Thousands of cars drive on South College Avenue every day — right past the buildings that house University of Delaware's College of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

But few passersby realize what goes on in and around those buildings, said Katy O'Connell, the college's communications manager.

So, for the past 37 years, students and staff in the college have hosted Ag Day every spring to create a buzz

around their highly resourceful program.

"It really started as a way for students and the college to come together to promote activities they're doing," O'Connell said. "A lot of people come by us every day and know we have the dairy farm and know we have ice cream, but they don't really know what else we're doing."

And what goes on at the college is a lot more hands-on than your typical class lecture. Dorset ewes, for

Who will be the next YouDee?

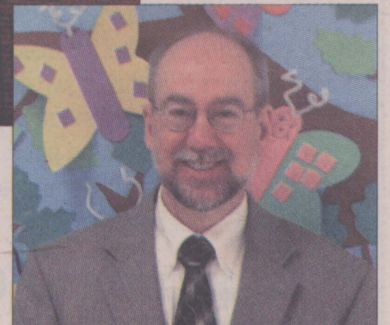

Got Drugs?

Get rid of them during
'Take-Back Day' Saturday

Several state agencies and the federal Drug Enforcement Administration will collaborate to give the public an opportunity to safely dispose of expired, unused and unwanted medications between 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. this Saturday.

Individuals can dispose of unwanted medicines at 31 collection sites statewide, including three sites in Newark, during National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day.

Newark collection sites are the University of Delaware Public Safety Building at 413 Academy St., the Christiana Care Health Services Parking Lot T, at 4755 Ogletown-Stanton Road, and Newark Senior Center, at 200 Whitechapel Drive.

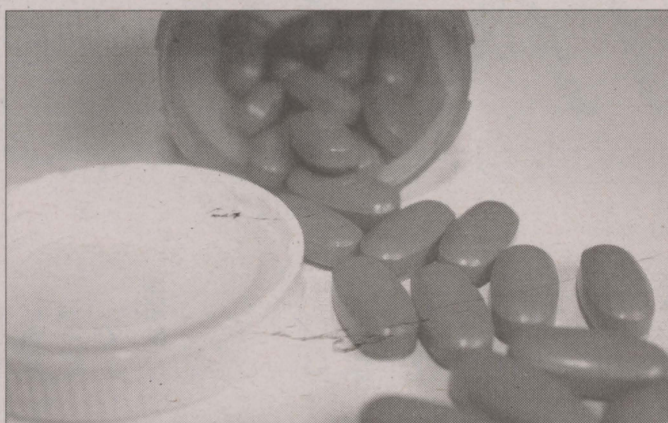
The service is free and anonymous; no questions will be asked. Personal information should be removed from bottles and packages.

Prescription and over-the-counter pills, liquids, and cream medications, and even pet medication will be accepted during Saturday's Take-Back event. Injectables and aerosols are not included in the program, and will not be accepted.

The medications will be collected in specially marked barrels or boxes, and then safely destroyed.

"Unused medications pose a threat to our children, our families and our environment," said Delaware Gov. Jack Markell. "The National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day is a safe way to dramatically decrease the amount of unused drugs in our medicine cabinets, homes and environment."

According to the DEA, a total of 4,465 pounds of unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medications were collected in Delaware during the last drug take-back event in October.



"One of the most common ways for abusers to obtain prescription drugs is by raiding the medicine cabinets and even the trash cans of friends and family members," said Attorney General Beau Biden. "But that also means that one of the simplest ways to fight abuse is to responsibly get rid of drugs that are no longer wanted or needed. The Prescription Drug Take-Back provides an easy, quick opportunity to make our homes and communities safer."

Drug Take-Back Day addresses a vital public health and safety issue. Other methods of discarding unused medicines, such as flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash pose potential health and safety hazards to private and public water systems.

"Prescription drugs have been found in some Delaware water supplies where they may be accidentally ingested by humans," said Rita Landgraf, Secretary of Delaware Health and Social Services. "The Take-Back Day is a coordinated and carefully regulated opportunity to dispose of unused, unwanted and unneeded medications. It also is consistent with DHSS's commitment to addressing prescription drug abuse in Delaware."

