## Wilmington man arrested for attempted murder and rape of 17 year-old

On January 29, the Newark Police Department arrested 20 year-old John A. Nelson, of the 1200 block of Sycamore Avenue in Wilmington, for the attempted murder and rape of a 17 year-old female, also from Wilmington, while attending a party in unit block of Academy Street.

On Sunday morning, at approximately 1 a.m., officers responded to a large party at a residence across from the Aetna Fire Station and began to clear a large crowd leaving the party. Upon doing so, officers heard screams for help at the rear of the residence and

located the 17 year-old female lying on the ground below a 2nd floor window, being aided by several individuals.

Investigators learned that the victim had been alone in a locked second floor bedroom of the home when Nelson, who is an acquaintance of the victim, kicked in the door. The victim attempted to flee, however, Nelson prevented her from doing so. During the struggle, Nelson grabbed the victim by the throat and strangled her to the point of unconsciousness. Nelson then sexually assaulted the victim and following the assault threw her from the bed-

room window.

The victim was transported to Christiana Hospital where she underwent surgery for her injuries from the fall including a broken arm and punctured lung. She is currently admitted at Christiana Hospital.

Nelson was identified by the victim and officers were able to locate him at his residence in Wilmington. He was taken into custody without incident.

Nelson was charged with the following crimes: Attempted Murder 1st Degree, Rape 1st Degree, Kidnapping 1st Degree, Burglary 1st Degree, Strangulation, Assault 3rd,

and Criminal Mischief. He was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in lieu of \$286,600 secured bail.

**Homeless man apprehended, charged with November 13 attempted rape in Newark**

On January 28, following a two and a half month search, Marvin Holmes, 42, a homeless man known to frequent businesses along Elkton Road, was apprehended in Philadelphia by the United States Marshals Service Violent Offenders Task Force. Holmes was wanted for an attempted sexual assault, which occurred on November 13, 2011 in a field adjacent to the James F. Hall Trail in Phillips Park.

The victim, a 30 year-old female, became suspicious of the male at this time and turned around to leave. When she turned to leave the male grabbed her and knocked her to the ground where he proceeded to attempt to remove her clothing. The victim was able to fight off the male suspect and fled on foot to a residence on Apple Road where she reported

the incident to the homeowner. The victim sustained minor neck and back pain but refused medical treatment. Newark Police and a K-9 team from UDPD checked the area for the suspect, however, he was not located.

As the investigation progressed over the months, Holmes was known to frequent the area of 10th and Locust Street in Philadelphia and was located inside a bar at that location. Holmes was taken into custody without incident, waived extradition, and was transported back to Newark where he was arrested on the outstanding charges.

Holmes was charged with one count each of Strangulation and Attempted Rape 2nd Degree. He was committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$110,000 cash bail.

**Troopers investigate attempted robbery**

The Delaware State Police are currently investigating the attempted robbery of a Bear area pizza shop that occurred Monday night.

The incident happened on January 30 at approximately 10:20 p.m., as an 18 year-old employee of Little Caesars

Pizza, located in the 1000 block of Governor's Place in Bear, was standing on the sidewalk outside of the shop. The victim was then approached from behind by two suspects. The suspects, one of which was possibly armed with a handgun, ordered the victim back in to the pizza shop, however, the door was locked. The victim then got the attention of a second employee who was inside and asked them to open the door. The second employee began to open the door, but after noticing the two suspects behind the victim, closed the door and yelled. The two suspects then fled the area. The victim was not injured.

The first suspect is described as a black male, 5'02"-5'05" tall, 150 lbs. He was last seen wearing a black jacket, blue jeans, and a dark colored mask covering his face.

Suspect #2 is a black subject, 5'07"-5'10" tall, 180 lbs. They were last seen wearing black pants, a black jacket, and a dark colored mask covering their face.

**Newark man charged after fleeing in stolen vehicle**

The Delaware State Police have charged Reginald E. Brown, 37 of Newark, after attempting to elude Troopers in a stolen vehicle.

The incident occurred at approximately 3:20 Saturday afternoon when a Trooper on routine patrol observed a 1998 Suzuki X-90 SUV on southbound Route 7 south of DE 273. The Suzuki was reported stolen earlier the same day from the City of Wilmington. The Trooper in a fully marked patrol vehicle activated the emergency equipment in an attempt to conduct a vehicle stop. The Suzuki's operator later identified as Reginald E. Brown, of Newark, turned right onto Rivers End Drive, began to pull over to the right shoulder and then sped away at a high rate of speed into the residential development.

