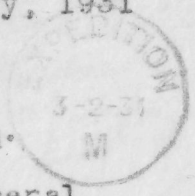

Dear Mr. Messersmith,

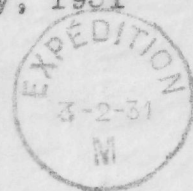