Each day, approximately 2,500 teens use prescription drugs to get high for the first time, according to the Partnership for a Drug Free America. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends — often from the home medicine cabinet.

In order to participate in this workshop, prior attendance at one of Tri-State's information sessions is required. These hour-long information sessions will be held

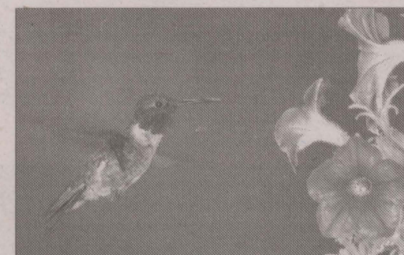
at 11 a.m. Saturday, April 28 and at 11 a.m. Saturday, May 5.

The sessions and workshop will be held at Tri-State's Frink Center for Wildlife, at 110 Possum Hollow Road in Newark. Volunteers must be at least 16 years old.

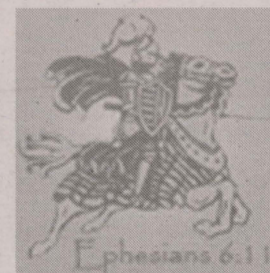

instance, are shorn there each spring for wool that is spun into yarn and woven into blankets. Students hone beekeeping and honey-making skills by tending an apiary of 22 honeybee hives. Cows on the college's farm produce milk that is churned into ice cream and sold at the UD Creamery.

The annual Ag Day event, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. this Saturday, will highlight these and other things happening within the college.

The event will take place right on the college grounds, at 531 S. College Ave.

Ag Day usually attracts about 5,000 people, O'Connell said, adding that organizers have noticed a spike in attendance in the past couple of years, which she attributes partly to the UDairy Creamery's success.

One of Ag Day's most popular events every year is the UD Botanic Gardens plant sale, O'Connell said. The sale is going on this week and beginning at 9:30 a.m. Saturday. Visit <http://ag.udel.edu/udbg/events/annualsale.html> for more details.

Other Ag Day activities include beekeeping demon-

strations at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., a tree-climbing demonstration at 10:30 a.m., 1 and 3 p.m., and a free-flight bird show at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. featuring Phung Luu, who graduated from the college's animal-science program and now owns his own wild-bird-training company.

Live bands will perform throughout the day and refreshments will be available for sale. There is no admission cost for most Ag Day activities, and parking is free.

What's new at UDairy Creamery? Supervisor Renee Poole has the scoop

"From the cow to the cone." How many cows have you milked for the job?

I have actually never milked a cow.

What have you learned about the process of making ice cream?

I've learned that ice cream making is pretty hard work, and can get very messy. Temperature is key when making ice cream; if it doesn't freeze properly, then your ice cream will be no good. It is also very tiring. At the creamery, we hand-mix a lot of our pieces and swirls into the ice cream. You can definitely build some arm muscles!

Working around ice cream all day must be tempting. How do you resist?

It is very tempting, and some people may think that you just get sick of it after a while, but this is not the case. At the creamery, we are always coming up with new flavors, so it is even harder! But I usually just tell myself "No, you can't

have it" — which doesn't always work.

What's your favorite product at the creamery?

My favorite ice cream has to be Mint 'n Cookies. But one of my favorite products we sell is actually honey! When it is in season, the creamery sells honey produced by the bees at the UD apiary.

What are you most excited about seeing at Ag Day this year?

Everything! This is my first year on the team, so I am excited to see all of our hard work really come together on this one day. I think I am most excited for all the demonstrations! We have demonstrations dealing with service dogs, birds and even tree climbing.

Newark Charter School expansion approved

Plans include \$9 million building renovation for new high school

State Board of Education members unanimously approved the proposed Newark Charter School expansion plans last Thursday.

The decision gives school officials the go-ahead to begin renovating the 125,000-square-foot former Lear plant on Elkton Road, about half a mile south of the existing NCS elementary and middle schools.

