WHY ARE ATHLETICS WORTH WHILE?

The Women's College Athletic Association has answered this question if we consider the interest which every member, from the sport enthusiast to the "book-worm," has taken in athletic work. Athletics are essential to a college if that college is going to progress. The old idea that girls should sit around and look pretty to decorate the home has been completely destroyed; girls need exercise and have shown through their athletic work that athletics are very worth while. Membership in the Athletic Asso-

ciation is almost 100 per cent, and we are glad to say that the Junior Class holds the record as every girl in the class of '22 is a member of the Athletic Association. Every Junior considers athletics as well worth her while. Let us hope that next year every member of every class will hold this same point of view and support the Association so that, instead of one class 100 per cent strong, we shall have one college 100 per cent strong.

THE POINT SYSTEM

The purpose of the point system shall be to promote Athletics, and to give every girl, in spite of physical handicap, a chance to show her interest in athletics for athletics' sake.

Broad Jump—running and standing.

Practice—1 pt. for each.

Relay—50 yds.

Practice—1 pt.

1st place—5 pts.

III. Dash—50 yds.

Practice—1 pt.

Winning:

- 1st place—5 pts.
- 3rd place—2 pts.
- 3rd place—2 pts.
- Class—10 pts.

Requirments for Awards:—

Numerals:

- Major sports—7 pts.
- Minor sports—5 pts.

Letter:

- Qualifications for numerals.
- Must be chosen for an Honor Team.
- Must have 2 years of Athletic Work.

Shield:

- To the class having highest percentage of points.

Practice hours shall continue from the beginning of the season to the final event, and credit shall be given to those making the number of practice hours assigned. Two practice hours shall be required for all entries. All practices shall be conducted

according to accepted rules. For final events a disinterested party shall referee. The Honor Team shall be chosen by a two-thirds vote of a committee composed of the Athletic Council and the Heads of Sports, and members shall be chosen from all classes. There shall be six Honor Teams—3 of major sports and 3 of minor sports.

I. Basketball—10 members.

Forwards, 3; Guards, 3; Centers, 2; Side Centers, 2.

II. Tennis—4 members.

III. Hockey—14 members.

One for each position.

Three substitutes—1 for each line.

Honor Teams for Minor Sports:—

I. High Jump—1 member.

II. Broad Jump—1 member.

III. Fifty-yard Dash—1 member.

These requirements for awards are subject to change at the will of the organization.