The Trooper attempted to follow the Suzuki but terminated the pursuit after the vehicle increased speed in the residential neighborhood. The Trooper then lost sight of the vehicle. Additional Troopers responded to the area to search for the vehicle. A short time later the Suzuki was observed traveling at a high rate of speed northbound on Smalleys Dam Road, and then eastbound onto Freedom Road approaching the Route 7 Intersection, attempting to weave through other cars stopped for the red traffic signal. A Trooper in a fully marked Ford Crown Victoria with

emergency equipment activated, maneuvered eastbound on Freedom Road, in an attempt to block traffic on DE 7 southbound and prevent the fleeing vehicle from entering the intersection. As the Crown Victoria entered the intersection, its front left corner was struck by the front of a 2004 Nissan Murano traveling southbound on DE 7. The Murano was being operated by a 53 year-old female from Bear. After the collision, the Murano veered right and rear ended a 2007 Dodge Magnum which had turned onto DE 7 southbound from Freedom Road. The Magnum was being operated by a 41 year-old male from Newark. After the impact the Murano traveled off of the roadway onto the lawn of a residence in the southwest corner of the intersection.

Troopers approached the Suzuki and attempted to take Brown into custody. Brown did not comply with the Troopers orders and attempted to put the vehicle in reverse. Troopers quickly attempted to subdue Brown and remove him from the vehicle and a struggle ensued. A Trooper was able to deploy his Taser and neutralize Brown, taking him into custody.

The 53 year-old female operator of the Nissan Murano and a 60 year-old female passenger were evaluated by EMS and refused medical treatment at the scene.

The 41 year-old male operator of the 2007 Dodge Magnum and a 10 year-old female passenger were evaluated by EMS and refused medical treatment at the scene.

Brown was transported by ambulance to the Christiana Hospital for evaluation. He was treated and released.

Brown was charged with Disregarding a Police Officer Signal, Receiving Stolen Property, Driving Under the Influence of Drugs, Possession of Crack Cocaine, Resisting

Arrest, Aggressive Driving, Driving while Suspended/Revoked, and Other traffic related offenses. He was also found to have 1.5 grams of crack cocaine in his possession. Brown was also wanted on 12 active capias issued by the New Castle County CCP.

Brown was committed to HRYCI on \$16,089 Secured Bond.

DE 7 southbound was closed for approximately 1.5 hours while the incident was investigated and cleared.

**Gas station-convenience store robbed**

The Delaware State Police are currently investigating the armed robbery of a Newark area gas station that occurred last Thursday night.

At 9:15 p.m. on Thursday as a male entered the Shore Stop in the 700 block of Old Baltimore Pike. The suspect displayed a handgun and confronted a 44-year-old male employee. He then demanded money from the cash register. The clerk complied and man fled.

The clerk was not injured. The suspect was described as a white male, 20-30 years of age, 5 feet 9 to 5 feet 10 inches tall and 210-215 pounds. He was last seen wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and white sneakers. No video footage was available.

## Newark celebrates three Div. 1 signings

### Red Lion Christian also has three signees

Ceremonies to celebrate athletes signing Division I football scholarships is nothing new at Newark High School. In fact, it's rare that a year goes by when there isn't one.

However, for the past two years there hasn't been any such ceremony as one of the most storied programs in Delaware struggled through a rare slump of churning out Division I-caliber players.

But just as the Yellowjackets returned to their "Tradition" of excellence on the field this past fall, the school celebrated on Wednesday morning the signing of not one, but three of its players to Division I scholarships.

Flanked by family and cheered on by friends, Xavier Griffin, David Grinnage and Taylor Reynolds made their college intentions official when they signed their letters of intent on the auditorium stage at Newark High.

It was no secret where wide receiver Xavier Griffin and tight end David Grinnage were heading, since both made verbal commitments to attend North Carolina State University this past summer. But quarterback Taylor Reynolds was a different story.

After verbally committing to James Madison University late in the season, the second team All-State quarterback notified the JMU coaching staff that he was still going to consider other options.

Reynolds narrowed his choices to Richmond, William and Mary, Delaware and James Madison, and, after visiting Harrisonburg just a couple weeks ago, he made up his mind that playing for the Dukes was the right decision.

"Offensively it is a great fit," a smiling Reynolds said shortly after making it official. "I have some of the same skill sets as JMU's cur-

rent starting quarterback. I got along very well with the players and coaching staff, and the facilities are top notch. James Madison is very competitive athletically and academically."

Away from the field, the second team All-State quarterback was just as impressed. "The area is beautiful," he said. "The campus was really pretty. I just enjoyed my visit. Overall I felt very comfortable there."

Newark coach Butch Simpson was happy for his four-year starter.

"I don't think there was a wrong school for Taylor," Simpson said. "I think in some cases staying home is good for some people because it's their comfort zone. For others, going out on your own and establishing new relationships and seeing other parts of the country and what's best for you is the way to go. I think Taylor's choice was a very good decision."

Reynolds' favorite targets, Griffin and Grinnage, made their previous verbal commitments official when they signed their letters of intent in front of their peers, several whom were donning wolf hats.

"N.C. State is a great fit for me, from the campus itself to how they run their offense and pass the ball a lot," Griffin said. "I look forward to doing big things at the next level."

When asked what excited him the most about playing at the next level, the first team All-State wide receiver was quick with his response: "I look forward to being on television."

Grinnage, a first team All-State selection at tight end, will accompany Griffin to N.C. State.

"I felt like it was the best fit for me," Grinnage said. "I got along with the coaches and players. I also believe that it will give me the best chance

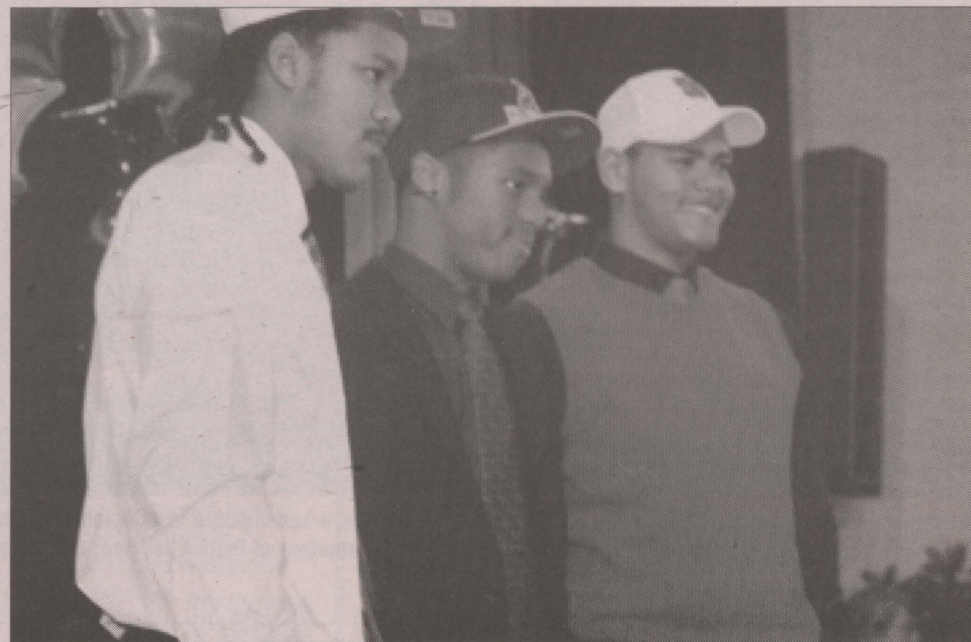

to succeed in sports and move forward in football."

Simpson thinks both will find success in Raleigh.

"N.C. State is a new world for us," Simpson said, referring to the fact that no other Yellowjacket has played for the Wolfpack. "As soon as they went to camp down there they were offered the full scholarships. The families were at the visit and everyone was overwhelmed and quite happy. It's a great school,

a great environment, and a high-level football program.

"All three of these guys are very content with what they've decided."

## Governor Signs into law ban on dangerous "bath salts" drugs

Surrounded by lawmakers, police officers, scientists, social service and health officials, the Governor signed a bill into law that makes permanent a ban imposed last September on a class of designer drugs popularly known as "bath salts." The new law also gives police and prosecutors more flexibility in dealing with the dangerous drugs.

"This is where public safety and law enforcement meet science and public policy," said Governor Markell. "This has been a scary epidemic. These drugs, with their high potential for abuse, have been a threat to people and public safety. The emergency ban ordered through Secretary of State Jeff Bullock in September has been a success because emergency rooms are seeing fewer people affected by these 'bath salt' drugs. By permanently banning these drugs, we hope to lessen their availability and their use."

People on the drug can experience bouts of extremely violent paranoia requiring emergency room personnel to take measures, including rendering patients unconscious, to treat them. In some areas, bath salts cases threatened to periodically overwhelm some emergency rooms around the state. The compound of drugs exploded in popularity last summer.

"When it became clear

how much these drugs were affecting our communities, we used our emergency powers to act quickly to get them off our streets and out of our stores," Bullock said. "With the Governor's leadership on this issue and with the strong support of the General Assembly, we have ensured that not only are bath salts outlawed in Delaware, but also other dangerous designer drugs."

"In order to protect the public we've got to stay one step ahead of the criminals that develop these poisonous substances," said Attorney General Beau Biden. "This new law not only permanently bans 'bath salts,' but also more than a dozen chemicals that could be used to produce new versions of these dangerous mind-altering drugs. I applaud Senator Hall-Long for her leadership in developing this legislation and thank the General Assembly and the Governor for working so quickly to enact this bill."

Sen. Bethany Hall-Long, D-Middletown, who is also a nursing professor, had been developing legislation banning bath salts when the General Assembly took its summer break. During that time, she worked with the administration, law enforcement as well as medical and pharmacological experts to develop the new law.

"This was a team effort," Hall-Long said. "These are drugs that you can make in

your basement, if you have the right chemicals. Without the changes we made to the law, it wouldn't have taken a lot to make a drug with the same devastating effects but with a subtle difference in its chemical makeup that would have shielded a person from prosecution."

A significant investigatory role rests with the Chief Medical Examiner's Office, which will test the chemicals in the drugs.

"This will be a big challenge," said Health and Social Services Secretary Rita Landgraf. "But we're going to work to ensure that the Medical Examiner's office will have the resources it needs to meet that challenge and give our partners in law enforcement the information they need to prosecute these cases."

Rep. Rebecca Walker, a practicing nurse, saw the effects bath salts have on people first hand in her job as an emergency room nurse at Christiana Hospital.

"People under the influence of these bath salts are so out-of-control and violent that they've injured nurses and EMS providers, making it difficult to provide the necessary treatment," said Walker, D-Middletown. "My biggest concern is for members of the community who may be violently attacked. Permanently banning this dangerous designer drug is an important step in protecting Delawareans."

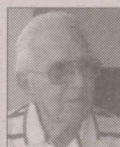

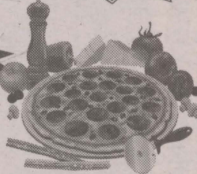

# UD a partner in \$18.5 million solar grant with Arizona State University

University of Delaware materials scientist Robert L. Opila is leading efforts with colleagues at Arizona State University to create a new hybrid solar cell with distinct efficiency advantages.

Silicon solar cells, like those perched on top of homes and businesses, only capture up to 20 percent of sun's energy. Opila's work involves making traditional silicon solar cells thinner and then applying a tandem, thin-film organic solar cell on top that he says will create a huge surge in efficiency, potentially increasing energy capture from 20 to 30 percent.

"UD is setting world records for how long electrons stay excited in silicon," says Opila, professor of materials science. "Improving collection of these long lived electrons will improve the efficiency of the solar cells dramatically."

It could also drive down solar costs "because only sixty percent of the area and materials will be needed to achieve the same result," he adds.

Opila's work is part of an inter-university effort to develop technologies and manufacturing processes needed to dramatically increase the amount of solar photovoltaic energy supplying the nation's homes and businesses. Solar currently

supplies less than one percent of the electrical energy needs of the United States, according to the National Science Foundation (NSF).

Arizona State University is leading the effort, which includes creation of an Engineering Research Center (ERC) called the Quantum Energy and Sustainable Solar Technologies (QESST). The project is funded by a joint \$18.5 million grant from NSF and the Department of Energy (DOE).

UD, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the California Institute of Technology and the University of New Mexico are co-principal investigators. In all, the project includes collaborators from eight academic institutions and 40 industry partners.

"We don't want to continue with incremental changes, we want to drastically improve the way that energy is produced," remarked Opila. "The opportunity to work with like-minded colleagues devoted to helping solar become part of the real electrical grid is exciting."

The five-year grant will invest \$1.65 million in solar funding at UD. In addition to Opila's work, UD researchers will also lead efforts to develop high efficiency thin-film solar cells and advance governmental policies to ensure solar energy technology is viable in the marketplace.

The University of Delaware's Institute of Energy Conversion (IEC) has been a leader in the research and development of thin-film photovoltaic solar cells and other photonic devices since 1972. The UD IEC was recognized by DOE and the National Renewable Energy Laboratory in 1992 for its efforts in thin film photovoltaics, and was designated as a Center of Excellence for Photovoltaic Research and Education. According to Opila, world records for high efficiency thin-film solar cells made from copper-indium-gallium-selenide (CIGS) have only recently reached twenty percent.

William N. Shafarman, a UD assistant professor in materials science and IEC scientist, is developing a way to increase this energy output of CIGS by enhancing the structure from a simple CIGS solar cell to a tandem CIGS solar cell. Shafarman predicts the new CIGS tandems can increase efficiencies from 20 percent to 30 percent.

"Typically as you increase band gap, efficiency suffers dramatically, but we think we have a route forward here," explains Shafarman.

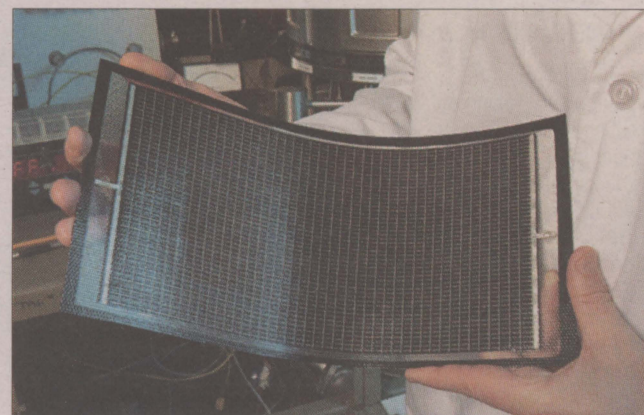

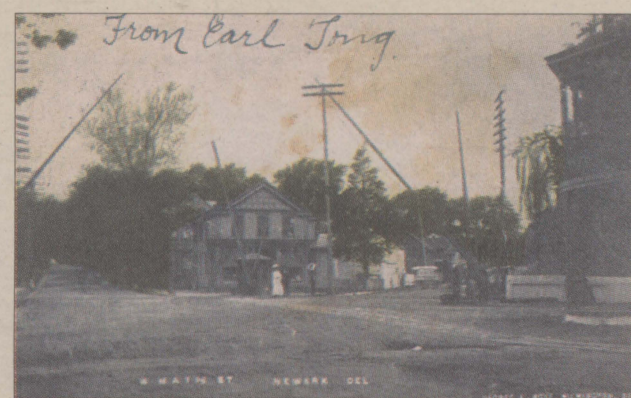

The post card bears a one-cent stamp and was addressed to "Master Harvey Richard, Cherry Hill, Cecil Co. Md." It was postmarked at Cherry Hill, MD on March 16, 1907. The building is said to have been built in the late 1800s as Uncle Billy Brown's West End Market. Legend has it that Uncle Billy's back room was a favorite gathering place.

Later the site was Richard's General Store. In the 1950s it was Linton's Restaurant, a favorite family place to eat. By the last quarter of the century it had become Wonderland. The property to the right of the picture across New London Road is the Deer Park Hotel. The street to the left is West Main Street, also known as Nottingham Road. The upraised crossing gates are for the B & O Railroad tracks that pass through the intersection. Attic would like to know more of the history of this property. # Leasure Elementary fifth grader wins State Investwrite Essay Contest

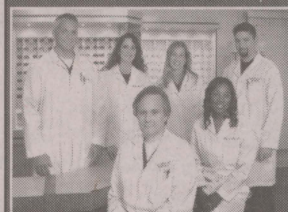

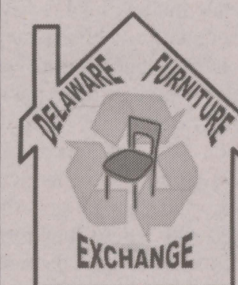

# FY'13 Budget Proposal supports job growth, invests in education

Governor Jack Markell unveiled a balanced budget proposal that invests in jobs and public education, keeps the state's commitment to critical areas like public health and safety and balances without the need to raise taxes or add new fees.

"Budgets are about priorities, and this budget makes clear that our top priorities are encouraging economic growth, making our public schools stronger, and ensuring that we are governing responsibly," Markell said.

The budget continues years of efforts to govern responsibly by finding ways to cut costs. The state has cut over 1,000 state employee positions, enacted state employee health and pension reform that should secure over \$480 million in savings over a 15-year period; reduced specific operating expenses like state-agency printing and advertising expenses; cut the state's energy costs through reverse auctions; slashed the state's fleet by 895 vehicles; and reduced costs by renegotiating state leases. These efforts have helped to reduce expenses while ensuring the state maintained its AAA bond rating, which keeps down the cost of borrowing.

"We remain very focused on investing and spending taxpayer dollars wisely. In order to cover the cost of increasing

demands on state government, we must continue to find savings and efficiencies in our state agencies," Director Visalli said.

While the recommended budget includes an additional \$21.7 million dollars for Medicaid, the Governor made clear during his State of the State and in this budget address that the state will focus this year on bringing down those costs. Over the last 10 years, Medicaid spending has grown 127 percent, to the point where federal and state spending together now exceeds \$1.2 billion each year.

"As I mentioned in the State of the State, tackling these spiraling costs – moving from paying for sick care to paying for health care – has to be a priority or we'll lose the ability in the future to invest in areas like education that are critical to economic growth," Markell said.

The budget proposal includes significant investments in public education, including additional state funding for 111 new teacher units in schools, step increases for school employees and salary increases for paraprofessionals. While federal Education Jobs Act funds had helped support local districts this year, the federal government did not renew that program. To support local districts and keep educators working, the Governor's budget recom-

mends the state replace those lost federal dollars with an additional \$27.4 million dollars in state funds, which is the largest single additional investment in the Governor's budget proposal. Public education also receives a boost in the Capital Budget, which dedicates \$116.1 million for school projects.

With additional investments in early childhood education and support for the SEED and Inspire college scholarships, the budget recognizes that education cannot begin the day a child arrives for kindergarten or end the day someone crosses the stage with their high school diploma. The state's recent success in the federal government's second Race to the Top contest (the "Early Learning Challenge") means federal resources will also be available to complement the state's early childhood investments.

"Great schools are an important factor in our ability to attract new jobs to Delaware now. Great schools that graduate kids who are ready to succeed in work or college are critical to our state's – and those kids' – economic future," Markell said.

With jobs remaining the Governor's top priority, the budget proposal makes several investments in economic growth. The Capital Budget

would replenish the state's Strategic Fund, which has helped attract new employers and expand existing workforces at companies like Amazon, Mountaire Farms, Baltimore Aircoil, Nanticoke Hospital, Johnson Controls and PBF Energy, which reopened the Delaware City Refinery. These Strategic Fund resources would also support some of the Governor's expanded efforts to help small businesses.

"We need to keep focused and keep pushing forward in our efforts to expand economic opportunity and make our state an even better place to start and grow a business," Markell said. "Companies deciding where to invest and hire also look for places with clean air and water and for places parks and recreational trails that make life for employees and their families healthy and rewarding. Quality of life matters deeply to them because it matters to their workforce. If we overlook them, our state is likely to get overlooked."

Given the importance quality of life issues can play in economic development, the Governor's capital budget recommends \$13.3 million for a series of Statewide Trails and Pathways; \$2.6 million for libraries; a \$1.3 million investment in the state's Clean Water

State Revolving Fund and \$1.9 million for the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, each of which will leverage several million in additional federal funds; \$4 million for the state's Housing Development Fund and \$2.1 million to redevelop strategic sites like NVF and Fort Dupont. It invests in public-safety projects like the new Delaware State Police Troop 3 in Camden and Troop 7 in Lewes and supports \$7.5 million in federal funds for the new Delaware National Guard Armory in Dagsboro with \$2.5 in state capital funds.

While the unveiling of the Governor's budget proposal traditionally focused on the Operating and Capital Budgets and was led by the Governor and Ann Visalli, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, the Department of Transportation's Secretary Shailen Bhatt included his proposals this year for the state's Transportation Trust Fund. Bhatt explained the agency's new approach to operating – called TEAM DeIDOT (for Transparent, Efficient, Accountable and Measured) – and new approach to budgeting, which includes more closely aligning agency staff and financial resources with the department's capital program and operational needs.

"Sound management of our infrastructure and our transportation dollars is an important part of our state's fiscal health," Markell said. "DeIDOT has made clear their budget priorities are to be realistic and responsible while maintaining a robust capital plan to create jobs and meet the state's transportation needs."

The Fiscal Year 2013 Recommended Operating Budget totals \$3,544.5 million, an increase of 1.025 percent over the Fiscal Year 2012 budget. The Fiscal Year 2013 Recommended Bond and Capital Improvements Act totals \$448.0 million and the Governor has also recommended a Grants in Aid set-aside of \$40.2 million. Total recommended Fiscal Year 2013 General Fund appropriations are \$42.6 million less than Fiscal Year 2012.

The Fiscal Year 2013 Operating Budget and Capital Improvements Act fully funds the state's Rainy Day Fund, adheres to the state's three-part debt limit, seeks to maintain the state's AAA bond rating and appropriates only 98 percent of available revenue. ## Newark Post:

At a time when budgets are tight, and programs and services in our community are being cut back, the Pentagon budget keeps getting bigger. The Secretary of Defense announced on January 26 that he plans to slow the rate of growth for the Pentagon budget, but even under this proposal in 10 years the Pentagon budget would still be bigger than it is today. Over the last decade, the Pentagon budget has grown by 100 percent. Some of that growth was to pay for the wars, but a lot of it went right into the Pentagon budget. Right now, we are all having to cut back. The Pentagon should have to as well. I hope that our members of Congress will stick with the current law, which requires the Pentagon to cut its budget by nearly \$1 trillion over the next decade – twice what the Secretary is proposing.

