Canal softball champs right at home in regional tourney

Canal Little League has doubled its pleasure, with both its 11-12 and 14-15 year old softball all-star teams winning state District II championships last week.

And both teams will enjoy some home cooking this week, because Canal is hosting the Mid-Atlantic regional softball tournament at its Glasgow complex.

The 14-15 year old stars advanced to the regional after breezing through the District II winners' bracket. Canal finished the district tournament without a loss, and defeated Suburban 19-1 for the title.

Jill Elmer earned the victory, allowing only two hits while fanning 12 batters.

Canal scored eight runs in the first inning to put the game out of reach. Key blows were struck by Allison Goldsborough, who belted a bases loaded double, and Dawn

Minner, who ripped a run-scoring triple.

Minner ended the game with two triples and a double, while teammates Jen Asbury and Andrea Rolfe each laced three singles. Stacy Winterringer and Kari Manlove stroked two singles each during the game.

"The girls are feeling real comfortable right now and they're really looking forward to the Mid-Atlantics being at home," said Canal coach Bruce Minner. "We've been practicing hard all week long

and I think we're right on track."

Last year, the Canal 14-15 year old stars advanced to the World Series in Kalamazoo, Mich., and they are hoping to repeat that effort. But success breeds notoriety and Minner realizes that tournament teams will be looking to knock off Canal this year.

"I like being at top but whether it will bother the girls, I don't know," said Minner. "I like having the reputation and having the intimidation factor

that success brings."

The winner of the Mid-Atlantic regional will travel to Connecticut for the Eastern Regional. From there, it is northward to Kalamazoo. Minner believes that the road to Kalamazoo will depend on the girls' ability to maintain their concentration.

"Intensity is the key thing that we've got to maintain," said Minner. "The girls know that they've got to keep their intensity up throughout each game, especially as the com-

petition improves with each tournament. But the girls are ready and I believe we'll have it."

The 11-12 year old stars advanced to the Mid-Atlantic regional the hard way, battling back through the state District II losers' bracket.

Canal then topped New Castle 12-5 and 9-1 in back-to-back games to capture the District II championship.

Canal had been thrust into the losers' bracket after falling

Nationals blank Midway 5-0 for '13' title

They say bad things happen in threes. And after two Newark National Little League all-star teams had been eliminated from state District II tournament competition within 24 hours, there was a bit of apprehension prior to Saturday afternoon's district championship which pitted Newark National's 13 year old stars against those from Midway.

But the National all-stars would have nothing to do with superstition and disposed of Midway 5-0 at Gabor Field to advance to the Mid-Atlantic regional tournament which will open in Dover this week.

The win was significant, considering that the same group of boys who won the title were

unable to win the district championship last year in the 11-12 year old division.

"The kids have made a lot of progress," said National manager Larry Pritchard. "Last year they didn't make it to through the district. This year they succeeded by playing sound, basic baseball. It was a team effort and everybody gave 110 percent. You just can't ask any more out of a team."

Newark National was led by starting pitcher John Laznik, who hurled a four-hit shutout. Laznik battled out of some early inning trouble before settling down. He allowed just one hit through the final five innings.

It was Laznik's third complete game victory of the tournament.

"He's our number one pitcher

Newark American stars win district crown

The Newark American Little League 11-12 year old all-stars captured the state District II championship Monday night, topping Piedmont 11-3 for the title.

By winning, Newark American moves into a best-of-three series with downstate champion Seaford for the state crown. The playoff will begin at 6 p.m. Friday at the Stanton-Newport Little League diamond.

The series will pit two teams which have excelled in recent years. Seaford is the defending state champion, and Newark American won the title in 1985.

Monday, Newark American was led by pitcher Chuck Beatie, who allowed just three hits. Beatie also helped his own cause, rapping three hits — one a home run — and knocking in four runs.

Canal seniors capture district

It took 22 years of hard work, but in the end it was well worth it. Canal Little League's 14-15 year old all-star team captured its first state District II championship in 22 tries by defeating Newark National 18-2 on Friday night at Glasgow.

With the victory, Canal advances to the Mid-Atlantic regional in Dover. The team will open play tonight.

"Newark (National) has always had a mystique over Canal and we could never seem to beat them," said Canal manager Ernie Spence. "We've always had trouble, but the kids were real determined this year and really got fired up for the game. They're a close knit bunch and work well together."

Canal erupted for all 18 runs in the first two innings. They opened the game by sending 19 batters to the plate in the first inning, scoring 13 times.

