## Technology helps find missing senior

An 80 year old New Castle County man, who suffers from dementia, was located Thursday night several miles away from the Newark Senior Center, with the assistance of the Project Lifesaver Program. This is the first documented successful use of the technology in the area.

At 3:35 p.m., on Thursday, County Police responded to the Newark Senior Center for a report of a missing person who had been diagnosed with Alzheimer's. When the officers arrived, they contacted the victim's son who reported his father was missing from the center.

Police learned the victim's

family had enrolled him in the Project Lifesaver Program approximately one month ago. Earlier that same day (Thursday), an officer had responded to his home and replaced the battery in his wristband, which houses a transmitter device.

Several officers began searching the area as assisting personnel sent out an automated phone alert to the surrounding communities. Meanwhile, officers who are trained in the operation of the program responded to the area and began searching for the victim using specialized

## More money for Craig




Roger Craig, the University of Delaware graduate student who last week set a record for one-day winnings of \$77,000 on the popular television game show Jeopardy, has continued his streak as champion into a second week. **Victim catches suspect after chase**

A residential burglary took place in the 200 block of Kells Ave. on September 18, 2010 around 4:30 a.m. A resident of the house awoke to find a stranger in his bedroom. Upon being confronted, the intruder claimed he was in the wrong house and left. The resident then saw that cash from his wallet was now on a chair where the suspect had been standing. Realizing the suspect had attempted to steal his money, the victim woke his roommate, and the two went looking for the intruder.

They saw the suspect a short distance down the street and gave chase when he ran off. The two residents caught and detained the suspect on the James Hall Trail, south of Kells Ave. Police arrived and took the suspect into custody on the trail.

An examination of the crime scene showed that the suspect had cut a window screen, then entered the house through the unlocked window. The suspect was just about to steal the money when he was confronted by the resident. No other property was stolen. The residents are both 20 year-old male University of Delaware students.

The defendant is John D. Morton, 23, of Middletown. Morton was charged with Burglary 2nd Degree, Attempted Theft, and Criminal Mischief. He was released after posting a \$500 bond.

**Student robbed**

A street robbery occurred on N. College Ave. near North St. on September 19, 2010 at 3:30 a.m. The victim had crossed the foot bridge from the University of Delaware's Laird Campus and was walking on N. College Ave. when he was approached by a group of five or six males, believed to be in their mid to late teens. One member of the group asked to use the victim's cell phone. When the victim removed the phone from his pocket, one of the suspects displayed what appeared to be a pellet gun and demanded the phone. A second suspect removed a small amount of cash from the victim's pocket. The suspects were last seen running on North St. toward Wilbur St.

The suspects were all described as black males, appearing to be high school-age. All were wearing white Polo sneakers that had a blue Polo emblem on each shoe. One had dreadlocks. One was wearing a fitted Cincinnati Reds cap. Another was wearing a black MLB cap backwards on his head. Another had a dark Polo baseball cap.

The victim, a 19 year-old University of Delaware student, was not injured.

**Woman arrested in pepper spray robbery**

A Glen Burnie, Md. woman has been arrested in connection with a pepper spray attack and robbery in downtown Newark. She was identified as Brandi R. Knight, 21, of Tall Pines Court.

An arrest warrant has been obtained charging Brandi Knight with two counts of Robbery 1st Degree and 2 counts of Assault 2nd Degree.

Knight was identified with the assistance of an officer from the Anne Arundel County, Md. Police Department, who saw the surveillance image captured at a Wawa market and distributed by the Newark Police. Police indicated there was an apparent attempt to use a credit card taken in the robbery.

Knight is currently in custody in Maryland and is being held awaiting her extradition to Delaware to face these charges.

The second person pictured in the surveillance photos has also been identified, and the investigation into her involvement in the robbery is continuing.

The robbery occurred on North Chapel Street, just off of East Main Street, at 1:30 a.m. on Saturday August 28. The two female victims were walking on north Chapel St. when two other females approached them from behind. The victims were sprayed in the face with pepper spray, and one was tackled to the ground. Both victims then had their purses taken by the suspects.

