Newark High students install peace and remembrance garden

In a peaceful, shady spot in the Newark High School courtyard, a yellow pole stands as a beacon of peace, inclusiveness and remembrance.

The pole – emblazoned with the phrase “May Peace Prevail on Earth” in eight languages, plus Braille – is the focal point of a new peace and remembrance garden that students installed as part of an Earth Day service project on Saturday.

“It represents that we’re OK with everyone and we’re a diverse group of people,” said sophomore Sierra Turell, who helped install the pole along with fellow members of the Newark Nature Society.

Teacher Bob McDowell, who rescued the pole from the trash, said the garden is dedicated to the students Newark High has lost over the years.

“It’s a nice, peaceful spot people can come to,” McDowell said.

The peace and remembrance garden is the latest addition to the courtyard, which contains a rain garden, native plants and bird

feeders. A few years ago, the National Wildlife Federation designated it a Certified Wildlife Habitat.

Benny St. project approved

Newark council members sworn in

Council members Jason Lawhorn, Jen Wallace and Stu Markham were sworn into office during a brief organizational meeting April 19.

One by one, they raised their right hand and recited the oath of office administered by City Secretary Renee Bensley.

Lawhorn, who was accompanied by his wife, Colleen, and his two sons, will begin his first term on council after beating out two other newcomers for the District 5 seat vacated by Luke Chapman, who did not seek re-election. A 41-year-old Fairfield resident, Lawhorn works as research manager for Advanced Materials Technologies in

Wilmington and serves as vice president of Newark American Little League.

Wallace was sworn in for her second term representing District 3 after defeating former city employee Ricky Nietubicz in the April 10 election. A 46-year-old resident of Barksdale Estates, Wallace works as membership and marketing coordinator for the American Society of Cytopathology and as a freelance writer. She was first elected to council in 2016.

Markham, who ran unopposed in District 6, is beginning his seventh term, making him the longest consecutively serving council member. A 59-year-old resident of The Hunt at Louviers, he manages a software development team at JP Morgan Chase. He was

first elected to council in 2006.

At last week's meeting, council unanimously re-elected Markham deputy mayor, continuing the tradition of giving that title to the council member with the most seniority.

The deputy mayor presides over meetings during the mayor's absence. Coincidentally, Markham was called in to service last week because Mayor Polly Sierer was out of town.

Downtown Newark spring concert series kicks off next week

The Newark Parks and Recreation Department's annual spring concert series will kick off next week with a performance by local favorite Club Phred.

Newark names trail for fallen firefighter Jerry Fickes

A fallen hero will forever be memorialized in a Newark park. On Monday, city council unanimously approved a resolution to name a trail in Rittenhouse Park after Jerry Fickes, a longtime firefighter from Newark who died in the line of duty two years ago. "This is what we need to do to

ensure people will, in perpetuity, understand his sacrifice," said Councilman Jerry Clifton, who spearheaded the effort. Fickes, 51, was one of two Wilmington Fire Department firefighters who died Sept. 24, 2016, when a burning building in Canby Park collapsed. A third firefighter died of her injuries several weeks later. Fickes was also a volunteer

with Newark's Aetna Hose, Hook and Ladder Company and at one time served as an assistant chief. Colleagues described him as a quiet but hardworking firefighter who was always the first one into the fire and wasn't afraid to get dirty. "He was the personification of a great public servant," said Clifton, who knew Fickes through Aetna and family members. Some

time later this year, officials will hold a dedication ceremony at the trail in Rittenhouse Park, located off West Chestnut Hill Road. The 1.9-mile trail, which takes hikers through the woods and along the Christina Creek, is a good tribute to Fickes, who was an avid outdoorsman, Clifton said. "It's a very serene, almost reverent, trail," Clifton said. "This is so fitting for his memory."

