The College of Engineering requires 21 credits distributed as follows:

- Completion of 3 credits in each of the following University Breadth Requirement categories, with no more than one course taken from any single rubric (i.e., the four-letter subject code):
 - Creative Arts and Humanities
 - History and Cultural Change
 - Social and Behavioral Sciences
 - Mathematics, Natural Sciences, and Technology (normally satisfied by one of the following courses that Engineering students take: CHEM 103, CHEM 104, CHEM 111, CHEM 112, CISC 106, MATH 241, MATH 242, MATH 243, MEEG 112, PHYS 207, PHYS 208)
 - 9 additional credits must be taken from the University Breadth Requirement course list in the Creative Arts and Humanities, History and Cultural Change, or Social and Behavioral Sciences categories and/or from the College of Engineering Supplemental Course List
- Of the 21 credits, for timely progress toward degree completion, 3 credits must satisfy the University Multicultural Requirement
- Of the 21 credits, 6 must be at the upper level (usually a 300-level or above course) restricted to courses in the Creative Arts and Humanities, History and Cultural Change, and/or Social and Behavioral Sciences categories from the University Breadth Requirement course list and/or courses designated as upper level on the College of Engineering Supplemental Course List.
- All courses must be passed with a minimum grade of C-.

Students should choose courses in consultation with their advisors. Detailed guidelines, which include a list of courses that may be used to satisfy the program's requirements, may be obtained from the Assistant Dean for Undergraduate Advisement, department offices, and the College of Engineering website:
