Tho intellectual classes, inoluding the wiversity students and their professore, feel lamiliated over developments. Doop indignation prevails in the Clurchas. The laek of freedos of ppeech is widely resented. The four-year plan inttead of jaspiring a hope of better tietes, is ridieuled. The "brotherly" meetinge between the eployers and employese are fostoring irritation rathor than corradsشap。

Ahout aifhteon months hence a revolution will break out. The uphosval will cowe fron the nassen. Arwy leaders will thon atep in to rostore orcer and reinstate a eonstitutional monareky which is what tho Gorvan people really dowiro.

The non in powor today are guito a mall gang probably only fourteen, including Goebbels who is discrodited oven with Hitler, and von Dapen wose botrayal of zruoning brought \#itler into orfico.

Folitionl nurdere continue, but Hitler and his frionds have loarnod a losson fros the Frexeh levolution, that is, they do not bohed thoir oncuios in pablio. Hony proninont Cormens live in fors of their lives.

Tho Aryy loadore are the moderate influence in forelgn politition. Thoy gotr Cormany carnot win a war and thet oven a viotorious war could only bring deepor misery to the Geruan people. Thanks to thais wistom and docision an inoursion into Austria or Gzochoslovalia mill not take pinco. Tho zasses want peace with Germany'a noighbors: the only yar that mirht bo apopular one wonld be with Italy.

Mobody actuslly Selioves in " Kller'e blufe when ho when Cermans to believe that his rocime is admired by other nations. Dut intolligert, Comans are distressod whom they find men like Eenderson strougthoning Mitior's haxds by oxprossing a feigned admation. Diplomatio courtooy requires no more than a Priemaly appreciation of some traits in the Corman oharacter and some of Cexmary's soientific, tochnical, ant literary achiovemonts.

In responsible circles it is realized, and Lohaoht in particular is well avare, that Gernany's paranount need is foreign eredits. Let those Governments who would be in a position to grant aredits give the Ooman people claarly to underatand on what ternac Germany would be regarded as sufficiontiy trustworthy to be piven financial assistance - be it in the form of lonns or commercial facsilties. The firmt condition chould be froedom of the proas, wish would spell the imodiste domfall of the rogive.

One of the lending and beet znformed objective observers of the whole position in Surope states that the foregoing must bo recoived with the credence due to the atatoments of a man who lcrowa the Ceman situation from the inside as fow do.