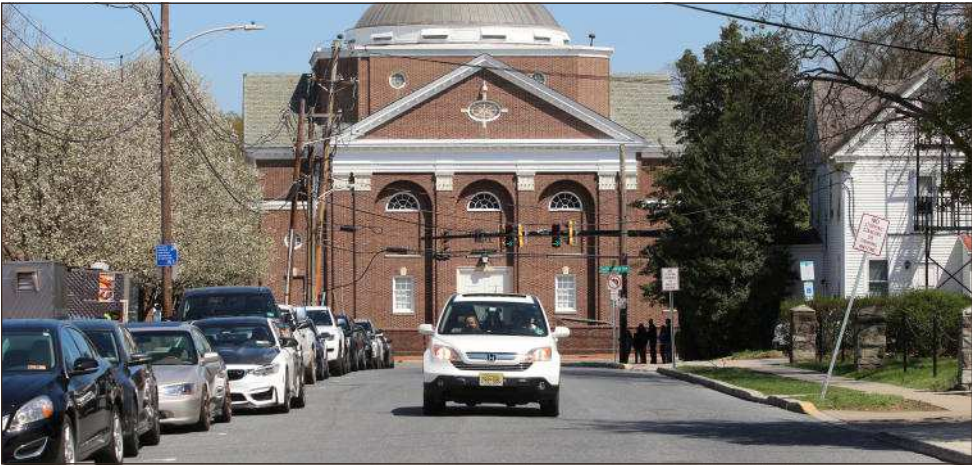
Proposal: Make portion of Amstel Avenue one-way

Plan would accommodate cyclists on South College Avenue

A portion of Amstel Avenue soon may be restricted to one-way traffic as part of a plan to better accommodate cyclists on South College Avenue. With the proposed change, city officials would be able to move the parking meters on South College Avenue to Amstel Avenue, achieving a longtime goal of bike advocates, who say the parking spaces impede cycling. South College Avenue has a bike lane, but that bike lane disappears in front of the Morris Library, where

there are 15 metered parking spaces. "This has always been one of the sticking points, these car spaces that create a break in the bike lane and force people to go either on the sidewalk or out into the

traffic lane," said Mark Deshon, chair of Bike Newark. With the continued development of the STAR Campus and a new University of Delaware dorm slated for South College Avenue, the road will become an even

more important thoroughfare, he added. "This corridor is going to be terrifically critical," Deshon said. "We'd like to see it be something more than just car traffic." Tim Filasky, acting pub-

lic works director, said addressing the gap in the bike lane is one of the goals listed in the 2014 Newark Bicycle Plan. "The current proposal involving Amstel was initiated by the city after several years of brainstorming on ways to modify the parking on northbound South College to remove the gap in the bike lane," Filasky said. In order to avoid losing the parking spaces – and the revenue they generate – the city would move them to the south side of Amstel Avenue. Currently, there are meters on the north side, but the road is not wide enough to accommodate two rows of parking plus two travel lanes. Therefore, Amstel Avenue would be open only to eastbound traffic – cars heading toward South College Avenue – between Or-

chard Road and South College Avenue. The rest of the road would remain open to two-way traffic. Motorists on South College Avenue would no longer be able to turn onto Amstel Avenue and will instead have to take Kent Way to Orchard Road and then turn onto Amstel Avenue. "With that, we would achieve getting a bike lane on South College Avenue and not losing any parking," Parking Supervisor Courtney Mulvanity said, adding that the city recently extended the time limit on those meters from four hours to eight in an attempt to convince students to park there rather in Main Street lots. The city's traffic committee unanimously supported the plan last week, and it will move on to city council for final approval.

Men robbed at gunpoint outside Studio Green Apartments

Two men were robbed at gunpoint outside the Studio Green Apartments early Sunday morning, police said.

The robbery happened just after 12:30 a.m. in the 100 block of Thorn Lane, according to Sgt. Gerald Bryda, a spokesman for the Newark Police Department.

The victims, ages 19 and

29, were standing in front of an entrance to the apartment building when the robber approached, pointed a handgun at them and demanded money.

The robber then took the victim's cellphones and ran

away.

The perpetrator was described as a 6-foot-tall black man with a thin build. He was wearing a dark jacket, light-colored pants and a dark mask over his face.

