





Who's Who

PAULENE MYERS first appeared in her one-woman dramatization, *The World of My America*, at the Metro Theatre in Hollywood. Ever since, she has been touring it on the West Coast to enthusiastic audiences.

Miss Myers is a veteran of the New York stage. She grew up literally under the direction of such craftsmen as George Kaufman, Arthur Hopkins, John Golden, Moss Hart and Jed Harris.

Born in Ocilla, Georgia, Miss Myers attended public schools in New Jersey and received her theatrical training at the New Theatre School in New York.

She made her Broadway début in Growin' Pains at the Ambassador Theatre, followed by Plumes in the Dust with Henry Hull, The Willow and I with Gregory Peck and Martha Scott, The Naked Genius with Joan Blondell, Anniversary Waltz with MacDonald Carey and Kitty Carlisle, Dear Ruth and Take a Giant Step. She toured with Ruth Gordon in Here Today, with Jane Cowl and Peggy Wood in Old Acquaintance, with James Barton in Free and Equal, with Fred Stone in You Can't Take It With You and in Anna Lucasta.

Among her stage appearances on the West Coast have been *The Blacks*, *The Ponder Heart, Simply Heavenly, A Member of the Wedding, The Dreamy Kid* and *Nobody Loves an Albatross.* 

She has a string of motion picture credits starting with *The Green Pastures*. In the film version of *Take a Giant Step*, she recreated the role of Violet for which she had been acclaimed on Broadway. Memorable also is her performance of Dr. Walden, a psychiatrist, in *Shock Treatment*. Miss Myers played the African mother in *Something of Value*, Bob Hope's housekeeper in *I'll Take Sweden*, and Hogan, a private secretary, in *Honeymoon Hotel*. Some other films in which she appeared are *Fate is the Hunter*, *Rachel Cade*, *Dear Heart* and *All the Fine Young Cannibals*.



In more than 100 television shows Miss Myers has played such widely assorted roles as a 75-year old slave on *The Americans*, a West Indian matriarch on CBS-TV Workshop, and a recurring role as an X-ray technician on *Dr. Kildare*. She has appeared on Studio One, Amrstrong Circle Theatre, Hallmark Theatre, Playhouse 90, Matinee Theatre, Philco Playhouse, Donna Reed Show, etc.

Paulene's long career as an actress has been punctuated by her appearance as a dancer with the Hemsley-Winfield Ballet in the Metropolitan Opera's production of *The Emperor Jones* with Lawrence Tibbett. She also danced in *Kykunkor*, the African dance drama. In between theatrical assignments, Paulene earned her living modeling for painters and sculptors.

This season, CBS Network presented Miss Myers as Sojourner Truth on Camera Three.

MICHAEL HENNAGIN, who composed the score for *The World of My America* is a native of California. His musical education includes scholarships at Aspen, Colorado, Curtis Institute of Music, and private study with Leonard Stein and Aaron Copeland. Among his credits are scores for ABC-TV Purex Specials, NBC-TV Dupont Show of the Week, CBS-TV Repertoire Workshop and ABC-TV *Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea.* He has composed film scores for *The Gallant Hours* and *Talking About Northrop*. During this past year he composed music for the Detroit Public Schools.

STELLA HOLT (*Producer*) has been producing Off-Broadway for the past fourteen years and this is her 35th presentation. She produced three plays by Langston Hughes: *Simply Heavenly*, which moved from Off-Broadway to Broadway and later to London; *Jerico-Jim Crow* and *The Prodigal Son* which toured Europe last season. Some of her other productions include *Me Candido!*, *Orpheus Descending, Red Roses for Me* and *All in Love*. Recently, she returned from Hawaii, where she completed a study on a Ford Foundation grant on the feasibility of a regional repertory theatre there. Showcard APPLE (*Producer*)-no one in the theatre calls her by her first name, which happens to be Gertrude—is making her début as a producer. Until recently she served as business manager for the Theatre Guild. She has been associated in various capacities with many of the theatre's leading producers, authors, and stars. Among them were Howard Lindsay and Russel Crouse, Guthrie McClintic, Katherine Cornell, Courtney Burr, Theron Bamberger, Paul Ford, Walter Matthau, Ruth White, Burgess Meredith, Julie Harris and Manning Gurian.

JAMES GORE (*Stage Manager*) designed the lighting for the original *Little Mary Sunshine* and *The Prodigal Son*. He stage-managed the European tour of *The Prodigal Son*. He was production stage manager and lighting designer for The Theatre in Westchester, at Dobbs Ferry. For the past two summers, Mr. Gore served in similar capacities at the Falmouth Playhouse, Cape Cod, Mass. At present, he is an instructor in the Theatre Arts Department at Columbia Universiy.