The suspects were last seen entering red or maroon car that

was driven away from the area northbound on north Chapel St. At the time of this release, a more detailed description of the suspects is not available.

Both victims are 21 years old. One of the victims suffered a scraped knee that did not require medical attention. The other was not injured.

Owner Dave Raymond told officers that the costume was one of two that was dropped off for repairs. Both costumes had been repaired by another company, but had been picked up by Raymond personally and were left on a coat rack to be shipped to the owner. Raymond had arranged for the delivery while he was on vacation that week. When he returned, the owner called to say that only one costume had been sent and that the gladiator costume, worth \$4,500, was missing.

Due to the fact that several weeks had elapsed since the incident, police have not processed any physical evidence, though a search by police revealed no forced entry into the site. Interviews with employees and cleaning staff have taken place. So far, no suspects have been named.

**Costume missing from business**

Employees at the Raymond Entertainment Group reported that a red gladiator costume was taken from their business sometime between the dates of August 24 to August 30. The business designs, builds and

# Week two comments from coaches, players

Newark (1-1), Red Lion (3-0) and St. Mark's (2-0) won on the gridiron, while Hodgson Vo-Tech (0-2), Glasgow (1-1) and Christiana (0-2) suffered losses. Here's how some of the coaches and players saw it.

Red Lion Christian Academy eighth-grade quarterback David Sills on his first career touchdown pass: "It was really cool throwing my first touchdown pass because it was to my brother (sophomore wide receiver Jahmere Irvin). I wasn't really thinking about it that much when it happened because it was such a good game. But then it hit me when I went over to the sideline and I thought it was really cool."

Newark quarterback Taylor Reynolds on the Yellowjackets' 42-0 win over Christiana and the upcoming showdown against St. Mark's Friday night under the lights in Newark at 7: "The win was a big confidence boost to our team. It will help us as we go into this week's game against St. Mark's. We will be more confident with ourselves and how we will perform this

Friday. Everyone is beginning to feel more comfortable on the field as well."

Hodgson Vo-Tech captain Tyler Hunter — via text to Newark intern sportswriter Trevor Brancato — on his team's 0-2 start after appearing in the Div. II state title game last season: "It was a tough loss. Delmar came ready to play from beginning to end. We can't hang our heads though; we have to dig deep at practice this week and have to come ready to play this weekend."

St. Mark's coach John Wilson on his team's 2-0 start to the season: "We have played well enough to win against two very tough Henlopen teams, Milford and Sussex Central. The difference in the Central game was our ability to run the football in the second half when we needed to. One of the things that we have learned about our team so far is that we are physical on both sides of the offensive and defensive lines. Although we still need to develop more consistency and discipline, and cut down on our mental errors, we are excited about the potential of this team and the opportunity to get better."

Glasgow coach Shannon

Riley on what he told his team after Friday night's 41-6 loss to Dover: "I told our team that Dover is an excellent team and there is no reason to hang our heads. We have to continue working towards our goal of winning Flight A. Charter is our Flight A opener, and if we beat them we are 1-0 and in first place in the conference." The Dragons travel to Charter of Wilmington for an 11 a.m. game Saturday.

## Hens highlights

Player of the game: The offensive line. Center Rob McDowell, guards Will Nagle

and Gino Gradkowski and tackled Kevin Uyll and Shea Allard opened up gaping holes as the UD running backs scampered for 373 yards on the ground in the Hens' 30-6 win over Duquesne.

Quote of the week: "When the line moves the defense back, that's how I can get up the middle and get downfield," said running back Andrew Pierce, who set a new freshman record for rushing yardage when he ran for 200 yards against Duquesne. "I've been praising the job they've done all season and I'm going to keep praising them." The previous record was held by Phillip Thaxton, who rushed

for 177 yards against West Chester in 2007 before being moved to wide receiver last season.

Injury update: Quarterback Pat Devlin was scheduled to have the cast on his left wrist removed and replaced by a brace Tuesday. He is expected to play Saturday at Richmond.

The future under center: Red-shirt freshman Trevor Sasek debuted as a starter against Duquesne, completing seven of nine passes for 75 yards and a touchdown.

Accolades: Pierce was named The Sports Network National Rookie of the Week

for the second straight time, was named the CAA Offensive Player of the Week for the first time in his career, and was cited as the CAA Rookie of the Week for the third straight week.

# September: Month of the stinkbug

Out with August and in with September. Labor Day is the last (unofficial) day of summer; one last trip to the beach and then back to school. Warm days and cool nights; air conditioners off and windows wide open. Football season has begun, and we can't wait for the sights and scents of the official fall season. Everyone has made the transition smoothly; but, what we didn't bargain for as we welcomed in the month of September--- stinkbugs, invading our gardens and our homes.

The brown marmorated stinkbug (scientific name: *Halyomorpha halys*) is an exotic insect pest recently introduced to the United States from Asia. The adult stage is distinctly shield-shaped with brown and gray spotting on the upper side of its body; the underside of its body is white, sometimes with gray or black markings. The stinkbug feeds on fruit and seed pods of a variety of plants and becomes an annoyance to homeowners in the fall when it tries to get inside and seek shelter for



the winter months. This month our Extension office and the Master Gardener Garden Line have been responding to dozens of phone calls, e-mails, and samples. Everyone wants to know "What is this bug?" and "What can do I do to control it?"

The stinkbug is highly mobile and feeds on a number of vegetable and fruit crops, as well as ornamental plants,

including apples, pears, raspberries, and peppers, serviceberries, viburnums, roses, and hollies. It feeds by sucking on plant juices. On the fruit, early season damage appears as grooves or brown lines on the surface, while late season damage appears as small, dead spots on the surface or just beneath the skin. This damage can be worsened by secondary infections and eventual scarring as the fruit matures. Stinkbugs

also feed on the leaves of plants. Their feeding damage appears as lightly colored flecking or "crows-foot" shaped lesions; the lesions sometimes fuse and turn brown with time.

Unfortunately, there aren't many products available for stink bug control. We recommend removing stinkbugs from your garden by hand-picking. And, although the appearance of your fruit and vegetables may

be marred, you can still harvest and consume stinkbug damaged fruit and vegetables.

Finally, at this time of year, stinkbugs want to get inside. Come September, stinkbugs begin to scope out their shelter, identifying easily accessible and cozy sites to spend their

winter months. Keep in mind, stinkbugs are harmless; they do not bite humans or pets. They enter homes through any small opening, particularly around windows. To prevent stinkbugs from entering your homes, "caulk and seal!" That is, seal any cracks and openings you can find.



# Band director extraordinaire remembered

Heidi Sarver mentioned "ripples in the water" when talking about her close friend George N. Parks.

The University of Delaware Marching Band Director was referring to the tens and perhaps hundreds of thousands of musicians, whose lives were touched by the University of Massachusetts-Amherst Marching Band leader, who grew up in Newark.

"We talk about six degrees of separation," she said. "With George, it was one."

"He was the drum major, the cheerleader," Sarver said in a telephone interview as she took time out from the grueling fall schedule of a band director. But behind the energetic showman was a humble man who would do anything for his friends, she said.

Parks was well known in marching band circles for holding a band leadership and drum major's camps at the U Mass campus and throughout the nation that typically attracted three thousand students annually.

Parks died late last week at the age of 57 of an apparent heart attack while traveling with the U Mass Band to the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. According to press

accounts, his death came just after the band was to give a performance at an Ohio high school.

The passing of Parks came

as a shock for the U Mass community and the home page of the university's website continues to pay tribute to the man, whose dream of having a band building in Amherst was coming true with construction of a \$5.5 million facility.

Sarver and Parks phoned one another daily. Their last phone call last week went on for a while, Sarver remembered.

"He seemed tired," Sarver said, but she did not read anything in to that, given the fact

that his band was traveling to one of the legendary stadiums in college sports. "For us, it's Mecca," she said of playing at the Big 10 powerhouse.