The Lear building — where car seats for Chrysler Durangos were made until

the plant closed in 2009 — will be renovated to fit classrooms for students in grades seven through 12. It will eventually house a full-sized gym, cafeteria, media center, three technology labs, an engineering lab, six science labs and music facilities for band, orchestra and chorus, said Gregory Meece, Newark Charter School's director.

The renovation is expected to cost about \$9 million, Meece said.

"It's like buying a house: we'll be getting a mortgage payment and basically our

current payment will double," he said.

The payments will come out of the school's operating expenses, money raised through fundraisers and grants from private foundations, Meece said.

"We've always been able to find ways to get what we need through donations, conservative spending and creative financing," he said.

Last Friday morning, Meece admitted he was not sure going into Thursday's meeting how board members were going to vote.

"I'm glad it was a unanimous vote," he said. "It was important that a strong message be sent that this was a

good idea."

The proposal to add a high school has had many vocal opponents, including community members and Christina School District officials who at public hearings said they feared if NCS started admitting high-school students, the best students would leave the public-school system.

In a letter to the state Board of Education last month, ACLU Delaware members also asked the board to reject the expansion proposal. The letter cited the low percentage of minority and low-income students attending NCS, compared with the much-higher per-

centage attending Christina School District schools.

Newark Charter School's current student body is 11 percent African American, 4 percent Hispanic and 15 percent low-income — which the ACLU letter stated is partially due to the school's lack of participation in the state's free-and-reduced-cost-lunch program.

"In all likelihood, this failure discourages low-income families from entering their children in the Newark Charter School lottery," the letter states.

State Board of Education Secretary Lillian Lowery, in her own letter submitted to state BOE members earlier this month, recommended that the board approve the NCS expansion — but only if

the school followed certain guidelines, including mandatory participation in the free-and-reduced-cost-lunch program and a community campaign to better advertise the school and its application process.

The school accepts applications from any student living within a designated 5-mile radius of the school. Students are selected at random by a lottery held each year.

Meece said the school had already planned to begin offering free-and-reduced-price lunches starting this fall.

Last Friday, he was already moving forward with construction plans, and met with

Out of the Attic

Exhibit teaches a lesson about Newark's one-room schools

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 2012 photograph of the Newark History Museum exhibit about area one-room schools. Education in the 18th- and early-19th centuries took place in small private schools, or with hired tutors.

Publicly funded schools in Delaware began under the leadership of Secretary of State Willard Hall that resulted in the General Assembly establishing a state education system with the "Free Schools Act" of 1829.

A school district had about 35 pupils and one building. When a district had enough students for two schools, another district was created rather than building a second school within the same district. In effect, each school was its own district and the system grew to have 423 districts.

Inhabitants of the Newark area met on

Oct. 11, 1830 to organize a system of public schools. In 1831, Newark citizens built the first area public school on record, referred to as District 31. The building stood for more than 150 years on land behind the present Dunkin' Donuts on Main Street.

Soon, another one-room school, District 41, was built in Newark; the building is now part of the house at 143 West Main St. Both ceased to be used as schools in 1884 when Districts 39 and 41 were united using the new building at 83 East Main St.

construction-company representatives in the afternoon. Renovations will begin in June, he said.

The school will start admitting its first class of 162 ninth graders in the fall of 2013, and will add a new grade each year over the next three years.

Meece said he's excited about working with high-school students again.

"I worked at St. Mark's High School for 15 years and the Charter School of Wilmington for five years," he said. "Every grade level has its own enjoyable things and its own challenges, but I do miss the high-school-aged students. You can use a little more humor, and they get it."

In other school news, Lowery announced Friday that she would be leaving her position for a new job as State Superintendent of Schools with the Maryland State Department of Education.

House Education Committee seeks
public's input on charter schools

The House Education Committee will hold a public hearing May 1 to solicit input from citizens on local charter schools.

