LANGSTON HUGHES: Distinguished young negro poet, novelist and playwright, and author of a significant autobiography, "The Big Sea."

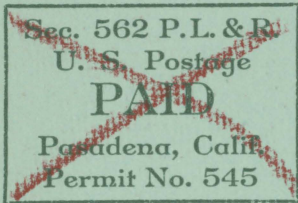

Lyric Soprano

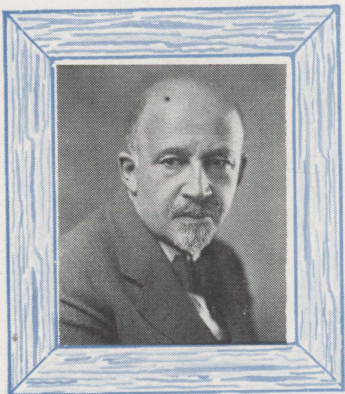

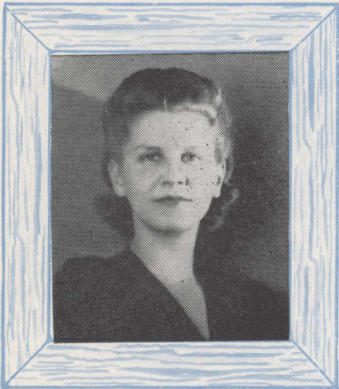


March 26

Lyric Soprano

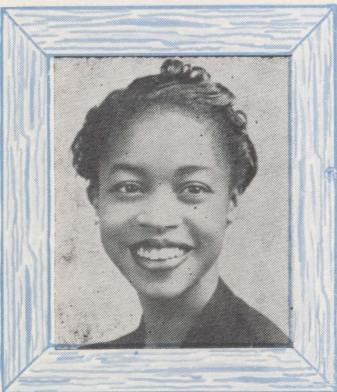

Poet



received these remarks from Stephen Vincent Benet, "Straightforwardness, directness, reality are good things to find in a young poet. I do not mean that this is interesting and moving poetry because it is written by a Negro. It is too late in the day for that sort of meaningless patronage—and poetry must exist in its own right." Thus, Miss Walker won the Yale Award for being the finest young American poet in 1942. She reads her poetry, "For My People," in joint recital with the University of Texas Symphony Orchestra.

At her present age of thirteen, she has had the distinction of giving Town Hall recitals, accompanying the Philharmonic Orchestra and becoming the youngest member of the National Association of American Composers and Conductors. 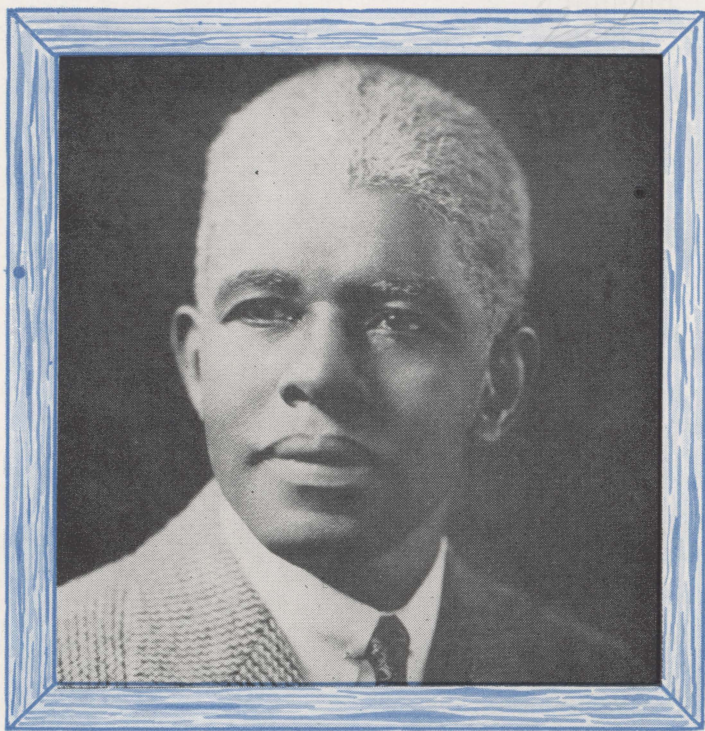
April 16

ADAM C. POWELL, JR.

Lecturer

recently withdrew as the Negro Councilman of New York City to concentrate on running for United States Congressman from New York. He is pastor of the largest Protestant church in the world, chairman of the Coordinating Council of Harlem Organizations, editor of the newspaper, **THE PEOPLE'S VOICE** and is the outstanding contemporary leader of the Negro people. His analysis, prophecies and predictions will prove to be invaluable for our changing world. To hear his lecture will be a lifelong blessing.





April 30

ROLAND HAYES

Tenor

remains an idol of the concert stage all over the world. The New York Times made this comment after one of his recent recitals: "(He) showed once again that he is a unique artist. Time has not blurred his sympathies nor his gift for making even a three-line song a complete experience in which the last shade of meaning is explored and communicated". The life and career of Roland Hayes are without parallel in the world's musical history. From barefoot boy, guiding a bullock-drawn plow on the Georgia farm of his widowed, slave-born mother, Hayes toiled his way to the heights of worldwide musical fame. He has received universal critical acknowledgement as "America's greatest native-born concert tenor of this era". In London, the far famed English music critic, Ernest Newman, once stated that this American Negro was the "only tenor I have found worth listening to this season. He was summoned to Buckingham Palace to give a "Command Performance" before the late King George V of England. This climax for the 1944 Artist Series will help establish it as the "finest college Artist Series of the year".

