OUR PLATFORM:

We organize the Independence Party, because it is time to set the public welfare in order.

We are unalterably opposed to the repeal or modification of the Eighteenth Amendment of the Federal Constitution; to the repeal of the Klair State-wide Prohibition Law and the Loose Anti-Shipping Law, in the State of Delaware.

We are unalterably opposed to the restoration, in any manner, of the legalized saloon or the sale of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes, under the protection of the State.

We are unalterably opposed to the modification of the National Prohibition Act so as to permit the manufacture and sale of light wines and beers.

We find no distinction between a tax on intoxicating liquors and a tax on brothels, lotteries, race tracks and gambling houses.

We demand rigid economy in the expenditure of State funds and the discontinuance of a practice on the part of the Legislature of making appropriations for non-essential activities.

LET US NOT BE FOOLED, we do not have to amend the Ten Commandments, nor to repeal them. It is not the right of a Legislature, nor the makers of the Constitution to protect a business that does not promote the purposes for which government was established.

That does not provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare.

LEST WE FORGET: This is a fight between right and wrong; between the saloon and the haters of the saloon; between the moral forces of America and the evil forces of America.
