The Teacher Education program at the University of Delaware requires that the Praxis I exam (general exam) be taken in the Freshman or Sophomore year, and that the Praxis II (specific subject) be taken before enrolling in student teaching (EDUC 400). In order to ensure this, the department is tying the Praxis I exam to the students' junior-level clinical course and adding a notice about the need to take the Praxis II before their student teaching. There is no change to the curriculum.
