PERSONAL

Dear Friend:

By this time your holiday in Arosa is behind you, and I hope that you and Mrs. Heineman had a pleasant and restful stay there with plenty of sunshine. I have continued very busy here with all sorts of things, but happily the internal situation of Austria continues quiet and in most respects promising. The Chancellor made a speech on Sunday in the Bundestag before all the leaders of the Patriotic Front of the country, in which he covered internal and external policy of the Government for the current year. It is generally considered the best speech which he has made since he became Chancellor, and it indicates that there will be no change in internal or external policy. This is very encouraging for Austria and for the general situation.

My plans are still to go home on leave, sailing from Hamburg on the MANHATTAN on April 7, and while I cannot be sure that I will get away, the prospects for the present are good. I shall unfortunately have to proceed directly from Vienna to Hamburg, but I expect to be in Berlin the 4th or 5th of April on my way to Hamburg.

I hope that these few words find you not too pressed with your many duties. I wrote you at some length at the Excelsior in Arosa on January 25 and hope that you got the letter. My wife joins in all good wishes to you and Mrs. Heineman.