Bill Seymour paced the offense, belting a home run and a double while driving in three runs. John Durante and Kip Houchin knocked in three runs apiece while teammates Paul McDonald, Derrick Shaw and Tom Snedeker each laced two singles.

Teacher wins \$10,000

After leading the \$10,000 Delaware Park handicapping tournament for most of the way, Newark's Robert Maxwell slipped to fifth place when his horse finished second in the final race Sunday.

Maxwell, who like the other 455 contestants started the event with an imaginary \$1,000 bankroll, finished with \$26,097 in pretend cash.

However, for his fifth place finish, Maxwell did earn \$100 in real money.

The \$10,000 grand prize was won by Tom Ennis, a high school teacher from Glassboro, N.J., who amassed an imaginary bankroll of \$52,910 after picking the winning horse in Sunday's last race.

Close behind in second place was Allen Eicheberger of Wilmington, with real winnings of \$2,500 from a bankroll of \$50,000.

Edward Lally of Wilmington finished third, and won \$750, for an imaginary bankroll which grew to \$29,687, and Donna Boring, a housewife from York, Pa., won \$250 for finishing fourth with a bankroll of \$26,662.

DelPark tourney grand challenge

Vincent Ditrano got to Delaware Park early last Saturday morning, filled with excitement. For Ditrano, this was his first visit to the tree-shaded Stanton race track since 1976, when 15,000 people jammed the grandstand to watch jockey Steve Cauthen.

"Why have I returned? Because I remember the charm and beauty of Delaware Park — and also to win the \$10,000," said Ditrano.

Ditrano, a 6-foot 4-inch resident of Hackensack, N.J., was one of 456 people — including this reporter — from 14 states who paid a \$30 entry fee for the chance to win big money as contestants in the Delaware Park handicapping tournament.

The tournament opened Saturday, July 25, but was halted the following day because of severe thunderstorms. It concluded this weekend.

All contestants were given a mythical bankroll of \$1,000 to wager. The bettors with the top

five bankrolls at the end of the tournament were awarded cash prizes, with \$10,000 going to the winner.

Contestants gathered on the second deck of the grandstand, where rows of card tables and chairs were positioned facing the leader boards which kept track of everyone's wagers and standings in the competition.

Ditrano's opening gambit involved betting the minimum \$2 on the first few races, waiting for July 25's feature race, the Delaware Handicap. I followed along, while Donald Smith surged to the early lead by amassing a \$2,250 bankroll.

Through the day, various leaders forged leads and then faded. Gloria Bocchicchio carried the lead into the seventh race with \$4,270, then quickly dropped into the pack.

Meanwhile, Ditrano and I saw our money dip toward the \$900 range, unable to find the horse to move us onto the leader board. If only we had followed Ed Zabielski of Newark, the track handicapper, who scored five winners in a row.

Millcreek slides past Newark for state Babe Ruth title

Eighth-inning error costs Newark stars as Millcreek rallies

Although baseball is generally not a game decided by just one play, it was a single miscue that cost the Newark Babe Ruth League 14-15 year old all-stars the state title.

Millcreek topped Newark 4-3 for the championship, taking advantage of a three-base Newark error in the bottom of the eighth to win the crown.

The play began innocently, with relief pitcher Tom Hurst striking out Millcreek batter Rory Conway. However, the ball squirted past Newark catcher Kevin Scannell and Conway took off for first.

In his haste to nail Conway for the second out, Scannell overthrew first baseman Kyle Perry and the ball sailed into right field, allowing Conway to advance to third.

Newark manager Belmont Perry ordered Hurst to intentionally load the bases, creating a force out at any base. Millcreek's Bryan Crutcher then provided some late game dramatics by working Hurst to a full count before nubbing a cue shot just out of the reach of Hurst's glove, allowing Conway to score the winning run.

Although the play was pivotal, Millcreek actually won the game in the seven and one-half innings prior to the last at bat.

"You really can't focus on that play too much because the real key to the game was that we didn't hit the ball," said Perry. "After that first inning, where we scored three runs, our offense completely shut down. The

same thing happened in the game before."

Newark had advanced through the winners' bracket in the state Babe Ruth tournament, and needed to win only one game in two from losers' bracket champion Millcreek to capture the state title. However, Millcreek shut out Newark 4-0 on Thursday to force Friday's championship game.

"We were in a very enviable position before Thursday's game and I was very comfortable with how we were playing," said Perry. "But we seemed to be on our heels on Thursday and not as intense. On Friday we came out like gangbusters and had scored three runs after only four people had come to the plate. Then we just stopped hitting."

