

Herrmanns Florida

October 10th. 1863

Dear Sister

I take this opportunity to let you know that we are well at present and hope those firm birds may find you all the same. I received your letter the twentieth of September and was very glad to hear from you but I haven't had time to answer until now on account of moving we left Morris Island the second of this month on the Steamer Boston and landed here about the seventh or eighth I don't know which nor do I know we got some fresh bread two night we haven't had any food about four months the crackers was very good which we had only they

had worms in them about a half inch
long and about a dozen in each
cracker. I had a kind of a moshen
two reinlist for three years
but havent durd it yet but I
think I will if there is eney chance
for me in the Army. Joseph Booth
died the night we left Morris Island
he had his discharge two go home
and was left in the ninth main
hospital with these few remarks
I will chose good by for this
time but you must write
soon and tel the rest two
I still remain your brother
