To the Delaware State Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On April 22, 1986, I received Senate Bill No. 412, which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 60, TITLE 7, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO THE DISPOSITION OF SOLID WASTE."

This bill would prohibit the Secretary of Natural Resources and Environmental Control from issuing "any permit which would empower a person to transport solid waste into the State of Delaware from without for the purpose of storing, processing or disposing of such solid waste in the State of Delaware". Because this legislation is blatantly unconstitutional, and because there is an alternative, constitutional solution to the problem this legislation addresses, I am returning Senate Bill No. 412 without my signature.

No one in this State, particularly the Governor and the Secretary of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, wants trash imported into Delaware from other states. Unfortunately, there are legal limits on what any individual state may do to limit the importation of solid waste. The people of New Jersey did not want the City of Philadelphia's garbage, but in 1978 the United States Supreme Court struck down as unconstitutional a law which effectively prevented the dumping of out-of-state trash in New Jersey. City of Philadelphia v. New Jersey, 437 U.S. 617 (1978). In that case the United States Supreme Court ruled that the New Jersey statute was a protectionist measure, and thus was per se invalid under the Commerce Clause of the U.S. Constitution. Since the New Jersey legislation discriminated against "articles of commerce" coming from outside the state, the law violated the Commerce Clause since there was no reason, apart from its origin, to treat such garbage differently. Despite New Jersey's legitimate environmental concern, the Supreme Court concluded that the state could not attempt to isolate itself from a problem common to many by erecting a barrier against the movement of interstate trade.

The Supreme Court decision in City of Philadelphia v. New Jersey applies with even greater force to Senate Bill No. 412, which actually is far more restrictive, and therefore, far more flawed, than the unconstitutional New Jersey statute. Senate Bill No. 412 not only bans the deposit of out-of-state solid waste in Delaware, which by itself is impermissible under the Supreme Court's decision, the legislation also bans even the processing of such waste for deposit outside the state, which is an even clearer intrusion on interstate commerce than the New Jersey statute. In exercising my constitutional power to approve or disapprove legislation, I cannot simply ignore the constitutional defect in Senate Bill No. 412, as apparently the General Assembly did in passing this legislation without a dissenting vote.

Although a state may not simply ban the importation of solid waste, there may be other ways to address this problem. Without question the State may regulate the storing, processing, or disposing of solid waste in Delaware and require those who seek to engage in such activity to adhere to certain conditions set forth in a permit or license. An amendment to Senate Bill No. 412 clarifying this power regarding out-of-state solid waste was prepared but not introduced in the House of Representatives. Furthermore, consistent with the Constitution, the State of Delaware may be able to restrict to State residents access to State-owned landfills. I am prepared to work with the General Assembly to explore both options and enact appropriate legislation.

In addition to the bill's unconstitutionality I must express my concern about the manner in which it was introduced and passed. The legislation was rushed through the General Assembly with just cursory committee review. It passed despite its constitutional defects, which were attempted to be corrected by way of the unintroduced amendment. With legislation of this importance and legal complexity, the General Assembly should engage in more meaningful deliberation.

Regardless of the manner in which it was introduced and passed, however, Senate Bill No. 412 remains unconstitutional. For this reason I am returning it without my signature.

To the Delaware State Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On June 12, 1986, I received Senate Bill No. 420, which is entitled : AN ACT AMENDING TITLE 5, CHAPTER 9, TITLE 12, CHAPTERS 2, 13, 15, 33 AND 35, AND TITLE 25, CHAPTER 5; AND INSERTING A NEW CHAPTER 34 OF TITLE 12 OF THE DELAWARE CODE BY REVISING AND ENACTING CERTAIN LAWS RELATING TO BANKS AND TRUST COMPANIES AS FIDUCIARIES, AND TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF ESTATES AND TRUSTS.

This bill substantially rewrites Delaware law relating to estate and trust administration, fiduciary duties and liability, and the common law Rule Against Perpetuities. Because one provision of this bill would preempt the full faith and credit the State of Delaware owes to the laws of its sister states, and thereby violates fundamental principles of comity, I am returning Senate Bill No. 420 without my signature.

Section 3 of Senate Bill No. 420 provides for the admission of the wills of non-domiciliaries to probate in Delaware. Under this legislation, such wills can be admitted to probate in Delaware even if they have been rejected from probate in the domiciliary jurisdiction, as long as the grounds for rejection would not affect the validity of the will in Delaware. In any event, such wills by this legislation would "have the same force and effect as if originally proved and allowed in this State, and it shall be allowed to operate on any property of the testator, wherever located".

