KIDS COUNT in Delaware Census Brief: 2020 Child Population

DELAWARE CHILD POPULATION COUNT STAGNANT

While Delaware's total population increased by 10.2 percent between 2010 and 2020, Delaware's child (0 –17) population increased by less than one percentage point (640 children or 0.3%) according to new data from the U.S. Census Bureau. Because of growth in the adult population, children now make up a smaller proportion of the state's population, going from 22.9 percent of the total population in 2010 to 20.9 percent of the total population in 2020.







The 2020 Census counted a total of 989,948 individuals in the state of Delaware. Of these, the bulk (570,719 or 57.7 percent) reside in New Castle County. Sussex County is next populous with 237,378 or 24 percent of the state's population. There were 181,851 individuals counted in Kent County, making up 18.4 percent of the state's total population.

POPULATION BY COUNTY

As a proportion of the state's total population in 2020, children 0–17 were 20.9 percent of Delaware's population. This ranges from a high of 23.1 percent in Kent County to a low of 18.3 percent of individuals in Sussex County. Children make up 21.2 percent of the total population in New Castle County.

From 2010 to 2020 New Castle County added 32,240 individuals, representing a 6 percent change in the state's total population, while the child population in New Castle County increase only 3.4 percent. In the same time period Kent County's total population increased by 19,541 individuals or 12 percent, while the county's child population decreased by 4.1 percent. The largest increase in total population was in Sussex County; with the addition of 40,233 individuals, this represents a 20.4 percent change in total population, while the Sussex child population decreased by 8 percent.

POPULATION BY RACE/ ETHNICITY

Delaware's child and adult populations look different from one another in terms of racial and ethnic breakouts at the state level. While 56.1 percent of Delaware's children identify as either Black, Hispanic or Other, only 37.6 percent of Delaware's adult population reflects this same racial and ethnic identity. Those of Hispanic ethnicity make up 17.6 percent of the child population, but only 8.7 percent of the adult population.

NOTE: "Other" includes non-Hispanic individuals of a single race who do not identify as "Black" or "White" as well as individuals who identify as multiple races.





This publication reviews the U.S. Census Bureau Redistricting Data that was released on August 12, 2021. The release is the first from the 2020 Census that breaks out data by all children compared to all adults. An analysis by Dr. Bill O'Hare indicates that the Census had a higher net undercount of children nationally in 2020 than it did in 2010. However, we will need to wait for more data to determine how many children were missed, if the rate of missed young and older children grew, and if there is geographic difference by state.




Adult Population 18+ and Child Population 0-17 by Race/Ethnicity, 2020





Adult Population




Child Population







New Castle County

The Census reported 120,843 children in New Castle County in 2020. Of these:

- 48,141 identify as white non-Hispanic
- 33,813 identify as black non-Hispanic
- 21,163 identify as Hispanic
- 17,726 identify as an other or multiple race(s)

The racial and ethnic diversity in New Castle County is more pronounced for both children and adults than in either Kent County or Sussex County.

Kent County

The Census reported 42,046 children in Kent County in 2020. Of these:

- 19,907 identify as white non-Hispanic
- 11,394 identify as black non-Hispanic
- 5,020 identify as Hispanic
- 5,725 identify as an other or multiple race(s)

Sussex County

The Census reported 43,516 children in Sussex County in 2020. Of these:

- 22,577 identify as white non-Hispanic
- 6,177 identify as black non-Hispanic
- 10,201 identify as Hispanic.
- 4,561 identify as an other or multiple race(s)

Population distribution shows simultaneously the largest proportion of white non-Hispanic adults combined with the largest proportion of Hispanic children in Sussex County.

NOTE: "Other" includes non-Hispanic individuals of a single race who do not identify as "Black" or "White" as well as individuals who identify as multiple races.