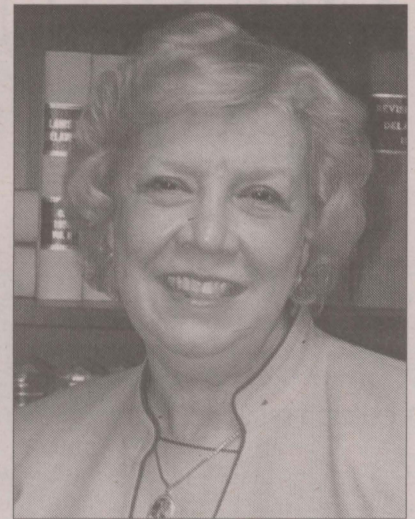
In recent months, several issues regarding charter schools have emerged. House Education Committee Chair Rep. Terry Schooley (D-Newark) said that holding a hearing so those concerns can

be publicly voiced will help outline the issues that need to be addressed for traditional and public charter schools to move forward.

"A lot of the issues that have surfaced recently have been centered on the Newark Charter School expansion, so I have heard a lot of the concerns firsthand," Schooley said. "In addition, other subjects have emerged over the past few months. This hearing will give all committee mem-

bers an opportunity to hear those concerns. It will be a chance for the public to tell us about areas such as capital spending, moratoriums, preferences and impact issues. Then we can begin to address those concerns in a productive manner. This is just the first step in the process of developing good public policy.

The hearing will convene at 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 1 in the House Chamber in Legislative Hall in Dover.

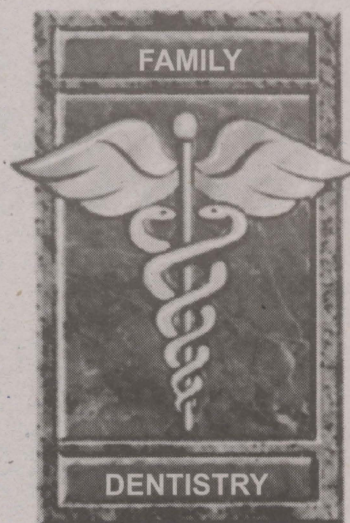
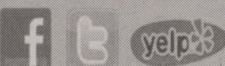

Summer camp:

Where kids can keep on learning

It may seem far off, especially to those with tests and projects still to finish, but the end of the school year is indeed fast approaching. While a three-month break from school is something everyone looks forward to, there are also some downsides to being absent from a learning environment for that long. According to the National Summer Learning Association, most students lose about two months of grade-level equivalency in math skills over the summer months. And the U.S. Department of Education cites that youth can lose as much as 25 percent of their reading skills during summer break.

This learning loss impacts the following school year, as teachers often have to spend about four weeks re-teaching information that children have forgotten. So how do we curb this loss of knowledge and

help our children continue to learn in the summer?

There are many summer programs available to keep kids engaged, active, and involved in the learning process. One way is summer camp. Camp is a place where every child has the opportunity to thrive and learn valuable life skills. There are camps suited to every type of interest, including sports camps, environmental camps, cooking camps and general-interest camps. These important skills support the learning that youth do during the school year.

systems. All give participants intense learning experiences that will keep their minds sharp and active. Who knows — they might even discover a possible career path.

Camp gives youth the chance to try something new in a safe and caring environment. In addition to increasing, rather than losing, knowledge over the summer, kids also develop important life skills such as responsibility, resourcefulness, citizenship, caring and communication.

But let's not forget about the importance of "playtime." The American Academy of Pediatrics has stated that play is an integral part of learning, as it contributes to the cognitive growth of children. And what better place to play than at summer camp?

There are plenty of options for kids to play outdoors in the summer — vacations, the community pool, sports practices — and don't forget to add camp to the list. Camp provides kids with a place to learn

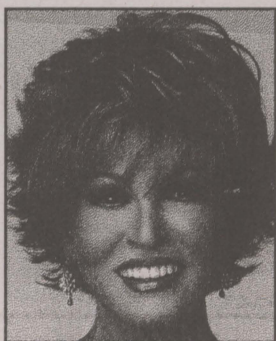

Glasgow baseball players, coach enjoying the fruits of their labor

Twenty years ago when Antwain "Mack" Haman took the baseball field as a player at Glasgow High School, he was focused on where the sport might take him down the road.

After a stellar high-school career, Haman played at Coastal Carolina University and then spent four years in the Orioles' minor-league system. A few surgeries brought an end to his big-league dreams, and Haman found himself back at his alma mater, where from the start, he focused on resurrecting a struggling baseball program.