Stopped hitting is right. Newark scored three runs on two hits in the first inning of Friday night's game and then was held hitless by relief pitcher Mike Oller, who hurled six innings without yielding so much as a single.

On Thursday, Newark was held to only three hits by Bryan Crutcher, who totalled 19 strikeouts in two games against the Newark all-stars.

As Millcreek's pitching continued to frustrate Newark, momentum began to swing towards Millcreek.

"We had been blistering the ball up until Monday but we just couldn't hit their pitching," said Perry. "They score a run here and there and the next thing you know the game's tied up and going into extra innings."

"We started to scratch out a few runs and it seemed we got some momentum," said

Millcreek coach Larry Crutcher. "Yet, we were confident all along. We went into that first ballgame (3-2 Newark win) really believing we were the better ballclub. After that loss, we still had the confidence that we could do it. We shut them out last night and tonight it was just a matter of who made the plays."

Making the plays is an integral part of any tournament, and so is luck. And in the final two games, the Newark all-stars were on the wrong side of lady luck.

"You have to have three things to play well in this tournament," said Perry. "The first two elements are talent all the way down the line-up and a coaching staff that works well together. The third is that you have to depend on luck. And in those last two games, I felt we just didn't have any of that last element with us."

Piedmont drops National 11-12 stars

The Newark National Little League 11-12 year old all-star team went as far as it could for as long as it could before being eliminated Saturday in the District II loser's bracket championship game.

Piedmont, the defending District II champion, proved too much for the Nationals, winning 18-1 at the Midway Little League field.

"Piedmont's got a good hitting team and there's not much you can do to stop it," said National manager Stan Samluk. "If you're going to lose you might as well lose this way."

The Nationals took an early one-run lead, but it was short lived. Piedmont quickly erupted for three home runs and never looked back.

The key blow came in the second inning when Piedmont's Wes Murph sent a Jason

Thomas fastball over the center-field fence for a three-run homer. Eric Galuskin added a grand slam later in the game, putting the contest out of reach.

"I thought we had a chance when we went ahead early and they (Piedmont) started throwing the ball around," said

Samluk. "But that guy (Murph) hitting the home run really turned things around."

Murph was also the winning pitcher. He fanned nine National batters and allowed just one hit.

Although disappointed by the result, the National all-stars held their heads high, realizing

that they had performed well during the two-week tournament.

"The kids tried, and you've got to give them credit for that," said Samluk. "They realize they were up against a good team. They're a good bunch of kids, the best I've ever worked with."







in the tournament opener, 2-0 to Stanton-Newport. The team then went on to win four straight, including a 20-4 victory over Stanton-Newport.

"We stranded eleven runners in that first game and we were a little tense," said Canal coach Joe Wujick. "We had worked really hard in practice and maybe we were a little flat or a little overconfident at first, and when we got behind we got tense."

After the first game, the Canal stars came back with a flare, averaging 15 runs a game while allowing only four runs.

"We were a lot more patient and a lot more comfortable after the first loss," said Wujick. "Everybody expected us to win and I think that pressure got to the kids. But after that first loss the kids showed no signs of folding and really hung in there. I'm real proud of them."

In claiming the district title, Canal was forced to defeat a strong New Castle team in back-to-back games.

In the first game, Stacy Wright pitched a five hitter with seven strikeouts for a 12-5 victory. Tammy Dotson and Christina Klein paced the offense, combining for four hits.

In game two, pitcher Carrie Wujick hurled a six hitter while teammates Diana Brown and Roni Salony each drove in two runs.

The second victory brought Canal the district pennant, but Wujick believes the tournament was actually won during the second inning of the second Stanton-Newport game.

"I think the key to the tournament was when the kids pulled of a double play against Stanton-Newport when the score was tied," said Wujick. "That showed the kids that they had the potential to win the tournament and got them to start believing in themselves."

Now it was time for our move, however, with the running of the Delaware Handicap. This was the race Ditrano had come to see, and his favored horse, Coup De Fusil, was running.

Strangely, when jockey Angel Cordero Jr. brought Coup De Fusil across the finish line a winner, Ditrano was upset. "I came down to bet Cordero on Coup De Fusil," he explained. "I was all set, but I decided to go out to the paddock to see the horses. That swayed my wager."

"I noticed that Ogden Phipps, the elder statesman of New York racing, was here, and I assumed he made the trip to watch his horse, Home Leave, win the race. I put two and two together and came up with zero."

The first day's action over, Ditrano headed back to his hotel with just \$772. I wasn't much better with \$863. Richard Demmel led with \$7,199.

Ditrano returned early again Sunday, donning a blue windbreaker to warm up his cold break at the betting window.

He knew he had to act quickly to catch the leader on this second day of the tournament. "Today I have to pick two or three horses and parlay my money," he said, "realizing that the quickest way to the poor house is the three-horse parlay."

To parlay means betting money on one horse, winning and then putting all your money on the next horse.

Unfortunately, Ditrano was right about directions to the poor house. His bad luck continued, and he tapped out after losing his final \$500 in the third race.

"I had no shot if I didn't do something," he said. "Now I'm going to bet real money."

Not only was the field scratched by half at this point, but the contest was postponed as well when severe weather caused Delaware Park to scrub its final races of the day.

At that point, Newarker Robert Maxwell led with \$12,033. I finished with just \$753.

Despite the bad luck, Ditrano had a great time. "This was the most fun I've had at a track in a long time," he said. "This place hasn't changed. A time warp feeling of being sent back 15 years was there for me. I'm glad I returned to Delaware Park."

Then the researcher found a man who summed up the problem and gave the solution in a single sentence. "My bus'd never be more than a minute or two late," he observed, "if I didn't have to stop to let the bleeding passengers on and off."

I like that man; he has a view of the world and his place in it that is straightforward and easy to understand. His primary mission, as he sees it, is to drive his bus on its daily rounds in all kinds of weather, under all kinds of traffic conditions and to keep

it on schedule. The passengers are a secondary and unnecessary hassle.

While the idealists and do-gooders of the world might find this sentiment somewhat selfish, I find it refreshingly honest. Therefore, I am nominating that London bus driver for a Nobel Prize because he has found, if not a universal truth, at least a universal wish.

There are times in all our lives when extraneous events — like bus passengers — clog up or defeat our best laid plans. My sister-in-law laments about the time she elegantly wrapped and flam-

Several of us are convinced that bankers would be much happier if they could keep track of money without having to cope with customers. And we all have encountered clerks who would find their jobs much more satisfying if they didn't have to contend with shoppers.

I suspect my washing machine doesn't like socks. It told me, one day, that its job description is limited to soaking, washing, rinsing, and spinning. It is not supposed to keep track of socks who wish to stray from their appointed mates.

Finally, to inject a very personal note, I am convinced that my role as wife and mother would be much simpler, and I would do it with much more kindness, efficiency and aplomb if my husband and children didn't clutter up the house.

Milk: Fat makes all the difference

When faced with the choices at today's supermarkets, have you ever wondered how whole, lowfat and skim milk are different?

You probably already know that the main difference is the amount of milk fat each contains. But are there other differences as well? Not really, according to University of Delaware extension food and nutrition specialist Dr. Sue Snider.

Snider says the federal standards for fluid milk vary slightly among the whole, lowfat and skim classifications. But by far the major difference is in the amount of fat.

Whole milk must contain a minimum of 3.5 percent fat; lowfat milk can have either 0.5 percent, 1 percent, 1.5 percent or 2 percent fat; skim milk must have less than 0.5 percent fat. To get lowfat and skim milk, processors use centrifugal force to separate the fat from the other solids. The amount of fat removed can be changed by adjusting the equipment.

The fat removed is sold as cream, or it is used in ice cream, cream dressing for cottage cheese or other foods such as frozen desserts.

The differences in the amount of fat account for caloric differences among milk choices. One cup of whole milk has 150 calories and 48 percent of those calories are from fat; 2 percent milk has 121 calories with 37.5 percent of calories coming from fat; 1 percent fat milk has 102 calories with 28 percent of calories from fat; and skim milk has 86 calories with less than 1 percent of its calories from fat. So, not only do the number of calories differ among the milks but the percent of calories that come from fat differs as well. Skim and lowfat have the same nutritional benefits as whole milk but without extra calories and fat.

There are also slightly different standards for whole, lowfat and skim milk regarding the addition of vitamin A, a fat-soluble vitamin that is removed from the milk with the fat. Vitamin A must be returned to lowfat and skim milk; adding it to whole milk is optional, although usually done.

Adding vitamin D to whole, lowfat and skim milk is also optional, but it is a standard procedure.

Today's youngsters would thank milk processors for ad-

ding vitamin D if they ever had to take cod liver oil as their grandparents did, Snider says. Children once took cod liver oil to prevent rickets, a disease

caused by vitamin D deficiency. Eventually the vitamin was added to milk because milk is a common food for children.
