I will try and Be contented and if I Cannot content my Self I will go in the Navy But as you Say when once free from the Army I think I will be Better Satisfied...I Suppose I will not have another Chance to write to you for Some time So if you dont hear from me you need not Be uneasey...the weather is very warm this is A warmer day down here than aney day we had in maryland the last Summer I was at home.
