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

GE Solar lays off 86

G the second and third production shifts as well as some engineering staff at the its Glasgow manufacturing site.

facturing site. The PV Daily website reports about 86 employees were released. The website and other published reports said the operation employed 200 at one point.

A spokesperson for GE told PV Daily, "The market for the solar technology manufactured at the Newark, Delaware facility has seen a sudden and dramatic decline, which required us to align our output with the market demand. The Newark plant will continue to manufacture solar modules, but operations in this area will be reduced from three shifts to one shift, requiring fewer workers."

General Electric purchased the assets of bankrupt AstroPower to gain a bigger foothold in the solar power market. AstroPower, founded in Newark, with technology developed at the University of Delaware, fell victim to low energy prices and other problems as it attempted to become a global company. GE has also purchased other young companies in an effort to gain a bigger foothold in the solar business.

GE and other companies in the solar business, have fallen victim to a deep recession and low oil prices that have hammered the market for new construction and renovation projects.

Blue & Gold dining club to close its doors July 1

The Blue & Gold Club is closing its doors on July 1, the victim of changing dining styles and a big deficit.

The members-only dining club, serving University of Delaware alumni, faculty, staff, parents, students and friends, also cited a decline in memberships and a deficit that could not be underwritten in the current environment.

Established in 1971, the Blue & Gold Club is located in a 1926 Georgian house at 44 Kent Way that was given to the university in 1966. Over the years, the landmark building served as temporary administrative office space, a women's residence hall and a student infirmary during the renovation of other buildings on the campus.

Membership in the club is \$50 per year, but declined 26 percent in the last eight years. There are currently 943 individual members, down from 1,274 members in 2001.

"Fine-dining restaurants such as

the Blue & Gold Club have lost significant market share to casual concepts, every year during the last decade. One result has been the decline of such membership clubs nationally. When the club was originally established, there were significantly fewer dining options available on the campus and in the city of Newark," said Ron Cole, president of the Blue & Gold Club board of directors and UD professor of food and beverage management. The Blue & Gold Club also had competition from within the university in the form of Vita Nova, a fine-dining establishment operated by the UD, Hotel and Restaurant program.


program. "The Blue & Gold Club was a wonderful dining option on campus but in the current economic environment it is an activity that we cannot afford to continue to subsidize," stated UD Executive Vice President Scott Douglass.

Over the years the University and club engaged in several strategies to

re-engineer the club's operations and engaged in marketing efforts to increase membership participation.

increase membership participation. A large operating deficit and the cost for deferred maintenance and capital improvements to the club are estimated at nearly \$2 million over the next five years.

Staff members of the club have been informed of the closing, and, when possible, they will be considered for other positions at the University. A future use for the building has not been determined.

Lewis has been arraigned and released on \$24,000 unsecured bail and ordered to have no contact with any of the victims

at 28 Annabelle Street, Newark, while attending a party at Sigma Alpha Mu fraternity. Griffin was a pledge of the fraternity. The information leading to the charges was developed during the investigation of Griffin's death and does not imply direct culpability in the death police emphasized.

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

Newark bank robbed

On Monday afternoon, a masked robber entered the Wachovia Bank branch at 622 South College Avenue, Newark. The suspect displayed a silver handgun and demanded cash from two tellers. The employees complied with the demand, and the suspect left the bank. Before he got to his car in a near-

by parking lot, a dye pack exploded. Some of the stolen cash was recovered in the parking lot.

The suspect got into a silver

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Chevy Malibu with a New York registration of DXJ 9876. He drove southbound on South College Avenue. Near the intersection with West Chestnut Hill Road, the suspect's vehicle struck three other cars, causing damage to its front end and right side. The vehicle continued southbound and was last seen driving onto the ramp from S. College Avenue onto southbound I-95

No one was injured. The suspect is described as a black male, average height, thin build, and bald. He was wearing a black ski mask during the robbery.

7-11 robbed

The 7-11 on East Delaware Ave. was robbed at around 4:40 p.m. Monday morning, Newark Police reported According to police, the suspect walked behind the service counter, displayed a silver knife to the store employee, and demanded money. The clerk opened the register and the suspect removed the cash from the drawer. The suspect also grabbed a few packs of cigarettes, and then left the store. He was last seen walking toward South Chapel Street. The victim, a 20 year-old male employee, was not injured.

The suspect is described as a black male, 20 to 30 years of age, 5 foot 10 to 6 feet tall, weighing 160 to 180 lbs, clean shaven. He wore an orange hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans. The jeans have a design on the rear pocket. Additional robberies took place at 7-11s, but police have not directly linked the suspect or suspects.

The dietary health threat of animal products

A massive National Cancer Institute study in this week's Archives of Internal Medicine corroborates dozens of earlier findings linking meat consumption with premature deaths and reaffirms the role of lifestyle in

determining our life expectancy. The ten-year study of 545,653 Americans found that those consuming the equivalent of a small hamburger were 33 percent more likely to die, mostly from heart disease and cancer, than those who ate the least meat.

Last October, a study of 16,000 people in 52 countries, published by the American Heart Association, found that a "western" diet of meat. fried foods, and salty snacks raised the risk of heart attacks by 35 percent. Conversely, a diet rich in fruits and vegetables reduced heart attack risk 30 percent. A 24-year study of 88,517 female nurses, published in last April's Archives of Internal Medicine found that those who ate lots of fruits. vegetables, and whole grains, reduced their risk of heart attack and stroke by 24 and 18 percent, respectively.

A landmark review of 7,000 diet and health reports, released in the fall of 2007 by the World Cancer Research Fund, found a "convincing" link



between consumption of meat and an elevated risk of colon cancer, as well as a "likely" link with cancers of the lung, stomach, pancreas, esophagus, prostate, and uterus.

It never ceases to amaze me how quickly we condemn regulatory authorities for traces of toxins in our food or water, while ignoring the much larger dietary health threat of animal products.

National Bank was re-chartered as Farmers Trust Company of Newark in 1913 then moved to a new building at 82 East Main Street in 1926 (now Wilmington Trust). Stores have filled the old building including the State Restaurant (1940's through 1960's), Mary Ann's Nut Farm (1980's) and TCBY since the 1990's. time in the gym keeping fit. "I have a full agenda and lots of 'to do' lists, but it feels good to cross things off and then start a new list," she said.


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
