Nonprofits might lose free refuse service

Free trash pickups for nonprofits and churches could become a thing of the

The Newark City Council, Monday night, discussed widening the base of commercial trash collections that could add fees to a wider group of users.

The Council earlier approved adding apartments to the city trash collection system as a way to increase city revenues. In discussions with the city, apartment owners suggested that some communities could live with once, rather than twiceweekly pickup schedules.

Further trash fee reductions could take place if a larger base of nonprofits, schools, churches and perhaps condominiums (already paying fees to haul-ers) pay city trash pickup costs. Residential customers receive trash service through their property tax bills.

Discussion centered on agreements the city makes with nonprofits, such as recreation programs being held at school gyms and how that would play out against new charges. Sorting out those arrangements would be difficult, councilmen admitted.

It was agreed that the issue will be taken up at future meetings to provide sufficient notice for those

The council voted to tighten up language in regard to public improvements at condominium developments.

The city Planning Commission earlier recommended the change in language, due to the belief that developers might decide they are not required to pay for sidewalks and other improvements, since the property is private.

Developers typically post bonds that guarantee the improvements will be made.

Planning Director Roy Lopata said no problems have cropped up, but suggested that a recovery of the housing market could bring more adult communities that could have such improve-

The council also approved bids for property-casualty insurance for the city.

City officials recommended no major changes in coverage, after looking into the addition of insurance for environmental problems and terrorist attacks on computer

Total cost of the insurance will be nearly \$645,000, up \$26,000 from a year ago. Rising vehicle insurance rates accounted for much of the increase. The city also found out that some equipment and vehicles were not on insurance policies.

Earth Hour got its start in Australia, but has since spread worldwide, with more than 300 U.S. cities and 80 million U.S. residents participating last year.

City Manager Kyle Sonnenberg said the city will do its part to turn off non-

The council received an ordinance that would allow more students to be housed in homes along Continental Avenue. The ordinance will receive final consideration at a future meeting.

Council members also encouraged residents to fill out their U.S. Census forms. That includes students who do not believe they need to fill out

Also discussed was the possibility of moving the start time of the City Council meeting from 7:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.

City Hall watchdog Jean White said the earlier time might not allow enough time for dinner prior to the meeting and reduce the amount of time spent with the family.

Manager City Sonnenberg said the 7 p.m. time would not necessarily reduce costs for the city. Rather, it is the actual length of the meeting, he said.

That resulted in a discussion on possible ways to make meetings more efficient.

Later in the meeting, the

discussion turned to the format of a Council Workshop, scheduled for April 12th.

Workshops are designed to discuss weighty issues, such as city budgets. Council members opted to keep comments made by the public at the end of the meeting, rather than during discussion of individual agenda

Newark, like most municipalities, is dealing with revenue shortfalls, due to a sluggish economy and tough real estate markets, leading to more extensive use of workshops to hash out issues.

Tip, search lead to murder suspects

Cecil County officers say an anonymous tip and the search of an Elkton-area apartment played pivotal roles in this week's arrest of the two remaining suspects in the 2009 murder of a Newark area woman near Chesapeake City, Md.

According to Lt. Bernard Chiominto of the Cecil County Sheriff's Office, investigators recovered evidence while searching a West Creek Village apartment that helped them track down 20-year-old Joel Thomas Milburn of Elk Mills and 17-year-old Seth Dallas Jedlicka of Middletown, who both were captured by U.S. marshals at a motel in Miami early last week.

Chiominto said investigators searched the apartment of Milburn's ex-girlfriend on March 5 after receiving an anonymous

"We were told that fruits of the crime might be inside that residence," he said. "We didn't find any stolen property, but we did find correspondences from

Spring is in the air - think local

pring, it is around the corner, and am I ever ready for it, as I am sure we all are. There are still

the lingering piles of snow on the ground, but the warmer weather that has graced us this past week has brought on spring fever with a vengeance.



Spring, it is a time of birth,

preparation and growth. Lambing and calving seasons have begun and farmers have begun to prepare their fields for the season ahead. You'll start to hear the familiar whir of the tractor engine or see farming implements traveling down the road in efforts to prepare fields.

Maybe you have a pile of gardening catalogs that await your perusal or perhaps you have a detailed outline of what your plans are for your own garden plot. For the last few

years, community gardening was in resurgence, and it looks like this is going to continue. Maybe this year will be your year to become a member of a community garden. Maybe you are excited for your first taste of locally produced strawberries or tomatoes, or to receive your first share of your subscription to the Community Supported Agriculture operation you joined. Or, perhaps you're excited to take your family for a visit to a local farm and experience an agritourism adventure.

Our state's farmers' markets will be opening in June and are a place to go and find an eclectic mix of the best Delaware has to offer. While you still have awhile to go for tradi-tionally produced fresh fruits and vegetables in Delaware, you do have an opportunity to enjoy locally grown foods and support local businesses. Several local restaurants have partnered with area growers for supply of meats and to a lesser extent at this time of year - produce. We have several growers who produce hydroponic vegetables and use

high tunnels and the like as season extenders. Maybe you thought ahead and were able to stock up and either freeze or can some farm fresh veggies from last season. Perhaps your freezer and cupboards are growing bare. Plan ahead this year. If you do not have a garden, purchase extra locally grown produce and process it yourself at home either through canning or freezing. You will literally enjoy the fruits of your labor throughout the season. It has been my experience, if you process commodities properly and use a great recipe, you sacrifice little in flavor.

There is nothing like enjoying fare that is home grown or produced locally. are plenty of opportunities to experience our State's number one industry agriculture

The building brought together the management and operating offices of the city government. It features a large meeting room for City Council and other public boards and committees. A later addition brought the separately located Police Department and Alderman's Court to the site. The Town Office for many years was in the original one bay Aetna fire house on Academy Street. The office moved to larger space in the Academy Building across the street. Continuing growth of the town and the City staff needed to provide services to

the community led to the present custom designed facility on Elkton Road. The picture is on loan to the Newark Post from the Newark Historical Society collectrom the Newark Historical Society collection. Newark resident Thomson receives honor

The year was 1938 ... Bill Thomson's mother loaded him in the car and together they took the 30-minute trip from Swarthmore to Philadelphia to see the Penn Relays Carnival. The enormity and glamour of the nation's oldest track and field meet cast an immediate spell on the naïve young boy, and from that moment on the Newark resident was hooked on the sport.

"I was enthralled by it,"
Thomson said in a phone interview shortly after returning from his annual three-month winter hiatus in Florida. "I was so spell-bound that I still remember most of the winners from that day."

That trip to Franklin Field on the University of Pennsylvania campus was just the beginning of the Newark resident's long and storied career in track and field, one that has included coaching and officiating at the sport's highest levels.

And now, even at 82, like the Energizer Bunny on those battery commercials, Thomson keeps on going ... and going ... and going.

Thomson's years of service to the Delaware track and field community will be recognized on March 25 when he receives the Herm Reitzes Award, which recognizes long-time service to athletes in Delaware, at the annual Delaware Sportswriters & Broadcasters Association Banquet at Cavaliers Country

Club

"I was surprised when I was notified about the award," Thomson said. "I asked to make sure it wasn't being given to me as a 'has-been,' and they assured me it wasn't."

Thomson's accomplishments as a track and field official include serving as the Penn Relays' high school referee, overseeing the competition involving over 11,000 athletes. He has also refereed virtually every major NCAA and national event. But Thomson doesn't let what many would consider a haughty status keep him from doing what he perhaps loves most, serving as a referee here locally at the New Castle County and state high school championships.

There's no one better on

rules in the United States," says Jim Fischer, director of running programs at the University of Delaware. "He's as big as there is in high schools across the nation. He's active on a national scale in rules and coaching."

Thomson is also an international-level coach whose lengthy resume includes serving as hurdles coach on the 1980 USA Olympic women's team that boycotted the Moscow Games. His well-known coaching expertise helped put Delaware on the national track and field map and eventually led to his induction into the Delaware Track and Field Hall of Fame (1994) and the Delaware Sports Hall of Fame (1997).

"He and Jimmy Flynn started the women's track program here at UD," Fischer added. "And to this day, he and his (Thomson's) wife, Ann, remain very supportive of our program. Bill has been a wonderful mentor to me."

Thomson and his wife of 59 years, who is also a track and field official, passed on their passion for the sport to their five children.

"Track has always been a part of the DNA in our family," says son Gordon Thomson, who ran at Newark High and the University of Florida. "I grew up in the bowels of Franklin Field at the Penn Relays. It was like being in a castle."

Gordon says of all his father's accomplishments and awards, this one in particular will be very special to him.

"He's an avid newspaper reader, so to be honored by a group of sportswriters ... well it will just make this award even more special to him."

Thomson says he has kept plenty busy the last couple weeks since his return from Florida, but added he's already looking forward to his first meet of the season, April 10, at the University of Delaware.

"I've always felt an obligation to the sport. I made a pact to myself a long time ago that I would try to serve as a role model to the younger coaches and officials. And as long as I feel I can contribute, I will."

Fortunately for thousands of track and field participants in the state of Delaware and all over the country, Bill Thomson just keeps on going ... and going ... and going.

Local athletes running to success at Goldey-Beacom

Milburn and Jedlicka while they were on the run."

Chiominto declined to name the woman who rents the apartment or specify the type of correspondence they recovered.

He did note, however, that Jedlicka's mother and his two adult sisters were at the apartment when police served the search warrant. He described all four women as "uncooperative."

Jedlicka's mother also is accused of hiding the vehicle used in the November robbery and murder. Although she has not been charged with any crimes, police said they recovered the white 1998 Plymouth Breeze that Jedlicka and Milburn were thought to still be using, hidden in a garage at her Middletown

"We believe that (Milburn and Jedlicka) were assisted while on the run, and those people who helped them will be arrested and charged," he said.

Their alleged accomplices, 17-year-old Anthony Michael Melchor and 21-year-old Karl Gladden-Postles, both of Elkton, have been in custody since Feb.

All four men are charged in

the shooting death of 40-yearold Newark-area resident Terri Ann McCoy on Nov. 4. As-yetunidentified property reportedly valued at more than \$100,000 was taken during the home invasion robbery and murder at McCoy's parents home in the 3700 block of Augustine Herman Highway.

Each of the suspects is facing an assortment of felony charges, including first-degree murder, armed robbery and first-degree

Chiominto said police began to receive tips about the crime almost immediately and the amount of volunteered information only increased after Melchor and Gladden-Postles were arrested last month.

We believe that Milburn and Jedlicka had remained in this area until we arrested the first two suspects," he said. "That's when they went on the run."

"There is no honor among thieves," he quipped. "Evidently, even (criminals) believe what the suspects did was uncalled for." The two men are now in Maryland.


Armed robbery reported