Police: Man threatened two with gun during argument

A man was arrested last week after allegedly threatening two people with a gun during an argument inside a Newark home, police said.

The incident happened at 4:45 p.m. April 19 in the 200 block of Peach Road, just off West Park Place.

The victims, a 20-year-old man and a 21-year-old woman, were arguing with the residents of the home over a monetary debt, according to Sgt. Gerald

Bryda, a spokesman for the Newark Police Department. Bryda said the victims and the residents were acquaintances.

During the argument, Charles R. Dunagan, 33, emerged from a bedroom, pointed a handgun at the victims and threatened to shoot them if they did not leave, Bryda said.

The victims, who had never seen Dunagan before, fled from the home and called 911. Police arrested Dunagan and found the handgun during a search of the home.

Dunagan is listed as living in Bear, but it's not clear if he was staying at the Peach Road home or what is relationship to the residents is, Bryda said.

He was charged with two counts of aggravated menacing, two counts of terroristic threatening and one count of possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony. He was committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$23,000 cash bail.

Newark man sentenced for assaulting woman during carjacking

A Newark man will be sentenced to at least 50 years in prison after pleading guilty to cutting a woman while trying to steal her car.

James Branch, 38, attempted to climb into the woman's car outside a Shoprite grocery store in Wilmington in September 2017. As they struggled, he cut the woman on her

thigh, leg and elbow, but the woman was able to escape and run back into the store to get help.

Branch, who has been declared a habitual offender because of previous convictions for robbery, assault and kidnapping, faces a minimum mandatory of 50 years in prison. He will be sentenced in July.

Newark man gets 9 years for child porn

A Newark man caught uploading child pornography to the internet was recently sentenced to nine years in prison.

Justin Eggleston, 32, was arrested in March 2017 after the state's Child Predator Task Force was tipped off by an undisclosed online service. A forensic examination of his computer revealed

several photos and videos of child pornography.

Eggleston pleaded guilty to two counts of dealing in child pornography.

He must register as a Tier 2 sex offender.

Police are asking for the public's help identifying a man who stole \$80 worth of soap from the Acme in Suburban Plaza last week.

Shortly before 1:30 p.m. April 17, the man hide several packages of Dove body wash and soap in his jacket and walked out of the store without paying for them, according to Sgt. Gerald Bryda, a spokesman for the Newark Police Department.

The thief was described as a white man with shaggy brown hair and a full beard, 20 to 30 years old and between 6 feet and 6 feet 2 inches tall. He was wearing a black-and-blue winter coat and tan shoes.

Newark boys tennis team learning on the go

Newark High School's boys tennis team lost seven players to graduation, and looking at the resumes of the players in the top five positions, the Yellowjackets should be going through a rebuilding year.

Their 4-2 record tells a different story.

"The team has responded well to being put into positions they were not always familiar with," said head coach John Taylor, who is in his 18th season at the helm of the Yellowjackets' program. "This team is young and inexperienced but their effort and determination toward improvement is something we focus on regularly.

Don't be content to stay where you are, find ways to improve in every aspect of the game and become a complete player."

Zach Coffing is already a complete player. The junior co-captain moved into the first singles slot this season after earning a sixth seed in third singles at last year's state tournament. His experience has come in handy early on.

Sophomore Evan Prusisz rounds out the singles players in the lineup. The doubles teams are senior co-

captain Alphonso Riddick and junior Kelvin Raices playing in the first slot and sophomore Angelo Riddick and freshman Zac Lassar in the second.

Like all of the spring teams across the First State, Newark's tennis team lost a lot of practice time due to poor weather, and match conditions have been less than ideal. Taylor has been happy with how his team has responded.

"When given the opportunity, the players are excited about getting to play," he said. "I enjoy this so much just seeing the guys' enthusiasm before every match."

As the Yellowjackets head into the second half of the season, Taylor is making sure his players stay focused on improving in each match.

"We try to instill the concepts of play with effort, be as consistent as you can, and strive to the finish," he said. "This team is be-

DEA, local police to collect unwanted prescription drugs Saturday

POST STAFF REPORT

Residents who have leftover or unwanted prescription drugs will have a chance to dispose of them properly this weekend.

Saturday marks one of two drug take-back days sponsored each year by the Drug Enforcement Agency and local police departments. The program allows people to dispose of medicine for free, with no questions asked.

Dozens of drop-off locations in Delaware will be open between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Saturday. Locations in the New Castle County include:

- Newark Police Department, 220 S. Main St.
- Christiana Care Surgical Center, 4755 Ogletown Stanton Road
- Delaware State Police Troop 2, 100 La Grange Ave.
- Delaware City Police Department, 407 Clinton St.

- Middletown Police Department, 130 Hampden Road

- New Castle County Airport, 151 N. DuPont Highway

- New Castle County Police Department, 3601 N. DuPont Highway

- Shipley Manor Nursing Home, 2723 Shipley Road

- Wilmington VA Medical Center, 1601 Kirkwood Highway

The Newark Police Department also has a permanent drop-off box that is accessible during normal business hours.

Officials say disposing medicine correctly is important because it prevents it from polluting water – as can happen if medicine is flushed down the toilet – or falling into the hands of addicts.

"Unwanted, expired or unused prescription medications are often an unintended catalyst for addiction," Delaware Division of Public Health Director Dr. Karyl Rattay said in a statement. "Participating in Drug Take-Back Days provides the average person a concrete way they can make a difference in the ongoing opioid epidemic our state is facing. By taking the important step of cleaning out medicine cabinets, you can make your home safe from potential prescription drug

abuse or theft."

According to the 2015 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 6.4 million Americans abused controlled prescription drugs. Additionally, national studies show that almost two-thirds of people who misuse prescription drugs get them from friends and family, including by raiding medicine cabinets, purses and drawers. DPH reported to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that 293 people died in Delaware from drug overdoses in 2016, compared to 214 in 2015.

Drugs for disposal must be in a container such as a pill bottle, box, blister pack or zipped plastic bag, with personal information removed. Liquid medications must be in their original containers. Needles, aerosols, biohazard materials, medical equipment and batteries will not be accepted.

McDowell uses the courtyard – once known as the school’s “smoking court” – as an outdoor classroom for his environmental science students. It’s a good way to provide hands-on lessons and help students develop an appreciation for nature.

“I bring them out here and feed them a fresh blackberry off the bush, and I’ve got

them hooked,” he said.

Through the nature club, the students maintain the courtyard, often staying after school or coming in on weekends to help out.

“They lay claim to it,” McDowell said. “This is their spot.”

On Saturday, McDowell and the students were hard at work giving the area a much-needed spring cleanup. Besides installing the peace pole, they planted dozens of bulbs, picked up trash, painted downspouts and complet-

ed other projects.

“We’re reviving our little area,” Turell said.

Sophomore Kayla Bradham said she enjoys being in nature and appreciates the opportunity to help maintain the courtyard.

“It makes me feel like I’m actually helping out the school,” she said.

Sophomore Kaylee Newnam concurred.

“We just want to keep it something for plants and animals to feel welcome,” she said. “It’s a lot of fun, too.”

Police identified her killer as Jennair Gerardot, 47, of Wilmington.

"This was a calculated, planned attack," William A. Colarulo, superintendent of Radnor Police, told reporters Tuesday afternoon. "She broke into the house, she was lying in wait and she shot [Chapman] as soon as she walked in and then she shot herself."

Chapman was recently divorced from former Newark Councilman Luke Chapman, whose term expired earlier this month after he declined to seek a fourth term. The Chapmans own a house in Fairfield Crest, but Meredith Chapman had recently moved to Radnor Township, where she lived alone.

"Meredith was a beacon of light to anyone who was fortunate enough to meet her," the Chapman family said through a spokeswoman. "She loved her family fiercely, was a compassionate friend and among the most talented and innovative professionals in her field. Her death was sudden and tragic, but will

not define who she was to the thousands of people who loved her. Her family is devastated, heartbroken and requests privacy and respect as they grieve."

Chapman grew up in Beech Hill near North Star and attended Pike Creek Christian School.

In 2007, she graduated from UD, where she was a cheerleader, and also coached cheerleading at Newark High School. She was a reporter and producer at WHYY-TV and then served as a communication manager for then-congressman Mike Castle before being hired by UD in 2010 as a senior news editor in the media relations department.

She quickly rose through the ranks at UD, helping shape the school's social media strategy and teaching digital marketing classes as an adjunct professor.

In 2016, Chapman ran as a Republican candidate for state senate in District 8, which encompasses most of Newark as well as parts of Pike Creek and Hockessin. She narrowly lost to incumbent David Sokola.

"She was sharp, hard working and motivated by a sincere desire to serve her community. She was bound for great things and it's tragic for that light to go out so

soon," Sokola said in a statement Tuesday. "I've also had the privilege to work with her husband, Luke, over the years, and he especially is in our hearts today. We

wish him strength, peace, and privacy in what we know is an incredibly difficult and painful time."

Chapman recently left UD and this month started a new job as

assistant vice president for marketing and creative services at Villanova University. On social media Monday evening, she posted a photo of herself flashing a big smile in front of a church on the Villanova campus.

"Just a week into the job and I'm already feeling the love from #NovaNation!" Chapman wrote.

Less than three hours later, Radnor Police were called to her home, where they found her and Gerardot both dead.

Colarulo said authorities believe Chapman was having an affair with Gerardot's husband, Mark. Jennair Gerardot found out and plotted the attack, police said, noting that investigators have found emails and text messages indicating her plans.

Mark Gerardot was supposed to have dinner with Chapman on Monday night and grew concerned when she did not arrive. He went to her house, where he found the women's bodies and called police.

"We sympathize with both families because this tragedy has rocked their worlds. It's also rocked the worlds of our township and the residents who live around there," Radnor Deputy Chief Christopher Flanagan said.

with 11 townhouse-style apartments, six on Benny Street and five on South Chapel Street.

Each unit will be three stories tall and include six bedrooms, with each bedroom limited to one tenant. There will be a grassy area between the two clusters of townhouses, which will allow people to walk between them but prevent cars from using it as a cut-through from Benny Street to South Chapel Street.

The plan calls for four parking spaces per unit – two in a garage and two in a parking area outside the townhouses – and the project will be deed-restricted to prohibit tenants from applying for on-street parking permits.

Baldini's lawyer, John Tracey, told city council on Monday that the project continues the trend of re-

placing older homes with higher-density student housing on Benny Street and the surrounding area.

"There have been a number of projects that have been coming before council in the last five to six years that kind of augment what has been occurring in this area," Tracey said.

Twenty of the 22 houses on Benny Street operate as student rentals. The city's comprehensive development plan lists the area as low-density residential, but in recent years, city council has made exceptions for certain properties and allowed high-density apartment complexes.

The project discussed Monday is adjacent to a similar project that was approved by city council in December. At 36 Benny St., developer Ben Prettyman is replacing an aging student rental duplex with seven townhouse-style apartments.

Council OK'd the latest project, approving Baldini's

request for a rezoning, comprehensive development plan amendment and major subdivision.

"I think this matches the character of the neighborhood," Councilman Jerry Clifton said. "I think it fits the comprehensive land use plan. I think this assists us in cutting down on the amount of traffic in the city by clustering residents like this."

Councilman Jason Lawhorn, in his first regular meeting since being elected earlier this month, noted that residents in his district are concerned with an increase in rental properties in Fairfield, Fairfield Crest and other areas. Allowing higher density development in areas like Benny Street will help concentrate rental units in places already dominated by students, he said.

"It is of economic value to the city and also is a step toward solving some of the issues we have with the high demand in student housing," Lawhorn said.

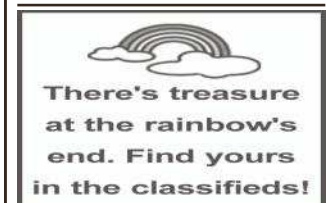
