The FY05 budget I will propose will include \$12 million for the "next generation" of the 800-megahertz system and I ask that you support that proposal.

Let me pause for just a moment, take just a moment to introduce some honored guests. First, Colonel John Craig, commander of the 436th Airlift wing at Dover Air Force Base. And now two very, very special guests, both recently returned from service in Saudi Arabia and Iraq. Please recognize them and, in doing so, recognize the service of our state's military men and women: Army Guard Master Sergeant First Class Timothy Sinko of the 153rd Military Police Company and with him today, Air Guard Master Sergeant Paul Shavack of the 142nd Airlift Squadron. Thank you gentlemen, for being with us.

The sacrifice exhibited by the men and women of our Delaware National Guard and the military reserves and Dover Air Force Base around the globe remind us of the service of veterans in past years. My bond bill proposal will include substantial funding for Delaware to soon eliminate its status as one of only three states without a home for our treasured veterans.

Let's extend a new era of opportunity to those on our roadways in the path of some future drunken driver; to those whose lifestyles may be different from our own; to veterans who have served our state and our country so well; and to those in the fire, police and emergency response community who risk their lives for ours every day.

We should not use the recent economic upturn as an excuse to unleash budget growth. Over the last 30 years, the operating budgets enacted after an economic downturn have shown growth of 8 to 11 percent.

That level of growth is not responsible and that will not be acceptable. The budget I will present will show modest growth and will require more of the money-saving initiatives like those that we've done the last several years.

As we consider measures that may affect our bottom line, we must be sure to recognize those coming challenges, including the possibility of slot machines in neighboring states; expenses imposed and shifted from the federal government; the escalating costs of health care; and there are others.

As we consider our fiscal future, I ask you to stay true to the principles that have put Delaware in such positive shape, stay the course. Failure to do so might risk our ability to take full advantage of the era of opportunity.

In conclusion, my message today is simple. Delaware has endured some tough times and, because of our responsibility and our willingness to work together, we've emerged stronger than almost every other state. We face the future with advantage: a sound, solid foundation, while others are struggling just to regain their footing.

Our challenge is to build wisely on that foundation, to be the architects of a next stirring phase of Delaware design. Let's join together, as Delawareans have at each of the critical moments in our state's history, let's grasp a bright future. Ladies and gentlemen, the state of our state we face a new era of opportunity.

Thank you.

RESOLUTION BY THE TOWN ASSEMBLY OF THE VILLAGE OF ARDEN

WHEREAS, the prevention of terrorist attacks is a critical national priority, it is equally important to preserve the fundamental civil liberties and personal freedoms embodied in the Bill of Rights over 200 years ago, and which have been preserved through a constant vigilance against periodic threats to its principles; and

WHEREAS, a number of provisions of the USA PARTRIOT Act threaten fundamental rights and civil liberties, including:

- Section 213 which permits law enforcement to perform searches with no one present and to delay notification of the search of a citizen's home;
- Section 215 which permits the FBI Director to seek records from bookstores
 and libraries including books of patrons based on minimal evidence of
 wrongdoing and prohibits librarians and bookstore employees from disclosing
 the fact that they have been ordered to produce such documents;
- 3. Section 218 which amends the "probable cause" requirement before conducting secret searches or surveillance to obtain evidence of a crime;
- 4. Sections, 215, 218, 358 and 508 which permit law enforcement authorities to have broad access to sensitive mental health, library, business, financial, and educational records despite the existence of previously adopted state and federal laws which were intended to strengthen the protection of these types of records;
- Sections 411 and 412 which give the Secretary of State broad powers to
 designate domestic groups as "terrorist organizations" and the Attorney
 General power to subject immigrants to indefinite detention or deportation even if no crime has
 been committed; and
- Sections 507 and 508 which impose an unfunded mandate on state and local
 public universities who must collect information on students that may be of interest to the
 Attorney General.

WHEREAS, new legislation has been drafted entitled the Domestic Security

Enhancement Act (DSEA) (also known as PATRIOT II) which contains numerous new law enforcement and intelligence gathering powers, many of which are not related to terrorism, and which would severely dilute, if not undermine, many basic constitutional rights; and

WHEREAS, in response to the threats against civil liberties embodied in certain provisions of the PATRIOT Act legislation has been introduced; therefore by the Town Assembly of the Village of Arden be it

RESOLVED that we, the Village of Arden in Delaware, join approximately 235 other US communities in affirming its strong opposition to terrorism, and also affirm that any efforts to end terrorism not be waged at the expense of the fundamental civil rights and liberties of the people of Arden, the United States, and the world; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that we affirm the rights of all people, including United States citizens and citizens of other nations, living within the Village of Arden in accordance with the Bill of Rights and the Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that we reaffirm the concepts and doctrines promulgated in the Bill of Rights and the U.S. Constitution by lawfully resisting every effort to erode those rights and protections including:

freedom of religion, speech, assembly and privacy; protection from unreasonable searches and seizures; due process and equal protection to any person; equality before the law and the presumption of innocence; access to counsel in judicial proceedings; and a fair, speedy and public trial; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that we call on our United States Representative and Senators to monitor the implementation of the USA PATRIOT Act and the Orders in furtherance thereof and actively work for the repeal or amendment of those sections in the Act and those Orders that violate fundamental rights and liberties as stated in the Bill of Rights and the U.S. Constitution, by sending a copy of this resolution to Senators Biden and Carper and Representative Castle; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that by sending a copy of this resolution to the Governor and Attorney General of Delaware, to the Chairpersons of both Houses of the Delaware General Assembly for public reading and the President, we encourage our elected and appointed officials to work for repeal or amendment of the USA PATRIOT Act and those Orders in furtherance thereof which undermine basic civil rights and liberties provided in the Bill of Rights and Constitution of both the state of Delaware and the United States of America.

HCR 49 was adopted by voice vote and was sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Representative Smith requested and was granted privilege of the floor for himself and Representative Buckworth to present House Tributes to Sandra Wilson-Hypes and Darrin Anderson representing the American Heart Association, Dian Thompson, citizen and the staff of F. Neil Postlethwait Middle School. Representative Wagner made comments. Representative B. Ennis requested that he be marked present. Representative B. Ennis requested and was granted personal privilege of the floor to make comments.

Representative Smith made comments.

Representatives Gilligan, Schwartzkopf & Valihura requested that they be marked present.

Representative Smith introduced guests.

Representative Smith requested and was granted privilege of the floor for Chief Justice E. Norman Veasey who delivered the State of the Judiciary Address.

Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, President pro Tempore Adams, Lieutenant Governor Carney, Members of the 142nd Delaware General Assembly of the State of Delaware. I appreciate very much also the attendance of my judicial colleagues here today and many of my distinguished friends from around the State and former Governor Dale Wolf is here I see. Thank you, Governor, for being here. Friends too numerous to mention but Mr. Majority Leader thank you very much for acknowledging my wife's presence. That's one presence I would also like to acknowledge, putting up with me for 48 years and leading me and guiding me through the last twelve years as Chief Justice.

Well, it's a high honor for me to appear here in this Chamber to give my final State of the Judiciary Message. And in each of the prior eleven State of the Judiciary Messages I've had a theme that I've tried to develop for that particular message and this year, I have two themes: and one is the recognition and excellence of our trial courts and some thoughts for the future.

And, before I go there however, I would like to express my deep gratitude to the General Assembly and the Governor for your great support of the Delaware Judiciary over the past twelve years. And on a personal note, I'd like to thank the members of the House and the members of the Senate for honoring me with your very moving Tributes that were personally delivered to me by delegations from each of the Houses to the retirement dinner that was given for me last Monday, March the twenty-ninth. It was a great occasion and I was deeply honored and I was also honored that evening when the Governor graciously presented to me the "Order of the First State". For all of these singular honors, I am very grateful and I will cherish them forever.

The State of the Delaware Judiciary is excellent. As I leave office, I look back in retrospect and look forward prospectively over the landscape of our court system as a vital keystone of Delaware's government and its economy. First the look back.

A leader of any organization strives to make certain that the organization has not been harmed or diminished on that leader's watch. The leader hopes, moreover, that maybe the organization has been improved on that leader's watch. I believe the Delaware Judiciary has not been harmed or diminished in the past twelve years. And I hope that history will show over those 144 months that we were productive in performance improvements that have yet to be measured but can be measured.

I would measure the success of that history by the primary standard that's used by national judicial bodies such as the Conference of Chief Justices and the National Center for State Courts. And that standard is public trust and confidence. It is essential that the Judiciary, as a separate branch of government, must have that public trust and confidence. Otherwise, the promise of the rule of law that is vital to our civilization is an empty, unfulfilled promise.

There are no definitive or statistical criteria to measure public trust and confidence. In our annual reports and in our budget presentations to the Joint Finance Committee we quantify and set forth most urgently our needs in the context of what is realistic for the Judiciary to request. And what I would like to do today is give you a brief overview of some of the accomplishments and needs of our court that are most important to leave you with.

We all hear regularly and happily about the international recognition and preeminent reputation of the Delaware Judiciary. And in the retrospective, I'd like to try to demonstrate to you where to place that credit. And in terms of the prospective to look ahead—I will mention a few categories where the leadership of all three branches of government should consider focusing their priorities to affect public trust and confidence in the Judiciary.

Well, first in the Supreme Court and all of the Justices in Delaware enjoy a distinguished reputation of unquestioned integrity, competence and stability. And although the Supreme Court sets the tone and the

policy for the Judiciary, a court system is only as good as its trial bench. And as for the allocation of credit or the assessment of credit for the preeminent local, national and international reputation of our courts, I give that lion's share to our trial courts. The Court of Chancery, the Superior Court, the Family Court, Court of Common Pleas and the Justice of the Peace Court.

First, there is no doubt in the minds of business leaders inside and outside Delaware that the Court of Chancery is the crown jewel of our Delaware Judiciary. Proxy Statements of corporations seeking stockholder approval to move their state of incorporation to Delaware regularly praise all three branches of Delaware's government. And in focusing primarily on the Judiciary, they say, and I'll quote a short excerpt from one of them:

the Delaware Court of Chancery, which brings to its handling of complex corporate issues a level of experience, a speed of decision and a degree of sophistication and understanding unmatched by any other court in the country, and the Delaware Supreme Court, the only appeals court, which is highly regarded and currently consists primarily of former Vice Chancellors and corporate practitioners; ...

That's just one little quote from one of these proxy statements. Well, the views expressed in all these proxy statements have been and continue to be the overwhelming sentiment among managements, directors and institutional investors. The Delaware Court of Chancery is regarded by legal experts as the national court of first instance in resolving disputes in corporate America. That reputation and the reputation of all of our courts has tangible results for our State, contributing well over 20% of our annual revenue.

Well, this "verdict" if you will, of competence is likewise reflected in the appellate record of these courts before our Supreme Court. And this is true for all these courts where appeals go directly to the Delaware Supreme Court. There are three of those, Chancery, Superior and Family.

The overwhelming majority of decisions in the Family Court are never appealed. To some extent that reflects the economic pragmatism of a particular matter, but it also reflects the respect—even for the losing party—of the integrity and expertise of that Court. And where there are appeals, from the Delaware Court of Chancery to the Supreme Court, the data that I've had researched over the last 12 years show that over 83% of Chancery judgments are affirmed by our Court. And the General Assembly and the Governor have shown increasing confidence in that Court with the new law in technology disputes and the new mediation-only procedure.

We have competition, we have competition from other states but we also have competition from the Federal Government. The Federal Government has laws and has regulations that threaten us by intruding into the internal affairs of Delaware corporations. We can't do much about that but we must continue to supply swift and certain justice in all areas of the law to maintain the strength, integrity and competence of the Judicial Branch.

Next, the Superior Court. It's an extraordinary court of general jurisdiction. And like the Court of Chancery, it also enjoys a glittering national reputation. Indeed, we have celebrated again this year—for the third year in a row and, I think, Mr. Majority Speaker, you referred that the Delaware Court system is the Number One court system in the United States for liability systems by a poll of the United States Chamber of Commerce. That poll, conducted professionally among a cross section of 1,400 business lawyers by the Harris Interactive poll, ranked our courts first in the following categories: overall treatment of civil litigation, treatment of class actions, punitive damages, timeliness, discovery, scientific evidence, judges' impartiality, and judges competence. And that poll showed also that an overwhelming 80% of those surveyed report that litigation environment in a state could affect important business decisions. And I think this bodes well for Delaware's economy.

Well, as you can see from these categories, the principal credit for the outstanding accomplishments of this number one rating belongs to the Superior Court. What is even more remarkable is that this Court maintains this superb civil case record while handling a full docket of serious criminal cases that are increasingly complex including a burden of a large number of death penalty proceedings.

In the Superior Court as well as in the Court of Chancery the affirmance rate by the Delaware Supreme Court is impressive over the past 12 years of my tenure. And those data show the following affirmance rate for the Superior Court: over 86% for civil cases, over 92% for non-capital crime cases and over 86% of capital cases.

Given the diverse and increasingly heavy workload of the undermanned, understaffed Superior Court over these twelve years, this very positive affirmance rate is a great tribute to that Court.

The third of the three courts where direct appeals go to the Delaware Supreme Court is the Family Court. That Court has extraordinarily wide and diverse jurisdiction. Their docket includes child custody, termination of parental rights, adoption, protection from abuse, divorce, alimony, marital property, crimes against children, juvenile delinquency and many related aspects of family law. I know of no other specialized family court in this country that has a broader portfolio of jurisdictional subject matter.

Moreover, this Court has instituted innovative procedures to improve its quality and effectiveness of delivering justice. This Court, along with the Court of Common Pleas and the Justice of the Peace Court, is the court that most of our citizens see. Yet our Family Court handles these stressful and ever growing (in numbers and complexity) caseload with skill and compassion. Family Court Judges who, like the other trial courts, are shorthanded and need more judges and resources, and they deserve great credit and thanks for the extraordinary work they do.

Like the Court of Chancery and the Superior Court, this Court also has a stellar record of success on review by the Delaware Supreme Court - affirmance rate of over 87% over this twelve year period. Again, a high tribute to that Court.

And although I have stressed the appellate records of these three courts where direct appeals go to the Supreme Court, I have equal praise for the Court of Common Pleas and the Justice of the Peace Court. These courts, as I said about the Family Court, are high volume court that people see, they're the "people's courts." And because they are high volume courts, they have to develop and have developed innovative techniques to provide swift, fair and equal justice to our citizens. They are experts at efficiency, whether it's the use of videophones, expansion of Drug Courts, Truancy Court, or enhancing vitally needed collections of fines, assessments and restitutions.

All in all, we have the finest court system in the nation from the Justice of the Peace Court to the Supreme Court. And the important point is that we must keep our courts on top. All three branches of government must continue Delaware's cooperative and interdependent policy of providing the needed resources to help our courts, nourish the environment of administrative efficiency of the court system and avoid obstacles that adversely impact our courts.

Systemwide, over the past twelve years, we have seen many advances in the Delaware Judiciary. And that's part of a team effort, that's not just me, that's everybody working together. This has come about not only as a result of the teamwork of the judges, but also as a result of the foresight and assistance of a succession of seven General Assemblies and three Governors over my twelve year tenure. And I'll just mention a few of these very briefly.

Remember the Commission on Courts 2000? That was started in my first year as Chief Justice with a Joint Resolution of both the House and the Senate that supported major structural reforms in our court. And with the help of the General Assembly and three Governors, we've built modern couthouses in all three counties, including the New Castle County Courthouse where we just put an art exhibit up yesterday as part of our program. And our courts have become user-friendly.

We have modern, uniform and technological and other processes established through our Judiciary, including the COTS which has now proven to be effective.

New advances in electronic filing and high-tech litigation that is at the national cutting-edge.

Businesslike efficiency has been a top priority. You remember the Court Task Force that was chaired by the late Jim Gilliam, Jr.

Inter-branch cooperation has been advanced through these State of the Judiciary Messages, annual invitations to members of the General Assembly and others to come visit our courts and through a Three-Branch Personnel System Reform Task Force that I'll talk about at the end.

Task forces and committees on Racial and Ethnic and Gender Fairness have been established. Administrative Directives against any bias in the court systems.

Delivery of Criminal Justice Policy which is speedy trials and many other advances in our Court are being implemented.

But one of the things that maybe not everybody sees is our judges are ambassadors. Our judges go out all over the country to speak about ethics and corporate governance and matters that are important to Delaware. So we have a long list, I have a list in the written version, of twenty-five additional things I'm not gonna bore you with right now that have been done in various categories of uniform systems that we have that this team has established.

Let me give you a little look ahead and then I'll sit down.

As we all know, no organization of national importance can afford to remain static, only tweaking its systems and improving at the margins. And Delaware Judiciary is no exception. We cannot be static.

The greatest asset, and I say this all over the country, of the State of Delaware in this competitive environment that I mentioned earlier is the spirit of cooperation among all three branches of our government. Together we can stay on the cutting edge by improving. And I would like to mention a few ways.

One, with respect to providing resources to help our Judiciary maintain its excellence, I have already presented to the Joint Finance Committee operating budget requests and we will likewise be presenting capital budget requests to the Bond Bill Committee.

Those requests include vital needs for modest resources for our existing judicial officers. And in addition, we have put before the Joint Finance Committee a comprehensive documented case for additional judgeships in several courts.

The continuation of our proven COTS case management system and courthouse improvements in all three counties are on the table and will be before the Bond Committee.

In terms of overall priorities for the State of Delaware, there is a need, in my view and I mentioned this in my State of the Judiciary Message to you last year, to continue to look at the overall criminal justice policy, much of which impacts our courts.

We start with the reality that many pieces of legislation in the criminal justice area have an impact, have a cost and those costs are there and they need to be recognized and you are recognizing them

There are violent offenders who must be incarcerated and there are nonviolent offenders serving mandatory minimum sentences in our prisons. The mandatory minimums impact costs and courts and I applaud the General Assembly, as well as the Department of Correction and the Speedy Trial Committee of the Judiciary and SENTAC for stepping up to the plate and bringing focus and some action to the problem. Legislation passed last year and legislation before you this year are significant.

Last year I mentioned in this address the American Bar Association "Blueprint for Cost-Effective Pretrial, Detention, Sentencing and Corrections Systems." That resolution which was 107 at the American Bar Association is a comprehensive one, and I gave you a complete list of what they were doing.

But now you have before you in this session House Bill No. 358. I think it was mentioned earlier today that would create a special commission on criminal justice. According to that bill, it would undertake a comprehensive review of Delaware's charging decisions, pre-trial detention, plea bargaining, sentencing, correctional systems, rehabilitation, programming, offender re-entry mechanisms, services, programming available in the community, and further, to identify modifications that can be made in those systems to improve their cost-effectiveness, in conformance with justice, public safety and constitutional requirements. And you can see that cuts across the board because what we have to be responsible for is not only efficiency in the court but providing indigent services. That is a very important thing. My wife and I just got back from Seattle, picked up the Sunday paper and, reading it on the plane that said their indigent system is failed. Their public defender system is failed. Their lawyer system is failed. Why? Because they don't have the money and they haven't had the resources and they haven't had the cooperation that you all have provided to us.

I think the concept in House Bill Number 358 that has wide sponsorship in both Houses is a concept that is a good one and I think it's consistent with the idea of the study I suggested last year. I hope you will favorably consider that bill.

In terms of general reform, there are two other things that I would like to briefly mention. One is the Personnel System. In the Judicial Branch alone, for example, there are two personnel systems. Some courts have a State Merit System, other courts have the Judicial Branch Personnel System. Over two years ago a Three-Branch Task Force was created jointly by the Governor, the Speaker of the House, the President Pro Tem of the Senate and the Chief Justice. We all signed this Memorandum of Understanding and the purpose of that Task Force is to rationalize and reform the current State compensation and benefit structure. I would respectfully urge that the Task Force work move forward.

Second, I'd like to mention again the Court Resources Task Force that had been chaired by Jim Gilliam. The Final Report was given to us in 2002. I think you have copies. That Report recommended a number of things that have already been implemented for businesslike efficiency in the Judicial Branch. And in addition to the recommendations that have been implemented, there's one that's in the process of implementation and that's the creation of a Permanent Advisory Committee on Administrative Efficiency of business and legal experts. And you can see all of this in our administrative directives that are on our website. Well, that permanent committee is hard at work to coordinate and make more effective the various administrative functions that are distributed throughout the Judicial Branch. That committee is expected to make important recommendations in the future. And some of those can be accomplished under the Constitutional authority of the Chief Justice. But others may require legislation and I am certain you will be hearing more from this committee and the next Chief Justice.

Let me say in conclusion it has been a high honor for me to serve this State as Chief Justice for this past twelve years. It has likewise been an honor and a pleasure to work with all of you and your predecessors and I shall be interested in seeing the continuing progress of the Judiciary under the next Chief

Justice who will—I am certain—have the support of this body, future General Assemblies, this Governor and future Governors.

So, I want to thank you very much for all your help and support. And thank you particularly for the privilege of addressing you today.

Dear Representative George:

I write today as a private citizen concerned about **House Bill 309** and the "final working paper" dated May 11, 2004, of the Working Group of the Criminal Justice Council. **House Bill 309**, if adopted in the requisite manner, would amend the language of Article I, Section 6, of the Delaware Constitution that has been part of the Bill of Rights relating to unreasonable searches and seizures in our Delaware Constitution for over two centuries. The amendment would change that time honored Delaware language to parallel the wording of the Fourth Amendment to the Federal Constitution, as interpreted from time to time by the United States Supreme Court.

Because an amendment to the Bill of Rights in the Delaware Constitution affects the liberties of our citizens, it should be done only after careful study and a reasoned conclusion that our Constitution is clearly wrong. What is at stake is a balance between the perceived needs of law enforcement and long-standing constitutionally-guaranteed civil liberties.

It has long been recognized by the United States Supreme Court that it is entirely appropriate for state constitutions to provide greater protections that those set forth in the federal constitution, as interpreted by the United States Supreme Court. By making the Delaware Constitution identical to the Federal Constitution, it seems that we would be ceding authority for the interpretation of our Constitution to the federal judiciary. Therefore, we may be risking an erosion of our state sovereignty and undermining the independence of our state judiciary.

A case in point is *United States v. Leon*, 468 U.S. 897 (1984) that read into the federal constitution the so-called "good faith" exception to the exclusionary role applicable to searches that exceed the authority set forth in a search warrant. The Delaware Supreme Court has held that the Delaware Constitutional protections against unreasonable searches and seizures do not recognize this exception that had been interpreted by the United States Supreme Court to be implied in the federal constitution. See, Dorsey v. State, 761 A.2d 807 (Del. 200) (citing *Rickards v. State*, 77 A.2d 199 (Del. 1950 and Mason v. State, 534 A.2d 242 (1987). Moreover, eighteen states have declined to follow the United States Supreme Court decision in *Leon* and only a few have followed it.

On a similar note, in *Jones v. State*, 745 A.2d 856 (Del. 1999), the Delaware Supreme Court held that the United States Supreme Court decision in *Hodari D.*, 499 U.S. 621 (1991) does not apply when interpreting the constitutional guarantees of the Delaware Constitution.

My main concern at this point is that we should not tinker with these venerable constitutional rights of Delaware citizens, unless there is a compelling reason to correct something that is clearly wrong. I have not been persuaded that there is such a compelling reason or that the Delaware Constitution as interpreted by the Delaware Supreme Court is clearly wrong.

The very recent history of the freedom of speech guarantee is interesting in this context. When the framers of the Delaware Constitution wrote the 1792 Constitution, they had before them the 1791 Federal Bill of Rights and the 1790 Pennsylvania Constitution. In the 1792 Constitution, Delaware's protection of the press was nearly identical to that provided by Pennsylvania's provision in Article IX, Section 7 of its 1790 Bill of Rights. In 1792, however, Delaware omitted the Pennsylvania provisions protecting free speech. In January 2002, legislation was introduced in the General Assembly to amend Article I, Section 5 of the Delaware Constitution to guarantee Delaware citizens freedom of speech. The language of that 2002 amendment was taken from the Pennsylvania Constitution of 1790. The proposed amendment became effective in 2003. This is one of the few substantive changes to the Delaware Bill of Rights since 1792. "By continuing to use the 1790 Pennsylvania Constitution as a model, the modern drafters of this[amendment] have provided a logical basis for consistency in judicial interpretation of Section 5." See Randy J. Holland The Delaware State Constitution: A Reference Guide (Greenwood Press 2002).

To demonstrate the fact that the Delaware Constitution has deep roots and has stood the test of time, I attach an addendum summarizing briefly the Delaware chronology and the Federal comparison.

Accordingly, I respectfully suggest the General Assembly not adopt **H. B. 309**, unless an independent, thorough, and scholarly study is undertaken considering all points of view in a deliberative manner to determine whether or not there is a compelling need to amend the Delaware Constitution on the ground that Article I, Section 6, is clearly wrong.

Delaware Chronology

Pre-Revolutionary War: Thomas McKean and John Dickenson of Delaware study law at the Middle Temple in England. They are contemporaries of William Blackstone, who wrote the definitive treatise on the Common Law of England.

1776: Thomas McKean is the principal author of the first Delaware Constitution and Declaration of Rights. The Declaration of Rights includes protections against search and seizure and incorporates the common law of England by reference as the law of Delaware.

1778: Thomas McKean moves to Pennsylvania and becomes Chief Justice of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court for twenty-two years.

John Dickinson moves to Delaware: Dickinson served as the Governor of Pennsylvania and the Governor of Delaware. He chaired the Annapolis Convention and was a delegate to the Philadelphia Convention which adopted the United States Constitution.

1790: Pennsylvania adopts a new constitution that is written by Thomas McKean.

1791: The Federal Bill of Rights becomes effective in December with the ratification by Virginia.

1792: Delaware adopts a new constitution. John Dickinson is the President of the Delaware Constitutional Convention. The Bill of Rights is made Article I rather than a separate document as it was in 1776. The words probable cause are added to the Delaware Bill of Rights. In writing the Delaware Bill of Rights, the Delaware Convention had before it both the Federal Bill of Rights and the Pennsylvania Bill of Rights from its 1790 Constitution. The words probable cause are found in both documents but the Delaware Bill of Rights looks a lot like the Pennsylvania Bill of Rights. This is not surprising since McKean wrote the Pennsylvania document and was a friend of Dickinsons. Especially since McKean had written the 1776 Delaware Declaration of Rights and Constitution.

1831: Delaware adopts a new constitution, and the 1792 Bill of Rights is retained verbatim.

1833: Chief Justice John Marshall writes the opinion in *Barron v. Baltimore*, 32 U.S. 243, that holds the Federal Bill of Rights does not apply to the states.

Mid-1800s: Delaware enacts a statute that requires more than probable cause to support a nighttime search warrant. In addition to probable cause, the affidavit must assert exigent circumstances. That remains the law today. In *Mason v. State*, the Delaware Supreme Court discussed the history of the nighttime search warrant requirement. The Court also held that the courts could not authorize a "good faith exception" to the nighttime search warrant requirement. *See Mason v. State*, 534 A.2d 242 (Del. 1987)

1868: The Fourteenth Amendment is enacted with the due process clause that becomes the basis for selective incorporation of the Federal Bill of Rights as applicable to state action.

1897: Delaware adopts a new constitution. The 1792 Bill of Rights is retained verbatim. During the constitutional debates, the delegates acknowledge that the United States Supreme Court has held that the Fifth Amendment Grand Jury requirement does not apply to the states. Nevertheless, the delegates decide that they want to retain the Grand Jury protection for the citizens of Delaware. This is accomplished by leaving the 1792 Bill of Rights unchanged.

1950: The Delaware Supreme Court decides *Rickards v. State*, 77 A.2d 199 (Del. 1950). The Court holds that if a search warrant is issued without probable cause, the Delaware Constitution requires exclusion of the evidence. Thus, since at least 1950, the Delaware Supreme Court has held there is a state constitutional basis for Delaware's exclusionary rule. This is consistent with Chief Justice John Marshall's citation to *Blackstone's Common Law Treatise in Marbury v. Madison*, 5 U.S. 137 (1803), for the proposition that violations of rights require appropriate remedies. This was cited by the Delaware Supreme Court in Dorsey, 761 A.2d 807 (Del. 2000).

1961: The United States Supreme Court holds that the federal exclusionary rule is not a constitutional requirement but is a judge-made common law pronouncement to deter police conduct. *See Mapp v. Ohio*, 367 U. S. 643.

1984: The United States Supreme Court decides *Leon*, 468 U.S. 897 and recognizes a good faith exception to the probable cause requirement in the United States Constitution.

1987: The Delaware Supreme Court decides Mason v. State and holds there is no good faith exception to violating the nighttime search warrant requirements.

1990: The Pennsylvania Supreme Court decides *Edmunds* under the Pennsylvania Constitution and holds that there is no good faith exception because the Pennsylvania Constitution requires exclusion of evidence that is obtained without probable cause.

1999: The Delaware Supreme Court decides *Jones v. State*, 745 A.2d 856 (Del. 1999) and holds that search and seizure protections of the Delaware Constitution are greater than those set forth in the United States Constitution.

2000: The Delaware Supreme Court decides *Dorsey v. State* which adheres to our Court's fifty-year old holding in *Rickards*. We note our consistency with *Jones* and cite *Edmonds* with approval.

OTHER STATES

As the appendix to the criminal justice working paper reflect eighteen states have declined to follow *Leon* and only a few states follow *Leon*.

PENNSYLVANIA PRECEDENT

I understand that it has been argued that the Delaware Supreme Court should follow the United States Supreme Court rather than precedents of elected judges from Pennsylvania.

This suggestion is factually flawed for two reasons. First, the only Pennsylvania precedent that Delaware followed was in 1792 when John Dickinson looked to the 1790 Pennsylvania Bill of Rights that had been written by Thomas McKean, the former Delawarean who had written the Delaware Constitution of 1776. Second, in *Dorsey*, this Court followed its own fifty-year-old precedent in *Rickards*. The Pennsylvania case was cited as persuasive authority only, in addition to citing the great many other states that had declined to follow *Leon*.

FEDERAL COMPARISON

Fifth Amendment: The United States constitutional provision for Grand Juries does not apply to the states. Nevertheless, Delaware requires indictments by Grand Juries.

Sixth Amendment – Jury Trial: The Federal Constitution does not require twelve jurors and does not require a jury to be unanimous. The Delaware Constitution adheres to both of the former common law requirements.

Sixth Amendment – Right to Counsel: The Delaware Constitution provides greater protection than the Federal Constitution. *Compare Moran v. Burbine* by the United States Supreme Court with *Weber v. State* by the Delaware Supreme Court.

Seventh Amendment: The Seventh Amendment right to a civil jury trial has never been incorporated by the Fourteenth Amendment as applying to the states. Therefore, a citizen's right to a civil jury trial is protected exclusively by the Delaware Constitution.

Second Amendment: The only significant change to the 1792 Delaware Bill of Rights occurred about a decade ago when the Delaware Constitution was amended to provide for a right to bear arms. It is interesting to note that although the Second Amendment had been in existence since 1791 the Delaware General Assembly provided for greater rights under the Delaware Constitution. Fourth Amendment: Although Jones and Dorsey both conclude that Delaware provides greater search and seizure protections than the Fourth Amendment, it is important to note that the Delaware Supreme Court adopted the identical standard for determining probable cause that is used for the United States Constitution. Specifically, the Delaware Supreme Court adopted the Illinois v. Gates, 462 U.S. 213 (1983), "totality of the circumstances" test for probable cause under the Delaware Constitution. See Coleman v. State, 562 A.2d 1171 (1989).

CONCLUSION

The United States Supreme Court has consistently recognized that it is entirely appropriate for state constitutions to provide greater protections than the federal constitution. *Moran v. Burline*, 475 U.S. 412 (1986) (C.J. Rehnquist for the majority: "Nothing we say today disables states from adopting different requirements for the conduct of its employer and officials as a matter of state law."); see also *Delaware v. Van Arsdell*, 475 U. S. 673, 704 (1986) (Stevens, J., dissenting). In concluding that "[t]he emerging preference for state constitutional bases of decision in lieu of federal ones is, in my view, the analytical approach best suited to facilitating the independent role of state," Justice Stevens quoted the Oregon Supreme Court:

"The point is...that a state's constitutional guarantees...were meant to be and remain genuine guarantees against misuse of the state's governmental powers, truly independent of the rising and falling tides of federal case law both in method and specifics. State courts cannot abdicate their responsibility for these independent guarantees, at least not unless the people of the State themselves choose to abandon them and entrust their rights entirely to federal law. State v. Kennedy, 295 Or.

260, 271, 666 P.2d 1316, 1323 (1983)." State v. Ball, 124 N.H. 226, 231, 471 A.2d 347, 350 (1983).

As a practical matter, there have been few, if any, cases other than *Dorsey* that excluded evidence because a search warrant lacked probable cause. There is no necessity to amend the Delaware Constitution as proposed by **H. B. 309**. The point is that it is very easy for a police officer to state why he or she wants to look at a particular place for a particular item. Since Delaware follows the Federal Probable Cause definition, there should be no confusion in the training process.

Dear Members of the 142nd General Assembly:

The Criminal Justice Council is required by law to submit to the General Assembly, each year, a legislative package for the improvement of criminal justice. This letter is our second letter sent to you for this session. At this time, we have the following comments regarding legislation:

The Criminal Justice Council defers taking a position on the following legislation:

HB 345 This act adds misdemeanor drug offenses to the jurisdiction of the Court of Common Pleas, such as simple possession of cocaine. It implements a recommendation made by the Courts 2000 study.

HB 417 This act would insure that, consistent with the premises and stated purposed of the Truth-in-Sentencing Act of 1989, any life sentence imposed by any Court under any provision of the Delaware Code will not be subject to probation, parole, good time or any other reduction but will be served in its entirety as a natural life sentence.

HB 424 This Act will transfer original jurisdiction over the crimes of Manslaughter and Criminally Negligent Homicide from the Family Court to the Superior Court. By doing so, the Act provides the Superior Court with discretion to either retain jurisdiction over such cases, thereby substantially increasing the range of available penalties, or to transfer the case back to the Family Court for prosecution.

HB 426 D.N.A. identification technology is the most powerful law enforcement tool developed in decades. It permits the identification of offenders and safeguards against the misidentification of the innocent. This Act enables Delaware to take full advantage of the power of D.N.A. technology to solve crimes and protect the innocent by requiring the collection of D.N.A. samples from any person arrested and charged with any criminal offense from whom fingerprints are currently collected.

The Criminal Justice Council opposes the following legislation:

SB 266 This Bill provides for the automatic expungement of all arrest records when a charge is dismissed without qualification, or if an accused is found not guilty.

HB 309 This Act is intended to ensure that the provisions of the Delaware Constitution governing searches and seizures are identical to the Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution and that the protections and rights which this provision guarantees are equal to those provided by the Fourth Amendment of the United States Constitution as it is, has been, and will be interpreted from time to time by the Courts of the United States.

See attached Working Paper prepared by the Criminal Justice Council staff.

The Criminal Justice Council supports the following legislation:

SB 221 This Bill enables foreign nationals in Delaware prisons to be sent back to their country of origin to serve the rest of their sentences.

SB 232 This legislation makes housekeeping changes related to the misdemeanor jurisdiction of the Justice of the Peace Court.

SB 242 Under current law, a person may file a petition in the Superior Court to expunge the police records of any arrest where he or she was acquitted of the resulting criminal charges, where those charges were dismissed, or where the Attorney General chose to nolle prosequi the case. This Act permits the person to file a petition for expungement in the specific court in the county where the case was terminated, disposed of, or concluded.

The Criminal Justice Council supports this piece of legislation with the provision that the bill allows the Superior Court to retain the ability to expunge all cases from all courts.

SB 262 This act will increase the protections afforded to Delawareans from criminal harassment by expanding the coverage of our harassment statute to acts which the perpetrator knows are likely to cause a reasonable person to suffer substantial emotional distress.

HB 358 This Act creates a Special Commission on criminal justice to conduct an informed assessment of the viability of alternatives to embarking upon construction program for additional level V capacity for the Department of Correction.

HB 365 Current law permits a Delaware judge to dismiss a charge against a driver for not having a child properly restrained in a car safety seat if the driver can produce evidence that a car seat has been purchased after the offense. The intent of allowing for the dismissal was to give the public an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the law.

HB 414 This Act: (1) clarifies that the Level IV portions of sentences do not count toward the time limitations placed on probationary or suspended sentences; (2) ensures that the sex offenses that would permit longer periods of probationary supervision are properly designated; (3) ensures that those robbery cases committed by juveniles that are subject to Superior Court jurisdiction are properly defined; (4) in light of the enactment of 74 Del. Laws, c. 62 (Senate Bill 26, 142nd General Assembly), removes unnecessary and duplicative verbiage from certain enhanced penalty statues – those prior offenses from other jurisdictions now fall under 74 Del Laws, c. 62; (5) makes it clear that the prior or previous conviction or offense definition in Title 21, §4177B(e)(1) of the Delaware Code does not fall under 74 Del. Laws, c. 62; and (6) clarifies that the provisions of the motor vehicle code that provide that certain offenders may be housed in settings other than Level V are classification statutes that permit the Department of Correction to properly classify inmates based on assessment of the inmate and available resources and that they are not sentencing provisions to be instituted by judges at the time of sentencing.

HB 420 This act would consider consolidate criminal cases in which certain charged offenses may be within the jurisdiction of the Court of Common Pleas while other charges from the same criminal episode may be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Family Court. The act serves to conserve the resources of the courts and ensure consistency in the cases involved.

The Council recognizes that certain pieces of legislation have passed, and possibly signed by the Governor before you receive the Council's recommendations and/or comments. The timing of our recommendations is sometimes difficult to coordinate the review of Bills. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience this may cause you.

WHEREAS, after a notable Hollywood, television and film career, and serving two-terms as one of California's most successful governors, Ronald Wilson Reagan won the Republican Party's nomination for President in 1980; and

WHEREAS, by appealing to the common sense of the American people, Ronald Wilson Reagan became the 40th President of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS known as "the Great Communicator", Ronald Reagan became one of the most popular presidents in American history; and

WHEREAS when President Reagan took office in 1980, the nation's inflation rate was 13.5%; and WHEREAS, President Reagan's belief in the principles of the free market and opportunity were the cornerstone of his economic policy, popularly known as "Reaganomics"; and

WHEREAS, "Reaganomic" policies included a reduction in taxes and restraint of government spending in order to leave more money in the hands of citizens, and the reduction of regulations which often constrained economic opportunity, job creation and the pursuit of happiness, which worked to ignite an unprecedented period of economic growth, whereupon the inflation rate dropped to under 5% by 1982, and therein remained throughout the rest of his Presidency; and

WHEREAS President Reagan's strong commitment to freedom and democracy changed the map of the world by helping to bring about the end of the Cold War in 1989, the dissolution of Soviet tyranny, the end of communism as an expansive form of economic and political organization, thereby securing freedom to hundreds of millions of Eastern Europeans after more than 70 years of brutal oppression and giving hope to billions around the world of a better life of freedom, liberty and democracy; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan had an uncanny ability to unite the nation under the strength of his convictions and his belief in the spirit of the American people; and

WHEREAS President Reagan's buoyant optimism and his vision of America as always having a new dawn ahead of it, and his faith in God and God's providence, all helped America reestablish our national confidence; and

WHEREAS, the life of President Ronald Wilson Reagan will always remain a shining example of the spirit of America and of true patriotism for generations to come; and

WHEREAS, we mourn the death of a true American hero and will always remember the legacy of President Ronald Wilson Reagan.

NOW, THEREFORE:
