My dear friend:

I was very pleased to receive your long letter of October 5th. and thank you for your invitation to stay with you on my way home. I am very sorry that it will not be possible for me to go back via Mexico.

I was glad to hear that you are so busy and have such a large staff, for I can well understand how important your work is to the war effort.

I met Mr. and Mrs. Kreglinger at lunch the other day at the home of one of the directors of the CADE.

The Ambassador, Norman Armour, arrived in Buenos Aires the same day as we did, and I have had occasion to meet him and Mrs. Armour several times.

There is a great deal of work for me here and it is not easy. I have seen many people.

Our new power station at Puerto Nuevo is performing very well. We are now burning 1.100.000 tons of corn annually. Mr. Armour is going to visit the station on October 28th. and the Company is giving a lunch there in his honor.

I have not yet had the pleasure of meeting Mrs. Fraser as I have so far been unable to reach her on the telephone. I hope to do so to-night.