The effect of this language is to permit the State of Delaware to administer a testator's property located not in Delaware but in the testator's state of domicile, according to the terms of a will that the domiciliary state rejects as invalid under its own law. Because it permits this result, Senate Bill No. 420 violates the Full Faith and Credit Clause of the United States Constitution, which requires each State to recognize, and give effect to, the laws and judgments of other States pertaining to persons and property within their jurisdiction. Aside from this constitutional constraint principles of comity compel the State of Delaware to respect the dignity of the legislative and judicial proceedings of its sister states, if Delaware expects to command corresponding respect elsewhere. Section 3 of Senate Bill No. 420 offends these principles, which the Delaware courts long have recognized and enforced. <u>Cf. Lewis v. Hanson</u>, 128 A.2d 819 (Del. Supr. 1957), <u>aff'd sub nom. Hanson v. Denckla</u>, 357 U.S. 235 (1958).

It has been represented to me that the drafters of this legislation are aware of this problem, and others, with Senate Bill No. 420 and are committed to offering corrective legislation when the General Assembly reconvenes next January. I acknowledge this commitment, but I cannot approve this legislation, knowing it to have a serious constitutional flaw of this nature, premised upon the anticipation of corrective legislation six months down the road.

I veto Senate Bill No. 420 with great reluctance. This legislation significantly improves the Delaware law of trusts and estates, enabling much more flexible trust administration and incorporating more modern concepts of fiduciary accountability. This bill represents the culmination of an extraordinary amount of effort by many individuals.

The outstanding merits of the other provisions of Senate Bill No. 420, however, cannot mask the fatal flaw in Section 3 of the bill. For the reasons stated above, I am returning Senate Bill No. 420 without my signature.

STATE OF DELAWARE Office of the Governor July 8, 1986

To the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On July 1, 1986, I received Senate Bill No. 550 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 17, TITLE 18, DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO LIMITED REPRESENTATIVES."

This bill eliminates the requirement that limited representatives (insurance agents who are licensed to sell certain lines of insurance) be examined and further required to take continuing education courses that touch on areas outside of those limited lines of authority for which they are licensed to sell insurance in Delaware.

This bill was drafted based on what appears to be the underlying premise that limited representatives continue to be a separate and identifiable classification of licensee regulated by the Insurance Department. I am informed by the Insurance Department that the classification of limited representative no longer exists since the repeal of 18 <u>Del</u>. <u>C</u>. §1706 formerly entitled: "Definition and Responsibilities of Limited Representative" effective September 15, 1985 (see <u>Del</u>. <u>Laws</u>, c 142, §4). All limited representatives formerly licenses as such by the Insurance Department are now licensed as agents.

If Senate Bill No. 550 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 were enacted into law, it would have the effect of recreating the classification of licensee known as limited representatives without defining the term and without setting forth the responsibilities of that class of licensee. Furthermore, there is another technical flaw that appears in Section 2 of the bill which directs that 18 <u>Del.</u> <u>C.</u> §1725 be amended to add a new sentence which reads in part: "No regulation may require additional or continuing education for limited representatives qualified and licenses under Section 1715(b) of this chapter \ldots "(Emphasis added)

This(b) of this chapter ... "(Emphasis added) The reference to 18 <u>Del.</u> C. §1715(b) in Section 2 of Senate Bill No. 550 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 is misplaced. In conjunction with the repeal of 18 <u>Del.</u> C. §1706, it should be noted that 18 <u>Del.</u> C. §1715(b) as it related to limited representatives was also repealed effective September 15, 1985, and subsequently replaced by a paragraph relating to "Broker's Certificate of Authority" which has nothing to do with the subject matter of Senate Bill No. 550 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1. All of these changes are not contained in the hard bound Volume 10 which contains Title 18, but rather can be found in the 1985 Interim Supplement (separate volume).

For the reasons cited above, I am, therefore, returning Senate Bill No. 550 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 to the Delaware State Senate without my signature.

To the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On July 1, 1986, I received Senate Bill No. 528 which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 5, PART I, TITLE II OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO PROHIBITIONS AGAINST CERTAIN TYPES OF KNIVES." The purpose of this bill is the recodify ll <u>Del</u>. <u>C</u>. §1446 by defining two separate crimes, one of which is new and involves the possession, use or delivery of a ballistic knife.