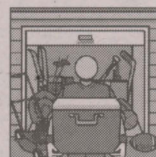

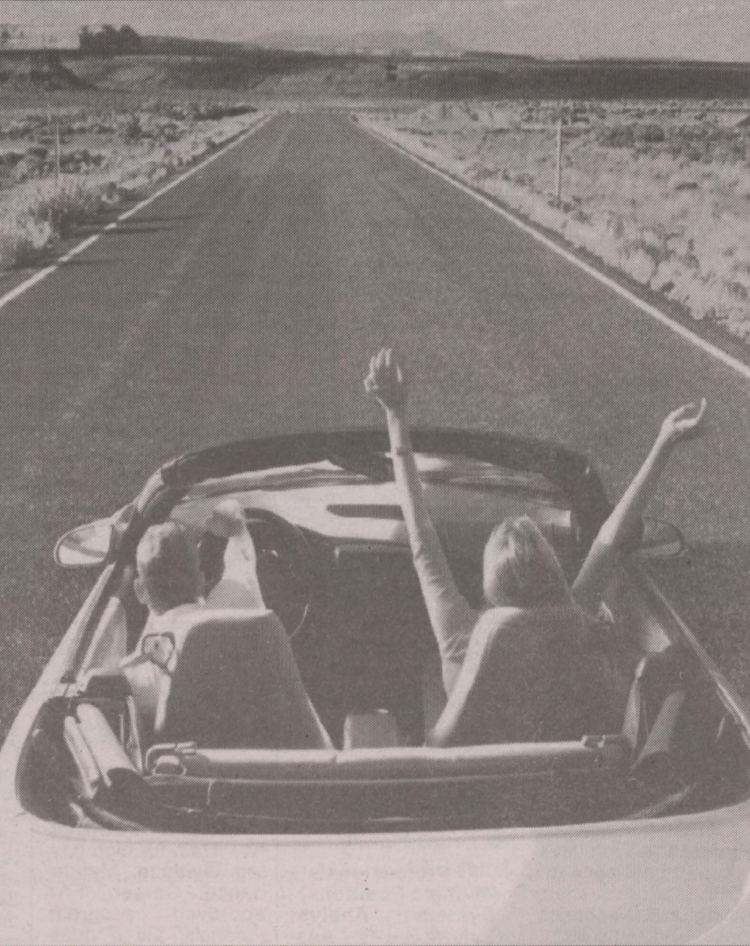

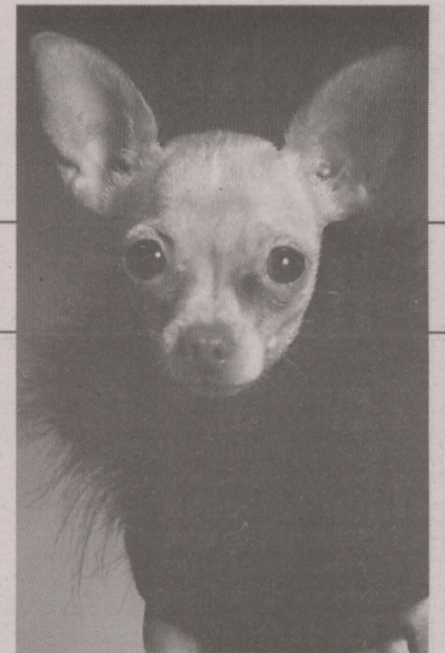

# Actor Steve Schirripa of 'Secret Life of the American Teenager' to speak at UD

"An Evening with Steve Schirripa," the actor who stars on ABC Family's *The Secret Life of the American Teenager* and was a regular on HBO's *The Sopranos*, will be held at 7 p.m., Monday, Feb. 13, in Mitchell Hall on the University of Delaware campus in Newark.

Schirripa will appear in a format similar to that of the popular television series *Inside the Actors Studio*. UD's Peter X. Feng, associate professor of English with expertise in film and literature, will conduct the interview and that will be followed by a question-and-answer session with members of the audience.

The event is free and open to the public, and is sponsored by the University's Department of English.

Schirripa, whose daughter Bria is a sophomore at UD, said he hopes the talk will "provide insight to people who are interested into getting into the entertainment business."

Schirripa said he came to acting "late in life" -- starting in his 30s -- and in a roundabout way. He was running a comedy club in Las Vegas when performers began asking him on stage and, once in the limelight, he "kind of got the acting bug."

He began taking lessons, going to auditions and getting small roles. The experience was important in helping him learn how to hit his marks, to understand the positioning of the cameras and to understand the terminology.

A trip home to his native New York City for a wedding brought an audition that led to Schirripa's first major role as Bobby Baccalieri in the HBO hit *The Sopranos*. "I read for the role, and the rest is history," he said.

Schirripa spent six seasons as a member of the cast and said the set of *The Sopranos* was "fantastic," noting it was "like going to work with good friends every day."

After *The Sopranos* finale, Schirripa said he was looking for work on a project that was not mob-related and joined the cast of ABC Family's *The Secret Life of the American Teenager*. He portrays Leo Boykewich, the father of teen Ben Boykevich, and has appeared in 85 episodes.

He is also host of the Investigation Discovery *Nothing Personal* program, which concerns murder-for-hire plots.

In addition to work in front of the camera, Schirripa has taken up the pen with a series of Goomba books and has written two young adult books with the title character Nicky Deuce, one of which will be made into a movie by Nickelodeon.

Schirripa said he has been to the UD campus on several occasions and has found it a "terrific school" with "a beautiful campus and great academics."

Schirripa said he is looking forward to a return visit on Feb. 13 to discuss the entertainment industry. "I'm not an expert, but I've been making a living at this for the last 12-14 years," he said. "Maybe I can help someone find the right path."

Schirripa was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., and the Brooklyn College graduate's acting odyssey began

while serving as the entertainment director of the Riviera hotel in Las Vegas. There he worked with such comedians as Drew Carey, Kevin Pollack and Bruce Baum and his cameo roles in their comedy specials led to episodic work on the big and small screen.

In addition *The Secret Life of the American Teenager* and *The Sopranos*, Schirripa has appeared in a range of programs including *Ugly Betty*, *Joey*, *Enterprise*, *Law and Order*, *My Wife and Kids*, *Ed*, the *George Lopez Show* and *The King of Queens*.

As a regular popular guest on

the talk show circuit, Schirripa was approached by *The Tonight Show* with Jay Leno to be a special correspondent and to date he has appeared on the show over a dozen times. He is also a correspondent for *The Today Show* and a regular film critic on *The Showbiz Show*.

Schirripa recently won best supporting actor in the New York Independent Film Festival for his role in *What Are the Odds*. He also stars in *Duane Hopwood*, which premiered at the Sundance Film Festival, and can be seen in the Newline feature film *High Roller*.

Schirripa can also add published

writer to his list of credits with the best seller *A Goomba's Guide to Life*, published by Clarkson Potter, his first in a series of three Goomba guidebooks. This comical book, co-written by Charles Fleming, includes chapters on growing up in Brooklyn and great goombas in history. His second and third books -- *The Goomba's Book of Love* and *The Goomba Diet* -- are currently in stores.

He also has written two books for young adults -- *Nicky Deuce: Welcome to the Family*, which is being made into a movie by Nickelodeon, and *Nicky Deuce: Home for the Holidays*.
