisory Committee. This effort resulted in the identification and scheduling of all the records of all the State, County and local agencies.

During this process, it became evident that microfilm production had to be increased in order to provide for the effective management of the diverse and voluminous records identified in the inventory. We could no longer keep producing reams and reams of paper with little or no thought to their ultimate disposition. It therefore became the second priority (after the inventory) to diversify and expand our microfilm operations. This we did in fiscal year 1980 and we plan further expansion in fiscal year 1981 if the recommended budget is The next priority will be to strengthen the technical capability of the records management staff and automate record monitoring processes in the Records Center. Because we started with no trained staff this priority is of the most importance and its effect throughout the State will be substantial. By the fiscal year 1982 budget we will be ready to undertake additional records management projects. Forms management might very will be among those projects which would be a priority at that time. I might point out, however, that while there would doubtless be some sayings from an operational forms management program it is our belief that the savings resulting from a fully implemented general records management and microfilm program, as reflected in our fiscal year 1981 budget request, would be far, far greater.

At the current time, we do not have the personnel to implement the program outline in SB 499. Forms management is a technical field which requires knowledge that none of our staff currently possesses. Neither do we have the clerical personnel sufficient to bear this task. SB 499 does not seem to provide for any of these evantualities. I might add that, even if SB 499 came with an appropriation, we could not now carry out its We must proceed to develop a comprehensive records management program, of which forms management is only part. in a rational pattern. Catching up with the records management commitments we have already made and implementing the intensified microfilming projects will take every bit of effort in fiscal year 1981 from a Bureau that is already overburdened. To divert us from this systematic process of building a records management program by involving us now in a forms control effort would be a classic case of putting the cart before the

I would like to suggest that, in the alternative to SB 499, our Department keep you updated and briefed on the progress of the records management program and work with you in the implementation of a forms management program as part of the overall records management effort. We believe this can be done without the need for additional legislation and, if done in a sound, efficient and practical way, can be done with minimal additional resources.

I appreciate the opportunity of providing our thoughts and trust you will let me know if there is any further information you feel would be helpful in this effort.

J. Caleb Boggs, who served with great distinction for two terms as a Senator from Delaware, observes today his 71st birthday.

In special ceremonies tomorrow, the people of Delaware will pay well-deserved tribute to Cale Boggs, who represented them with surpassing skills not only as a Member of the Senate but as a Member of the House of Representatives and as a two-term Governor of his State.

The Federal building in Wilmington will be dedicated tomorrow as the J. Caleb Boggs Federal Building.

It was my personal pleasure to serve with Senator Boggs on the Committee on Public Works during my first term in the Senate, and I came to know him especially well through our mutual services on the Air and Water Pollution Sub-Committee.

Cale Boggs was the first ranking Republican of that subcommittee, created in 1963, and I was honored in later years to succeed him in that post.

Rarely has any Senator earned the unversal affection and respect of the entire Senate membership as Cale Boggs did. Our former colleague from Montana, Lee Metcalf, said during Senator Boggs' reelection campaign in 1966 that if the Senate itself could vote, Cale Boggs would win, 99 to 0. And if Cale voted for himself, it would be unanimous.

Similarly, the late Robert F. Kennedy, then a Senator from New York, was called upon in that 1966 campaign to speak for Cale Boggs' opponent. Senator Kennedy, at the height of his political appeal, asked his friend Cale Boggs what he should do. Cale, in his customary way, said, "Bob, you have to take care of your friends and your party." But Robert Kennedy, perhaps the most popular Democrat in America in that period, declined to campaign against the Senator from Delaware.

Mr. President, these are stories of a special man, and I know my colleagues join me in wishing J. Caleb Boggs well on his birthday today and on his day of tribute tomorrow.

The privilege of the floor was extended to Harry Terry and Tom Sandbach (Senate Attorneys) after which the roll call vote on the Bill was taken and revealed:

Senators Adams, Berndt, Cook, Cordrey, Hale, Hughes, Kearns, Knox, Littleton, Marshall, Martin, McDowell, Murphy, Sharp, Weiss, Zimmerman - 16.

NO: Sentors Arnold, McCullough and Spence - 3.

ABSENT: Senators Cicione and Holloway - 2.

Therefore, the Bill was declared passed by the Senate and sent to the House for consideration.

SB 638 was reported from the Executive Committee - 5 Merits.

SB 638 was taken up for consideration on motion of Senator McDowell under suspension of the necessary rules:

SB 638 - AN ACT TO REQUIRE GRANT-IN-AID APPLICANTS TO SUBMIT ZERO-BASED BUDGETS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Senator Cicione moved that the Bill be laid on the table. The roll call vote on the motion was taken and revealed:
