Dear Nat:

I have your note dated September 11 acknowledging my letter about Mr. Mallory. I saw Mrs. Mallory here a few days ago, as her family lives in Mexico City, and I learned from her that he has already gone to his home near Spokane, Wash., where Mrs. Mallory will join him until about October 21, when he comes to Mexico City. He is going to fly with Mrs. Mallory to Buenos Aires from here. I had planned not to return to Mexico City from my trip north until about October 30, but as I am very anxious to see Mallory, for any number of reasons, I will be planning to return here not later than October 27 or 28 so that I will have a chance to see him before he returns to Buenos Aires.

With regard to Mr. Donnelly, I shall have an opportunity of expressing some opinions to Mr. Heineman and to you while I am in New York, before going to Toronto on October 6.

I am glad to know that Brosens is coming up from Buenos Aires, as I feel that this question of the equipment for Cade will have to be settled one way or other. I am utterly unaware of what the situation is today in Buenos Aires and I think Brosens cannot give a real picture to Mr. Heineman by letter, so that it will be very useful for Mr. Heineman for any number of reasons to see Mr. Brosens in New York.

I will be spending the day of October 6th in New York as I arrive in the morning and leave in the evening for Toronto, but I expect to be back again in New York on October 10th for a number of days.
