## Year-end finances show large improvement

City Finance Director Robert Uyttebroek, who replaced former director Dennis McFarland after his retirement in January, presented the December 2011 financial report at the City Council meeting held on Monday, February 27, reporting that Newark showed a surplus of almost \$7 million for the year. This is an increase of \$829 thousand over what was expected for 2011.

The Government Fund showed an overall surplus of \$1.198 million, with revenues showing an increase of \$954 thousand over initial budget estimates.

Expenses dropped by \$244 thousand.

Enterprise Funds showed a slight deficit of \$278 thousand. The report showed the fund at \$18.068 million, but was budgeted to be at \$18.346 million.

Consolidated revenues came in \$39.668 million for the year, an increase of \$755 thousand or 1.94 percent from estimates. Overall expenses were reported to be \$32.714 million, a \$74 thousand decrease, or 0.23 percent, from the 2011 estimate of \$32.788 million.

According to his report, Uyttebroek stated that Newark has a cash-on-hand balance of \$25.414 million or an increase of \$6.393 million from the beginning of the year.

Though attaining a greater cash bal-

ance has been a concern of the Finance Department in order to secure and maintain a strong bond rating, Uyttebroek stated in his report, "I urge caution in using this figure as a reference to financial condition."

He reported that since the cash balance is a "snapshot" of the balance sheet for only a specific period of time, other factors are stronger indicators of the city's financial profile.

Uyttebroek stated, "The more germane reference items to gauge a going concern's solvency, sustainability and to determine trends are 'Operating Income' (Revenues over Expenditures) and the change in 'Fund Balance' from the Income Statement."

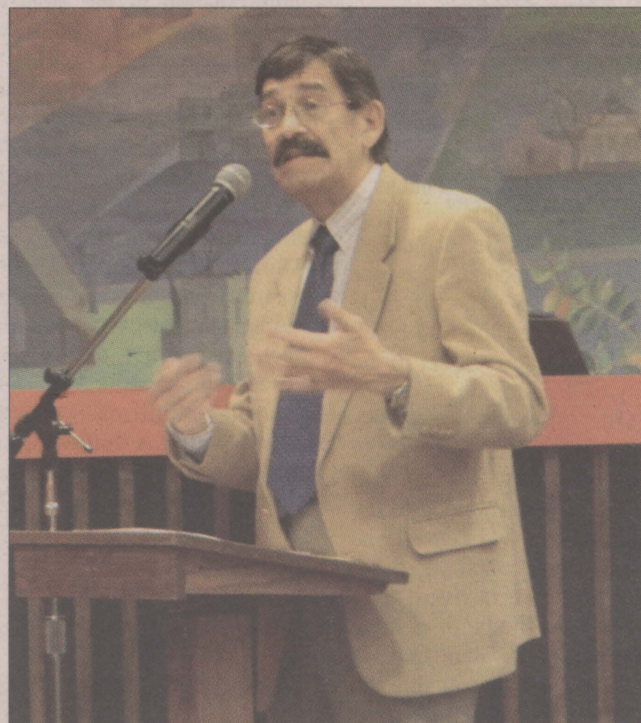

## "Top Secret America" author speaks at UD

In the uncertain days following the Sept. 11, 2001 attacks, countless government agencies were charged with finding and stopping terrorists. One such group was INSCOM, a division of the U.S. Army created in 1977 to look for defectors and traitors within the army.

However, after Sept. 11, INSCOM's mission morphed into one already being done by dozens of other organizations, Washington Post

reporter Dana Priest told a University of Delaware audience Wednesday night.

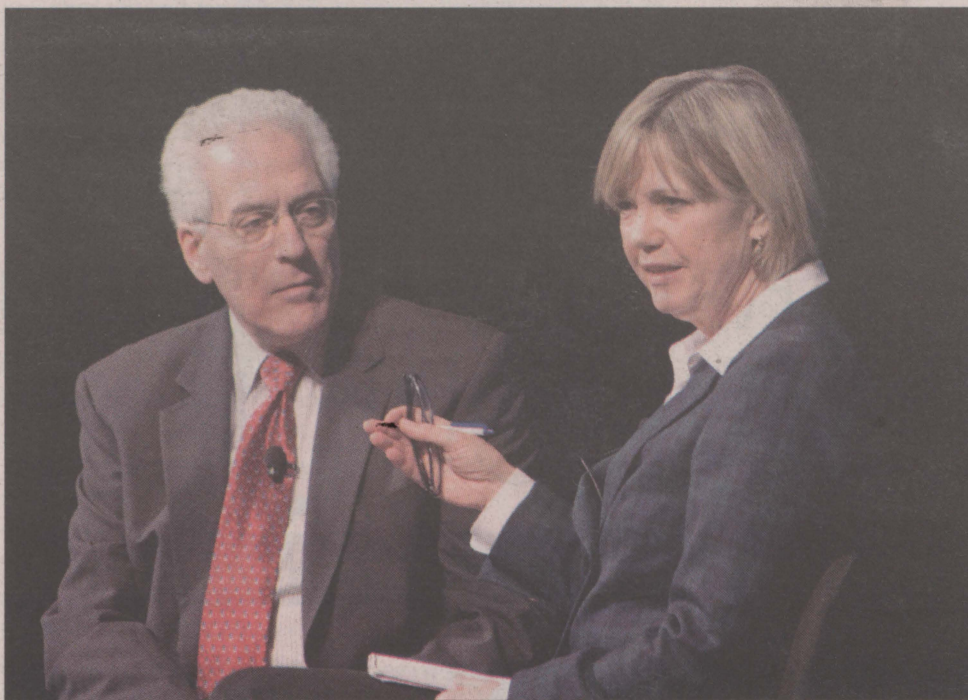
"What INSCOM did was say 'What we really want to do is find terrorists within the United States, so we're going to put together a plan to do that,'" Priest said. "Their plan looked like they were reinventing the wheel with the most rudimentary analysis. What they were not doing was their job of looking for bad guys within their own ranks."

Meanwhile, an Army officer named Nidal Hasan went largely unnoticed after alleg-

edly exhibiting suspicious behavior at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, she said. Now, he stands accused in the November 2009 shooting deaths of 13 fellow soldiers at Fort Hood.

The incident, Priest said, is an example of the confusion that was common as the U.S. intelligence community ballooned in size after 2001. The government added dozens of new agencies and tens of thousands of new employees, but many had no clear job description.

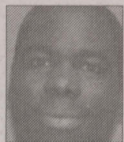

**Murder suspect apprehended and victim identified**

New Castle County Detectives have arrested Darrell Phillips, a 44 year-old male who resides in the unit block of Old Fence Lane in the community of Country Creek, located about 7 miles from Newark. He has been charged in the murder of his daughter's estranged husband, Clarence Brown, a 26 year-old male who resides in the 600 block of North Adams Street in the City of Wilmington.

On Monday night, February 27, at 8:52 p.m., County Police and Paramedics responded to the unit block of Old Fence Lane for a report of shots fired. When officers arrived, they located the body of a male subject, later identified as Clarence Brown, outside the home who was unresponsive and suffering from an apparent gunshot wound to the upper body. Emergency personnel immediately transported the victim to the

Christiana Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The investigation revealed that the victim had responded to his estranged wife's parents' home in an attempt to speak with the female. When the victim arrived, there was a confrontation at the front door, at which time Darrell Phillips allegedly shot the victim. An off-duty Delaware State Trooper was in the area and heard the female screaming and immediately responded to the home and was able to detain the suspect.

During the execution of a search warrant that was obtained for his residence, detectives were able to locate and seize the handgun.

Darrell Phillips was charged with the following crimes: Murder in the First Degree and Possession of a Deadly Weapon during the Commission of a Felony. He was arraigned and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institute and is being held without bail.

**Troopers seek public's help in locating wanted subject**

The suspect is possibly operating a dark colored Chrysler minivan with Maryland tags.

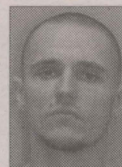

**Arrest made in PNC Bank robbery**

The Delaware State Police have arrested a man in connection with a bank robbery in Bear.

The incident occurred Monday afternoon, February 27, at approximately 3:12 p.m., when Joseph P. Thomas, 33, entered the PNC Bank located in Eden Square Shopping Center in Bear. Thomas approached

While Troopers were checking the area of Pulaski Highway (US 40) and Bear Corbitt Road (SR 7), they located Thomas in the Ruby Tuesday restaurant where he was taken into custody.

Thomas was arraigned at JP2 on charges of Robbery 2nd and Wearing a Disguise During the Commission of a Felony. He was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional Institution on \$30,000 cash bail.

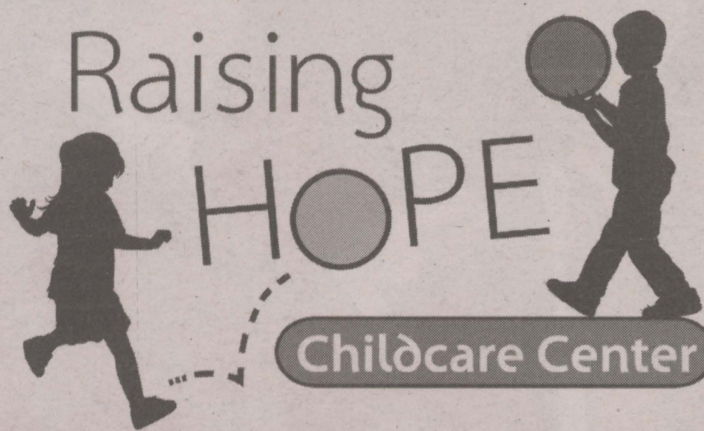

ger car was driven onto the CSX railroad tracks near the intersection of West Main Street and New London Road, Newark. The car's driver was northbound on New London Road, but the driver who was unfamiliar with the area, turned left onto the train tracks causing the vehicle to



become stuck on the tracks. Two passers-by noticed the car stuck on the tracks and stopped to assist. The two passers-by approached the vehicle and made contact with the driver, who was still seated in the vehicle, and the passenger, who was attempting to push the vehicle from the tracks. The two passers-by attempted to assist the driver free the vehicle when the train gates activated and they heard the sound of the approaching train. The passers-by told the driver to get out of the car; however she continued to try to free the vehicle. The passers-by then pulled the driver from the vehicle and ushered her to safety. Shortly thereafter, a westbound CSX train entered the crossing and struck the car. The car was pushed several hundred feet before being thrown from the tracks and coming to rest. The train came to a

stop shortly thereafter.

No one was injured. The driver of the vehicle was not intoxicated. CSX train traffic was halted and the roadway at the train crossing was closed for approximately two and half hours while the crash was investigated. The investigation is still pending and no charges have been filed at this time.

## Two teens arrested for middle school fire

The Delaware State Fire Marshal's office has arrested two twelve year-old students for a fire at Cobbs-Gauger Middle School in Newark.

The Aetna Hose Hook and Ladder Company of Newark was alerted to a fire at the school shortly after noon on Thursday February 23, 2012. Fire apparatus arrived with smoke conditions in the hallway and the school evacuated.

State Fire Investigators were called to the scene and conducted an investigation. The fire originated in a locker and was intentionally set.

Both juveniles were arraigned today in Family Court on Arson 1st degree and Conspiracy 2nd degree charges. They were released on \$15,000 unsecured bail. Damage to the school was approximately \$150.

There were no injuries reported.

## Traffic stop leads to the discovery of drugs and two handguns

New Castle County Police have arrested Jeremiah Harrison, a 35 year-old male who resides in the 600 block of West 8th Street in the City of Wilmington. He has been charged with drug and weapon offenses after he was stopped for an equipment violation while in the Shops at Red Mill located at the intersection of Kirkwood Highway and Red Mill Road, and found to be in possession of two handguns. Harrison, who is a convicted felon, is prohibited from possessing weapons.

On Friday, February 24, at 12:53 a.m., New Castle County Officers were conducting proactive patrols in the area of Hunter's Crossing Apartments when

Officer Fisher observed a red Chrysler Sebring traveling on Capital Trail without the vehicle's headlights being illuminated. A short time later, the vehicle was stopped in the Shops at Red Mill.

When the officer approached the car he detected a strong odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. The driver, Jeremiah Harrison, was contacted and removed from the vehicle without incident. Officer Fisher then discovered that Harrison had a loaded .380 semi-automatic handgun that was concealed in his waistband. He was immediately taken into custody. Assisting officers had con-

tacted the passenger, Jamal Ford, a 36 year-old male who resides in the 1200 block of 10th Street in the City of Wilmington, and he was removed from the vehicle as well. During a search of the vehicle, officers discovered a .45 semi-automatic handgun hidden underneath the passenger's seat and a loaded magazine in the center console. Police also located two baggies of marijuana that were hidden inside a shirt that was located on the rear seat.

Corporal Joseph Krajewski and his canine partner "Eros" responded to assist the officers and conducted a money sniff which yielded a positive indication for the presence of a con-

trolled dangerous substance. The officer then seized \$517 of suspected drug money.

Jeremiah Harrison was charged with the following crimes: Carrying a Concealed Deadly Weapon a Firearm (Two Counts), Possession of a Deadly Weapon by a Person Prohibited, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Failure to Have Registration in Possession, and Two Lights shall be Displayed on Motor Vehicle. Harrison was arraigned and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institute after failing to post \$6,000 secured bail.

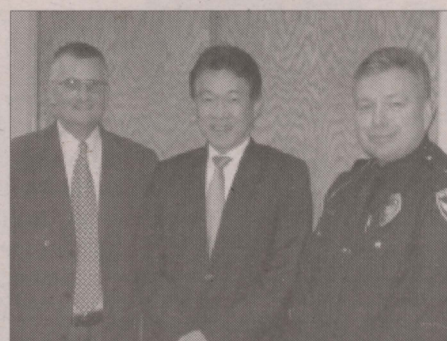
Jamal Ford was charged with the following crimes: Possession of Marijuana, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Ford was arraigned and committed to the Howard

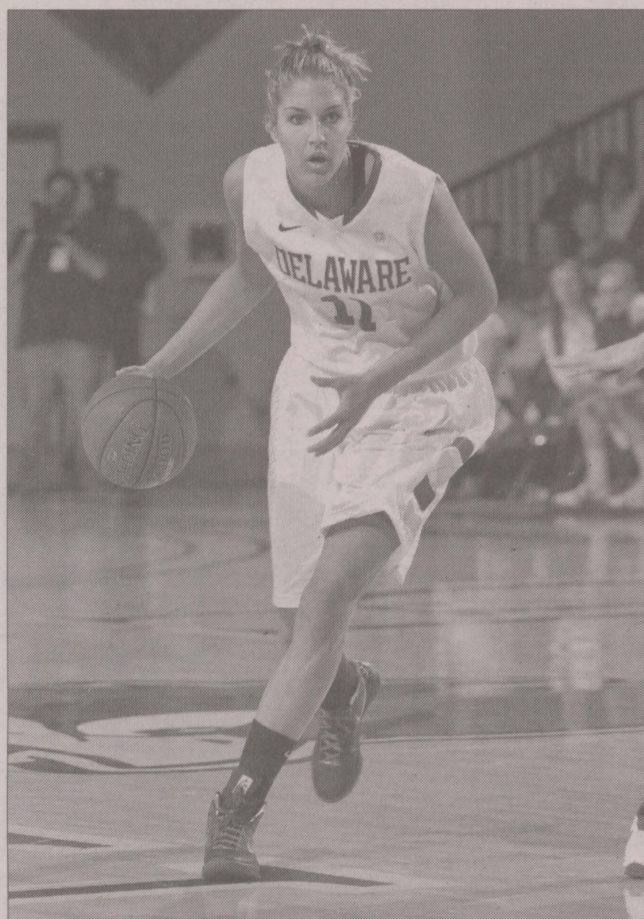

# Delle Donne's success highlights historical season for Hens

This isn't how it was supposed to be.

When Elena Delle Donne walked off the court at the Bob Carpenter Center in 2008 with her fourth high school state championship trophy firmly in her grasp, it was supposed to be the last time we'd ever see her play at the Bob Carpenter Center.

She was a national story — a big-time player heading to a big-time program to do even bigger things in due time.

She was so big-time that Delaware coach Tina Martin really didn't even recruit her. Delle Donne was wanted by every major women's college program in the country — including the premier college program, Connecticut.

The high-scoring games in front of sellout crowds were supposed to happen in

Storrs, not here in Newark.

Fortunately for us, to Delle Donne, there was no place like home.

The story's been told over and over of how the nation's top high school senior skipped her graduation ceremony so that she could get to practice at UConn, only to literally turn around and come back home.

That wasn't how it was supposed to be.

The 6-foot-5 phenom became a national story again, only this time, it was a negative one. Was it burnout or pressure? Or was it a combination of the two? Rumors were rampant. But as we now know, the real reason she wanted to come home was neither. Instead, the answer was in the hands, literally, of her older sister, Elizabeth. Delle Donne came home because she said she couldn't stand the thought of losing literal touch — Elizabeth was born deaf and blind and can't verbally communicate — with her older sister.

So the larger-than-life Delawarean enrolled at UD in the fall of 2008. She returned to the court, only this time it had a net strung between two poles, not one hanging from a rim. She became an instant success as a volleyball player, but her hankering for basketball quickly returned.

Martin welcomed her with open arms (and I'm sure a huge smile).

Fast forward to last Sunday. The Hens completed a perfect season at home on Senior Day. It's a season that, regardless of what hap-

pens from this point forward, will go down as the most successful in University of Delaware basketball history, men or women.

It was a season of firsts

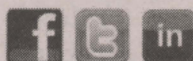

for the women's basketball team: First sellout (Sunday's was the second); first AP Top 25 ranking; first Top 10 ranking.

And it was a record-setting season for Delle Donne. She's the top scorer in the nation averaging just over 28 points per game. She

became UD's all-time leading scorer when she broke Mike Pegues' mark of 2,030. She's an All-American, on the court and in the classroom. As an individual player, she's done just about everything there is to do at Delaware, and she still has one season left.

But it's never been about Delle Donne the individual.

Not at Ursuline Academy, not on any of the travel or all-star teams she's played on, and not at Delaware. And because of that, she'll forego the opportunity to play in the WNBA — she graduates in June and probably would have been the No. 1 draft pick — and instead return for one more year.

But first there's unfinished

business for the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season champions and their sure-to-be CAA Player of the Year: There's a conference tournament title to go after — UD is the top seed in this weekend's CAA tournament — and an NCAA first-round game to be won (the Hens are almost a lock to be seeded fourth or higher).

And for Delle Donne, her focus will be on the final score, not her individual statistics. She hopes to keep the seniors that were celebrated at the Bob on Sunday, on the court for as many more games as possible.

"This has been a phenomenal season," she said modestly after scoring 35 points against Northeastern. "But

today was about the seniors. ... There were some tears shed before the game. We're going to miss them."

Fortunately for Blue Hen fans, she's not one of them.

"Duplication runs rampant in this area," she said. "It's like kids and a soccer ball. Everyone's running after the soccer ball, but nobody's playing offense or defense. If everyone's allowed to do that, it's not going to be a very good game."

A two-time Pulitzer Prize winner, Priest has spent the last decade reporting on what she calls the "military intelligence complex" — a name, taken from the military industrial complex that President Dwight Eisenhower famously warned about.

Last year, she co-authored the book "Top Secret America," which details the

size and breadth of the intelligence community.

She spoke at Mitchell Hall Wednesday as part of a lecture series called "Spies, Lies and Sneaky Guys," moderated by Ralph Begleiter, director of the university's Center for Political Communication and a former CNN correspondent.

At least 1,200 government agencies and 2,000 private companies have top-secret intelligence status, she said. Most disturbing, she said, is the rising number of civilian contractors involved in anti-terrorism efforts.

"They're at the heart and soul of what the government does in our name," she said. "When I interviewed Leon Panetta, when he was CIA

director, about the contractor issue, he said, 'This really worries me because their allegiance is not necessarily to the government, and I cannot necessarily control them.'"

The intelligence community has improved since Sept. 11, she said, but most of its successes have nothing to do with increase in agencies and spending.

"We are absolutely safer," she said. "Not because of this giant military intelligence complex I just described but because within it, there are some smaller, finely tuned organizations that have made gigantic strides in collecting intelligence and bringing it together with rapid speed."

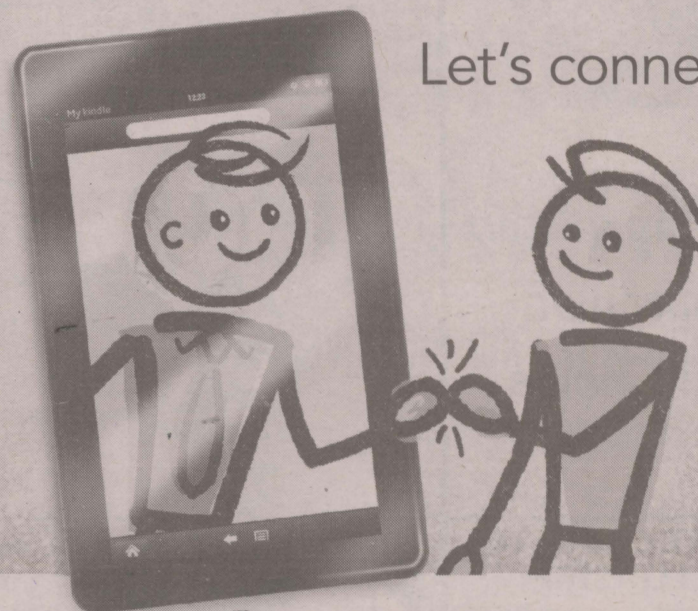

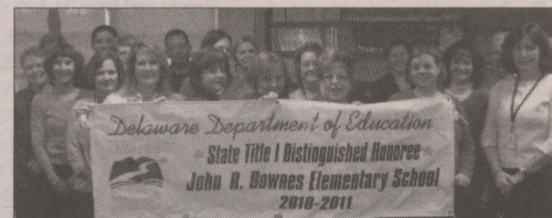
## Downes Elementary School receives State Title I Distinguished School Award

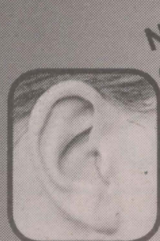

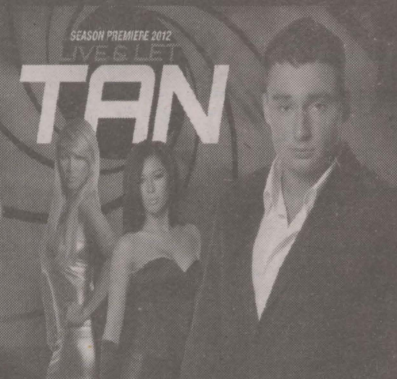

## Out of the Attic

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 1950 picture of the Newark Town Council members. At that time, Newark was divided into three council districts. Two councilmen were elected in each district.



The mayor was elected town-wide. Shown left to right are Frank M. Durnall (middle district), Samuel L. Diehl (middle district), Carl F. Rankin (western district), Dr. Wallace M. Johnson (mayor), Norman E. Battersby (eastern district), Robert Levis (western district) and William M. Coverdale (eastern district). During the next decade and a half the Town experienced a big population increase due in part to considerable new housing built within the existing town limits and to annexation of surrounding properties into the town. The people came to work in the manufacturing plants, distribution centers, and businesses that came to the Newark area in the 1950's and 1960's.

The 1960 census showed that Newark had grown to over 25,000 residents within the town limits. That qualified Newark as a City and, at that time, the second largest city in the state. Charter changes brought six council districts with one person elected in each district. The governance form was changed to the Council-Manager plan that still exists today.

Visit the Newark History Museum located at the historic 1877 passenger train station on South College Avenue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks.