Haman knew it would take time to turn the program around, and in his first three seasons, the Dragons won a total of just six games.

"I knew what I had before I took the job," Haman admitted about the early struggles. "I knew my staff and I could one day change baseball back to what everyone once knew it was here at Glasgow. I am glad things are slowly changing in a good way."

Glasgow (5-3) is led by a group of juniors and seniors who have played through the frustrating years and are now enjoying the fruits of their labor.

"This year has been fun for my kids so far," Haman said. "We have been working hard on and off the field."

Leading the way on offense is junior Zach Zervas, who plays third base and pitches. The right-handed hitter is batting over .650.

"I have been coaching for 12 years and I truly can say that this kid will probably end up being the best I have ever coached," Haman said. "He sees the ball very well. He reminds me of Kevin Mench (a former St. Mark's standout, UD All-American and major-leaguer) because of how he recognizes the pitch right out of the pitcher's hand."

The infield is anchored by sophomore second baseman Mike Hand, who, according to his coach, "is the truth" on defense and also effective at the plate.

"He is small," Haman said of his No. 2 hitter, "but you won't be able to tell that when he puts the ball in play."

Senior centerfielder Jeremy Euston patrols the outfield and also pitches. Haman looks to Hand and Euston as key leaders on the team.

"These two guys are natural born leaders on the diamond," Haman said. "Both are very good baseball players and they work very hard in practice to improve their games. And on game days I have seen them make hard plays look easy."

On the base paths, junior shortstop Dominick Donato has already stolen 10 bases. The leadoff hitter's ability to get on-base and then get himself into scoring position has helped produce several of the Dragons' runs this season.

"He is a fiery player that any team would love to have," Haman boasted.

Senior Alex Sanchez bats fifth and splits his time in the field between left field and catcher. The right-handed batter boasts a .350 average and, according to Haman, "Is truly the heart of our team."

While the players' stats are impressive, as are the number of wins compared to recent seasons, the school is

perhaps proudest of its baseball team's accomplishments off the field.

"What I am the most proud of is their growth as citizens," athletic director Jeremy Jeanne said. "We try to teach our athletes how to be good role models and good citizens. The team has displayed wonderful sportsmanship, and under Coach Haman, they have been involved in the community."

Haman is focused on instilling in his players that there's more to winning than outscoring opponents.

"We don't have the so-called big-name players, and so it's nice to have players come in and just play hard and learn the way we coach," Haman explained. "I have a great group of kids who take baseball seriously, and that's what's changing Glasgow baseball."

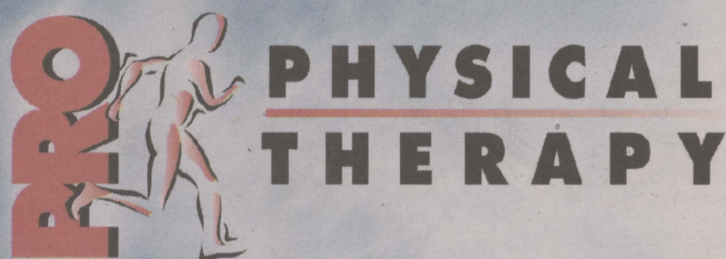
"I am also proud to say that our team GPA is over 3.4," Haman added. "That's winning, in my eyes."

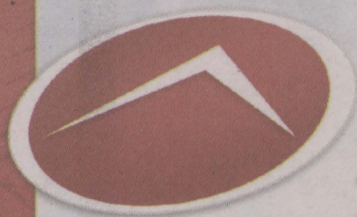


Dominick Donato, one of the team's key players.

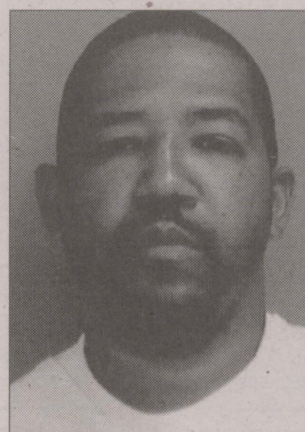
Six vehicles broken into in Villa Belmont