Senate Bill No. 528 defines and creates two separate criminal offenses:

1. Unlawfully dealing with a prohibited knife (switchblade knife) - 11 Del. C. §1446(a); and

2. Possession of a prohibited knife (ballistic knife) - 11 Del. C. §1446(b).

The Bill is flawed to the extent that while it creates two separate criminal offenses, only one of those offenses has been classified as either a felony or misdemeanor. Senate Bill No. 528 creates a new II <u>Del</u>. C. §1446(c) which classifies the crime of "unlawfully dealing with a prohibited kniffe" as a Class B misdemeanor. This bill fails to classify the newly created crime of Possession of a Prohibited Kniffe as either a felony or misdemeanor nor does the bill establish the grade of misdemeanor or felony (i.e. A. B. C. or unclassified). This failure to classify the new crime would render the bill in violation of II <u>Del</u>. C. §4202(b) which states: "Each misdemeanor defined in this Criminal Code is either a Class A or a Class B or a Class C misdemeanor, as expressly designated in the section defining it." (Emphasis added)

The section of the Delaware Code defining classification of felonies (II <u>Del.</u> C, \$4201(b)) also has the identical requirement that classification once a crime is defined in the Criminal Code, must be designated in the section defining it. Without defining the classification of misdemeanor or felony that attaches to the crime of Possession of a Prohibited Knife, no penalty in the form of either imprisonment and/or fine may be imposed by any of this State's courts. And furthermore, a crime without a penalty cannot be enforced or serve as a deterrent.

For the reasons cited above, I am, therefore, returning Senate Bill No. 528 to the Delaware State Senate without my signature.

To the Delaware State Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On June 30, 1986, I received Senate Bill No. 411 which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 9 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE AUTHORITY OF KENT CONTY TO ESTABLISH BUILDING PERMIT FEES AND ESTABLISH PENALTIES FOR OFFENSES OR VIOLATION OF ITS CONSTRUCTION CODE."

This bill provides Kent County with the exclusive authority to establish fees for building permits and, by ordinance, to establish penalties and fines for violations of Chapter 44, Title 9, of the Delaware Code.

Section 2 of the Bill specifically provides that Kent County Levy Court shall prescribe, by ordinance, "penalties for offenses for violations...of this Chapter..." Senate Bill No. 411 did not, however, amend 9 <u>Del. C.</u> \$4414(b) which provides: "(b) Whoever violates this Section shall be fined not more than \$100 or imprisoned not more than 10 days, or both."

If Senate Bill No. 4ll were enacted into law, Chapter 44, Title 9, of the Delaware Code would have conflicting penalty provisions, one providing for the Kent County Levy Court to enact an ordinance to set penalties and violations (9 <u>Del.</u> C. §4410) and the penalties that are specifically prescribed at 9 <u>Del.</u> C. §4414(b) in its entirety.

For the reasons cited above, I am, therefore, returning Senate Bill No. 411 to the Delaware State Senate without my signature.

To the Delaware State Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

I am returning without my signature Senate Bill 114, received on June 26, 1986, which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 51, TITLE 29, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO LEAVE FOR VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY SERVICE." The intent of the bill is to allow State employees who are active volunteer firefighters or active auxiliary members of fire companies, with the approval of the State Agency for whom they work to respond to fire, rescue, ambulance or other emergency calls during their regular hours of employment without loss of pay, vacation, sick leave or personal leave time.

The subject matter of the bill is already covered by existing Merit Rule 6.0430 as it applies to merit system employees, with two caveats. Senate Bill 114 extends this benefit to active auxiliary fire fighters and broadens the scope of employees covered to other public employees outside the merit rules. It is unknown how many employees are affected or potentially affected by the contents of this bill.

All Delawareans are indebted to volunteer firefighters and their support groups who volunteer countless hours and risk their lives to protect out lives and property. Such service should not and does not go unrewarded, however, fiscal responsibility dicates that this bill cannot be supported.

A great many of the employees to whom this bill would extend the benefit are currently permitted under the existing Merit Rule to participate in such emergency activities without loss of pay provided the agency agrees to such arrangement. The breadth of this bill would extend that beyond current affected employees at a potential cost to the State which is unknown.

From a management perspective, such items should be handled administratively rather than statutorily. Codification of these types of rules make the system rigid and unable to respond to changing times and conditions. Such changes are better left to the State Personnel Commission to respond to the needs of the State and its communities.

For the reasons cited above, I am returning without my signature Senate Bill 114.

STATE OF DELAWARE Office of the Governor July 3, 1986

To the Delaware State Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On June 30, 1986, I received Senate Bill No. 300 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 21, TITLE 24 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS IN OPTOMETRY."

This bill was written by the Joint Sunset Committee and makes numerous changes to the Board of Optometry, its composition, and procedures under which it should operate.

Section 4 of the Bill amends 21 <u>Del. C. \$2112</u> by striking from the first sentence of \$2112 the following: "But which shall in no case exceed \$30.00 biennially."