Sarver was a student of Parks, who built the nationally known band program at U Mass, with an enthusiasm that never seemed to diminish.

Parks had grown up in Newark and graduated from Christiana High School. Parks, according to Sarver had attended the University of Delaware for two years. He went on to transfer to West Chester University and earned a degree from that institution and later from Northeastern University in Boston.

He became the leader of the Marching Minuteman at the age of 24, after winning titles with a drum and bugle corps unit in Pennsylvania.

He went on to head the U Mass program for more than three decades, while gaining increasing acclaim for his summer camps.

The paths of Parks and Sarver nearly collided in the mid-1990s when both applied for the lead role in the UD Marching Band.

Sarver ended up getting the job and while there was some tension for a time, Sarver noted that Parks went on to help her pack for the trip from Pennsylvania to Newark.

Conducting a marching band was not easy, but Parks was always available to offer advice.

"I don't know if I would have gotten through it," she said of his advice and counsel in the early going.

Parks is survived by his wife of 31 years, Jeanne (nee Clayton), daughter, Kathryn, son, Michael, his mother, Vesta Parks and brother Patrick, of Newark, , sisters and brothers-in-law Barbara and Ed Firchak of Ocean City, Md., Pamela and Dan Kopec of Louisiana, brother and sister-in-law Jon and Lorie Parks of Delaware, and his in-laws, Harvey and Barbara Clayton of Jensen Beach, FL, and brother-in-law Robert Clayton of Celebration, FL. He was pre-deceased by his father, Norman Parks.

Services will be private. A memorial service is expected to be in Massachusetts.





## OUT OF THE ATTIC



This week's Out of the Attic item is an October 2006 W. T. McLain photograph of the New Century Club building at East Delaware Avenue and Haines Street. In 1893 a group of Newark women established a literary and social organization known as the Tuesday Club, later renamed the New Century Club. Committed to matters of civic responsibility, the Club's adoption of the motto "Not for ourselves alone" reflected its deep interest in social service. Throughout its history the Newark Club has played a key role in advancing education, healthcare, environmental conservation, and other issues affecting quality of life. Members were active in promoting, financing, and expanding the services of the Newark Library. They lobbied vigorously for the establishment of the Women's College of the University of Delaware. This site was obtained in 1916 and the present Club House was completed in 1917. The building has been used for a variety of purposes: recreation space for military personnel during World Wars I and II, a Community Center for local youth, and as an activity center for such organizations as the Red Cross and Blood Bank of Delaware. The property was listed on the Delaware Registry of Historic Sites in 2003.

equipment designed to locate the tracking signal emitted by the transmitter.

## Delaware's jobless rate holds steady

Delaware's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged from July at 8.4 percent in August as retail trade and federal government job totals dropped by 700. The unemployment in August 2009 was 8.3 percent. The August unemployment rate in the nation was 9.6 percent, compared to 9.5 percent in July. The figures were released Friday from the Delaware Department of Labor.

The number of unem-

ployed in Delaware dropped from 35,700 in August of last year to 35,0300 in August of this year. Overall employment is up by 4,000 jobs in year-to-year comparisons, a gain of 1 percent. That was better than the nation's job gain of 0.2 percent.

Job gains over the past year have come in leisure and hospitality, up 2,800 jobs and education and health, up 2,300.

The largest job losses over the one-year period came in

construction, down 1,300 and manufacturing, minus 1,200.

Unadjusted employment figures comparing cities and counties in Delaware gave Newark an 8 percent jobless rate, up from 7.7 percent in July and 7 percent in August 2009.

The lowest jobless rate was in Sussex County, due to the tourist season, at 7.6 percent, compared to 7.2 percent in July and 7 percent in August of last year.

The New Castle County unemployment rate was 8.7 percent, down slightly from 8.8 percent in July and slightly above the 8.5 percent posted in August 2010.

Wilmington had the state's highest unemployment rate at 12.5 percent, up from 12.2 percent in July, but down slightly from the 12.7 percent posted in August of last year.


