Dear Mr. Carr:

I am sending you herewith a copy of my letter to the Secretary, dated February 9th, which may be of interest to you.

The pouch arrived this morning, and contains two packages addressed to Captain Underwood, which I assume contain the plans and specifications for the repairs and alterations to the house. When I got the telegram that the plans were being sent, I wrote to Captain Underwood in Rome that they would probably arrive here today. He has informed me that he is coming here by automobile from Rome and should be arriving today.

I cannot give you any impression concerning the plans or their suitability, as they are addressed to Captain Underwood and not to me or to the Legation, and they will, therefore, not be opened until his arrival.
