This will acknowledge receipt of a certified copy of HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 4 which was adopted by the General Assembly of the State of Delaware on April 6, 1961 and approved by the Governor of Delaware on April 11, 1961. This Resolution proposed reconsideration of the decision to close the Lenape Ordnance Plant at Newark, Delaware.

The Lenape facility already has been closed as far as production is concerned and is being maintained in an inactive status. The Army's current and mobilization requirements recently have been reviewed to determine whether this and other facilities could be disposed of as excess to all foreseeable Army needs. The results of this study disclosed that retention of the Lenape Ordnance Works is not required either by the Army or Department of Defense and should be reported to General Services Administration for disposal.

Any adverse impact on the local economy resulting from the disposal of this installation is regretted. The type of production being accomplished at this plant already had been transferred to another facility operated by Chrysler Corporation prior to the decision to dispose of Lenape. The major impact on the local economy, therefore, resulted from the loss of production rather than the recent decision to dispose of the plant. Only a small number of employees would be required to maintain the installation if it were not disposed of.

Additional gambling of any kind: lottery, dog racing, etc., would be one of the worse things that could happen to the moral character of our citizens and to our State, for it would put our State into the gambling racket and thus encourage all types of evil in the name of legality, and legality never makes evil right and excusable according to the teachings of the Bible.

What our State needs is not more gambling but more of God.

All our political leaders have a moral responsibility first to God and then secondly to the citizens of our beloved State. When this is so, then what is best for our State, based on the Bible's teachings, will be our motivation and our objective.

If we are to survive spiritually as free Americans, it will be primarily because of our spiritual values and not because of the amount of money our State has in its treasury.

Please have this letter read before the members of the House of Representatives and incorporate it in the records of its proceedings.

Dear Mr. Moore:

Since you are chairman of the committee to which a recent House Bill, No. 209, I believe, has been referred to extend the hours of sales of beverage alcohol in our State from 12 o'clock to 1:00 A. M., I write you in vigorous protest.

If the selling of booze at this late hour should become a law, at an hour when most people are home with their families receiving their proper rest for health's sake and for preparing their proficiency in their daily tasks, it would increase the already serious problem of drinking drivers and law enforcement in our State, for one more hour of drinking can make the mighty big difference between a sober person and a drunkard, safety on our highways and accidents.

What our citizens desperately need in this State is not more hours for drinking liquor, for our people already have too much time for this, but more hours for doing creative and constructive activities that will enrich their minds and souls and thereby make a better State in which to live.

No doubt some of the very weak excuses given for enacting this legislation into law is that it gives some few drinkers more time to get their liquor. This is a most ridiculous reason, for if a person cannot get his liquor within the already stated hours, he has no one to blame except himself. Certainly he cannot blame the present sales hours. Let us not be deceived by this brand of reasoning, for it is typical liquor business propaganda.

Another very weak excuse, for this later hour law is that other nearby states may be having later sales hours. So what? Does Delaware have to be a puppet and imitate what others do in this matter? Do we not have the moral courage to be different?

When we citizens are sincerely honest with ourselves, and faithful to the sacred trust placed in us, we know that this kind of legislation is proposed by a few greedy graspers in the liquor business who are never satisfied and who are most selfishly afraid they may lose some sales. Would that they everyone were as much concerned about the health, safety, and character of all their drinkers.

As law makers I know you will be asking yourselves, what is best for all our people and for our State in this matter. Your obvious answer is not additional sales hours for a business which has already overly saturated our State with too many problems, for we know that we should be clamping more controls on this most degrading business and not opening up more polluting sluices.

We are sincerely grateful for all good legislation passed by the members of the House which has been for the wellbeing of our citizens and State.