The effect of striking the above-referenced phrase is to remove the \$30.00 cap on the licensing fee charged by the Board for the renewal of a license to practice optometry in this State. By removing the cap, and not imposing any restrictions or formula to be used in determing the amount of said fee, the legislature has delegated to the Board of Optometry the power to set the fee in such an amount as they please, or presumably, in an amount that they deem is appropriate.

A bill which delegates all power to a professional licensing board to set a registration or license fee as it pleases violates <u>Del</u>. <u>Const.</u> Art. VIII, $\S10(a)$ which provides: "The effective rate of any tax levied or license fee imposed by this Sate may not be increased except pursuant to an act of the General Assembly adopted with the concurrence of three-fifths of all members of each House." (Emphasis added)

It is important to know that it is not unconstitutional for the General Assembly to delegate to an administrative agency or professional licensing board the power to set the amount of a fee. What distinguishes a constitutional from an unconstitutional delegation is whether the legislature delegated the power to set the "rate" of the tax or fee. The primary definition given to the word "rate" by the Random House Disctionary of the English Language (Unabridged, 1966) is "...The amount of a charge or a payment with reference to some basis of calculation."

Thus, a "rate" is not necessarily a fixed dollar amount, but it can also be a standard or formula by which a dollar amount can be calculated. <u>George A. Knotten Asso. v. Fulton Kotten Mills, Inc.</u>, 307 F. Supp. 1396, 1399 (SDNY 1970).

Clearly, this legislation, if enacted into law, would not provide the Board of Optometry with any guidance, limitations, standard or formula, to be used by the Board of Optometry in setting the dollar amount for a license fee.

I commend the Joint Sunset Committee for their efforts in modernizing the statutory provisions under which Delaware licensing boards operate. However, because the licensing fee system established by Senate Bill No. 300 as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 is in contravention of <u>Del</u>. Const. Art. VIII, §10(a), I am returning it without my signature.

RULES OF THE SENATE SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 4

IN REFERENCE TO TEMPORARY RULES OF THE DELAWARE STATE SENATE.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly that the following Rules of the Senate be and they hereby are adopted as Temporary Rules for the governing of the present session, until further action of the Senate:

- Rule 1. ORDER OF BUSINESS
 - 1. Calling of the Senate to Order.
 - 2. Prayer by Chaplain.
 - 3. Salute to Flag
 - 4. Roll Call.
 - 5. Reading of Journal.
 - 6. Presentation of petitions, memorials or communications.
 - 7. Reports from Standing and Special Committees.
 - 8. Reporting by the Secretary of prior filed bills and resolutions.
 - 9. Introductions of all other bills and resolutions by members.
 - 10. Agenda for the day.
 - 11. Miscellaneous business.

Rule 2. CONVENING OF SENATE

Unless otherwise ordered by a majority of its members, the Senate will convene every day, except Monday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, at 1:30 p.m. All proceedings of the Senate shall be public. Executive sessions by the Senate are expressly prohibited.

Rule 3. ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS

- (a) Every member shall be in his place at the time to which the Senate stands adjourned.
- (b) No Senator shall absent himself from the service of the Senate without leave.

Rule 4. ROLL CALL; READING OF JOURNAL

Each legislative day and before the Senate proceeds to the consideration of any business, the Secretary shall call the names of the members in alphabetical order, and shall then read the Journal of the preceding legislative day, which shall be approved or corrected by order of the Senate.

Rule 5. CONTENTS OF JOURNAL

The proceedings of the Senate shall be briefly and accurately stated on the Journal; messages to the Governor in full; the titles of all bills and resolutions; every motion with the name of the member making the same, except motions for adjournment; the names of the members voting on all roll calls.

Rule 6. PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS, MEMORIALS OR COMMUNICATIONS TO THE SENATE

(a) After the Journal is read, the Presiding Officer shall lay before the Senate communications or messages from the Governor, reports and communications from Departments or State Boards, and other communications addressed to the Senate, and such bills, joint resolutions and other messages from the House of Representatives as may be upon his table, undisposed of.

(b) When petitions, memorials and other papers addressed to the Senate are presented by the President, or a member, the contents thereof shall be briefly stated.

(c) The Presiding Officer may at any time lay, and it shall be in order at any time for a Senator to move to lay, before the Senate, any bill or other matter sent to the Senate by the Governor or the House of Representatives and any question pending at the time shall be suspended for this purpose. Any motion so made shall be determined without debate.

(d) Messages from the Governor or from the House of Representatives may be received at any stage or proceedings, except while the Journal is being read, or while a question of order or a motion to adjourn is pending.

(e) When a message is brought to the Senate by the Governor or his messenger, or by a member of the House of Representatives, or any officer thereof, the members of the Senate shall rise upon their feet, if so directed by the Presiding Officer.