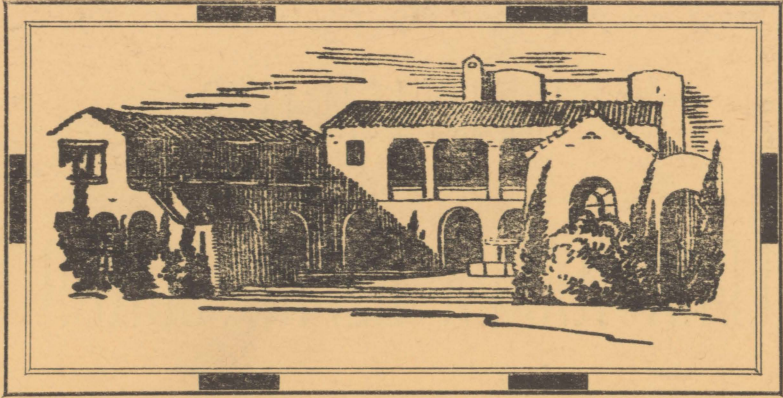

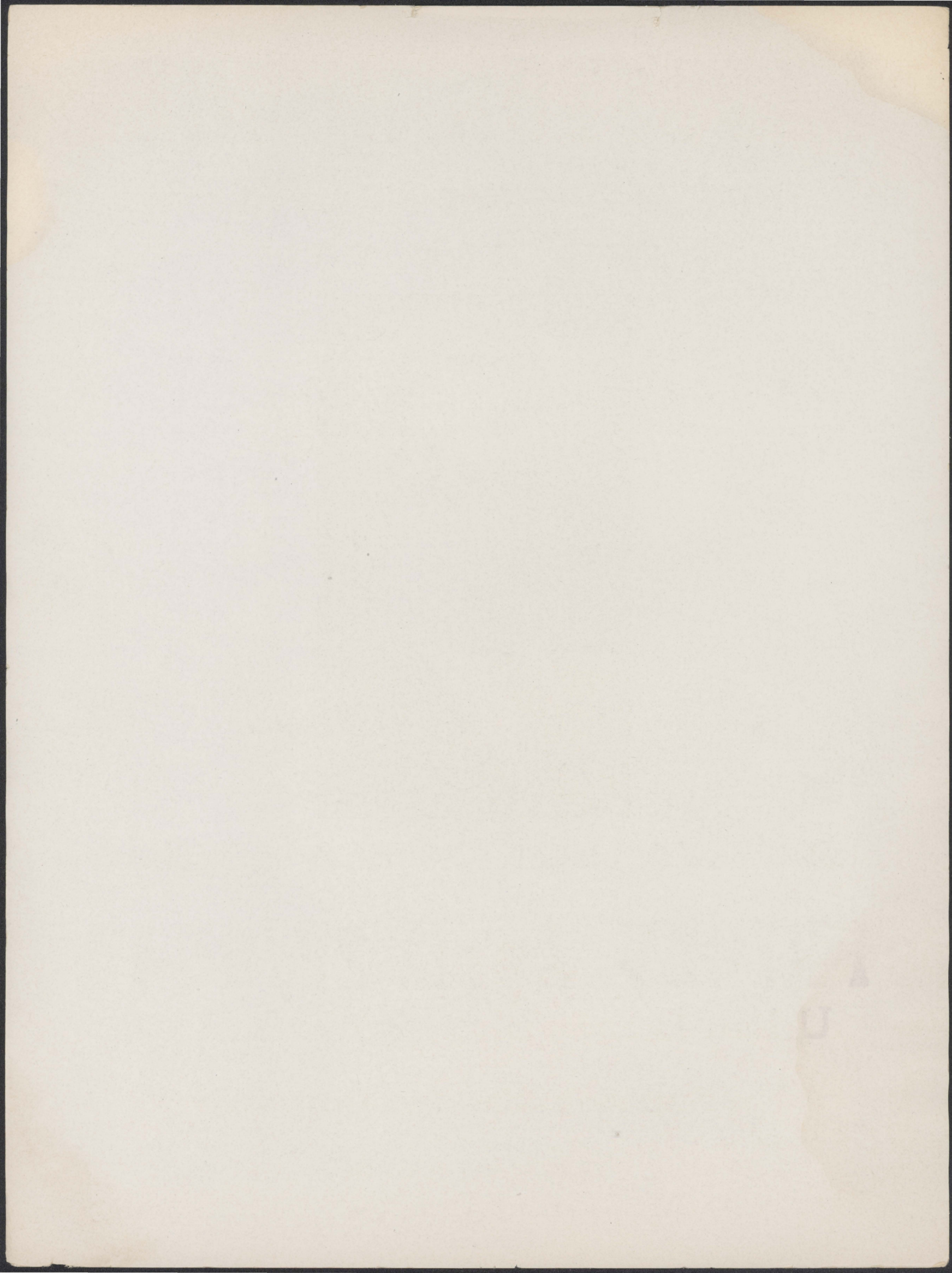

Winter Lecture Series Committee 1937 1944

"America became a great country through free discussion and free enterprise."

In 1937, a small group of people believing in the value of the public forum, banded together under the auspices of the Plymouth Congregational Church to bring to the Detroit community some of the Nation's best thinkers on the current issues of the day. This group became known as the Winter Lecture Series Committee of the Plymouth Congregational Church. Since this forum was to serve the entire community, the membership of the committee was drawn from the broad community.

The first person to be presented by the Committee was one of Detroit's own rising, young poets—THERESA CAVER.

During the seven years this committee has brought to the Detroit community such persons as Rheinhold Niebuhr, Stanley High, Arna Bontemp, Elmer Carter, Lester Grainger, Zelma Watson Duke, Crystal Byrd Faucett, Rabbi Leo Mann, Elmer Ward, Lillian Smith, Carey McWilliams, Dr. Chas. S. Johnson, Dr. E. Franklin Frazier, Pauline Redman, Jack McMichael, Dr. Charles Wesley, and others.

The Lecture Series throughout the years has operated as an inter-racial forum.

In these days when our community and the nation have been seeking a constructive way out in building better human relations, this Lecture Series has been able to render a real service.

In the years ahead we hope to expand and to establish an interracial forum of the air.

We thank our many friends for their co-operation through the years. We depend upon your continued support to achieve our goals in the future.

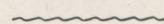

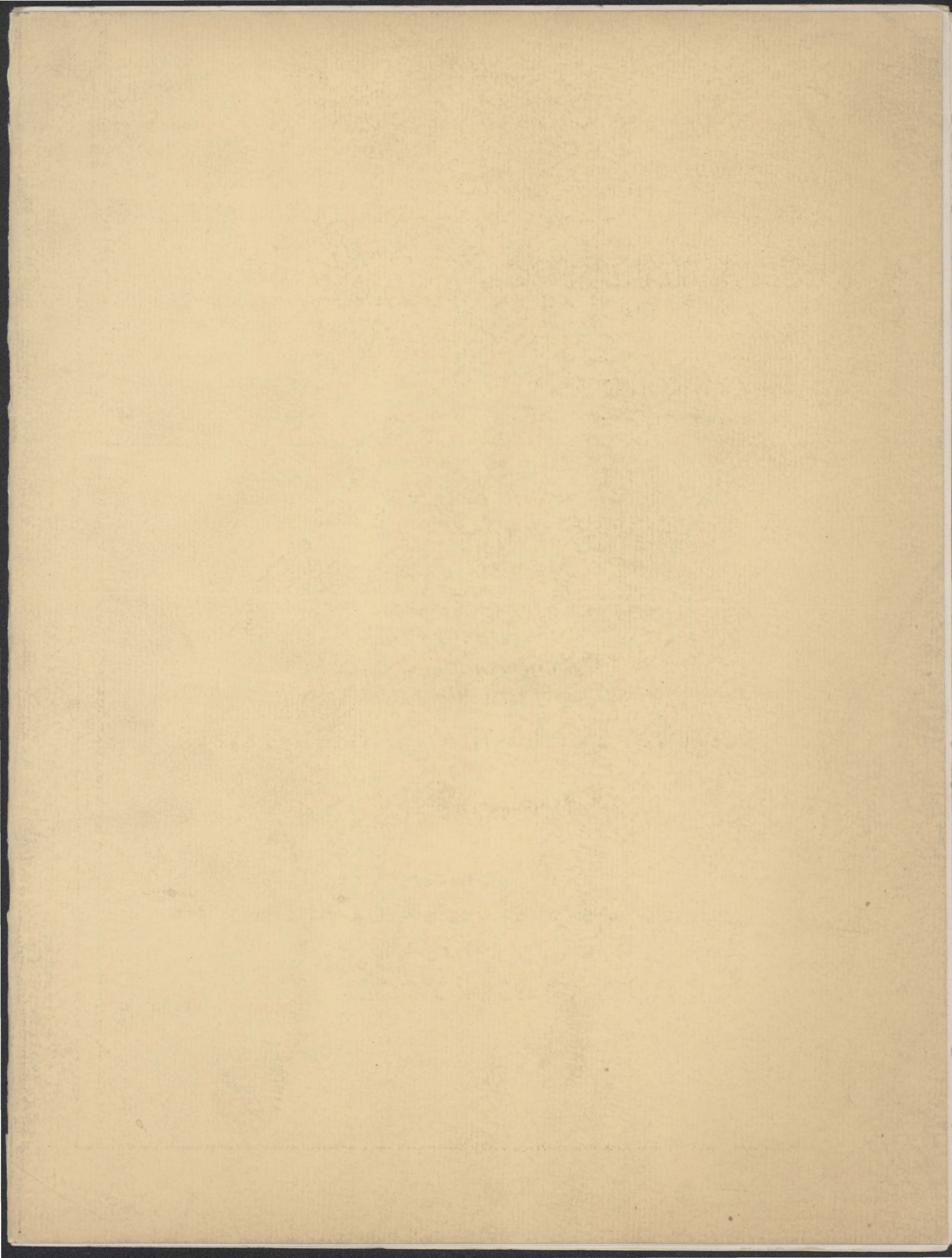



HIS CAREER AS A WRITER

Langston Hughes began to write at Central High School in Cleveland; became a member of the staff of the school magazine, and edited the Year Book upon his graduation in 1920. "The Negro Speaks of Rivers", his first poem in a nationally known magazine, appeared in THE CRISIS in 1921. In 1925 he received the First Prize for Poetry from the magazine, OPPORTUNITY, the winning poem being, "The Weary Blues", which gave the title to his first book of poems sent to the press a few weeks thereafter. That same year Vachel Lindsay read three of Hughes' poems on a program at the Little Theatre of the Wardman Park Hotel in Washington, where Hughes was a bus boy, which brought national attention to his work. In 1927 while a student at Lincoln University, he received the Palms Intercollegiate Poetry Award, and in 1931, the Harmon Gold Award for Literature. He was included by Dr. Charles Austin Beard in his selection of America's twenty-five "most interesting personages with a socially conscious attitude". On October 24, 1935, his first play, "Mulatto", was produced on Broadway at the Vanderbilt Theatre. That year he received a Guggenheim Fellowship and in 1940 a Rosenwald Fellowship. During the summers of 1942 and 1943, he was in residence at Yaddo

Since 1926 he has published eight books and has written many articles, stories, and poems in various magazines including Esquire, The New Yorker, The Saturday Evening Post, Common Ground, Asia, Travel, The Nation, The New Republic, Survey Graphic, Poetry, Theatre Arts, and many anthologies including O'Brien's, Untermeyer's Contemporary Short Stories, and The Negro Caravan. His work has been translated into French, Spanish, Russian, Chinese, Japanese, German, Dutch, and other languages in publications abroad. His novel, "Not Without Laughter", has been published in England, Russia, France and China.

