# **Shoprite replacing Safeway in Bear**

The former Safeway store in Bear's Governor's Square Shopping Center will have a new occupant by the end of the year.

Work is under way on the former 53,000-square-foot store that will gain an extra 10,000 square feet as it becomes a Shoprite store, according to Delaware Supermarkets officials Rich Mestro and Dan Tanzer, director of operations and marketing director respectively.

The Kenny family, owner of Delaware Supermarkets, has steadily expanded over the years and now has locations in Stanton, Newark, north Wilmington and most recently the Wilmington riverfront.

Delawareonline.com reported cost of renovation and expansion of the former Safeway site will run into the millions of dollars. The expansion will extend into a small portion of the shopping center as well as an addition to the existing supermarket building.

Shoprite, which operates as a cooperative grocery wholesaler under the Wakefern Foods name, serves individually-owned Shoprite stores.

According to Maestro and Tanzer, Shoprite had been interested in the Bear area for a number of years, at one point announcing plans for a store at a new shopping center site to the east of Governor's Square. Market studies continued to point to the potential of the area. When the Safeway store site became

available, the company saw an opportunity to expand, the executives noted. The Bear store is in a busy location near Routes 1, 7 and 40 and despite reports that the Safeway store was losing money when it closed, rumors that Shoprite and other grocers were interested in the site continued to make the rounds.

Delaware Supermarkets' newest store, in the riverfront area of Wilmington, features an upscale appearance and expanded departments.

The new store in Bear will include the features of the Wilmington location, including a restaurant. Unlike the Wilmington location, the Bear store will not have a pharmacy. Employment will total 180.

Shoprite has been gaining market share in the Delaware



Valley as other chains have been closing stores

One competitor, A&P, owner of Superfresh and Pathmark stores, entered Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings and closed a store in the Glasgow area.

Published reports have indicated that Shoprite has overtaken Acme in market share in the Delaware Valley. Acme is still believed to still have the biggest market share in northern Delaware.



### **Council approves Amstel redevelopment**

Newark City Council on Monday unanimously approved a plan to build townhouses at 116 Amstel Avenue and heard the first reading of a proposal to do the same thing on an adjacent property.

Currently on the .49-acre 116 Amstel site is a converted house that is the headquarters of the Baptist Student Ministry, which serves students at the University of Delaware. The

group's student leaders live in four bedrooms upstairs.

The plan, which required rezoning, subdivision and a special use permit, calls for the demolition of the existing structure and the construction of two new buildings.

In the front of the property will be a new, 5,000-square-foot headquarters for the ministry. Behind that will be a two-story L-shaped building that will house six townhouse apartments.

"We think it's a great design that will be very visually appealing," said Lisa Goodman, the attorney representing Amstel Avenue, LLC, the developer building the project. She noted the buildings will be brick to match the university's build-

Blake Hardcastle, director of the ministry, told council the current building is in need of repair and the former house was never properly suited for a ministry.

"What's great for a family isn't always great for a ministry," Hardcastle said. "(This) is a shiny new building the students can be excited about."

Currently, the entire property is owned by the Delaware Baptist Association, but it will soon be split between the DBA and Amstel Avenue, LLC.

"We reached an agreement that will allow them to update their facility, and we'll take ownership of the rear piece (of land)," said Kevin Heitzenroder of Amstel Avenue, LLC.

Heitzenroder said construction will begin in October, and he hopes for a June 2012 com-

### City considers new parking system

Newark could have a new, two-level parking facility on Main Street as early as the end of next summer if a new proposal is approved by city coun-

The plan calls for a foundationless, modular steel-andconcrete structure to be placed over the existing Lot 3, which is behind Café Gelato and Catherine Rooney's Irish Pub. According to initial estimates, the structure, called the More Park System, would add 113 parking spaces to the existing 200 in the lot.

The estimated \$3.4 million cost would be offset by raising parking fees in all three of the

city's pay-to-park lots from 50 cents per half hour to 60 cents per half hour.

"We're at a crossroads with downtown development," said Maureen Feeney Roser, assistant planning director. "More businesses and people want to come, and we must expand our parking inventory to accommodate them."

Feeney Roser presented the plan to city council Monday night. Council did not vote on the plan but expressed support for the project and informally gave Feeney Roser the authority to continue fine-tuning the

The project will be part of the capital budget, which council will vote on this fall, Feeney Roser said

The city has already signed a

memorandum of understanding with the Newark Development Trust to explore building a parking garage on Lot 1 behind the Galleria, but that project is still a few years away.

Feeney Roser said the city first heard about the More Park System, which is popular in Europe, last fall. It was appealing to officials because it can be built quicker and cheaper than a traditional parking garage.
"It's built like building blocks

and can be placed directly over an existing parking area," she said. "Because it's modular, we don't have to shut down the entire lot while it's being built."

Construction of the structure would take eight weeks, though some site work, such as burying power lines and moving fire hydrants, would need to be done first. If all goes well, Feeney Roser said, the project could start at the beginning of next summer and be completed before university students return in the fall.

In contrast, a garage, like the one being considered for Lot 1, would take up to a year to build.

The plan also calls for an additional entrance to the lot off of Center Street. The entrance would be built on land the city recently acquired.

Ryan German, the owner of Café Gelato, told council the extra parking spaces are needed. The lot is almost always full during lunchtime, he said, making it difficult for his customers to find a place to park.

This is a very important project," German said.

### Crash claims life of Newark area man

Delaware State Police Crash Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal motorcycle crash that claimed the life of a man from the Newark area and tied up traffic in the area for hours.

The crash occurred at 2:35 p.m., Monday, as Donald Desanctis, 21, of Holmes, Pa., was driving a 2008 Chevrolet tow truck southbound on Del. Route 896, south of Newark and was approaching the intersection of Four Seasons Parkway in the left turn lane.

Troopers reported that Desanctis' truck turned left on to Old Cooches Bridge Road, crossing the northbound lanes of Route 896 and into the path of a 2002 Suzuki GXR Motorcycle traveling northbound Route 896 at a high rate of speed and operated by Johnathan O'Neill, 23, of Newark.

The front of the motorcycle struck the passenger side rear of the tow truck and burst into flames. O'Neill was ejected from the motorcycle and into the roadway.

O'Neill suffered fatal injuries and was pronounced dead at the scene. Preliminary investigation indicates that he was not wearing a helmet.

Desanctis was the only occupant of the tow truck. He was not injured.

A preliminary investigation does not indicate that alcohol was a factor in the crash. The status of the traffic lights for both vehicles is under investigation, with charges pending the conclusion of the investigation.

Route 896 was closed in both directions between U.S. Route 40 and Old Baltimore Pike for approximately three hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

### Man charged with rape of 16 year-old female

New Castle County Detectives have arrested Javier Curiel, a 40 year-old male who resides in the 200 block of North Old Baltimore Pike in Newark, DE. He has been charged with offenses related to the sexual assault of a 16 yearold female.

On Monday, July 18, detectives were assigned to investigate a reported sexual abuse case involving the young victim. The investigation has revealed the victim had been sexually abused on at least five occasions (additional information regarding the circumstances and location is being withheld to protect the victim's identity).

On August 8, after an extensive interview with Javier Curiel, detectives were able to confirm his involvement in the crime and he was arrested at police headquarters. Curiel was charged with five counts of rape in the second degree and one count of rape in fourth degree. He was arraigned and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institute after failing to post \$52,500 secured bail and ordered to have no contact with the victim.

### Shooting investigation at Christiana Village Townhouses

New Castle County Police are currently investigating the shooting of an 18 year-old Newark teen that was shot and is at the hospital in critical condition.

Late in the afternoon, at 4:25 p.m., on August 8, County Police received information that a subject arrived at the Christiana Hospital by private vehicle after sustaining a gunshot wound to the upper body. Police initially received information that the individual was shot while in the parkland, but after further investigation it was revealed the incident occurred inside a home in the 1800 block of Lowland Way in the community of Christiana Village Townhouses.

Currently, officers and detectives are canvassing the area and conducting interviews in an attempt to gather more information in reference to the shooting. ### Man charged after shoplifting incident

The Delaware State Police arrested an Elkton, Maryland man after he injured a store employee while being apprehended for shoplifting.

The incident began after Martin E. Goodwin, Jr., 31, entered the Home Depot store located in the 2000 block of Peoples Plaza Drive, in Newark, at approximately 8:30 p.m. on August 4. Goodwin proceeded to obtain a shopping cart and was then observed by store personnel responding to the section of the store where copper wiring is displayed for sale. He then attempted to remove rolls of wire from display, however he was not successful due to the

fact that the rolls were secured on the display shelf and cannot be removed without the help of an employee. Goodwin then proceeded to remove other types of wire that were not

secured, as well as assorted tools from display, and placed them into the shopping cart. He then attempted to exit the store without paying for the

merchandise. Goodwin was then confronted by three store employees who attempted to detain him. He then produced a box cutter knifé and threatened the employees with it. He also informed the employees that he was armed with a gun. As the employees attempted to disarm Goodwin, one of the employees was cut on his hand. The employees were finally able to subdue him and escort him to the security office where Troopers were then contacted. A gun was not located.

After a State Trooper arrived and began questioning Goodwin, he became agitated and ran from the security office. The Trooper was able to detain him however, as he ran out of a rear door. Further investigation revealed Goodwin had driven to the Home Depot in a 1995

Jeep Wrangler that had been reported stolen to the Elkton, Maryland Police Department earlier in the day.

Martin Goodwin was arrested and charged with Shoplifting, Assault 2nd Degree, Aggravated Menacing (3 counts), Terroristic Threatening (3 counts), Receiving Stolen Property, Possession of a Deadly Weapon during the Commission of a Felony (3 counts), Resisting Arrest, and Carrying a Concealed Deadly Weapon. He was arraigned at JP Court 11 and then committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institution for lack of \$107,000 secured bail.

### Stolen vehicle hides iuvenile runaway

On August 1, during a routine patrol, Newark Police discovered a light blue Hyundai Sonata with Missouri registration parked in a wooded section near the intersection of Creek View Road and Paper Mill Road. The responding officer approached the car and found two individuals, one male and one female, sleeping inside. When questioned, the pair stated that they were a married couple on their way to visit a relative in Atlantic City, NJ, but had been robbed, leaving them with no money, identification, or a place to stay.

The man identified him-

self as David Plummer, 25, of Kansas and the nervously called herself Jasper Plummer. A routine check showed that the male's ID checked out, but that the female's did not. The girl gave two other false names that did not show up in any databases, before she was transported to Newark PD for questioning. Upon arriving at the station, she gave her real name, showing her to be a 15 year-old runaway. As Plummer returned with the vehicle to pick up the female suspect, a registration check showed that the car had been reported as stolen, as well as the car's contents, which consisted of credit/debit cards, bedding, and a small dog, just two days before by the Barton County Sheriff's Office in Lamar, MO. Plummer was detained for further questioning and the car was impounded. A search of Plummer's person also revealed a pool ball wrapped in a sock, that the suspect said "was used for protection."

The girl was charged with Criminal Impersonation and issued bail in the amount of \$50. Plummer was charged with Receiving Stolen Property, Endangering the Welfare of a Minor, and for Possession of a Dangerous Instrument. He was arraigned and issued bail in the amount of \$20,000 and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Facility.

### Playing it safe to prevent concussions

Every year, thousands of children sustain head injuries playing sports, in car and bicycle accidents, fights and even minor falls. Most childhood head injuries are not serious and affect only the outside of the head; however, children may experience a temporary loss of brain function, known as a concussion. Although some accidents can't be avoided, simple safety precautions - and common sense - can go a long way in preventing concus-

With the busy back-toschool season fast approaching, now is a great time for parents to discuss safety with their children.

At Home - Childproofing your home is vital to keep young children safe from concussions. Toddlers, for instance, may pull themselves up using table legs or use dressers as jungle gyms, which can lead to a fall. Create a safe place to play and explore at home, and never leave a child unattended.

Enjoying Activities - Be sure children wear properly fit-

ting, appropriate headgear and safety equipment when playing contact sports, biking, rollerblading, skateboarding, snowboarding or skiing.

On-the-Go - If your child drives, talk about the importance of always wearing a seatbelt and being attentive at all times. Obeying speed limits, signs, and safe-driving laws help reduce the chances of having an accident. Discuss the effects of drugs and alcohol, which slow reaction time and impair judgment, making teens much more likely to have an accident. Teens also should never text while driving.

Anyone who sustains a head injury should immediately be removed from the activity or sport. Even without a loss of consciousness, it's important to watch for these symptoms of a concussion. Concussion symptoms may not appear right away and can develop up to 72 hours after the initial injury:

· A change in level of alertness, feeling confused or dazed

- · Sleepiness or difficulty falling asleep
  - · A bad headache
  - · Nausea or vomiting
- · Dizziness or difficulty with coordination and/or balance
- · Blurred vision
- · Slurred speech or saying things that don't make sense
- · Feeling anxious or irritable for no apparent reason
  - Convulsions or seizures The severity of a concus-

sion is determined by how long symptoms last and is only known after someone has recovered. The longer the symptoms of changes in brain function continue, the more severe the concussion. Kids who sustain concussions usually recover within a week or two without lasting health problems, but a child with an undiagnosed concussion can be at risk for brain damage and even disability.

After a concussion, the brain needs time to heal. While symptoms persist, your child should not:

- · Attend school or have a normal workload
- · Take any high-stakes testing (for example, state testing or SATs)
- · Participate in physical activity including gym class, recess, and sports
- · Participate in wheel activities (for example, biking, rollerblading, or skateboarding)
- · Drive or operate heavy machinery
- · Return to work

Some children will report feeling better even though their thinking, behavior, and/or balance have not yet returned to normal. It's important for parents to wait until all symptoms have cleared and your doctor has given the okay before resuming normal activities.

The customer in the picture foreground is identified on the picture as Alma C. Tolomeo. Mrs. Tolomeo, now age 105, lives in Newark with her son Frank. The Tolomeos operated Newark Pharmacy for many years at South Chapel and East Main Streets. Newark Trust and Safe Deposit Company was founded in 1905 by prominent Newark businessman Samuel J. Wright. It was first located on Academy Street in the back comer of the Newark Opera House. Later it moved to Main Street

Newark Trust merged with Farmers Bank of the State of Delaware that later merged with Girard Bank and moved to a new building at Center and East Main Streets. After housing several businesses, the 87 East Main Street property was purchased



by the University of Delaware. It was demolished in 2010 as part of the University's new bookstore project. The space where the bank stood will be part of the landscaped open area leading from Main Street to the bookstore entrance.

The proposal, which was approved by the Planning Commission in July, is set for a public hearing and council vote on Sept. 12.

# Are you ready for some football?!

The time was 6:15 a.m. this past Monday at the University of Delaware football practice fields. It was then and there on another hot and humid morning when one of the most storied Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Div. I-AA) football programs in the country began its quest for a national title.

The task will not be easy. Delaware lost a talented senior class, whose leadership and commitment head coach K.C. Keeler boasted about throughout last season.

Among the departures from last year's 12-3 team, which won a share of the Colonial Athletic Association title and advanced to the NCAA Division I FCS title game, are five players currently on NFL rosters: quarterback Pat Devlin (Miami), defensive backs Tyrone Grant (Washington), Anthony Walters (Chicago) and Anthony Bratton (Green Bay), and linebacker Matt Marcorelle (Houston).

Despite the impressive list of players from last year's team who won't be back, Keeler is confident the players who are returning can once again compete at a very high level.

'We have a pretty good football team coming back despite losing some great seniors, lead-

ers, and some really dependable players," Keeler, who begins his 10th season, said during the annual CAA Football Media Day. "I think we had as good a spring as we've ever had and all indications are that this has been a great summer of preparation. I think we have a pretty good football team coming back and our expectations are really high."

The Blue Hens were picked by CAA head coaches and media relations personnel to finish third in the CAA preseason poll. The Hens received two first-place votes and trailed only William and Mary (12 first-place votes) and James Madison (4) in the rankings.

Perhaps Delaware's top returning player -- or certainly the most talked about one - is sophomore running back Andrew Pierce. Last year's CAA Rookie of the Year led the nation's freshmen in rushing with 1,655 yards and 14 touchdowns, and also caught 32 passes for 199 yards and three TDs.

'My teammates and I are really anxious for the season to come, put the pads on, and

get back on the field," said Pierce, who shares pre-season Offensive Player of the Year honors with William and Mary senior running back Jonathan . Grimes. "I don't really pay much attention to all of the
