## STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL

When I last saw X he asked me to get confidentially information concerning where the principal radio stations were located in countries contiguous to Germany which could possibly be used to convey programs which could be heard by the German people. He wanted to know where these stations were, by whom they were controlled, what the technical details were, as to wave length, et cetera, and also what stations there were in this country which could probably be heard in Germany. He had in mind that the German people did not really know what was going on outside and that arrangements might be made by purely unofficial persons for well arranged programs which would give the information concerning public opinion in other countries as well as on the general situation. I was to prepare a memorandum on this subject at my convenience.
