Upon motion by the Chair, motion prevailing, the Journal of the Previous Session stood approved, and the reading of the same was dispensed with.

On motion of Mr. Lammot, the Senate recessed at 2:20 P. M. until call of the Chair.

Senate met at expiration of recess at 3:30 P. M.

Messrs. Cook, Tull, Williams, Johnson, Melson, Pryor and Behen asked to be marked present.

The Chair announced the signing of HB 133.

The Chief Clerk of the House informed the Senate that the House had passed and requested the concurrence of the Senate in the following bills: **HB** 58, **HB** 225 and **HB** 341.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 119th General Assembly, that the State Treasurer be and she hereby is authorized and directed to pay to any attache or employee, who has been duly appointed by Resolution of the Senate, upon the order of the President Pro Tem of the Senate, sums on account from time to time not to exceed the total of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to any one person, on account of services to the present Session of the Senate, excepting the Senate attorneys who shall receive the sums on account from time to time, not to exceed the total of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) to any one attorney. Any such sums so paid shall be charged against the salary of the individual attache or employee to whom such sum or sums are paid, and shall be a part of the expenses of this Session of the Senate.

WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission requires a written examination for anyone that desires a third class radio telephone operators license; and

WHEREAS, small vessel owners and operators of many years experience on the water are required to take this examination if they desire to operate a radio-telephone; and

WHEREAS, many of these watermen have a limited education to the degree of being unable to take such a written examination; and

WHEREAS, the livelihood of these watermen depend on owning and operating of small vessels with radio-telephones

installed thereon; and

WHEREAS, the State of Delaware is particularly in-

terested in protecting the welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the General Assembly of the State of Delaware that an oral examination rather than a written one would better suffice and be to the best interest

of the State of Delaware; and

WHEREAS, it is further the opinion of the General Assembly that the regulation set out by the Federal Communications Commission requiring a minimum wattage for radiotelephones be revised so that all small vessels would be equipped with radio-telephones of the wattage power adequate to the distance to be traveled by the vessel.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE that it shall be the manifest expression of this body that oral examinations for third class radio-telephone operators license be given rather than written examinations and that minimum wattage for radiotelephones be eliminated and require all small vessels to be equipped with radio-telephones of the wattage power adequate to the distance to be traveled by the vessel.

On motion of Mr. Williams, SB 91—"An Act to Amend Title 19, Delaware Code, Entitled "Labor" in Respect to Wage Payments," was taken up for consideration and read a third

SB 316—"An Act to Amend Title 31, Delaware Code, to Provide for the Consolidation of Ferris School for Boys, Kruse School and the Detention Home for Juvenile Delinquents and Method for Voluntary Consolidation as to Woods Haven School for Girls; Change Laws Relating to Such Institutions and Appropriate Funds," by Melson and Hoey; to Finance.

of Wilmington, seated in the Gallery.

The Chair announced the signing of HB 310.

The Hon. John N. McDowell, Secretary of State, delivered a message from the Governor, as follows:

GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE STATE OF DELAWARE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

Dover, June 6, 1957

To the Senate of the 119th General Assembly of the State of Delaware:

Your attention is respectfully directed again to the fact that the School Building Program Act of 1955 (Chapter 529, Volume 50, Laws of Delaware) and the Veterans' Military Pay Act of 1955 (Chapter 449, Volume 50, Laws of Delaware) contain provisions limiting the interest which may be paid on State of Delaware Bonds authorized by these Acts to a maximum of three per cent per annum.

All the bonds required to be sold in fulfillment of the programs established by these Acts have not yet been sold because the funds to be derived therefrom have not been requested to this date. The sale of additional bonds in these categories will however be necessary. With specific reference to the School Construction Bonds, more than \$23,000,000 of the total authorized have not yet been sold. Any inability to sell such bonds, or any portion of them, when the funds are needed would bring to a standstill Delaware's School Construction Program and have very serious effects upon our public school educational program.

Your attention is respectfully directed to this matter again at this time because of the present condition of the municipal bond market. Authorities in the field of municipal bond underwriting inform me that it is extremely doubtful that any State of Delaware serial bonds, offered in accordance with the State's approved financing pattern, could be sold at this time where the interest rate is restricted to a maximum of three per cent. Support for this opinion is given by the fact that the City of Wilmington found it necessary last month to accept a bid on its bonds of an interest rate of 3.10 per cent—and several of the bidders proposed an interest rate of 3.25 per cent. In this connection it should also be recalled that the City of Wilmington has an AAA credit rating whereas the State of Delaware has a lower credit rating of AA.

The fact is clearly recognized that the condition of the municipal bond market could change so that prevailing interest rates on such bonds would become lower. Underwriters however do not forsee such a change in the near future and are unwilling to predict that lower interest rates will prevail within the next few months. On the other hand it is anticipated that it will be necessary to offer School Construction Bonds, Military Pay and other State of Delaware Bonds in August 1957.