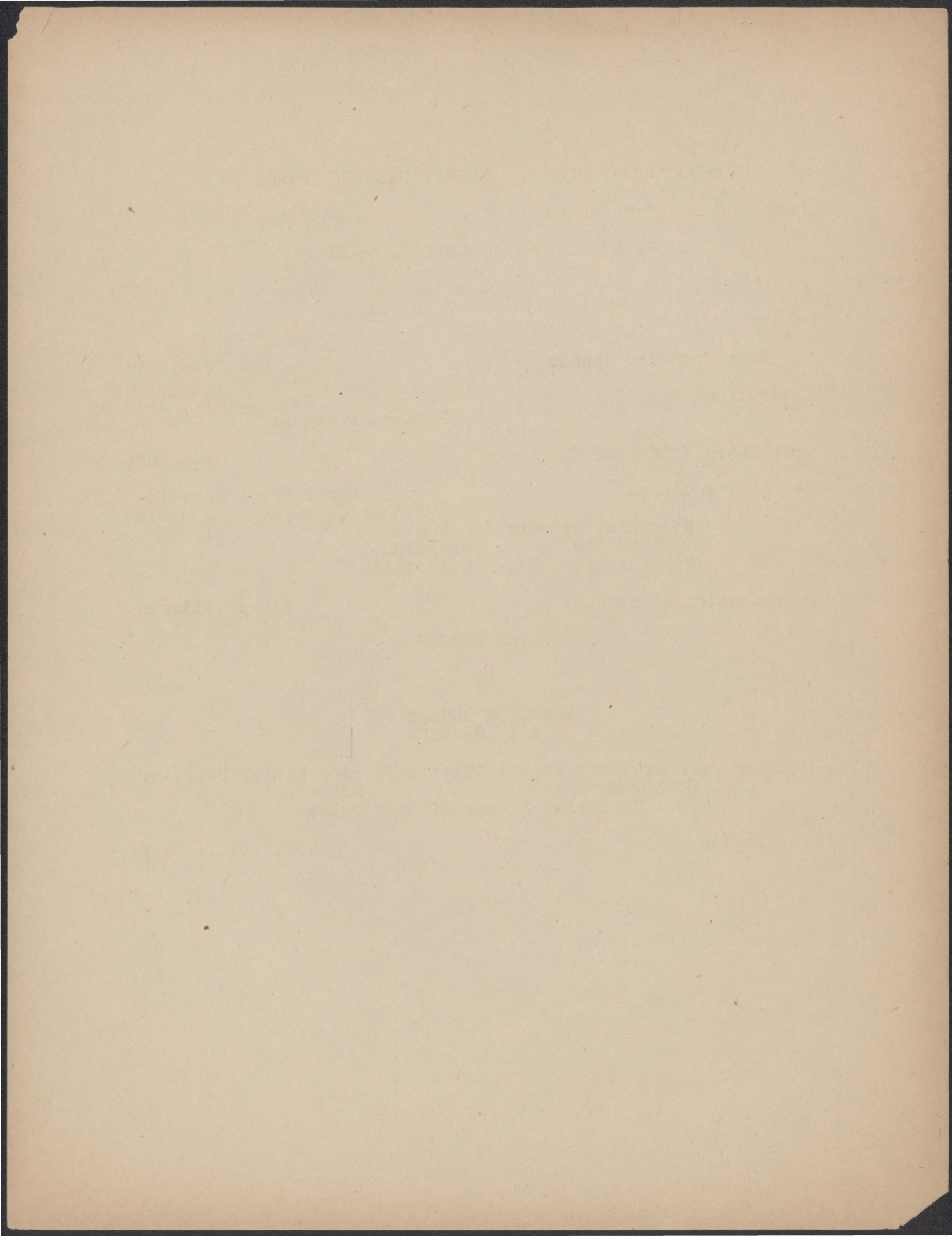

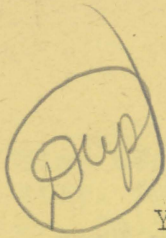
