UD Bookstore opens

On Monday, August 1, the University of Delaware opened the doors to its newest addition, the Barnes and Noble bookstore, located at 85 E. Main St. Also opening is a coffee shop, which is housed in the former Christina School District's Administration Building, and offers another entrance to the retail outlet. On September 1, UD will formally open the store with a groundbreaking ceremony.

The store features books and UD apparel on the first floor, with the student book section on the second. An Apple store, selling computers and other media devices to UD students and personnel only, is also on the second floor. Many third party Apple-authorized and related items are available for purchase, by anyone.

Though the store is open, construction is still ongoing to finish landscaping features outside of the main entrance.

Crime trending downward in Newark

As part of their weekly crime statistics, the Newark Police Department has reported that, for the first half of 2011, crime is declining in the city.

According to data from the Department's June 26 to July 2 report, serious crimes, such as robbery, assault, and auto thefts, have seen a 14.2 percent overall reduction for the same period, year to date, in 2010. Less serious crimes, such as criminal mischief, alcohol and drug offenses, and disorderly conduct saw a

decline of 15.6 percent overall.

Most serious crime categories saw sharp drop-offs in occurrences, with aggravated assault showing the most improvement, dropping from 21 investigations in 2010 to nine in 2011, a 57.1 percent improvement. Burglary, which dropped from 87 investigations to 61, and theft, which dropped from 397 occurrences to 361 this year, also showed improvement.

Negatively, auto thefts and robbery investigations showed slightly higher numbers in 2011 than in 2010.

For lesser crimes, disorderly conduct, criminal mischief,

other assaults, and alcohol and drug-related charges all saw decreases, with noise/disorderly premises and trespassing crimes as the only offenses showing increases for 2011.

The Police Department attributes the decrease in crime to a practice that has been in effect for the past few years called the Fall in Crimes Initiative, which utilizes computer data, crime statistics, and on-hand policing to quickly identify problem areas and redeploy resources where they are needed most.

Calling the program "intelligence-based policing," Mark Farrall, Public Information

Officer with Newark PD, stated that the department is "pleased and encouraged" by the positive results.

The Street Crimes Unit is another facet of the initiative, which, according to Farrall, allows the department to get a "jump on crime" by using uniformed officers to deter possible crimes by having a police presence and also by putting plain-cloths officers on patrol to quickly react to criminal acts as they happen.

The city's video surveillance system has been another deterrent, allowing the police to follow up on investigations by supplying additional details, such as occurrence

times, physical descriptions, and car registrations, in times where no witnesses were present. The group has called the system "very effective" in developing leads.

Traffic summonses showed increases in both moving and non-moving violations, from last year, mainly due to new laws emphasizing traffic safety in the area.

Parking violations showed a marked decrease in the number of meter tickets and parking summons/IPR. On the plus side, the scofflaw category, which marks the number of and dollar totals for unpaid tickets, showed a decrease, meaning that the

department is doing a better job of collecting fines.

Traffic accidents increased, including personal injuries, and reportable and non-reportable property damage cases.

Finally, there was 70 percent increase in Driving Under the Influence violations, up to 121 from just 71 last year.

Newark continues to pick up trash

The City of Newark has decided that garbage collection will not be bid out and that the city will continue to provide the service to its residents.

Using a study conducted by the city of Middletown when they privatized their garbage pickup, Newark earlier report-

ed that it could possibly save \$800,000 if the service was bid out to a private hauler.

An investigation done by the City Manager's office showed that the savings would be much less.

According to Mayor Vance Funk, "The City Manager estimated the savings would

be between \$200,000 and \$250,000."

Garbage collection has been consistently polled as the most popular service the city provides and has been the center of public debate since it was announced that Newark was looking to hire a private hauler, in an effort to reduce costs,

earlier this year.

In an e-mail to The Newark Post, City Manager Kyle Sonnenberg stated, "We are not going to pursue contracting of solid waste collection. Based on the feedback we got, people are very pleased with the existing service and we are not going to change it."

Corrigan promoted to Newark Post editor

"We're encouraging the public to become more active since it's the community's paper," Corrigan said.

Ralph Bush, general manager of the Upper Shore Publications, said he was

pleased to be able to promote a current employee.

"It's always great when you have a position to fill and you can find someone with the ability, skill and commitment within your own company," Bush said. "And Mark has all that."

After years of working in retail, Corrigan started with Chesapeake Publishing in 2004 as part-time researcher for the Delaware Business Ledger's Book of Lists. At the same time, he took classes at the University of Delaware, from which he graduated in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in English literature.

He said his best memories from his time at the Newark Post so far include covering the much-anticipated Senate debate between Christine O'Donnell and Chris Coons at UD's Mitchell Hall and videotaping President Barack Obama's arrival in Wilmington for the funeral of Joe Biden's mother.

Raised in Baltimore, Corrigan moved to Delaware in 1995. He now lives in North Wilmington with his wife, Jill, and their 6-year-old adopted son, Darius.

Mariano steps down as Christiana basketball coach

Nate Mariano has resigned as basketball head coach at Christiana High School after serving in the position for seven years.

"It was an extremely tough decision for me, but I'm on to the next stage of my life," Mariano said. "I will definitely get back into coaching at some point. I'm only 31, but this is the best thing for me right now."

Mariano began his coaching career at the age of 22 as an assistant at Christiana. Two years later he took over the reins of the varsity program and during his tenure led the Vikings to the state tournament three times, including winning the school's first boys basketball state championship in 2007.

"The highlight of my career on the court was the 2007 state title since it was such an amazing experience for the school and the kids," Mariano said. "But my true highlight is the amount of my kids who went on to college."

Mariano estimates that 90 percent of his graduating seniors went to get their education

after high school. In addition, Mariano saw 15 of his players continue to play basketball at the next level.

"That is the highlight and the thing I am most proud of in my coaching career," he added. "Just the relationships I had with my teams over the years, and how they developed academically, socially, and athletically."

During that 2007 season, which Mariano calls "magical," he led the Vikings to the school's first Flight A title since 1988 and had the opportunity to coach the state's player of the year, Tim Steed.

Mariano will remain at Christiana, where this fall he'll begin his sixth year as Dean of Students. When asked whether or not he'll ever return to coaching, Mariano was quick to reply: "My wife and I are having our first child in October, so that was the main reason for resigning. I can get back into the game in a few years when our baby gets older."

Jim Freel, who previously coached the girls team at Christiana, has been hired to coach the boys team. Hart Coleman is the new head coach of the girls team.

Nottingham Green Swim Club finishes perfect season

Nottingham Green won the top division in the Suburban Swim League for the first time since 1995.

"Both Chris Collier and I had high expectations going into the season," said Brian Polaski, who along with Collier, serves as the club's head coach. incredible job all season long, waking up early for practice and bringing their Gator spirit to every meet. We are extremely proud."

Polaski also said the team's success was due in large part to its assistant coaches: Meghan Holliday, Ian Moyer, Tyler Coffing, Ashling Cook, Samantha Spoor, Kristen Holliday, Cierra Runge, Ryan Hausler, Zoe Coffing, Whitney Holveck, Abby Spoor and John Neyman.

In addition to winning all of its meets this summer, the club took on an even greater challenge — raising money to help

The event occurred on July 23 with the couple reporting that the items were on the porch when they left that night, but noticed that they were missing the next afternoon.

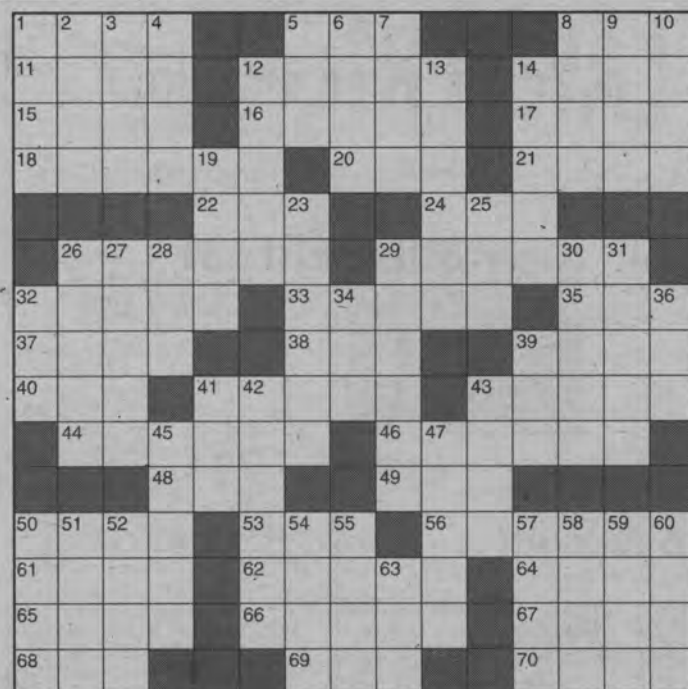
A search by officers showed no signs of forced entry through a side storm door, the point of entry. No evidence was found on the scene.

Tom was raised in New York City on the Lower East Side, Manhattan. He enlisted in the Army during WWII on his 18th birthday and joined the 29th Infantry Division and fought on D-Day, June 6, 1944 on Omaha Beach in Normandy, France. Wounded and captured, he was imprisoned in a French Convent in Remes, France and nursed to health by the French nuns and escaped with the aid of the French Underground.

Tom was awarded the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star.

Tom graduated with a BA in American History from the University of Delaware in 1950, and was a member of the Theta Chi Fraternity upon initiation by Alpha Hi Chapter on March 2nd 1946. Tom had received the traditional Greek education while graduating from the Exataxion Greek School of the Greek Orthodox Church of St. Barbara in New York City.

He entered the real estate profession in 1951 and opened his own office in 1954. He had been in almost all phases of real estate: Residential, Commercial, Investment, Land development, Syndication, Building, Counseling Business Opportunities and Property Management. During the 1970s Tom had five real estate offices and over 125 sales agents, and taught the Real Estate licensing Course for several years at Wilmington College. He was a major force and benefactor in organizing the Greek community of the Holy Trinity Orthodox Church to pledge and commit in building the church's community and youth center, to be enjoyed by all future generations.

Gerard Mangone

Gerard J. Mangone, 92, of Newark, died Wednesday, July 27, at his home. Born in the Bronx in 1918, Dr. Mangone's career as an international legal scholar spanned close to six decades, including almost 40 years as Professor of Marine Policy at the University of Delaware.

Dr. Mangone received his bachelor's degree from the College of the City of New York in 1938. Following four years of active military service, he earned his master's degree and doctoral degree in international law from Harvard University in 1947 and 1949. His dissertation won the Charles Sumner Award for the most distinguished contribution to international peace.

Before joining the UD, Dr. Mangone held faculty and administrative positions at

institutions including Wesleyan University, Swarthmore College, and Syracuse University, where he served as associate and acting dean of the Maxwell Graduate School of Citizenship and Public Affairs.

At Temple University, Dr. Mangone served as Dean for the College of Liberal Arts and then Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, administering eleven colleges and 25,000 students. Soon thereafter he was appointed executive director of the President's Commission on the United Nations and was the first senior fellow at the new Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars. Dr. Mangone also served as a consultant to the White House, U.S. Department of State, the United Nations, Japan, the Ford Foundation, and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

Dr. Mangone joined UD in 1972 as professor of marine studies and political science. In 1973, he created the Center for the Study of Marine Policy and served as its director for the next 16 years. In 2003, the center was renamed in his honor as the Gerard J. Mangone Center for Marine Policy.

Dr. Mangone earned numerous accolades throughout his career. He was a visiting professor at Yale University, Mt. Holyoke College, Trinity College, Princeton University, and Johns Hopkins University as well as a visiting lecturer at the University of Bologna, Peking University, the University of Natal, Capetown University, and the University of Western Australia. At Calcutta University in India, he was honored as the Tagore Law Professor and at the University of Delaware he received the most distinguished faculty award as Francis Alison Professor. In 2010, UD awarded Dr. Mangone an honorary doctor of science degree.

Dr. Mangone wrote more than 20 books and edited 25 others, and authored scores of scholarly papers.

Dr. Mangone is survived by his three daughters Cleopatra Victoria of California; Regina Alexandra, her husband Lee, and her son Jack of Arizona; Flaminia Mangone of Virginia, and his beloved

companion Alberte Dionne of Canada. Mangone's wife of 42 years, Emma, preceded him in death.

A service honoring Dr. Mangone's life was held at the First Presbyterian Church, 292 West Main Street, on Sunday, July 31.

This week's Out of the Attic item is a September 2005 picture of the response of the Newark City government in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina's devastating blow along the Gulf Coast. Newark's elected officials selected Pascagoula, Mississippi as a good match for specific assistance. Newark donated three police vehicles and one sedan to the Sister City. The vehicles were scheduled for auction in October. General Teamsters Local 326 driver Ralph Modero loaded the truck and drove it to Wilmington.

The vehicles continued their journey from Delaware to Mississippi with Baton Rouge Teamsters Local 5 driver Charles Weaver who was flown to Delaware for this purpose. The vehicles arrived in late September and were put to use immediately by Pascagoula who lost over thirty cars during the storm. Pictured with the loaded truck are, left to right, Ralph Modera, local driver, Carol Houck, Assistant to the City Manager, and John Ryan, Sr., Local 326 president, who made the transport arrangements.

In addition, after hearing of Pascagoula employee's need for cleaning supplies, Newark City employees and their Employees Council Local 103, IUE-CW A purchased cleaning supplies that filled every bit of open space in the vehicles. Also packed in the vehicles were fifty cases of



bug guard towelettes donated by the Avon Company to provide immediate assistance in limiting insect bites. Diamond State Ambulance donated its labor to remove bar lights from the police vehicles. Newark's Mayor and City Councilmen collected donations at Community Day totaling \$5,553. Local businesses, some with the help of UD fraternities and sororities, held fundraisers that gathered over \$9,000 for the Pascagoula relief effort. 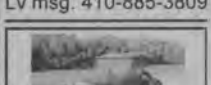