It should also be recognized that interest rates are determined by the many and various factors affecting the financial markets and not by interest rate limitations established by statutes or ordinances. Conversely an interest rate in excess of three per cent would not be bid by underwriters merely because no statutes limiting such interest rates exist. Again it is true that financial market rates, and the attractiveness to investors of the bonds being offered, would determine the interest rate to be proposed by underwriters.

Because of the facts and circumstances related above I encouraged the introduction earlier in this session of bills to remove the three per cent interest rate limitation of the School Construction Bonds (Senate Bill No. 18) and the Military Pay Bonds (Senate Bill No. 97). According to the latest

Calendar available to me Senate Bill No. 18 is still in the Finance Committee and Senate Bill No. 97 has been reported out on its merits but no further action has been taken.

Under these circumstances, and bearing in mind the fact that the 119th General Assembly reportedly expects to be in recess when the bonds referred to above are offered, I consider it necessary and appropriate in the interest of Delaware's School Construction Program and Veterans' Bonus Program to request again that the three per cent per annum interest rate limitation on the bond authorization bills described above be removed by legislative action.

At the same time I suggest that in any and all bond authorization bill enacted by the 119th General Assembly there be no provision placing a three per cent interest rate limita-

tion upon such bonds.

REPORT OF BUDGET COMMISSION TO THE ONE HUNDRED AND NINETEENTH GENERAY ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE

To the Honorable Members of the 119th General Assembly of the State of Delaware Dover, Delaware

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to the provisions of the 1953 Delaware Code, Annotated, Title 29, Section 6314 and Volume 49, Laws of Delaware, Chapter 363, Section 5, a report is submitted herewith pertaining to the functions and activities of the State Budget Commission.

Budget Commission, composed of the Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Accounts, State Treasurer and the State Tax Commissioner held 24 regular meetings during the biennium ended June 30, 1956. No special meetings of the Commission were held.

At meetings during fiscal 1955, 108 requests for Contingency Fund transfers and 88 requests for Appropriation transfers were approved. During fiscal 1956, 62 Contingency Fund requests and 68 Appropriation Fund requests were approved by Budget Commission.

Fiscal reports, statements of balnces of appropriations, estimates of receipts and other information pertinent to the fiscal affairs of the State were prepared by the accountants for the Commission and presented at the meetings and/or at the request of the Governor.

As required, the staff of Budget Commission rendered accounting assistance, installed and revised bookkeeping systems and rendered other services in various State agencies

and schools.

As a result of group instruction that was given in each county early in calendar 1953 to school administrators and clerks, it is especially gratifying to be able to report that our current audits of schools accounts indicate far superior accounting practices for Internal Fund accounts than had been customary prior to the assistance rendered by personnel of Budget Commission in this connection.

The State Department of Public Instruction has issued instructional methods to all schools for appropriation accounting. In most instances we find that schools are conscientiously

attempting to follow these directives.

It is agin urgently recommended that favorable consideration be given to revising inadequate legal requirements which are not now suitable for present sound fiscal management. We earnestly solicit ample statutory and financial provisions to enable modernization of accounting procedures in Delaware in order to serve better the interest of the people and to utilize most efficiently mechanical equipment and personnel which are available.

In accordance with the practice during the last few years, heating fuel needs for all State agencies and schools were surveyed and bid proposals tabulated. A copy of the tabulation

was sent to all schools and interested agencies.

Budget Commission accountants have conducted numerous audits and examinations of State Agencies and schools. Efforts have been made to determine whether recommended procedures for proper fiscal control are being maintained. Agencies have, without exception, cooperated with our accountants in the examination of fiscal records and in the majority of cases have been prompt to adopt recommendations.

We are still attempting to conduct the majority of audits with the regular staff accountants of Budget Commission rather than employ public accounting firms for this phase of

our operations.

We find that in addition to being more economical for the State, this procedure furnishes several other advantages. Many agencies whose records we audit report that it is much more satisfactory to have an auditor who is already familiar with the legal requirements and specific accounting practices of State fiscal affairs. A copy of all audits conducted has been delivered to the Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Auditor of Accounts, President and Administrator of the agency or school being audited and the State Board of Education for all school districts. A copy of each audit is available for inspection in the office of Budget Commission, State House, Dover, Delaware.

Budget request forms were delivered personally by a staff member or by registered mail to every State agency and school which receives State aid. Instruction and, upon request, assistance were provided in the preparation of budget forms. Budget Commission carefully considered all budget requests submitted. In many instances it was necessary to revise the requests but every department was invited to attend a hearing before Budget Commission in order to substantiate its request.

Attached are lists of the agencies and schools which have been audited. A statement of expenditures from the State Contingency Fund for the fiscal years 1955 and 1956 is also

included with this report.
