## Crime trending downward in Newark

As part of their weekly crime statistics, the Newark Police Department has reported that, for the first half of 2011, crime is declining in

According to data from the Department's June 26 to July 2 report, serious crimes, such as robbery, assault, and auto thefts, have seen a 14.2 per-cent overall reduction for the same period, year to date, in 2010. Less serious crimes, such as criminal mischief, alcohol and drug offenses, and disorderly conduct saw a

Most serious crime categories saw sharp drop-offs in occurrences, with aggravated assault showing the most improvement, dropping from 21 investigations in 2010 to nine in 2011, a 57.1 percent improvement. Burglary, which dropped from 87 investigations to 61, and theft, which dropped from 397 occurrences to 361 this year, also showed improvement.

Negatively, auto thefts and robbery investigations showed slightly higher numbers in 2011 than in 2010.

For lesser crimes, disorderly conduct, criminal mischief,

decline of 15.6 percent over- other assaults, and alcohol and drug-related charges all saw decreases, with noise/ disorderly premises and trespassing crimes as the only offenses showing increases for 2011.

The Police Department attributes the decrease in crime to a practice that has been in effect for the past few years called the Fall in Crimes Initiative, which utilizes computer data, crime statistics, and on-hand policing to quickly identify problem areas and redeploy resources where they are needed most.

Calling the program "intelligence-based policing," Mark Farrall, Public Information Officer with Newark PD, stated that the department is 'pleased and encouraged" by the positive results.

The Street Crimes Unit is another facet of the initiative, which, according to Farrall, allows the department to get a "jump on crime" by using uniformed officers to deter possible crimes by having a police presence and also by putting plain-cloths officers on patrol to quickly react to criminal acts as they happen.

The city's video surveillance system has been another deterrent, allowing the police to follow up on investigations by supplying additional details, such as occurrence

times, physical descriptions, and car registrations, in times where no witnesses were present. The group has called the system "very effective" in developing leads.
Traffic summonses showed

increases in both moving and non-moving violations, from last year, mainly due to new laws emphasizing traffic safety in the area.

Parking violations showed a marked decrease in the number of meter tickets and parking summons/IPR. On the plus side, the scofflaw category, which marks the number of and dollar totals for unpaid tickets, showed a decrease, meaning that the department is doing a better job of collecting fines.

Traffic accidents increased, including personal injuries, and reportable and non-reportable property damage cases. Finally, there was 70 per-

cent increase in Driving Under the Influence violations, up to 121 from just 71 last year.

## **Newark continues to pick up trash**

The City of Newark has decided that garbage collection will not be bid out and that the city will continue to provide the service to its residents.

Using a study conducted by the city of Middletown when they privatized their garbage pickup, Newark earlier reported that it could possibly save \$800,000 if the service was bid out to a private hauler.

An investigation done by the City Manager's office showed that the savings would be much less.

According to Mayor Vance Funk, "The City Manager estimated the savings would be between \$200,000 and \$250,000."

Garbage collection has been consistently polled as the most popular service the city provides and has been the center of public debate since it was announced that Newark was looking to hire a private hauler, in an effort to reduce costs,

In an e-mail to The Newark Post, City Manager Kyle Sonnenberg stated, "We are not going to pursue contracting of solid waste collection. Based on the feedback we got, people are very pleased with the existing service and we are not going to change it."

### Two charged in knife assault

The Newark Police Department has arrested two defendants following an early morning assault on July 31. The incident began when Victim 1, a 26 year-old

male from Newark, and Victim 2, a 21 year-old female from Middletown were looking for a parking space in the parking lot of the Deer Park Tavern located at West 108 Main Street. Victim 1 and three males (including Defendant and Defendant



exchanged words for an unknown reason, which prompted a verbal argument in the parking lot. The two groups parted and both went into the establishment. Throughout the evening the two groups continued to exchange words inside the establishment.

Shortly after 1 a.m., both groups exited the establishment and a fight ensued in the parking lot between Victim 1 and the three subjects. During the fight, Victim 1 punched one of the subjects, a 31 yearold white male from Newark, and knocked him unconscious. The fight then broke up and the two groups parted ways. Victim 1 began to leave the area in a vehicle with Victim 1 driving and Victim 2 in the front passenger seat. As Victim 1 was leaving the area, Defendant 1 and Defendant 2

went to a vehicle where they both retrieved large knives from the trunk. They then confronted Victim 1 who was seated in the drivers seat. Both Defendants then began swinging their knives at Victim 1 causing several severe lacerations to both arms and hands. Victim 2, who was seated in the passenger seat, was also struck by the swinging knives causing a laceration to her left arm.

Victim 1 then fled the attack in the vehicle and was later stopped by a UDPD officer who observed the vehicle driving erratically on East Delaware Avenue. Both victims were then transported via ambulance to Christiana

Victim 1 sustained severe lacerations to both arms and had two fingers severed off of his left hand. Victim 2 sustained a minor laceration to her left arm.

Defendant 1 was identified as Kyle J. Fletcher, 20, of Newark, and Defendant 2 was identified as Richard T. Burke, 21, also of Newark. Both were charged with two counts - Assault 1st Degree, one count - Possession of a Deadly Weapon During Commission of a Felony, and one count - Conspiracy. Both Fletcher and Burke were committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in lieu of \$62,500 bail.

### **Robbery suspects** caught

New Castle County Detectives have arrested two suspects for an armed robbery in the unit block of Kraffert Court in the community of Lakewood Farms in the Newark area They have been charged with robbery related offenses.

On July 22, County police were called to the unit block of Balbach Avenue and talked to a 23 -year-old man who reported that he had been assaulted and robbed at a location on Kraffert

The investigation revealed that the victim had arranged to purchase property from the suspects. The suspects drove the victim to a location on Kraffert Court to make an exchange. When the victim exited the vehicle, he was approached from behind by one of the suspects who struck him in the face and knocked him to the ground. The second suspect then displayed a handgun and began assaulting the victim. The suspects then rifled through the victim's pockets removing property and an undisclosed amount of cash.

The victim was able to flee and get help and was transported to the Christiana Hospital where he was treated for injuries that were considered nonlife threatening.

On July 29, Detectives were able to locate the suspects and take them into custody.

## Mariano steps down as Christiana basketball coach

Nate Mariano has resigned as basketball head coach at Christiana High School after serving in the position for seven

"It was an extremely tough decision for me, but I'm on to the next stage of my life," Mariano said. "I will definitely get back into coaching at some point. I'm only 31, but this is the best thing for me right now."

Mariano began his coaching career at the age of 22 as an assistant at Christiana. Two years later he took over the reins of the varsity program and during his tenure led the Vikings to the state tournament three times, including winning the school's first boys basketball state championship in 2007.

"The highlight of my career on the court was the 2007 state title since it was such an amazing experience for the school and the kids," Mariano said. "But my true highlight is the amount of my kids who went on to college."

Mariano estimates that 90 percent of his graduating seniors went to get their education

after high school. In addition, Mariano saw 15 of his players continue to play basketball at the next level.

"That is the highlight and the thing I am most proud of in my coaching career," he added. "Just the relationships I had with my teams over the years and how they developed academically, socially, and athleti-

During that 2007 season, which Mariano calls "magical," he led the Vikings to the school's first Flight A title since 1988 and had the opportunity to coach the state's player of the year, Tim Steed.

Mariano will remain at Christiana, where this fall he'll begin his sixth year as Dean of Students. When asked whether or not he'll ever return to coaching, Mariano was quick to reply: "My wife and I are having our first child in October, so that was the main reason for resigning. I can get back into the game in a few years when our baby gets older."

Jim Freel, who previ-ously coached the girls team at Christiana, has been hired to coach the boys team. Hart Coleman is the new head coach of the girls team.

The event occurred on July 23 with the couple reporting that the items were on the porch when they left that night, but noticed that they were missing the next after-


A search by officers showed no signs of forced entry through a side storm door, the point of entry. No evidence was found on the



### **Gerard Mangone**

Gerard J. Mangone, 92, of Newark, died Wednesday, July 27, at his home. Born in the Bronx in 1918, Dr. Mangone's career as an international legal scholar spanned close to six decades, including almost 40 years as Professor of Marine Policy at the University of Delaware.

Dr. Mangone received his bachelor's degree from the College of the City of New York in 1938. Following four years of active military

service, he earned his master's degree and doctoral degree in international law from Harvard University in 1947 and 1949. His dissertation won the Charles Sumner Award for the most distinguished contribution to international

Before joining the UD, Dr. Mangone held faculty and administrative positions at

institutions including Wesleyan University, Swarthmore College, and Syracuse University, where he served as associate and acting dean of the Maxwell Graduate School of Citizenship and Public Affairs.

At Temple University, Dr. Mangone served as Dean for the College of Liberal Arts and then Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, administering eleven colleges and 25,000 students. Soon thereafter he was appointed executive director of the President's Commission on the United Nations and was the first senior fellow at the new Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars, Dr. Mangone also served as a consultant to the White House, U.S. Department of State, the United Nations, Japan, the Ford Foundation, and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace

Dr. Mangone joined UD in 1972 as professor of marine studies and political science. In 1973, he created the Center for the Study of Marine Policy and served as its director for the next 16 years. In 2003, the center was renamed in his honor as the Gerard J. Mangone Center for Marine

Dr. Mangone earned numerous accolades throughout his career. He was a visiting professor at Yale University, Mt. Holyoke College, Trinity College Princeton University, and Johns Hopkins University as well as a visiting lecturer at the University of Bologna, Peking University, the University of Natal, Capetown University, and the University of Western Australia. At Calcutta University in India, he was honored as the Tagore Law Professor and at the University of Delaware he received the most distinguished faculty award as Francis Alison Professor. In 2010, UD awarded Dr. Mangone an honorary doctor of science degree.

Dr. Mangone wrote more than 20 books and edited 25 others, and authored scores of scholarly papers

The vehicles continued their journey from Delaware to Mississippi with Baton Rouge Teamsters Local 5 driver Charles Weaver who was flown to Delaware for this purpose. The vehicles arrived in late September and were put to use immediately by Pascaguola who lost over thirty cars during the storm. In addition, after hearing of Pascagoula employee's need for cleaning supplies, Newark City employees and their Employees Council Local 103, IUE-CW A purchased cleaning supplies that filled every bit of open space in the vehicles. Also packed in the vehicles were fifty cases of



bug guard towelettes donated by the Avon Company to provide immediate assistance in limiting insect bites. Diamond State Ambulance donated its labor to remove bar lights from the police vehicles. Newark's Mayor and City Councilmen collected donations at Community Day totaling \$5,553. Local businesses, some with the help of UD traternities and sororities, held fundraisers that gathered over \$9,000 for the Pascagoula relief effort. Newark's mayor, Vance Funk will be presented with an award in recognition of his long and devoted support of


