## Planning Commission recommends rezoning for new charter school

On Tuesday, amid an over-flowing crowd at the City Council chamber, the Newark Planning and Development Commission unanimously approved the rezoning and minor subdivision of a 20.63 acre property for the construction of a Newark Charter high school.

The site, located off of McIntire Drive in the Newark Interstate Business Park, is the location of the now-vacant Lear Seat

Manufacturing plant, just off of Elkton Road.

Representatives from the Newark Charter School submitted a request to rezone the area from general industrial/manufacturing (MI) to low-medium density residential (RH).

Plans call for the retrofitting of the present 100,000 square foot facility into a building which will house laboratories, a "cafetorium", music rooms, a gymnasium, and 40 classrooms. Two soccer and one lacrosse/field hockey turf fields will be built on the southern edge of the lot, along with a



reconfiguration of the existing parking lot to accommodate 543 car spaces and 30 bus spaces.

Concerns arose, from the commission, over the soil viability of the former manufacturing site, the added traffic to Elkton Road during peak times, and safety

issues dealing with the lot's proximity to the high-speed Amtrak train line in the rear of the property.

Joe Charma, of LandmarkJCM Engineering, and representing the Newark Charter School, stated that surveys showed that Lear Seat Manufacturing had very little effect on the soil, which was farmland before the company took over the site. DelDOT has said that initial surveys estimate that traffic will not significantly increase, though they will initiate a more thorough traffic study to determine the actual effects. Both the

Newark Planning and Police Departments requested that fencing be installed to separate the school from the train tracks, which will be incorporated into the final design.

Newark Charter School Director Greg Meece stated that the project has been in the planning stages for a few years and was started by requests from parents who wanted their children to continue the quality of education that the school provides for grades K-8. Continuing, Meece said that many businesses in the area have supported the

proposal in that the project will bring jobs to the area, another high-quality educational facility, and possible increases in economic growth and "quality of life."

Commenting on the building of another high school in Newark, Meece stated, "Our expansion is in order to give our parents a choice."

Opinions were split on the whether the city needs another high school, but Chairman Jim Bowman told the audience, that due to its large size, public comments would be limited to

## Polar Bear Plunge raises more than \$650,000

Plunge records were broken on Sunday as 3,685 "Polar Bears" took an icy dip into the Atlantic Ocean to help raise over \$650,000 at the 2012 Lewes Polar Bear Plunge to benefit Special Olympics Delaware. Both numbers are records for the event.

"It was another remarkable year, which just goes to show you the support the community has for the 3,500 Special Olympics athletes here in Delaware," said Jon Buzby, spokesperson for Special Olympics Delaware. "What we hope more than anything, is that the Bears who plunged, and those who watched them, walked away with

an even greater appreciation for the abilities of people with intellectual disabilities, and not just on the playing fields. For that, we can't thank the bears enough!"

The water temperature was 47 degrees, which made the 2012 Plunge the warmest to date. The previous record for water temperature was 43 degrees, set in 2006 and 2008. The air temperature was 42 degrees, slightly higher than the 20-year average of 39 degrees.

Over the past 21 years, over \$6.15 million has been raised at the annual event, which is presented by Wawa and Comcast.

## Glasgow High School teacher charged in sexual relationship with student

The Delaware State Police have arrested and charged a Glasgow High School teacher in connection with a sexual relationship involving a 17 year-old student.

On January 25, State Police Detectives were contacted by Glasgow High School administration reporting that a male teacher was involved in a sexual relationship with

a 17 year-old female student. After a thorough and comprehensive investigation, it was determined that the teacher involved and student had an apparent sexual relationship at the school since September 2011.



**Pleasanton** F. Pleasanton, 30, of Middletown, was

charged with 21 charges, consisting of Continuous Sexual Abuse of a Child, Sexual Abuse of a Child by a Person of Trust First Degree (10 Counts), and Unlawful Sexual

Contact Second Degree with Person less than 18 years of age (10 counts). Pleasanton was arraigned on the charges and released after posting \$112,500 secured bond.

## Police arrest Newark man for multiple shed and car break-ins

The Newark Police Department has arrested 24 year-old Michael Early of Newark for a seven-month crime spree, dating back to July 2011, involving multiple shed and car break-ins and the unlawful use of several credit cards stolen from within one of the vehicles. The investigation culminated in the arrest of Early on February 4 and the execution of search warrants by Newark PD and the University of Delaware Police at Early's residence and a second home in Newark where Early was storing stolen property.

During the search warrants investigators recovered stolen items linking Early to multiple break-ins along with additional recovered items which are believed to be stolen but which have not yet been linked to a crime. Those items, whose ownership is undetermined, include power tools, a child's bicycle, and multiple GPS units. The investigation is ongoing and additional charges are anticipated as Early has been linked to at least one vehicle break

in on University of Delaware property.

## Suspect displays gun, robs victim

On Thursday, February 2, Newark Police responded to an armed robbery call where the victim stated that he had just been robbed at gunpoint by two unknown suspects.

The victim, a 25 year-old male who said he had recently moved into the area, told authorities that earlier in the week he had been riding his bicycle along Elkton Road, near Delaware Avenue, when an unknown black male, who had introduced himself as "Little," had struck up a conversation about selling a pair of speakers to the victim. The victim, later in the week, contacted the suspect by phone and a meet was arranged in a parking lot behind a building on O'Daniel Ave.

Two suspects met with the victim, whereby suspect "Little" pulled out a revolver with a nickel finish and demanded that the victim turn over his wallet. The second suspect looked surprised and asked "Little" to put the gun away. The victim resisted when the second suspect

approached him, but "Little" threatened to shoot the victim if he continued to resist. After emptying the victim's pockets, the pair of suspects fled northwest towards Adams Street.

Suspect "little" is described as a black male, medium to dark complexion, 20-21 years old, 6 feet tall, approximately 170 pounds with a small build, having a scar on his forehead, short hair, and needing a shave. He was wearing jeans and a yellow coat.

Suspect 2 is also a black male, similar age and complexion, 5'08" to 5'09" tall, thin build, with short hair and also needing a shave. He was wearing a blue jacket.

No other witnesses were found. Officers are attempting to trace the telephone number of suspect "Little."

up behind them, as they were walking on Snowflake Road while in front of the Autumn Park Apartments.

Two unknown male subjects then exited the vehicle and approached the victims. The suspects demanded their property before rifling through the female (14) victim's pockets. Moments later, the male (14) victim handed one of the subjects an undisclosed amount of cash and both suspects then fled on foot toward the front of the shopping center. The vehicle was also seen heading in the same direction.

As a result of the investigation, three Newark teens were positively identified as the suspects who were involved in the crime. Officers then responded to Iron Hill Apartment complex and the Autumn Park Apartment complex, and made contact with two of the suspects and they were taken into custody without incident. Police have warrants of file for a third suspect, a 17 year-old male who also resides in the Autumn Park Apartment

complex.

Both 16 year old males, one of which resides in the unit block of Brookedge Court and the other who resides in the unit block of Winterhaven Drive, were charged with robbery in the second degree, conspiracy in the second degree, menacing and offensive touching. They were arraigned and released to their parents on \$7,500 unsecured bail. They were also ordered not to have contact with the victims or the co-defendants.

Fatal pedestrian crash on Old Baltimore Pike

Delaware Crash Reconstruction Unit is cur-

rently investigating a one-vehicle motor vehicle crash in which a pedestrian was struck that occurred Thursday night.

The incident occurred at approximately 10 p.m. on February 2 as Busurat Adesanya, 37, of Newark, was operating a 2008 Toyota Sienna and was traveling east-bound on Old Baltimore Pike just east of Trefoil Drive. The front of Adesanya's vehicle then struck Michelle Davis, 28, also of Newark, who was attempting to cross the east-bound lanes of Old Baltimore Pike in a northbound direction after exiting a DART bus with a friend. Davis, who was dressed in dark clothing at the time of the crash, was removed from the scene by

EMS and transported to the Christiana Hospital Trauma Center where she was pronounced dead. Neither Adesanya nor the victim's friend were injured.

Old Baltimore Pike was closed for approximately 2.5 hours as the crash was investigated and cleared.

Shoplifter caught with goods from multiple stores

Newark Police have announced that a homeless was arrested on shoplifting charges after he was seen by officers on Christina Parkway, near the bridge.

On Sunday, January 31, Newark Police received a call from the Rite Aid at 263

Elkton Road, where employees said that a white man had attempted to pay for several items, including dental products and two cartons of cigarettes, with a debit card. When the cashier told the man that the card was invalid, the man fled the store and ran south-bound on Elkton Road.

A description of the suspect was broadcast and officers searched the areas surrounding West Park Place, Apple Road, Chrysler Avenue, and Suburban Plaza, not locating the suspect.

A second call was received stating that a man with the same description had just shoplifted items from the Tobacco Outlet in Suburban Plaza and had recently left the store.

The suspect was final-

ly located along Christina Parkway with the items from Rite Aid and Tobacco Outlet, as well as several items traced back to the Walgreen's store located at Suburban Drive, a pellet gun, and additional items that were taken from an unknown store earlier in the week.

After being interrogated at police headquarters, the suspect, Joseph McCauley, a homeless man, stated that he came to Newark to steal the items and would return to Wilmington to sell them for money.

McCauley was arrested on three counts of Shoplifting Under \$1,500, released on \$15,000 unsecured bond, and given No Contact orders with all three stores.

Schools alerted to presentation scams

Attorney General Beau Biden warned school officials to be on the lookout for scam artists who fraudulently promise to facilitate a visit by a professional athlete or other celebrity to their school to speak as part of an anti-bullying program.

"Scammers will do almost anything to make a quick buck, sadly even stealing from our kids," Attorney General Biden stated. "Fortunately, there are a few simple steps you can take to help ensure you don't fall victim to this scam, including checking references of previous customers and not paying for

a service until it has been provided."

Last month a Maryland man was arrested on theft charges after promising schools in at least five Maryland counties that a member of the Baltimore Ravens would speak at assemblies. Shortly before the scheduled appearances the man called the schools to cancel the visit, but kept money that had already been paid. Nearly 20 schools are reported to have fallen victim to this scam, at a cost of more than \$14,000, according to the Annapolis Capital newspaper.

Several Pennsylvania schools

have reported to the state's Attorney General's Office that they have received calls asking if they would like a celebrity or athlete to appear at an assembly to deliver an anti-bullying message, pose for pictures and sign autographs for students.

Attorney General Biden's office has conducted free presentations on the dangers of bullying and how to stay safe online to approximately 30,000 students in Delaware schools and to many community forums across the state. If your school or organization would like the Attorney General to speak at an

# Sportsplex provides sports and life lessons

Whether it's a competitive volleyball team you are looking for, an indoor facility to pitch or hit baseballs, or just a place to play basketball for fun, the Delaware Orthopedic Specialists Sportsplex is the place for you.

The facility opened in November and houses the Delaware Juniors Volleyball Club, which is the largest club of its kind in the state. Previously, the club was renting nine gyms throughout the county, but now can house its entire club under one roof.

The club consists of youth coed youth programs: three boys and 15 girls teams in New Castle County, four girls teams in Kent County and two girls teams in Sussex. In comparison, the next largest club has just seven teams.

Club director Steve Lenderman estimates that 60 percent of the club players come from the Newark-Bear area, and that the upcoming

tournament schedule will be a boost to local businesses.

"We will be hosting events practically every weekend," he said. "This is sure to benefit local businesses when we have hundreds of out-of-state visitors at the facility."

But the Sportsplex is about more than playing in and hosting competitive volleyball tournaments. The facility is available to any member of the community who just wants to play volleyball or basketball.

"Our primary customer is associated with some sort of organized sports program, but we have numerous people who just rent the court for an hour," Lenderman stressed.

There is also an open gym on Friday nights, where people can pay \$5 to play basketball or volleyball. The only "rule" is that youths under the age of 16 must have adult supervision.

The Sportsplex — located in the old Happy Harry's corporate center across from the UPS facility — just added 8,000 square feet of turf,

along with batting tunnels and pitching mounds to help drive an even greater variety of athletes and teams to the complex. The next phase will include the addition of a physical therapy practice, completing Lenderman's vision of a complete training center, where he says athletes will be able to get "everything they need under one roof."

Lenderman, who has been involved in volleyball for 20 years, has coached at the high school and college level. But his enthusiasm is never greater than when he's working with youth.

"My passion is really with the club-coaching, where coaches really make the most impact," he admitted.

Part of that impact is giving

back to the community, and Lenderman stresses that to all of his players.

The club participates in many tournaments that raise funds for breast cancer, but this past weekend the teams took part in one of the club's favorite events — the Lewes Polar Bear Plunge.

"The first year I did the Plunge I was amazed at the number of people doing it," Lenderman explained of the event that benefits Special Olympics Delaware. "So the following year I thought taking the plunge would be a great team-building event, so I signed the team up and gave them a fundraising goal. We've ended up raising thousands of


dollars. Each year we have more and more kids and even their parents take the plunge."

And while Lenderman says the amount of money the club raises for the organization is wonderful, the lessons learned go beyond just jumping in the ocean for a good cause.

"As a youth sports organization, I thought the match to Special Olympic was perfect," he said. "It is great for our kids to see how good they have it and what they can do to help others."




Delaware Juniors Volleyball club at the Polar Bear Plunge in Lewis.

three minutes and that the only issue to be discussed was the zoning aspect of the project, not the quality of education in Newark.

Opinions varied, but hovered around the status of public schools versus charter schools.

New Castle County Councilwoman Lisa Diller, who supports keeping the land as a manufacturing site and attracting a new occupant, demanded that the commission consider the

ramifications of rezoning the site to residential.

"Once that land is gone, it can never come back," said Diller.

A member of the Christina School District Board, who spoke before the commission, estimated that the loss of revenue of putting in a tax-exempt institution, such as a school, instead of trying to lure a manufacturing company back to the site, will cost the city approximately \$50,000 per year, though the city will recoup a large amount of that figure

through the school's use of electricity and other services Newark provides.

One citizen told the commission that its purpose is to promote projects that improve the status of Newark, not ones that will divide it. He stated, "Newark should be one community, one great place."

## Out of the Attic

This week's Out of the Attic item is an undated Jess Rightmeyer photograph on an Everett Photo Card of the building at 300 East Main Street. This view shows the building when it was the Newark Senior Center. The Center was founded in 1957 to serve the Newark area. With membership growth and expanded offerings the Center moved to the pictured location in 1966. Continued growth made this building inadequate to serve the membership. This led to the construction of the customdesigned building at 200 White Chapel Drive that is the Newark Senior Center today.

The original building at 300 East Main Street was built circa 1890 as the Water Works plant for the new village water system. Water was pumped from the White Clay Creek and was distributed through wooden pipes under the streets. The development of the water system and the formation of the volunteer fire company came as a result of the disastrous fire that destroyed the Dean Woolen Mill on Christmas day 1886. Immigration and annexation of neighboring land caused the village to grow to be a town and then to become a city by the 1960 census. A totally new water system replaced the old Water Works. After the Newark Senior Center moved to White Chapel, the Main Street site became the new location of the New Ark United Church of Christ.

Visit the Newark History Museum located at



the historic 1877 passenger train station on South College Avenue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks.

The museum is now observing winter hours through March with visits by appointment only. Individuals, groups, clubs, or organizations are welcome to call 368-9845 for arrangements. The Newark Historical Society invites donations or loans of objects, stories, pictures, and other artifacts of places, activities, people, and life styles in the Greater Newark Area for its permanent collections and display. ## Girl Scouts of the Chesapeake Bay celebrate of 100 years of scouting

On Wednesday, February 2, Sens. Tom Carper and Chris Coons and Rep. John Carney (all D-Del.) hosted the Girl Scouts of the Chesapeake Bay on Capitol Hill as they celebrated 100 years of Girl Scouting. The Girl Scouts, primarily from across the state of Delaware, were in Washington to participate in activities surrounding the centennial of the Girl Scouts of the USA and to launch ToGetHerThere, the largest, boldest advocacy and fundraising campaign dedicated to girls' leadership issues in the nation's history.

ToGetHerThere is a response to unacceptable obstacles that affect today's girls. A comprehensive new research study called, "ToGetHerThere: Girls' Insights about Leadership," commissioned by Girl Scouts in partnership with GFK Roper, suggests that girls are desperate for accessible leadership role models to emulate, with the majority of them saying they have never, or almost never, had successful women speak to their school or class, or offer "girls like themselves" visits to

their workplace. Additionally, the study reveals that while girls are still generally optimistic about their futures, close to three out of five girls think that while a woman can rise up in a company, she will only rarely be put in the very top leadership role. Additionally, 81 percent of 13- to 17-year-old girls believe the workplace could do a better job of meeting the needs of their female workers. "The 100th anniversary of Girl Scouts is the right moment for us to commit to making a measurable impact on this generation of girls," the Delaware Delegation said. "Together, we will break down the barriers that prevent girls from leading by strengthening leadership programs through organizations like the Girl Scouts. When parents, teachers, and community leaders in Delaware – and across our country – ensure that girls have the resources they need to achieve their leadership potential, we not only help our girls, we improve our whole society."
