**Advantages Of Compost**  
Cited By Dick Harris

Compost is an inexpensive but valuable soil builder says Dick Harris, county urban assistant. This decomposed vegetation is high in humus content and rich with nutrients, and works "wonderfully" for potting purposes, as a side dressing for lawns, and to enrich and improve the texture of flower and vegetable garden soils.

The first step in constructing a compost pile is to choose a smooth and partly shaded location.

The pile is then constructed of 4-in. layers of leaves and organic matter separated by thin layers of soil. The final height should not exceed 5-ft.

Harris says it is wise to incorporate a little manure into the pile as it increases fertility of the compost. Some ground limestone is also beneficial to speed up decomposition.

## THE SCHOOL BOND REFERENDUM

Few of us are anxious for any increase in taxes, but we pay for public schools, and we pay the taxes.

Any increase in school tax imposes what may be an unfair burden upon older residents of the community who are paid for adequate schooling for their children of other years, and have paved and paid the way for our educational system as we know it today. But what's fair is not always possible.

The growing population of the Newark area has placed unprecedented demands upon our school administrators for provision of public education facilities—and they have met this challenge well indeed.

New schools have risen—and our tax rate with them—the overall result has been a happy one. The Newark school district ranks with the best, thanks to the efforts of our educators—and taxpayers.

A referendum will be conducted this Saturday to determine public opinion for the local borrowing of \$880,000 to finance the expansion of Newark public school facilities.

The voters will decide the issue, but bear in mind that school administrators have proved their capabilities and resignt—they are not obsessed with the idea of spending taxpayers' money—and they, the pros, believe Newark needs school facilities to be provided if the proposed bond issue approved.

## Medical Director Reports Reduction For Illness Rate

Dr. Thos. Hogshead Cites Progress In DuPont Plan Of Health Consciousness

An active program to help employees become health conscious can sharply reduce the illness rate, Dr. Thomas H. Hogshead of Newark, medical director of DuPont's engineering department, told members of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers in New York last week. At the close of World War II, Dr. Hogshead said, a survey of the health of DuPont engineers disclosed "a critical situation, particularly in the area of cardiovascular disorders. An active health program geared mainly to the prevention of heart trouble and related disorders was put into operation. . . . The health record changed for the better almost immediately."

Following consolidation of the engineering department in the new Louviers headquarters building near Newark in 1953, the medical division launched a broad program to help employees become health conscious. As evidence of its success, Dr. Hogshead said, "With an average of 2,500 men and women over the five-year period, 1953-57 . . . our sickness absenteeism is 1.3 per cent of the total hours scheduled for work. The average for comparable industrial groups is usually some two to three times this figure."

The medical division is equipped to handle an emergency situation, he said, "but our program is geared to prevent emergencies from happening. This makes it desirable for us to be in contact with the employees as frequently as possible."

Employees paid an average of 10 visits each to the medical division in 1957, he reported. Services include annual physical examinations which continue a company policy established in 1926.
